

-- **DERIVIERE, RIVIER** --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

-- Among the few extracted notes of my own in which I have some confidence are two burials from "Groede Collectanea. Aantekeningen over refuges en leden der Hervormde en Waalse kerken, brieven, enz., ca. 1600-1900" Hullu, J. de (Johannes) , 1864-1940 on FHL Film 0855879, apparently at Groede:

1607. Jacob de Rivière 63 j 16 Mar 1670 £ 0-0-8
1608 Jonas de Ryvière 62 j 18 Sep 1670 £ 0-0-8

--- The first figures are consistent with estimated birth years, so are probably not entry or ID numbers. Jonas could be Abraham's father of the notarial record--his death wasn't until a month later.

Kenneth R. Brown found a 14 July 1654 wedding in Amsterdam for Janneke Adams van der Spuyck, dau. of Adam v. d. Spuyck, to Abraham van de Riviere, candle maker, born Middelburg, aged 21. He reported two daughters baptized in Amsterdam in 1655 and 1656, and four subsequent marriages for him or another Abraham van de Riviere between 1659 and 1673, with at least 10 children born in Amsterdam.¹

Abraham, born poss. at Riviere in the Belgian province of Namur, resided for a time on the Island of Kadzand, near Groede, in the province of Zeeland, and emigrated to America, probably settling in Brooklyn late in 1676 or early 1677, later moving to Staten Island. He settled on Philipsburgh Manor before 1697, when he was elected elder of the Dutch Reformed Church there.

In the Flatbush Ref Ch membership register is this notation under Cripplebush: Bourgon Broucard. and wife Catharina; Abraham de Riviere. departed with certificate from Groede in the year 1680: and departed for Staten Island.³

In his will, he wrote: 24 April, 1716. I, Abraham De Reinere [a misreading of De Riviere], of the manor of Phillipsburgh, in the County of Westchester. I leave to Hannah De Reinere and Mary De Reinere, each a cow; to John De Reinere my saddle, pistols and holsters, and a horse. My executors are to collect all debts due me, and to put the money at interest till the children are of age, viz., Hannah and Mary by my first wife, and John, Rachel, Letitia and ~~Isaac~~ [corrected to Jane] by my second wife. I make John ~~Harrison~~ [corrected to John Harmson] and Garrett Van Wort [corrected to Van Ward] [correction: add Metice Buckhows] executors. Witnesses, Richard Chapman, John Buckhouse, Barent Dusen. Proved, June 22, 1716.⁴ [In this will, which was signed by mark, he is referring to his son Abraham's children by his son Abraham's two wives.]

In another version of his will, dated 24 April 1716, probated 22 June 1716 (Liber 8, p. 490), Abm. De Rinier [sic], of Manor of Philipsburg, mentioned Hannah, Mary, John, Rachel, Letitia, and Jane De Rinier (Relationship not given, but probably nieces -- WSP). Made John Harmson and Gerit Van Ward executors.⁵

[Translation: 23-12-1681 Statement of Peronne de la Haije, widow of Francois de Plus, on request of judge Johan van Gronsfelt, that she is pregnant of Jean Henquien, farmer in this district (child to be expected end Jan. early Febr.), who has once had a "conversation of the flesh" with her, in about the month of May in the year 1681, between the cottage or house of her opponent and the cottage of Rogier Crappeel, in the alley there, he, dHenquien, dragged her there, promising to give her this and that, but she declares, that she never got any money or other reward for it and that he, dHenquien, never asked her to do all this. (The last part is very hard to translate, so it is more an interpretation than a translation).]¹

Inleiding

In het Zeeuws Archief te Middelburg bevinden zich in het Rechterlijk archief Zeeuws Vlaanderen onder de nrs. 2152 t/m 2156 de acten van notaris Jan Gillissen van Cruijningen. Deze notaris werd 24 juli 1668 door de Raad van Vlaanderen te Middelburg geadmitteerd. Hij resideerde het eerste jaar te Nieuwvliet, maar bevindt zich vanaf 1669 te Breskens, van welke heerlijkheid hij op 2 april 1669 tot secretaris was benoemd. Daar woonde en werkte hij tot zijn dood in februari 1696.

In 1989 heb ik samenvattingen gemaakt van alle acten, welke verzameling later is opgenomen in de verzameling Nadere toegangen van het Zeeuws Archief. Aan het stuk had ik drie indices toegevoegd, op resp. persoonsnamen, namen van getuigen, en een soort zaakregister.
Dat stuk (met een enkele correctie) heb ik hierbij nu, augustus 2002, op mijn website geplaatst. En hoewel er een zoekfunctie op de website bestaat, heb ik voor het gemak ook de hiervoor genoemde indices bijgevoegd.

De acten, die niet ingebonden zijn, zijn per deel door het archief met potlood genummerd. Helaas heeft men de stukken niet eerst geordend, zodat de potloodnummering een zekere willekeur vertoont. Ik heb derhalve de acten eerst op chronologische volgorde gelegd en daarna verwerkt. Ten behoeve van de index heb ik alle acten doorlopend genummerd. Dit nummer staat vooraan. De nummering tussen [] geeft het deel en de potloodnummering aan. Op deze manier zijn de acten snel terug te vinden.

OPM: De acten t/m 16 juni 1669 zijn in het algemeen gepasseerd te Nieuwvliet, waar van Cruijningen toen woonde; vanaf 8 juli 1669 te Breskens. Alleen wanneer een hiervan afwijkende plaats van passering van de acte wordt genoemd, heb ik deze aangekend.

T.b.v. het register heb ik sommige namen aangepast; [] duidt op een toevoeging mijnerzijds, < > geeft de naamsvorm aan die in de tekst gebruikt was. Onderstreepte namen zijn opgenomen in het personenregister; cursieve namen in het register van getuigen, en vetgedrukte aanduidingen in het (beknopte) zaakregister. De afkortingen WT resp. MERK verwijzen naar een handtekening resp. handmerk (b.v. een kruisje) van de betrokken persoon.
