The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

I, Christopher Dean, of the city of New York, butcher, being sick and weak" I leave to my son John Dean all my lands and tenements in Westchester, by me lately bought of John Tudor. And all my lands at Hempstead in Queens County, bought of Josiah Hobert. I leave to my wife's son, Adam Wallis, all my lands at Crab Meadow in the County of Suffolk, bought of Richard Cornell. I leave to my mother in law Ruth Simmons, £10. To my friend Henry Batchelor, £10. To my kinsman, Edward Taylor, my seal ring engraved with E. T. To my friend, Joseph Nicolls, a ring value 15 shillings. I leave to each of those who shall bear up my pall at my funeral, a ring value 15 shillings, and a mourning hat band. I leave to each of my executors a ring, value a Spanish Pistole. My house and lot in New York by me bought of Humphrey Underhill and others, to be sold. Leaves to his wife Hannah two thirds of the rest of estate, and one third to his daughter Hannah, when of age or married. Mentions other children (not named). Makes his loving friends Wm. Morris "of the ferry" and Wm. Nicolls executors. Dated October 24, 1689. Codicil, Dated December 5, 1691, revokes the legacy of £10 to Henry Batchelor, and gives it to his mother in law, Ruth Simmons.

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. This twenty-fifth day of March, 1782. I, Isaac Dean, Esquire, of the Manor of Phillipsburgh, Westchester County, being in perfect health. All my just debts and funeral charges to be paid. My improvements to be sold for the best advantage of all my children: Samuel, Isaac and John and Thomas and Gilbert and Mary, wife of Jacob Stinets, and Margret, wife of David Concklin, and Emey, wife of Glad Requaw; Also, cash in the hands of John Dean, œ167; cash in the hands of Gilbert Dean, œ100. Deeds, Liber L, p. 52) -- Whereas Amos Dean of the East Patent of North Castle, carpenter, sold to Isaac Dean of Phillipsburgh, a parcel of land in the East Patent of North Castle, by deed bearing date 23 Jan 1772, and whereas the sd. Isaac Dean is dec'd., and the heirs at law, by name, Samuel Dean and Sisanna his wife; Isaac Dean & Hannah his wife; Thomas Dean and Elizabeth his wife; Mary Stimets, wid.; Margaret Conklin and David her husband; John Dean and Phebe his wife; Ann Requa and Gload her husband; Gilbert Dean and Effie his wife; released all claim to same to the sd.

I leave to my three sons, Gideon, Jedediah, and Isaac, all my real estate, houses, and lands. I leave to my wife Ariontyea the use of all so long as she remains my widow, and if it should so happen that she shall marry another husband, then she shall only have the sum of œ14 yearly out of my estate. My estate is to be appraised by two men, one chosen by my three sons aforesaid and the other by my three daughters, and for every hundred pounds the estate shall be valued at my sons are to pay £10. And I leave the same and all my household furniture to my son Abraham and my daughters, Jenny Ellsworth, Elizabeth Woolsey, and Mary Laroe. I leave to my two sons, Jonathan and Daniel, ten shillings, but no legacies are to be paid until three years after my wife's decease. It is also agreed by my wife that all the debts and legacies due me in this state or in the Jerseys are to be applied to pay my just debts. I make my sons, Gideon, Jedediah, and Isaac, executors." Dated July 20, 1781. Witnesses, Dr. Benjamin Ely, Simon Doian, Andreas Dubois, Jr. Proved, November 17, 1781.

Samuel Dean settled in Lancaster MA, signed the town covenant 1653, removed to Long Island before 18 Feb 1656 when he received a home in Jamaica. He was a Quaker, active since 1672. Quaker meetings were held at his Jamaica house in 1687.

On a 9 Jan 1661 list of "persons that have joined in a meeting of the quaecker, named George Wilson in the house of Henry Townsen" were 11 people: Henry Townsen, Sam Spicer (of Gravesend), Goedie Tilton (of Gravesend), Sam Andries, Ritchard Harcker, Samuel Deen & his wife, John Townson & his wife, Rutchard Brittnell, and Richard Chasmoor. Henry Townsend and Sam Spicer were taken prisoners, charged with lodging Quakers, and invited others to come and hear the Quaker preach (in both Rustdorp (Jamaica) and Gravesend). Henry Townsend was fined 25 pounds Flemish; Sam Spicer 12 pounds. John Tilton of Gravesend and John Townsend of Jamaica, were banished. Richard Chasmore signed (by mark) on 11 Feb 1661, a pledge to inform and assist authorities of the presence of Quakers in the town of Rustdorp. Those who would not subscribe: John Townsend, Richarde Harkar, Samuell Deine, Samuell Andrewse, Benjamin Hubbarde, Nathaniell Cole.²
