The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

DeRiemer

The de Riemer family originated from Kleef (Cleve), went to Antwerp and after 1585 they came via Middelburg and Grave to Rotterdam and Amsterdam. The 'American' de Riemers descend from Pieter Allaertsz de Riemer, a glazier by profession, from Grave, married to Magrietie Jacobs (this Pieter also had two sisters: Judith and Lijsbeth).

Pieter Allaertsz de Riemer had, as far as I could find 10 children: Frans, Gerrit, Annetie, Jannetje, Abraham, Nicolaas, Isaak (see below), Catharina, Marike and Neeltje.

The son Isaak de Riemer (bp Feb 27, 1614 Amsterdam) married Lysbeth Grevenraet (she m2 Elbert Elbertsz; m3 Samuel Drisius) and they had 9 children baptized in Amsterdam. After the death of Isaac, Lysbeth Grevenraet came with 4 of her remaining children to New Netherlands: Margretha (m1 Cornelis Steenwijck; m2 Henricus Seleijns); Pieter (see below); Machteld (m1 Nicolaes Gouverneur; m2 Jasper Nissepadt) and Huibert (married Catharina Smith).

After the death of Isaac, Lysbeth Grevenraet came with 4 of her remaining children to New Netherlands.

In her will, she directed: (Written in Dutch form.) In the name of the Lord, Amen, know all men who shall see this present Publick Instrument, that after the Nativity of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, 1684, the 4th day of July, did appear before me, Wm. Bogardus, Public Notary, in New York, admitted by Rt. Hon. Thomas Dongan, Captain-General, etc., together with the underwritten witnesses: Mrs. Elizabeth Graveratt, late widow of Dr. Samuel Drisius, deceased, in his life-time minister of that place. Being sickly but having perfect use of her senses, and disposes of her temporal estate in manner following. She leaves all of her personal estate to her children Mrs. Margaret Steenwyck, wife of Cornelius Steenwyck, Machtell, widow of Nicholas Gouverneur, Peter De Reiner, and to the two children of her deceased son Hubert De Reimer, Isaac and Elizabeth "gotten by Catharine." Witnesses, Martin Cregier, Hendrick Jellison. New York, January 5, 1687/8, entered in the Records of the City of New York, per me, Gus. Kingsland, Deputy Clerk. Translated by P. De Lanoy.

Isaac de Riemer was listed in the 1686 Domnie Selyns list of members of the NYC Ref Ch. He was living on Beurs Straet, ["Exchange Place"] (Whitehall Street). Listed before him were: ...Jacob Teller, en syn huysvr. Christina Wessels; Jacob de Key, en syn huysvr. Hillegond Theunis; Sara Bedlo, h. v. Claes Borger; Pieter de Riemer, en syn huysvr. Susanna de Foreest. Listed after him were: Juffr. Magareta de Riemer, wed. van den Hr. Cornelis Steenwyck; Andries Greevenraedt, en syn huysvr. Anna van Brug.¹

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were: Isaac de Riemer, j.m. Van N. Yorck, en Aeltje Wessels, j.d. als boven, beyde wonende alhier.

He was a merchant of New York City. Isaac de Riemer was appointed Mayor of New York in 1700, and was elected a member of the Colonial Assembly from 1700-1702. From 1702-50 1704 he was Alderman of the West Ward, also Collector of the South Ward in 1706. He was elected Constable in 1708 and Alderman of the Out Ward 1714-17.²

I leave to my son, Isaac De Reimer, all that my house and lot in New York, situate and lying in a certain street called the Bridge street, bounded on the east by the house and lot of Andrew Grevenaet, on the west by the house and lot of Rev. Henricus Selynus, south by said street and north by said Peter De Reimer. Also one half of my glaziers tools. All the remainder of estate, real and personal, is left to his wife Susanah for life, and then to his son, Isaac De Reimer. Makes his wife executrix. Witnesses, Geritt Hardenburgh, John Van Giesen, William Huddleston. October 5, 1702, Isaac De Reimer, son and heir at law, of Peter De Riemer, his mother Susanah De Reimer being dead, was sworn as administrator, before John Bridges.
