The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Evert Duyckinck was a portrait painter. Born 1621. Came to New Amsterdam in 1638 from Borchten (Borken), a village in North Brabant, Holland. He is described as a limner, painter, glazier, and burner of glass. In 1640, in the service of the West India Company, he was stationed at Fort Hope (near present Hartford, CT).

In 1693, he painted the portrait of Stephanus van Cortland, who had been mayor of New York City in 1677.¹

A grant was made in 1643 to Evert Duyckinck of a plot of land behind the meadow ground of the West India Co., also land on Prince's Street, and on the east side of the graft (canal).²

In the marriage record they were: Evert Duycking, j.m. Van Borken, en Hendrickje Simons, j.d. Van Noordthorn.

Evert & Hendrickje were living in 1649 and for many years after on Hoogh Street (later Stone Street, near William), Isaac Bedlow and Christopher Hiighland living on either side of him.²

[Contract] Evert Duyckinck engages Cornelis Jansen from Rotterdam as an apprentice for the term of eight consecutive years, commencing on the first of Mar A], 1657, during which time the above mentioned Evert Duyckinck is bound to bring up the said Cornelis Jansen and to provide him with food, drink, necessary clothing, lodging, washing, etc.: also, to teach him the trade of a glazier or such [other] trade as Evert can and to have him taught reading and writing. The guardians must pay the school money. During the aforesaid time the said boy must remain in the service of Evert Duyckinck and show him proper respect, as an apprentice is bound to exhibit toward his master. Thus done and signed the 6th of October A], 1648, in New

Amsterdam. Everdt Duyckinck. [wit? guardians?] Jan Jansz Damen, Oloff Stevensz. In my presence, Jacob Kip, clerk of the secretary, 1649 9 3. Cornelis Jansen was an orphan lad whose parents had been killed by the Indians at their farm at Sapokanican (the later Greenwich)[Greenwich Village], in the war of 1643. Their three children, aged respectively four, three, and one years of age, at that time, were received into different families in the town.

Evert Duyckinck was appointed Fire Warden in 1674, and admitted as Freeman of the New York City in 1698. In 1698 he and Alderman Provost were appointed to supervise the repairs of the public buildings.

Gerardus Duyckinck was a portrait painter. He was admitted as freeman of NYC in 1731, and there described as a limner.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Gerardus Duyckinck, of New York, "limner," being in good health. I leave to my eldest son Gerardus £5, in full bar as heir at law. I leave to my wife Johana the use of all real and personal estate during her widowhood to bring up and maintain our children, and after her death all estate to all my children [not named]. My executors may sell real estate. If no children should survive, then I leave all my estate to my sisters, Hendrike and Mary. I make my wife and my brothers in law, David Abeel and David Van Brugh, merchant, executors. Dated April 4, 1741. Witnesses, Thomas Niblott, Josiah Milliken, Richard Ray. Proved, January 14, 1756.
