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The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Born a slave, he bought his freedom in 1806 from Jacob Concklin. He bought, on 7 Jan 1806 a plot of land at what was then [Harrington Township?], at what became known as the Skunk Hollow community in Alpine.

On 7 January 1806 (recorded 14 June 1806, Bergen Co. Y:86) Peter Quidor and Mary, his wife, of the County of Essex, conveyed to Jack Earnest of the County of Bergen, for \$87.50, 5 acres, 30 square rods, including the road, in the Township of Harrington, bounded N and E by Peter Quidor, Sr.; S by lot no. 19; W by lot no. 13. On 18 Nov 1841 Jacke fell asleep "before the fire." He awoke as his clothing caught fire, and he ran outdoors, but before he could get his clothing off, he was mortally burned. He managed to put on a great coat and went to the house of a black neighbor, John Cortright, who lived a quarter of a mile distant. He survived until the following day, and died in the afternoon of Friday, November 19, 1841.

Cornelius Wyckoff of Flatlands, Kings Co., in his will dated 4 April 1726, mentioned his daughter Margaret, and his son-in-law Hendrick Eldertson (named as executor).

In his will, he wrote: I, Hendrick Eldert, of Jamaica, in Queens County, Gent., being in health. I leave to my wife Tryntie the use of my dwelling house, barn, and garden, and part of my orchard, and two horses and my riding chair, and two cows, with feed for the same; Also sufficient provision, of meat, bread corn, and firewood, and £10 a year, and a negro woman, And all bonds and money and house furniture, and all things she brought when married. I leave to my eldest son Johanes £5 for his birthright. "My negro man Weenus is to choose which of my children he will live with." I leave to my sons, Johanes and Eldert, all my lands and meadows and messuages in Jamaica and Newtown, And they shall pay to my 5 daughters, Styntie, wife of John Munsey, Gertie, wife of John Stephens, Margaret, wife of Godfrey Kleyn, Ann, wife of Hendrick Emmons, and Mary, wife of Rem Van Cleff, £1,000. I leave the remainder of my estate to all my children. I make my sons, Johanes and Eldert, executors. Dated February 5, 1759. Witnesses, James Cebra, Benjamin Hinchman, Gent., JohnHinchman. Proved, December 12, 1768.

"Lucas Eldertszen, from Jever, was in New Netherland as early as 1643, when his name occurs in the records of the colony of Rensselaerswyck. He was in New Amsterdam 1646. In 1649 he was given power of attorney by Jan Lawrensen Appel to collect money due at South River, when he is called "the worthy Luycas Eldertszen from Jeveren." In 1654 a son of Eldertszen and his wife, Annetje Jans, was baptized in New Amsterdam, and a daughter in 1656. In 1657 we find him as laborer at the weigh house. In the same year he signed the petition of the Lutherans requesting that Rev. Goetwater be retained as Lutheran pastor. In 1661 he was in Beverwyck. His widow married, in May, 1666. Laurens Jansen Van Wormer, a Hollander. Eldertszen seems to have been a person of quiet disposition, though he often appeared in court."¹

Lucas Ellertsz (Luycas Elbertsen) appears but once in the records of the Rensselaerswyck colony, under the date of May 29, 1643, when his account is charged to Cornelis Teuniz, from Meerkerck. He was in New Amsterdam in June 1646 and in Beverwyck in 1661.³

Lucas Eldertszen (and variant spellings) appears 3 times in Calendar of Dutch Manuscripts edited by O'Callahan. These records are in the Council Minutes. The first record is in 1646 - on 7 June - court proceedings of Gysbert de Leuw vs Lucas Elbertsen [sic], for stating that plaintiff had been challenged by Gysbert Cornelissen to fight a duel with swords; defendant denies having said so, and declares he knows nothing of plaintiff but what is honest and honourable; will pay costs. He next appears on Oct. 20, 1649 with a power of attorney from Jan Laurensen Appel to "Lucas Eldertszen" to receive from Andries Hudde, and others on the South River, certain moneys due Mr. Hardenburgh. He is given another power of attorney on the 4 May, 1651 from Abraham Isaacsen Planck and Jan Snediger to "Luycas Eldersen" to collect the balance 'of the above note' [Certified copy of a note of David Davidsen in favour of Jan Snedeger, shoemaker, with a receipt for payment in part dated 4 May 1661].¹

To son Henry a set of silver waistcoat buttons. To my sister-in-law, Sarah Hart, a morning gown. To my God son, John Tudor, a mourning ring. To my God son, Joseph Huddleston, a silver spoon. To my God child, Mary Fromante, a silver spoon. Makes his wife executor. Dated May 13, 1693. Witnesses, Edward Graham, Alice Allison, Thomas Clark. Proved before Matthew Clarkson, July 3, 1694, and confirmed by Governor Benjamin Fletcher, July 4, 1694.

[NOTE.--The house and lot of Richard Elliot (or Ellet) has a curious history. In 1721 there was no known owner for the land, and by order of Governor Burnett an "Inquisition" was made before Gillet Livingston and a jury of prominent men. This elicited the fact that Richard Ellet, the former owner, was long since dead, and by what title he held the property was unknown. He left four sons, three of whom died without issue. The fourth son, Henry, "had gone to sea more than twenty years agoe," and had never been heard from since, and that the only owner was the said Henry who was doubtless dead. Mr. Thomas Clark had taken possession and had paid the taxes. Under these circumstances the Governor and Council adjudged that the premises had escheated to the Crown, and the Council "not knowing in any of our Colonies in America, a more Deserving and Learned Person in Divinity, History, Chronology and many other Parts of Learning, than our Loving Subject Lewis Row, minister of the French Church in our City of New York," they grant him the said houses and lots, August 23, 1723. Rev. Lewis Row died in 1750 and his heirs sold it to his son, Mr. Lewis Row, "gentleman," in 1751. He died within a year, leaving it to his wife, Affie, who married John Duyckinck. They sold the whole to James Perry of London and Thomas Hayes of New York, June 27, 1763. The western part of Delmonico's building on South William street stands on these lots, which originally were bounded south by Mill street. The lot was 38 feet wide and there were two houses on it.--W. S. P.]

tion of Derek Doran-Wood, online at Ancestry.com) "[My ancestor Maria Regina Ernest's] brother, Matthew Ernest, had many years [before 1741] left Mannheim without the knowledge of his parents. After a long time, he had written that he had come to America, had married a widow of great fortune (the widow of Jacob Sharpe, of Rhinebeck, New York) and was established as a merchant. In the spring of 1742, Mr. Ernest wanted [our ancestor John Jacob] Kemper to take command of a sloop he owned, or to buy one for himself, and ply up and down the Hudson between Rhinebeck and New York, a profitable business similar to what he had been employed in on the Rhine in Germany. His family could then stay in Rhinebeck, a German settlement, and have the advantages of a church and a school in their language. But by a singular obstinacy, John Jacob Kemper insisted on going back into the country, on the "Newland" he had heard so much about, to become a farmer. He had left Germany with this prospect, and nothing could divert him from this purpose. His ignorance of the English language probably made him diffident of engaging in a business carried on in that language. Finding him obstinately bent on his purpose, Mr. Ernest yielded and purchased for him a farm on the patent of Robert A. Livingston, on a lease of three lives, in that part of Dutchess County, now the town of Beekman, sixty miles below Rhinebeck and twenty from the Hudson. Christina Ernest remained with her brother and his family. Matthew Ernest continued to assist the Kempers by every means in his power. He visited them several times a year and brought them coffee, tea and sugar, sixty miles over almost impassable roads. He traveled on horseback with his saddlebags loaded with things for the family. In 1748 when Christina Ernest married John Wetzell of New York and removed there to live and Matthew Ernest removed to New York, these changes induced John Jacob Kemper to leave his farm. Mr. Ernest, on his last visit in the autumn, proposed that he sell the lease, quit the farm, and remove to a place he would provide them. Mr. Kemper, therefore, sold the lease, and in the spring of 1749, left the farm and the improvements of six years to the great regret of their kind neighbors who assisted them in getting to Rhinebeck where they could get a sloop down the Hudson to New York. By the sale of his lease, farm and implements, John Jacob Kemper was able to repay Matthew Ernest. [In 1753] Matthew Ernest, [by] then a prosperous merchant in New York, resolved to visit Germany in the hope of seeing his father once more. However, one month before his arrival in Mannheim, Pastor Ernest, our ancestor, had been burned at the stake for his religion. Matthew Ernest learned, too, of the fate of his sister, Susan, who had married and resided on the banks of the Rhine. By a sudden burst of a water-spout against a mountain in her neighborhood, a tremendous flood descended to the river, carrying death and destruction to all within its course. Her house was washed into the Rhine and the whole family perished. She was last seen standing at a door with an infant in her arms. Matthew Ernest did have the satisfaction of seeing his mother and his surviving sister, Catherine, who had married Christian Hoffman, and who with her husband and two sons returned with him to America. He brought workmen from Germany and established a glass factory six miles from New York, but this undertaking failed from the incompetency of the chief person employed, and Mr. Ernest consequently lost a great part of his fortune. When the Revolution began, Mr. Ernest entered into business in Philadelphia and when the British Troops came there, he put all his property and furniture on board a sloop to be taken up the Delaware River to Trenton, while he and his wife went by land. Instead of going to Trenton, the captain of the vessel went over to the British with all his possessions, and Matthew Ernest lost all his property except for the money he had with him. He settled in Morristown with friends until his death in 1780, three years after peace was declared [British surrender was in 1781]." By 1759 John Jacob Kemper returned to join Matthew Ernest in the mercantile trade. Together, the business continued to their mutual benefit.

A Bergen Country Road Return dated 20 Sep 1756 stopping a road that runs from Ramapogh to Hackensack through Marten Easterly's Land, and laying out a new road was recorded at the request of Marten Easterly. Landmarks cited for the new road were the line between Marten Easterly and John Ackerman (two rods from each land); land of Benjamin Oldis; stopping the road that runs from Campga atop the hill through Marte Easterly's Land; and have layed a four rod road from Peter Tibous at the waggon road; mud bridge; to said Ramapogh Road.¹

A "Gouda Easterly," probably a dau. of this couple, m. after abt. 1763, **Johannis Vreeland** (when Johannis was past 60 yrs. old). She was said to have been a native of Holland.
