The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, John Dumont, of Kingston, in Ulster County, merchant. I leave to my wife Rachel the use of all my estate during her life, for maintaining herself and bringing up and educating the children. As my children come of age they are each to have £25. After the decease of my wife all my estate is to go to my children, Johaness, Egbert, Petrus, and Catharine. I make my wife Rachel, and my brothers, Walter and Peter Dumont, and Francis Cornelis Schoonmaker, executors. Dated November 5, 1740. Witnesses, Dirck Van Keuren, Hendricus Van Keuren, John Slecht, Cornelius Van Keuren. Proved, March 18, 1741/2.

In her will, she wrote:...I, Rachel DuMond, of Kingston, Ulster County. I leave to my son John "all my Law and History Books which he now hath in his possession." I leave to my son Egbert all my lot of low land lying on the north side of Esopus creek, or Kill, in Kingston, which was devised to me by my father, Egbert Schoonmaker. Also all the lot of low land which I got by exchange from my brother, Hendrick Schoonmaker. Also all that certain tract of land lying to the southward of the Rondout Kill or creek, also in Kingston, as the same was conveyed to me by Samuel Whitaker. "Also all that lot of land lying in the Corporation of Kingston, commonly called and known by the name of Schepmoes Wey, or Pasture," so as the same was conveyed to me by Dirck Schepmoes and Johaness Schepmoes, deceased, as by said will and deeds may appear. Together with all buildings. And my son Egbert shall pay to my daughter Catharine £300. I leave to my daughter Catharine my silver teapot and silver milk pot. I leave to my son Egbert and daughter Catharine all money due to me. All the rest of my estate to my three children. I make my son Egbert and daughter Catharine and my friend, Andries De Witt, executors. Witnesses, Abraham Hasbrouck, Abraham Van Keuren, Joseph Gasherie. Proved, February 15, 1765, before Petrus Edmundus Elmendorph, Surrogate.

Inventory; Real--home farm of 615 acres, @ £3.10. per acre, £2,152.10; two lots at Rariton Landing, Middlesex Co., £50; a right laid out on the Northbranch, £3.5.4. Personal--£1,073.13.4, incl, bonds, cash and notes, £63.4; 9 negroes, £265; 3 looking-glasses, £4.2; 5 silver spoons and a silver cup, £5.10; 400 bush. of wheat, @ 5s., £100; 50 bush. of Indian corn, @ 2/6, £6.5; book debts, £149.0.6; appraised by Peter Wortman and Matheus ten Eick.

Peter Du Mon settled in Somerset County, NJ about 1699.

In his will, dated 29 March 1740 Somerset Co., NJ, Peter Dumont, yeoman; mentioned son, John, the large Dutch Bible. To him and his heirs £50 in payments by the four sons, Hendrick, John Baptes [Baptist], Peter and Rynear, when the youngest son then living will be of age; likewise to son Abraham. Lands to be divided equally between Hendrick, John Baptes, Peter and Rynear. Daughters--Cattelintje (wife of Christian Lagrange), Margaret (wife of George Bergen), Gerrette and Jannetie. Executors--sons John, Abraham, John Baptes, brothers-in-law Rynear and Nicholas Veghten. Witnesses--Dirck Van Veghten, Henry Van Middleswaert, John Broughton. Proved 17 July, 1744. 1744, July 12. Dumont, John, declines to serve as executor of the will of his father, Peter Dumont. Signed by Abr. Dumont, John Dumont.

Wallerand Dumont (DuMond) was a Huguenot from Coomen, Flanders who fled France during the persecution. He emigrated about 1657 from Amsterdam, Holland to New Amsterdam (New York). He was at that time a Cadet in a company of soldiers sent by the Dutch West India Company. He settled at Kingston, New York.

Margriet/Grietje Hendricks Van Wie's first husband, Jan Arentsen [Van Putten], was a member of the party who in 1659 attacked the Indians at Esopus; they retaliated by attacking and killing him in his home 7 June 1663. Margrietje had one daughter by her first husband, Antie/Anne. who m. Hendrick Kip.

In the Kingston marriage record, they were: Wallerandt du Mont, j.m. of Coomen, in Vlaenderen, Cadet of the Hon. [West India] Company of the Hon. Lord Durector General (Stuyvesant), and Margriet Hendricks of Wie, near Swol, widow of Jan Arentsen, both resid. here (in Wiltwyck, now Kingston).

Wallerandt DuMont Sr. Will dated March 15, 1701 and written in Dutch "My wife Gryetie Du Mondt shall have and enjoy durring her life the income and profits out of my entire estate, to dispose of at her pleasure, my debts to be paid before she dies and then the personal estate shall be equly divided among my heirs, but the negro shall go to my son Jan Baptist Du Mondt, he to pay for said negro such price as two honorable appraisers may decide upon. To my three sons, Weibrandt, Jan Baptist and Pieter, my house, garden and orchard beginning at the little kill near my house. As I did not dispose of my house, barn, garden and yards, and my son Jan Baptist du Mondt's 6 morgen wood-land, which I bought of the Trustees of the Corporation of Kingston, I dispose of 100 schepels of wheat out of said house, barn, garden, yards. To my six children named Wllerand, Jan Baptist, Peiter, Margrietje, Jannetje, and Francyntje, said barn, garden yard, except the value of the 100 schepels of wheat given to Wallerandt. To my sons Wallerandt and Jon Baptist, six morgens wood-land on the south side of the highway, adjoining the woodland belonging to the heirs of Tjerck De Witt and the woodland belonging to Capt. M. M.'s land and Jan Baptist shall have the three morgens next to the land belonging to the heirs of Tjerck De Witt, on condition that they have paid for it to the Trustees. My will is that my whole farm shall go to my three sons, not to be sold to strangers, or alienated but retain the name of DuMont for all time. "Myn Huysrouw" Grietje appointed executrix. (Mark of) Walerand Du Mont. Cornelis Eltinge, Tjerck deWitt, Wm. Nottingham. (At a Court of Common Pleas held at Kingston this 3rd Sept. 1713. The same persons appeared at the probathon of the will." (Anjou, Ulster County Probate Records)
