

-- **DUTCHER, DUYTSE** --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Barent de Duytscher became Tarrytown Dutch Church Deacon. 21 Aug., 1706-8; Elder in 1718, 1722, 1737, and a frequent godparent. His cattle mark was recorded 2 April, 1717 (Westchester Co., Liber E). In 1719 he was collector for Philipsburg Manor, and his house, near the old (Boston) Post Road, Broadway, was known as the Dutcher Place, and is so mentioned in laying out the old Post Road (Broadway). In 1732, he was assessed at £31 with his sons Johannes, and David. In 1742, either he, or his son Barent, was chosen one of the Philipsburg Manor Fence Viewers. On 3 Aug., 1751, "Barent Duytscher" was buried at the N. Y. Dutch Church, and may have been our Barent. On 23 May, 1749, a "Barent Deduyster," on payment, had been admitted Freeman of New York City (1885 N. Y. Hist. Soc. Coll., 166)¹

Barent Duytser was a Deacon in the Tarrytown Ref Ch in 1754.

In his will, he wrote: I, Barent Dutcher, of the Manor of Philipsburgh, in Westchester County, being in tolerable health. I leave to my son Isaac £25. To my daughter Rachel £10, and the best bed I have, with the furniture. My executors are to sell all the rest, and divide among my son Isaac and my daughter, Mary Monson, and my daughter, Catharine Barnes, and my daughter Rachel. I make James Hammond and William Dutcher, executors. Dated June 8, 1772. Witnesses, William Paulding, John Oakley. Proved, December 31, 1772.

He probably lived in or near Salisbury, CT. In 1728 Christopher was witness to his father's appointment as brander of horses. The 3rd Wednesday of May, 1737, twenty-five Salisbury Proprietary rights were sold, and Christopher Dutcher was a purchaser (Hist. of Litchfield, Conn., 547). 12 April, 1739, the first meeting of proprietors was held, Christopher being present, and 19 Dec., 1739, Canaan, Litchfield Co., Conn., was incorporated and the first meeting adjourned to Christopher's house (Id., 267, 268). The Canaan proprietor's book shows the allotment, Nov., 1739, of 55 acres to Christopher. In 1740 his commission as Ensign of the Company or Train Band of Canaan issued (Conn. Col. Records, VIII, 333). In 1742 he was taxed on £9.5.0, at Weatogue. 11th April and 2d May, 1742, the Canaan Town Meeting was held, and adjourned to Ensign Dutcher's (Litchfield Co. Hist., 268). 2 July, 1754, Richard Baldwin, for £62 conveyed 29 1/2 acres on the Housatonic River, adjoining Christopher's house-lot to him.

His will, proved 15 Sept., 1755, mentions his widow, his son Relof "under 21," and his daughters "Joannekee" and "Arkyonekee," wife of Wm. Whitney of Salisbury. 24 July, 1758, his widow and son Roelof signed an agreement as to the estate of Christopher's father, Roelof. "Christopher's Canoe Place" was an old Weatogue boundary (Hist. of Litchfield Co., 522).

After Roelof's death, his widow m. Aug., 1808, Col. and Judge Joshua Porter (Yale, 1754) of Salisbury, Conn., by whom she had no children. Roelof Dutcher, Jr., of Conn., laborer. May 1st, 1760, aged 22, enlisted as volunteer out of Capt. Winna's Co. to that of Capt. Van Veghten (Vechten), Albany, N. Y. Height 5 ft., 5 1/2 inches, fair complexion, blue eyes, brown hair (1897 N. Y. State Hist. Report, 2, 553). 1768, the commission of Mr. Ruluff Dutcher as Cornet of the troop of Horse, 14th Conn. Reg., was issued (Conn. Col. Records, Vol. 13, p. 97). In 1769 Ruluff "Dutcher," et al, of the North Ecclesiastical Society of

Canaan, living in the middle of the town, petitioned to be annexed to the South Society to save long journey and expense in attending public worship (Episcopalian), and to determine the probable building of a South Church (Id., Vol. 13, p. 155). Roelof became Captain in the Revolution in the 5th Conn. Reg. Light Horse, and later of the Militia Co. raised to repel the enemy at New Haven in 1779 (Records, State of Conn., 1776-78, Vol. I, p. 37?; Conn. in the Rev., 444, 476, 482, 548; Coll. of Conn. Hist. Soc., VIII, 211). The regiment, Major Sheldon's, accompanied Washington on his retreat through New Jersey. Roelof willed his old homestead, built in the Dutch style, to his son Roelof, with his farm, about 300 acres, on the Canaan side of the Housatonic. His farm on Salisbury side he willed to his son (Captain) John Ashley Dutcher. Will dated 20 Oct., proved 28 Nov., 1803 (Sharon, Conn.). In the 1790 U. S. Census he appears (Conn., 59) as head of a household of 7, with 7 slaves, in Litchfield Township and County, Conn.

Cornelis, in an affidavit on 17 Oct., 1722, gave his age as about 55 years, or born about 1667. His wife was therefore at least 12, and probably 14 years, his senior, which explains his having only one child by her. On 10 March, 1693, he and his wife mortgaged to Wm. Fisher land at Mombaccus, formerly of Wm. de la Montagne (Ulster Co. Deeds, A. A., 120).

On 20 Jan., 1712, Cornelis and his daughter Margaret were sponsors to a child, Cornelius, of his wife's daughter Eva (K., 2018). In 1715, he was private in Capt. Johannes Vernoooy's Co., Ulster Co. (1897 N. Y. State Hist. Report, 1, 558). On 9 Nov., 1719, he was mentioned in a petition reciting the trespass on his and other's lands at Wayhackaneck, on the Little Minissing Creek, Orange Co., by the Swarthouts (Cal. of N. Y. Eng. Dirck was one of the twenty-seven men detached from the Ulster County Militia for the defence of Albany (Clearwater's Ulster County, 89). This indicates he was then at least 16 years old, or born before 1675, as boys joined the militia, generally at about 16 years of age. On 17 June, 1692, "Dirck Duytcher" was private in Major Peter Schuyler's Company. Ulster County (1896, N. Y. State Hist. Report, 1-415). In 1715 he was in the same regiment, Col. Jacob Rutgers, with his brother, Cornelis de Duytcher, but in the company of Capt. Johannes Shepmoes (Id., 1-560).

On 20 Jan., 1714-5, he was assessed in the town of Hurley on I40 (Clearwater's Ulster Co., 67). Moving to Dutchess County, he was, April, 1722, elected Surveyor of the Farm Fences for the North Ward (Smith's Rhinebeck, 45), which extended from Pawling's Purchase to the north end of the county, a position also held by his brother Barent. In 1723 he was assessed on £11.11.0 (Id. 45-46). An old map is said to show his home, near Plymouth Hill in the north part of Dover (Reed's Amenia, 22).

He and wife Geertje Cornelis lived in Flatbush until 1675, then moved to Ulster County.

On 1 Sept. 1689, Jan appears as "ye duitcher" in Ulster Co., N. Y., and took the oath of English allegiance (Hist. Ulster Co., 69). "Jan Willemszen" with the subsequently notorious Aert Peterszen Tack, 5 Aug., 1660, purchased of Johanna de Laet, widow of Jan de Hulter, and wife of Hieronymus Ebbinghs of Hamburg, 48 morgens, 2 rods of land at Esopus, for 600 guilders, payable in three annual instalments in grain and beavers (Pearson's Rensselaerwyck, 276-7). Jan Willemszen made his mark. Tack, 14 Aug., 1661 (K., 7), appears in Kingston, and "Jan Willemszen" the same year (1897, Holl. Soc., 131). Burhan's Genealogy, p. 2, mentions an unconfirmed statement of the late Jonathan W. Hasbrouck that in 1663 "Jan Willemszen and his wife" in court at Kingston referred to Jacob Burhans as capable of testifying to their good character, as he came from their town Einigen in Brabant. On 18 Sept., 1663, "Jan Willemszen" was fined for venturing outside the Kingston stockade, without a guard, in violation of the decree made after the Indian massacre of 7 June, 1663. On 14 Sept., 1673, "Jan Willemszen" was lieutenant under Capt. Matheis Mathysen at Kingston (N. Y. State Hist. Rept., 1-383), and 1686-7 "Jan Willemszen" was corporal under the same captain, with "rullof Johnson" as a private (id. 2-451), and in 1687 "John Williamson" with "Barend a holender" (? Barent de Duytscher, 11), were "fottmen" in Capt. Tomes (Thomas) Gersones' Co. (id. 2-449).

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Margaret Dutcher, , of Phillipsburgh, in Westchester County, widow. I leave to my sisters, Altie and Rebecca, all my apparell. According to *Sweet and Alien Land*, by Van der Zee [New York: The Viking Press, 1978], Chapter, 'Law and Disorder,' p. 356, [Stuyvesant] was equally strict about adultery, and punishment was harsh, as Ytie Jansen found out. This young Dutch woman had lived with an Englishman, Jan Parcel, at the request of her husband, who himself preferred a certain Geesje Jansen. Despite these mitigating circumstances the court sentenced her to be whipped and banished. When Ytie and Jan -- "two sorrowful sinners" -- appeared two weeks later in court to ask for permission to marry, the magistrates were unrelenting and gave them three months to pack, telling them to "separate from each other at once." It is almost certain that Ytie never had to undergo the whipping. In New Netherlands -- unlike New England -- this sentence seldom got further than a symbolic flogging in the case of women, which meant that the offender was led to the stake, partly stripped, and given two rods on her hands, after which she was untied and banished."

On 23 March, 1663, Rolof Willamszen "van Heerden," at Beverwyck, later Albany, sold to Geurt or Gerrit Hendrickszen a lot with a cellar and the shed over it, for 275 guilders in see-want (Pearson's Rensselaerwyck, 320), and the day before he borrowed 504 fl. (\$100.80) from Hend. Hendricksen, at 10%, repayable in July (Albany, Index to Public Records). On 23 Sept., 1663, Roelof Willemszen and Willempje Thyssen, his wife, both from Beverwyck, became Brooklyn Church members (1897, Holl. So., 136, 138).²

On 23 Sep 1663, Roelof Willemszen and Willemken Thyssen, with an attestation from Beverwyck, joined the Brooklyn Ref Ch.¹

Willempje Thyssen m. (2) before 1674 as his third wife, **Jan Corneliszen Buys**, widower, son of Cornelis Buys of Buninck, and Hendrickje Janszen Damen, sister of the Jan Janszen Damen so prominent in early New York, who adopted Jan Buys as his son.

In the Kingston Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were: Roelof de Duytser, j.m., born in Mormelt [Marbletown], and Jannetje Bresie, j.d., born in Albanien, and noth resid. in Kingstouwn.

About 1720, Roelof Duyster with his family, removed in company with the Van Deusen and White families, and settled in that part of the town of Salisbury, Connecticut, then called Weatogue. His house was on the Cornwall road and being of stone

was used as a garrison house during the Indian troubles. A large family of children was born to Roelof and Jannetje Duyster and baptized at Kingston before 1720.

In July, 1711, before his migration to Weatogue, he was enrolled as a member of the Ulster county regiment commanded by Captain Ten Broeck and was a private in the Independent Company of the Manor of Livingston, November 30, 1715. After leaving Ulster county he resided at Dover Plains, then a part of Livingston Manor, and in 1714 a list of inhabitants shows his family consisted of one male over 16, three under 16, two females over 16, one under, and one slave. His name and that of his wife appear as late as July 26, 1722, on the records of the Dutch church at Kingston, as witnesses at the baptism of their grandchildren. In the deed dated August 29, 1720, when Roelof Duyster bought his farm in Salisbury, he is called of Weatogue and it is said the land purchased in Salisbury was then supposed to be within the borders of New York. He died a large landowner,

His will was probated 9 June 1737. He signed by making his mark.

In 1739, his sons, Henry, Christopher, Roelof, John, Gabriel, Cornelius, and the "Widow Dutcher" were on tax lists at Salisbury. Roelof's property was not distributed until July 24, 1758, when an agreement of heirs was signed by the sons Roelof, John, Cornelius; Herty, widow of Christopher; Gabriel, who received the homestead, and the children of Christopher who were then living in Canaan, Connecticut.

William Dutcher was prominent as a captain in the Revolution, and raised a volunteer company. He was commissioned as Captain 1775, with Daniel Martling and Geo. Monson as his First and Second Lieutenants.²

In his will, dated 9 Oct 1794, probated 23 Dec 1794, William Dutcher, of Greensburgh, farmer, devised that farm and stock [etc.] be kept together for the support and bringing up of family under direction of wife ----; mentioned sons John, William, Salem, Deliverance and Daniel all under age. two daus., Mary and Jemima; a "sloop, now in the Albany trade," to be sold. Executorts, wife ---- and son John Dutcher. Wit. George Comb, Jacob Vantassel, Abraham Acker.¹
