The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Albert was a tenant farmer, and no evidence of land ownership has been found. They lived near the Tappan Church until 1763 when they moved to the Schraalenburgh area.

His descendants adopted the **Duryea** spelling of the surname.

Albert changed the spelling of his name from Durie to **Duryea**.

The Demarest Supplement (I:8) errs in giving Tappan as place of baptism for Albert and also in the list of children.

They lived on the tract containing 7.90 acres of land situated on the north side of Grotke Road, bordering the Pascack Brook, purchased 29 Dec 1810 from Abraham Jersey, husband of cousin Hannah Demarest, for the sum of 200 pounds. On this land stood the original sandstone portion, one story in height, of the house presently at no. 52 Grotke Road. The house was later enlarged by a frame addition to the east, and a second story in height. They lived there for the remainder of their lives.¹

Albert served as a Private in the War of 1812 in the same companies as cousin Albert, and also received a land bounty of 40 acres.¹

Although his brothers John and Peter were given deeds by their father 24 Nov 1825 for certain lands where each had settled at marriage, Albert probably had received funds with which to purchase the Jersey property in 1810. On 11 Jan 1826 the three brothers exchanged deeds in a division of the father's remaining lands by which Albert received about 50 acres to the north and east of his residence, plus 6 acres of meadow along South Pascack Road. On 16 Sep 1848, he purchased from son John for \$400, the tenant house now at np. 706 South Pascack Road, which he sold 16 Dec 1864 to Garret A. Haring for \$700.¹

His will was dated 19 April 1865, probated 19 Sep 1870 Rockland Co., NY. In it he mentioned sons Albert, David, Peter, and John; daughters Martha Uzilla, and Sally; grandson Albert S. Messenger.¹

Albert Duryea was a farmer. He enlisted as a Private in the War of 1812, serving in the 142nd Infantry, New York Co., New York State Militia, under Lt. Col. Jonas Mapes, and in Company of Capt. John J. Sickles. He was transferred to the 1st Provincial Infantry, Detached Companies, U.S. Volunteers, under Lt. Col. Daniel G. Dodge in the Company of Capt. John J. Sickles. He served in the forts in New York Harbor. He applied for a land grant and received 40 acres.¹

His will, dated 26 June 1870, was probated in Rockland Co., NY. In it he mentioned his wife, sons Cornelius and John; daughters Jane, Lavinia, Cornelia, and Sally Ann; grandsons and namesakes Albert J. Duryea and Albert J. Haring.

Daniel was a farmer and a miller. Soon after his marriage he received a deed from his father for a large part of the homestead land at River Edge and Paramus, Bergen Co., NJ, probably that portion lying west of Kinderkamack Road, on which he made his home for a number of years. He later bought and sold numerous other parcels of land (detailed in [The Durie Family](#)). He acquired land at Kinderkamack (present Oradell and Emerson) from brother Samuel 6 May 1767; his homestead stood near the northwest intersection of Kinderkamack and Soldier Hill Roads in Oradell. In 1785 he moved to Morris County, NJ.

He was a Freeholder for Pequannock Township in 1793.

David was a farmer and they lived in part of his father's homestead which stood on the north third of the Morris land, the site now 257 Schraalenburgh Road in Closter, Bergen Co., NJ. David was devised this land and homestead along with other land, by his father's will in 1773.

In Sep 1775 David and 17 other residents were elected members of the Bergen County Committee of Observation and Correspondence, which was authorized to handle county affairs and to "carry into execution the resolutions and orders of the Continental Provincial Congress." According to Howard Durie (in [The Durie Family](#)) some members were not believed to have been very active supporters of the patriot cause; they were prosperous farmers and did not wish to be involved with anarchy which might disturb their established way of life.

In July 1777 David was among a large number of county residents alleged to be "disaffected" to the American cause; they were apprehended and taken to jail in Morristown. David was discharged 15 Aug after taking the required oaths of allegiance to the government of the State of New Jersey.

David was a carpenter, miller, and farmer. He probably went with his parents to NYC after the confiscation of the family homestead and mill property at Old Tappan. He did not, however, accompany them when they went to Nova Scotia in 1783. He was living in Paramus when he married, resided there afterward, and later lived in Hackensack. By 1799 he was living in Harington Township, in Bergen County, NJ. In 1803 David purchased and moved to 23-1/4 acres in the Town of Hempstead (now Ramapo), Rockland County, NY, including a grist mill (the property was about 2 miles northeast of the present Village of Pearl River). About 1816 they moved to a rented farm in Montvale, NJ until May 1818 when David bought a 53.47-acre farm at Macopin in Pompton (now West Milford Township in Passaic County), NJ. In 1825 they moved to Paterson, to a rented house on Parke Street where he ran a "Fancy Dry Goods" store for a time.

They lived at Pascack (now Hillsdale and Washington Township) on part of the land acquired by his grandfather, John Durie. He was a blacksmith, and conducted his business from a shop on the opposite side of the road.

In 1779 and 1780 he served as one of the Poormasters for Harington Township.

He studied for the legal profession, and his name is found on many documents drawn and executed by him in that capacity. He was elected a Freeholder in 1787 and a Justice in 1791. In 1804 he was appointed a Judge of the Bergen County Common Pleas Court and was reappointed for terms beginning 1809 and 1816.

Garret Durie was a farmer and lived on his father's homestead farm of about 110 acres on the east side of Schraalenburgh Road in Haworth, Bergen Co., NJ, in which he purchased the half interest of his brother John by deed dated 15 April 1811. Included were tracts of 6 acres of woodland on the west side of the road, and 1-1/4 acres of salt meadow at Orangetown, NY.¹

Shortly after his marriage, Garret had the p;d homestead demolished and replaced by one of sandstone and frame construction, now at #371 Schraalenburgh Road. It remained in his descendants possession until 1946.¹

In 1803 Anna was devised a house and land on Tappan Road in the present Northvale, Bergen Co., NJ, by the will of Daniel Haring, her grandfather. This property was sold in 1811 to brother-in-law John J. Blauvelt.¹

In his will dated 17 Jan 1837, probated at Hackensack, he left the estate to his wife and dau. during their lifetime, and finally to the child or children of the dau.¹

Jean Durier came to America shortly before 1686 and joined the Huguenot Colony founded by the Demarest family on land along the east side of the Hackensack River in what is now New Milford, Bergen County, NJ. On 27 July 1686 he received a patent from the East Jersey Proprietors for 261 acres west of the river in what is today River Edge and Paramus. He established his home on the easterly part in present River Edge, at a site between the early Kinderkamack Road and the river.

After the second marriage, they lived on the Demarest land on the east side of the river in present New Milford, NJ, where he resided until his death. On 11 Nov 1695 the Board of Proprietors of Eastern New Jersey approved of the sale of 233 acres sold to "John Durrie" for £55.

Because of his educational background and status in the community, he was appointed a Justice of the Bergen County Court on 5 Feb 1693. His will was dated 10 June 1698 and was probated 2 Sep 1698 at Perth Amboy, NJ.

They lived on land in what is now Haworth, Closter and Demarest, in Bergen Co., NJ, earlier in the former Morris House, and later building at the site of today's 257 Schraalenburgh Road, Closter. John purchased many additional tracts of land, and at one time owned more than 1,400 acres. *The Durie Family* contains an extensive account of his holdings.

He learned the blacksmith trade and was called a smith in transactions before 1733. In later years he was called a "yeoman" or a "gentleman."

He was a Churchmaster, chosen to supervise the building of the Schraalenburgh Church, finished in 1728. At interim periods between 1733 and 1751 he served as Freeholder for Bergen County.

John Durie was a farmer and lived probably from the time of his first marriage at a place called the "Vlakte" (the plain, or the Flats) in the northwest part of present New Milford, Bergen Co., NJ, on part of the land deeded to his father by grandfather Samuel Demarest. About 1767 John sold this land, probably to Jacobus Lozier, his brother-in-law, who owned the adjacent land. John then purchased, about 1767, from brother Samuel, a house and grist mill at "Stone Point" in present Old Tappan, Bergen Co., NJ. He lived there and ran the mill until the Revolutionary War period (in later years the mill site became the Collignon Chair Factory).

John, probably through the influence of his Peek connections, was sympathetic to the British side when the Revolutionary War started. He was accused of being a "disaffected person" and was apprehended and jailed at Morristown, NJ; by taking the required oaths of allegiance 30 July and 14 Aug 1777, he was discharged and sent home. After his property was confiscated, the family moved to New York City, and during the Evacuation in 1783, sailed for Nova Scotia. They settled there at Granville and in 1784 received from the British Government a grant of 250 acres in Clements Township, Annapolis County, Nova Scotia. They returned to New Jersey probably as early as 1787.

John was an Ensign in a Bergen County Militia company commanded by Capt. Abraham A. Haring in June 1779 of the American Revolution. He was among a group of 12, including Capt. Abraham Haring, who were captured 23 Mar 1780 by the British on an invasion into the Hackensack, Bergen Co. area. He was imprisoned in New York City and was not released until June.

They lived on Schraalenburgh Road in what is now Haworth, Bergen Co., NJ.

In 1773 he built a homestead on land inherited from his grandfather, in present Haworth, Bergen Co., NJ. This homestead is thought to have stood near the road, probably about the site of today's 265 Schraalenburgh Road. He was a farmer and merchant, probably conducting some sort of store near his home. In May 1796 he sold his homestead and farm to his uncle David and he bought 2 farms (with 2 homesteads) comprising several tracts of land on both sides of Tenafly Road in present Tenafly from John S. Banta and Direck Banta. John lived in the house on the west side of Tenafly Road and also had a saw mill by the brook on the part of the land east of present Engle Street.

He was elected a Freeholder for Hackensack Township in 1797 and served through 1815.

John Durie was a farmer, and after his first marriage, probably lived on his father-in-law's farm in present Woodcliff Lake. He then moved to Bergen Township in Hudson County, NJ by 1797, then about 1803, about the time of his second marriage, returned to Bergen County and lived on his mother-in-law's farm in Montvale. By 1813 he was back in Bergen Township, where he subsequently bought property.

John Duryea enlisted in the War of 1812 and was appointed a Corporal in the 83rd Infantry of Rockland County under Lt. Col. Benjamin J. Gurnee and Capt. Jacob J. Blauvelt, and served in the forts in New York harbor. He received a land bounty of 40 acres.

John Duryea was a farmer. They lived on land he received from his father by deed of 24 Nov 1825 covering 12 acres along the north side of present North Avenue and the west side of South Pascack Road, partly in Rockland County, NY and partly in Bergen County, NJ. On 11 Jan 1826, he received a deed from his brothers for lands totaling 50 acres lying in both states. He built a house on the NJ portion at the site of present No. 33 North Avenue in Montvale. His house was later destroyed by fire and replaced by another built on the same foundation.

John and Martha joined the Pascack Reformed Church 25 Aug 1833 where he served as Deacon and Elder between the years 1835 and 1857. He also served as Bergen County Freeholder for Washington Township in 1850-51.

John Durie was a carpenter and later speculated in real estate. During his first marriage he lived on the north side of East Madison Avenue in Dumont, Bergen Co., NJ on 5 acres acquired from his mother and her trustee by deeds 30 Dec 1843 and 31 May 1859, on which he built a house. This property was sold 25 Feb 1865, together with other lands owned by his mother and her trustee, to David D. Blauvelt.

John and his second wife had moved to Hackensack by 3 July 1864, when their membership was transferred from the Dumont Church to the Hackensack Church. There they lived on the south side of Essex Street until 1868. They subsequently lived at #18 and #52 Caroline Street, Newark, NJ, until 1871, and then moved to a farm of 54 acres in the Macopin area of West Milford Township in Passaic County. This was sold the next year in exchange for properties in Paterson and Manchester Township in the same county. They were living on another farm in Franklin Township, Bergen County, by 1874 and then moved to Jersey City in Hudson County the following year. There John was appointed administrator of his mother's estate 18 Oct 1875. They returned to West Milford Township to a farm of 30 acres, purchased 25 March 1882 from Conrad Vreeland, which was sold in 1887.

They subsequently lived in Lodi Township in Bergen County, where John had title to land from his uncle James Durie, and where Catharine died at an unknown date. She was buried there with her first husband.

John died in West Milford Township, while living there with his daughter Candace. His will was made 24 Aug 1892 and was probated in Paterson. He left a gold watch, chain and locket to granddaughter Sarah Emma Mabee. The remainder of the estate was left to son-in-law George Mabee.

Peter Duryea was a farmer. About the time of his first marriage he was given by his father 6 acres of land at the southeast intersection of Pascack and South Pascack Roads in the Town of Ramapo, Rockland Co., NY, on which he built and resided in the house now #706 South Pascack Road, at the corner of the roads. On 24 Nov 1825, he received a deed from his father for this property, paying a consideration of \$300. After their father's death, Peter and his brothers exchanged deeds 11 Jan 1826 by which he received 48 acres lying on both sides of the South Pascack Road adjacent to the 6 acres already owned, including the father's homestead and rented the smaller house. On 7 Nov 1831, he purchased from John J. Post for \$727, a tract of 24-1/2 acres adjoining his land on the east.¹

Hannah inherited 20-1/4 acres of land on the south side of the present Grand Avenue in Park Ridge, Bergen Co., NJ, in the division of her father's estate in 1822.¹

In their (2) marriage record published in *The Christian Intelligencer* 22 Nov 1834, they were: Mr. Peter Duryea to Miss Maria Perry.²

Maria inherited over 20 acres of land and her father's homestead at #134 River Vale Road in Park Ridge, by her father's will and a division of his lands in 1845. She and Peter lived on this farm.¹

The small house at #708 South Pascack Road in Rockland Co., NY was evidently sold to nephew John A. Duryea, perhaps around the time he married in 1843, by an unrecorded deed. The homestead farm of 71.75 adjoining was conveyed to son Peter doe a consideration of \$3100 by deed 25 March 1858.¹

Ralph Durie was a house carpenter and cabinetmaker. After he married, he and his wife lived with his parents at Tenafly, Bergen Co., NJ where their first child was born (who was named for his great-great-grandfather, James Ackerman, then living in New York City). They subsequently moved to 122 Hammond Street (later West 11th Street), New York City, with Ann Eliza Demarest Durie's sister Cornelia, mother of William Henry Blauvelt, who married Ralph's sister Jane.

In 1860 they returned to Tenafly to live in a house built for them on the east side of Tenafly Road at the northwest corner of his father's farm. They took title to this property 21 February 1861, and returned it to his father by deed 16 January 1865.

They then moved to a farm of 46 acres along Orangeburgh Road North in Old Tappan, the land lying partly in Bergen County, N.J. and partly in Rockland County, N.Y., purchased 13 February 1865 by Samuel R. Demarest from Jane Ann (Haring) Blauvelt and her husband. At his death in 1872 and by his will made 3 February 1870, the farm was entailed to Ann Eliza, plus the income on a trust of \$9,000. during the lifetime of her husband.

Ralph and his father built the Closter Reformed Church in 1862, and he built in 1892 at a contract price of \$3,450, the original Grammar School in Hillsdale which stood on the east side of Magnolia Avenue. He also built a number of houses in the "Northern Valley" towns, including Tappan, N.Y., and a tenant house now at #302 Orangeburgh Road North, on the farm.

In 1912 they rented the farm and went to live with daughter Martha on Closter Dock Road, in Closter, N.J., where Ralph died 21 February 1914.

The homestead at Old Tappan, together with about 15 acres on the south side of the road, were sold to John Korsmeyer 18 April 1917. The remaining land on the north side, plus the adjoining part in Rockland County, N.Y., were sold in June 1917 to James Uprichard.

He was a farmer and probably at one time a miller. He lived at present Harrington Park, then in present Oradell, Bergen Co., NJ until 1767 when he sold his land to his brother Daniel, and he and his family migrated to York (now Adams) County, PA in company with his cousin Samuel Demarest and his children. They traveled to the Bedminster area of Somerset County, NJ; then to Conewago in York County, PA; then, about spring of 1778, to the Shepherdstown vicinity of Berkeley County, Virginia (in what is now Jefferson Co., WV); and then to KY.

He may have later located in Ontario, but was back in the United States before 1795.

Catriena received 40 acres of land on the west side of Spring Valley Road in present Montvale, Bergen Co., NJ as her share of her father's farm, and she and Samuel lived there until their deaths.
