-- **DEPEW** --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

By 1687, he was in Orange County (now Rockland Co.) at Haverstraw or Orangetown. By Oct 1702 he was probably in Van Cortland Manor in Westchester Co., where some of his children had married and settled.

Francois was the brother of Nicolas (De Puis) De Puy who m. Catryntje DeVos. He was probably younger than his brother Nicholas Depew who followed him to New Amsterdam.

I leave to my wife Sarah the use of all my estate during widowhood, or until my youngest child is of age, except what I shall give to my sons Jacobus and Ephraim. My wife shall keep and maintain my children under age "and get them educated and instructed in the Christian Faith. When my youngest child is of age, my wife is to deliver up possession to my children, and she is to have the choice of my negro wenches, and one room in my house, with use of cellar and garrett, and yard room and garden, and fruit out of my orchard, "Also the sowing of a skipple of flaxseed on my farm yearly," And her choice of my cows, and my executors are to provide her an honorable maintainance. "I have given in my lifetime to my son Jacobus £120 in consideration of his being my oldest son and the many services he has done for me, and to promote him in his business," and he is to pay to my son Jacob œ20 when of age, and to my grandson Jacobus ≈ì40 when he is 12 years old. I leave to my son Ephraim the tract of land with the house and barn now in his possession, Beginning at a Cripple Bush (swamp) at a White Oak tree at the line between me and my brother, Moses De Puy, and thence north along the fence to a wagon road, commonly called the Keyseryck path or road, and then north to a gully, and then along the swamp or Cripple Bush to the land of Simon I. Van Wagenen, and then along his lands and the land of Benjamin Van Wagenen, as the same was sold to me, to the Rondout Kill or Creek, and then up the said Kill to the land of Moses De Puy, and thence a northwest course to beginning. "I leave to my son Jacob a certain tract of land, divided and undivided, which I have by a certain deed, in Rochester, known by the name of Hetzvat Transport." I leave to my son Jacobus a lot of land which I have bought of Johanes Miller, Jr., where my said son's house stands, Also an acre of land adjoining the house where my son has built a new barn, And he is to pay £60 to my 4 sons, Benjamin, Daniel, Jacob, and Joseph. I leave to my son Cornelius my house and barn and 3 acres of land, to be taken in one piece, and he is to pay £100 to my said four sons. All the rest of my lands and tenements I leave to my sons, Jacobus, Cornelius, Benjamin, Daniel, and Joseph, and they are to pay to my daughter Antie, widow of Benjamin Schoonmaker, £80, and to my daughter Elizabeth, wife of Peter Elting, £60, To my daughter Catharine, £100, To my daughter Susanah £100, and

to my daughter Sarah £100, And to my granddaughter Sarah, daughter of my daughter Maria, deceased wife of Jacobus Elmendorph Koole, £50, and to my granddaughter Mary, another child of the same, £50. I also leave to my daughter Antie, widow of Benjamin Schoonmaker, Jr., £80. To my daughter Elizabeth, wife of Peter Eltinge, £60. All the rest of my personal estate to my children and grandchildren. My executors may make partition of lands. I make my four sons and my brothers Cornelius and Moses executors. Witnesses, Hendrick Krom, Benjamin De Puy, Elias De Puy, Proved, August 21, 1762, before Jacobus Bruyn, Surrogate.

John DePuy, widower of Elizabeth Tysen, had banns read at Kingtston Ref Ch 15 April 1692 for a planned marriage to Geertruytje Jans, but this marriage did not take place, possibly because Jan discovered Geertruytje was already pregnant (she later baptized two illegitimate daughters (Blandina, bp. 16 Oct 1692, and Marritje, bp. 9 June 1695) at Kingston Ref Ch. John was living in Staten Island by 1680. He was Sheriff of Richmond County 1698 to 1701.

In his will, he wrote: 1st day of May, 1725. I, John Dupuy, of Richmond County. I leave to my daughter Hester, my dwelling house and lot next to the corner of King street, in William street, now or late in the tenure of Sheffield Howard; Also a negro girl and furniture for a room. I leave to my son John my Great Garden in William street, and all the drugs and medicines belonging to my shop. I leave to my son Daniel £60, and to my son Francis a negro boy and £100. He was a French Huguenot from Artoire, France. He arrived in New Amsterdam in November 1662 (on the Pumberland Church [Purmerland Church], which sailed Oct 16622). He was enumerated on the ship passenger list as Nicholas Du Pui from Artois, wife and three children (another list gives the ages of the children as six, five, and two years of age).

His Leiden marriage record said he was then "from near Atrecht, living at the Minnebroedergraft."

He was from Artois, France and was sworn in as a "beer and warehouse porter" in New York in 1665. On 19 March 1663 he made application for a plantation on Staten Island. He is the progenitor of numerous Depew families of Ulster, Orange, and Rockland Co. The name Depew became prominent in Nyack.¹

They were members of the Reformed Dutch Church of New Utrecht in 1677; later they apparently removed to Bergen, N.J.; he was of New York City at the time of his death in 1691.

The will of Nicholas Du Puis, residing in the city of New York (written in Dutch), was dated 13 Oct 1685 probated 14 July 1691. In it he mentioned wife Catalyna; children Jan, Moses, Susannah, and Nicholas. Wits. were Andrew Canon, Simeon Corneil, Jacobus de Coninck, Abraham De Reacore. Florus Williamse, William Bogardus, Sec. [either witnesses or poss. executors.]3
