The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, dated 29 Jan 1753, probated 14 Feb 1764, he wrote...I, Abraham Duryee, of Bushwick, Kings County. I order all debts paid, also my funeral expenses to be well paid by my executors. I leave to my wife Elizabeth the use of 1/2 my lands, meadows, and buildings during her widowhood, and so much of my movable estate as she thinks convenient to keep house with. The rest of movables I leave to my children. I leave to my son, Joost Duryee £20 for his birthright. I also leave to my sons, Joost, Daniel, and Abraham £191 15 s. each. Then I give to my daughters, Nelche, wife of John Terhune, and Mateneche, wife of Jacob Boerum, each £95. I leave to my son Johanes all my lands, meadows, and buildings, and he is to pay to my sons and daughters the sums above named; to pay £150 of the same yearly to my sons "as they are set down," until they

are paid, and £95 a year to my daughters until they are paid. My son Johanes is to have the choice of my wagons and tools. I make my wife and my sons, Joost and Daniel, executors. Dated January 29, 1753. Witnesses, Daniel Rapalye, Thomas Edsall, Philip Edsall. Proved, February 14, 1764.

In his will, dated 4 Dec 1751, proved 3 Sep 1753, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen, I, Charles Duryee, of Bushwick, in Kings County. I leave to my wife Mary, "in whom I am well pleased," £140, and all the household goods that she brought in my possession when I married her, and she shall dwell for one year in my house with my children. I leave to my eldest son, Jost Duryee, £5 for his birth right. I leave to my son Johanes, and to all the rest of my sons and daughters now unmarried, £30 each, for an outset, as the other children have had when they were married. I leave to my son Jacob the farm or settlement where I live, that is, all that piece of land that lies before my door, bounded north east by Simon Duryee, south east by Andries Stockholm, south west by Nicholas Fulkerston, north west by the road; And also the piece of land where my house and barn stands, with both orchards, bounded southwest by Nicholas Fulkerston, and all round by the meadows, and north east by

Simon Duryee; Also the meadow called the Cow Vly, and 1/2 my meadow next to Cow Vly, to be divided by a straight line across the meadow from the upland to the mill pond; Also 1/2 of my wood land that lies in the Hills, and 1/2 of my wood land that lies in my land between Abraham Duryee's and David Van Cott's lands. And he shall pay £800 to my three eldest sons, Jost, Johanes, and Charles, and to my three youngest sons, Dirck, Abrahams, and ~~Thims~~ [corrected to Theunis Duryee], and to my three daughters, Helena Van Zandt, Cornelia, and Elizabeth. I leave to my son Charles 4 acres of the other half of my meadow joining to the meadow of my son Johanes, and he is to pay £6 for the same. I leave to my son Jacob my cows, wagon, and plow. My executors are to sell all the rest of my estate and divide the proceeds among my children. I make my friend and nephew, ~~Abraham Schack~~ [corrected to Abraham Schenck], and my sons, Johanes and Jacob, executors. The will is signed by Charles and Mary Duryee. Dated December 4, 1751. Witnesses, Petrus Lott, Gabriel Duryee, ~~Gabriel Strong~~ [corrected to Gabriel Sprong]. Proved, September 3, 1753.

In his will, dated 1 April 1781, proved 30 July 1781, he wrote: To all Christian People to whom these Presents Shall come or in any way concern: Know ye, that I, Joost Dereay, of the Township of Oysterbay in Queens County, yeoman, being this first day of April, 1781, in but a weakly state of health, but mind and understanding quick and good and well. I order my executors to fully pay all my just debts and funeral charges. I leave to my well-beloved wife, Willimpey Dereay, two of my best beds and full furniture, my best horse and riding chais, my cupboard, two tables, looking glass and household furniture of all sorts and all kinds that is in my house (sufficient to furnish her for housekeeping), with sufficient meat and bread corn to last her one whole year after my decease; with two of my best swine, and the use and profits of all my lands which my son, George Dereay, leased to me and my wife. Unto my wife £200; to be paid her by my executors within three months after my decease. All which is to her free disposal. Unto my daughter Willimpey the next choice of my beds and full furniture; and £30; to be paid her within four months after my decease. Unto my grandson George, son of Jacob Dereay, £10; to my grandson Rulof, son of John Dereay, £10; all current money to be put on interest until they arrive at lawful age. Unto Nealey Noostrand, £20. Unto my son George one shilling Right of Land in the Common in the Township of Hempstead, which I bought of James Pearsall of Huntington. Likewise unto my son George twenty-one acres of plain land, which I bought of Jonathan Pratt, situated in Oysterbay Plain, with all my "Wites" of land whatsoever that is not already given away. Unto my son Charles 5 shillings; which makes, with what I have before given him, his full share of my estate. My executors are to sell all my estate not already disposed of, and divide the proceeds in the following manner. Unto my son George four eleventh parts; to my grandchildren (children of my son John, deceased), two eleventh parts, to be put on interest until they come to age, to my three grandsons (sons of Jacob, deceased), two eleventh parts, to be put on interest until they come of age; unto my daughter, Mary Bennet, one eleventh part; unto my daughter Willimpey one eleventh; unto my son-in-law, Garret Noostrand, the interest of one eleventh part, as long as he liveth, and, provided my daughter Cornelia should have lawful children, then the principal shall be divided between such children. In case my daughter should live to be a widow, I give the one eleventh part to her free disposal. I also give to Nelas a Lawfull Bond I have against her husband, Garret Noostrand, dated ye twenty-first of March, 1781. Condition of one hundred pound, fourteen shillings, three pence, to be paid them when they arrive to lawful age, and the interest yearly paid to their mother, Nealey Noostrand. In case that Nealey should not have lawful issue and should decease before her husband, Garret Noostrand, then I direct that her eleventh part and the money due on Noostrand's bond be equally divided into six parts, George Dereay to have two parts; John Dereay's children to have one part; Jacob Dereay's children to have one part; Willimpey Dereay to have one part; and Mary Bennett one part. I make my friends and neighbor, John Wortimon, Willits Kirby, Gabrial Dereay, and Abraham Monfoort, executors. Witnesses, Isaac Wright, George Montfort, John Wright (yeoman). Proved July 30, 1781.
