

## -- DELAMETER --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

### **Delamater**

"Glaude Le Maistre, or Delamater, as usually written by his descendants, had sprung from an ancient house of Brittany, the Lords of Garlaye, whose chateau and estates lay in the parish of Derval, in the diocese of Nantes. It was eminent in the civil and military service, the church, and the law. Its members had held commands in Picardy, where one of its now scattered branches, in which the name Claude first appears, became allied early in the sixteenth century to the Lords of Caumartin. Claude Le Maistre, Sieur De Hedicourt, becoming a Protestant, was, with others, imprisoned and fined at Amiens in 1588, at the instance of the League. He was a man of talent and spirit, and showed great valor in opposing the entrance of the Spaniards into that city in 1597, when soldiers in the garb of peasants, selling apples and nuts, had gained admission. Our Glaude Le Maistre was no doubt of this family, members of which had removed to Artois, where he was born, as before said, in the town of Richebourg. After escaping the country he comes to notice at Amsterdam, in 1652, an exile and a widower, living in the Tanners' cross-street, having lost his wife, Jeanne De Lannoy. On April 24th of that year he married Hester, daughter of Pierre Du Bois, of Amsterdam, though late of Canterbury, England, where Hester was born. Some of the Le Maistres had also taken refuge at Canterbury, and circumstances make it nearly certain that Glaude was among them, and with the Du Boises had left England because of the civil wars then raging, or the threatened rupture with Holland, and, perhaps, in his case, to take ship for New Netherland, as he soon did, appearing with Tournear first at Flatbush, and afterward at Harlem."—Riker, James, *History of Harlem*, p. 98

My wife Elsie is to remain in full possession of all my estate during her life. I leave to my eldest son Cornelius £5 for his right as first born. I leave to my sons Johanes, David, Jacobus, and Abraham, 3 morgens of land on Rondout Kill. Leaves property in Kingston to his sons Johanes and Jacobus. I leave to my son David my "sit plaas" (pew) in the Church in Kingston. Leaves legacies to all the above named sons, and to his daughter Ariantie, wife of Aldert Kiersted, and "to my wife's daughter, Jannettie, wife of William Eltinge." Glaude le Maistre was originally from Richebourg, in the present-day Departement du Nord, France. Richebourg, near the border between France and Belgium, was then in "Walloon Flanders" whose inhabitants were known as Walloons. Before their m. in 1652, both Glaude and Esther had lived in Canterbury, Co. Kent, England.

At the time of this third marriage to Hester Dubois he was listed as a grosgrain (silk) worker from Ryckbour and a widower. He and Hester came to the New Netherland soon after their marriage and settled in Flatbush NY. They later moved to Harlem where Claude was an overseer in 1666, 1669 and 1672.

Glaude and Esther were in New Amsterdam by 9 Mar 1653 when their son Jan was baptized. They lived for several years at Flatbush, then moved to Harlem, where he served as Magistrate from 1666-1673. He bought two allotments of land from Daniel Tournier, for which he took out a patent on June 25, 1668.

Clsude Le Maistre worked as a carpenter. In 1661 he applied for land on Staten Island, but removed to Harlem, N.Y. instead. He served four terms as a magistrate at Harlem between 1666 and 1673. He bought two allotments of land from Daniel Tourneur for which he took out a patent June 25, 1668. In 1675 he was chosen a deacon, but his sympathies were with the French church and service, whence arose the controversy with the town regarding the parish clerk's salary, which so disturbed his latter years."

Isaac Delamater inherited his grandfather Jan Flierboom's land at Old Tappan, Bergen County, NJ, part of which he sold to Martinus Hogencamp in 1799 and to Jacob Merseles in 1803.<sup>1</sup>

On 25 March 1803 (Recorded 18 Oct 1803, Bergen Co. R:62), Martinus Hogencamp of Clarkstown in County of Rockland, State of New York, and Autye, his wife, conveyed to James Haring and Cornelius I. Blauvelt of Harington, for \$750, 25 acres in Harington which was conveyed to said Martinus Hogencamp by Isaac Delamater and Jane, his wife, by deed dated 2 Feb 1799. Beginning NW corner of Cornelius Eckerson's land. Bounded E by said Isaac De Lamarter; N partly by said De-Lamarter and partly by Hackensack River; W by Hackensack River. Signed by Martinus I. All my goods and movables after my wife's decease, to my children. I make my sons and Thomas Janse executors. Dated April 26, 1736. Witnesses, Gilbert Livingston, Hendrick Van Curen, R. G. In his will, he wrote: 26 of April, 1756, I, Johannes De Lameter, residing in Kingston, in Ulster County, being sickly and weak in body, and in order to make all things regular, "I direct all just debts to be paid in proper time. "I leave to my wife Marytie the use of all household goods, pots, pans, bedsteads, with furniture, sheets, pillows, and all other linnen ware, the best cupboard, and all clothing, 1 cow, and all other housing stuff as was her own when she married." I also leave her the house and lot where we now live in Kingston during her widowhood, and the interest on £200. After the death or marriage of my wife, my daughter Marytie is to have the house, lot, and buildings, also the £200. I leave to my eldest and only son, Abraham De Lameter, my Large Bible, gun, and sword, and all my right in the Tan yard in Kingston, with the hides and leather, and all shoemaking tools, "Also all that lot of low land situate on the other side of the Great Kill on the Great Tract," as the same was conveyed to me by Hendrick Oosterhout and Janettie his wife, and he is to pay £100 to my other children. "I leave to my daughters, Elizabeth and Anna, an outfit or outfit such as my daughters Cornelia, Elsie, and Catharine have had. All the rest of my estate I leave to my 6 [7] children, Cornelia, wife of Cornelius Low, Elsie, wife of Dirck Schepmoes, Catharine, wife of Willhelmus Van Gaasbeek, Mary, Elizabeth, Anna, and Abraham. I make my daughters Elizabeth and Anna, and my son Abraham, and my sons in law, Cornelius Low and Willhelmus Van Gaasbeek, and my brother, David De Lameter, and Jan Elling, executors. In his will, he wrote: ...I, Martin De Lamater, of Marbletown, in Ulster County, being weak and sick, this October 18, 1768. I leave to my wife the use of all my estate during her life or widowhood. I leave to my son Jacob the farm on which I now live, "to the southwest, west, and northwest of my dwelling house, and extending so far as the Bottle bergh," including the land that lies there, And he is to pay to my 5 daughters and my grandson £600, viz., Elizabeth, Margaret, Maria, Bata, and Hester, and my grandson, Moses Cantine, Jr., son of my daughter Geertye, deceased. I also leave to my said daughters and grandson the remainder of all my lands, of which "one tract lies at Shanandore, and another tract lies at a place called Laggewack, some distance below Cashicton on the west side of the Delaware river, and bounding on the same," Another parcel lies at Marbletown at the Strene Kill, and another parcel at the Beaver Kill. I leave to my daughters, Elizabeth, Margaret, Maria, and Bata, each a negro slave, and the same to my daughter Hester and to my grandson, also to my son Jacob. The rest of the negroes (3) to my wife. I leave to my daughter Elizabeth £100, to be paid by my son Jacob; Also £100 each to my other daughters, and to my grandson, Moses Cantine, Jr., £100; To my son Jacob all farming utensils and horses. All the rest to my children. Witnesses, Petrus Dumond, Cornelius Bogart, Christopher De Witt. I make my son John and my sons-in-law, Abraham Cantine and Conrad Du Bois, executors. Proved, December 26, 1768.
