

-- DODD, DODDS --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Bartholomew, after baptizing several children in Pompton Plains, NJ, returned to Schenectady and settled there.¹

He owned land at Beavertown N.J. in 1773. A "Bartholomeus" and a "John Dods" were listed at Pequannock Morris County in the 1778-80 Revolutionary Census of New Jersey. It appears that Bartholomew served in the Revolution on the American side as one of his descendants made application about 1940 to join the DAR using a letter from the Adjutant General of New Jersey.

In the Vail Genealogy it states that Bartholomew and his brother Thomas and his father John Dodds put in claims for damage that occurred during the Revolution in amount of 30 Pounds 10 shillings in 1781.

Bartholomeus was in New York City in May of 1781 when son Bartholomew was baptized but back in Pompton Plains when daughter Maartje was baptized in October 1782. Bartholomew moved to Schenectady after 1872 and settled on lands that he inherited from his mother Catherine Schermerhorn. The family was in the Schenectady N.Y. area by April 1787 when son Jacob (child #12) was baptized at Schenectady Dutch Reform Church.

In May 1788, Bartholomeus purchased a portion of Lot 22 of the Patent granted to William Corry in the present town of Charlestown Montgomery County. In September of 1790 the Dods were living in the Town of Florida (Montgomery County, NY) as the marriage records of the Schenectady Church give the residence of both Antje and Catherine Dods as Remsenboss (Town of Florida). However by 1797 when Seatty (Sarah) Dods was married to Hendrick Staley their residence was given as Corry's Boss (Town of Charlestown). On 11 May 1801 Bartholomeus purchased 348.25 acres then in the Town of Mayfair in Fulton County [OH?] and gave his residence as the Town of Florida. This property, Lot 6 and 55 of the Benson Tract at the intersection of Hamilton County Road 6 and North Street was in the present Town of Benson after Hamilton county was created and the Town of Benson "set off" from The Town of Hope in 1860. North Street runs northerly from Road 6 between along the east side of Lots 55 and 66 toward Cathead Mountain. Although Bartholomeus may have been a farmer in the Town of Florida, it is likely he purchased the Town of Benson property for the timber. Portions of Lot 6 have been cleared and farmed at one time, but Lot 55 appears too rough and rocky to have been farmed on any meaningful scale.

It appears that Bartholomeus' son-in-law, John Eglin engaged in the lumber trade as when in 1830 and 1831 the Eglins (Thomas and John) transferred part of Lot 34 in the Glenn, Beeker and Lansing patents (about 2 miles west of the Dods property), the transferred property was referred to as the Eglin mill lot (the North Branch of Stoney Creek runs thru lot 34 and one might presume that the Eglins had built a saw mill on the property).

In February 1804 Bartholomew sold a portion of Lot 9 in the Subdivision of Lot 4 of XIII Allotment of the Kayaderosseras Patent to his son Cornelis Dods. This property appears to be on the Crane's Hollow Road in the Town of Amsterdam (Montgomery County) about a half mile south of the Saratoga road (New York State Highway # 67). This property likely included the present Dods Cemetery on Crane's Hollow Road. In June of 1806, he sold Lot 4 of the Benson Tract and the southern part of Lot 57 of the Benson Tract in the Township of Benson.

In his will Bartholomeus gave property to his sons. To Bartholomew Jr, he gave lot 6 of the Benson Tract and to Jacob, Lot 55 of the Benson Tract. He also gave them a part of Lot 4 of the Benson Tract (south side of Road 6, approx 1 mile east of North Street).

W:426) Daniel Dod of the County of Bergen, farmer, and Frances, his wife, conveyed to Cornelius Peterson of the City of New York, blacksmith, for \$858.75, two tracts lying between Preckness and Waghraw in the Township of Saddle River. (1) 38-66/100 acres beginning at the meeting of two small brooks at a place called by the "dutch" Cauld Bergh, being the beginning of a tract of 63 acres returned to Garrabrant and Halmagh Van Howten on 10 May 1751. (2) 30 acres surveyed by Andrew Bell, beginning at 63=acre tract described above; mentions tract of 35-19/100 acres returned to John Rattoon on 25 Sep 1791. Signed by Daniel Dod, Frances Dod. Witnessed by Simeon Ro-mayne, Thos. Wills.¹

After baptizing their son Bartholomew, they moved to Pompton Plains, NJ.

John Dods was appointed overseer of Highway for Pequannock Township Morris County (Pompton Plains is located in Pequannock Township) on 27 March 1750.

At the time of the Revolution John operated a tavern on the Road from Morristown to Two Bridges between Beaver Dam Creek and the Passaic River in present day Lincoln Park (then Pequannock Township). (Ref A history of Beavertown and Lincoln Park). John had a house on Highland Street just off Chapel Hill and his tavern was in the center of Lincoln Park and in 1971 were the two oldest houses in Lincoln Park. John's original farm consisted of 208 acres on both sides of Chapel Hill. The history suggests that George Washington may have stopped at the Dods Tavern as the Revolution army was encamped several times from 1871 to 1781 at Two Bridges and other area locations. John Dods, along with his sons Bartholemew and Thomas claimed for damages of 30 pounds and 10 shillings in 1781 because of losses suffered in the Revolution

His will (28 Sep 1786) according to the Vail Family Gen mentioned Eldest son by first wife, Bartholomew, his brother Thomas, wife Celiatai dods Sons John and Jasper Dau Catherine Jane and step dau Sarah. John's children may have also included Batje , Casparus , Jacob Johannus.²
