The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Edward Earle came from Maryland (Calvert Co., probably) about 1673 and was of New York in 1676. A deed to Secaucus Island was granted him on 24 Apr 1678 (1676?).

Edward Earle was commissioned Justice of the Peace for Bergen County in 1684 and Assistant Judge of the Bergen Common Pleas in 1705; he was in 1694 a member of the House of Delegates, Under the Governor and his council.¹

Edward Earle's will is dated 16 May 1709, but not probated until 8 May 1712. On 29 Mar 1712, Hannah, his wife, was granted letters of Administration on Edward's estate, "His will having been by some underhand manner been taken from her possession and cannot be found." She was granted letters of administration 13 Jan 1717. It is said in the Earle Genealogy that their son, Edward secreted his father's will after his death in 1711 and tried to take possession of the Secaucus property as heir-at-law, but that though he caused his mother a great deal of trouble, he did not succeed.

In his will he wrote: The 16 day of May, in the 8 year of our Sovereign Lady Anne, over Great Britain, etc., Annoque Dom., 1709. In the name of God, Amen. I, Edward Earle, Sr., of the County of Bergen, New Jersey, being indisposed of body. I appoint my wife Hannah sole executor, and I leave to her all houses, lands, and tenements, during her life, and then to my son, Edward Earle, Jr., for life, and to his heirs male, and in default of heirs male, then to my next grandson and his heirs male, and in default of heirs male then to any other of my grandsons and their heirs male. And all the houses, lands, and tenements, now in possession of my son, Edward Earle, are to go to him, with the same succession as above. My personal estate is to go to my wife for life and then to the children of my son Edward. Witnesses, Martha Maupeson, Elizabeth Pinhorne, I. Pinhorne. Proved in New York, before his Excellency Robert Hunter, Esq., May 8, 1712.

24 Apr 1712 Bond of Hannah Earle, his widow, as administratrix of his estate. James Nuttman and Josiah Ogden, both of Newark, fellow bondsmen. 25 Mar 1712 Petition of Hannah, widow of Edward Earle, complaining that her son Edward interfered with her duty as executrix and claiming to be heir at law had taken to his own house property belonging to the estate, and defies the law. 16 May 1712 Order making Hannah, the widow, administratrix of the estate, until the will is produced, it having been taken out of her possession by underhand means.

John Montgomerie, Esq., Captain-General and Governor. Whereas, Marmaduke Earle, John Earle, Hannah Earle, wife of Stephen Bourdett, William Earle, Alice Earle, Thamasen Earle, wife of Gerritt Hallenbeek, Philip Earle, Theodosia Earle, Silvester Earle, and Nathaniel Earle, some of the children of Edward Earle, deceased, who was son of Edward Earle, Sr., late of

Secaucus, in Bergen County, New Jersey, and of Hannah his wife, have presented unto me their petition, stating that he made his will May 16, 1709, and therein made his wife Hannah executor, who divided a great part of the personal estate among her grand-children, and she died intestate, leaving divers goods, etc. And some of her grand-children having received more than their proper share, and the others little or nothing, at their request Letters of Administration are granted to Richard Edsall, January 14, 1730.

On 24 April 1676 he purchased the Secaucus Patent. He was Commissioner of Revenue in Bergen during the English and French War; appointed 20 Oct 1692 High Sheriff of Bergen County; constable in 1694-'95.

His will was dated 28 May 1713 Secaeket [Secaucus], Bergen County, NJ. In it he mentioned Wife Elshe. Sons--Edward and Enoch; daughter Hanah Stoutenburgh and apparently other children. Land upon the Island of Seecockes. Personal property. Son Edward sole executor. Witnesses--Mathyes Hoppe, Aantie Hoppe, Peter Stoutenburgh. Proved 27 Aug 1713.

On 1 September 1716, Edward and Elizabeth Earle, of Secaucus Island, conveyed to Henry Mayer of New Barbadoes Creek, on the Hackensack River...purchased by Edward Earle Sr., deceased who sold to his son the said Edward Earle in 1710...between line of Maj. Nathaniel Kingsland and Bartholomew LaFeurt of New York and land of Hendrick Juriaensen, Nicholas Kip and Thomas Francis...was purchased of Maj. John Berry of New York City...2nd tract purchased by Edward Earle Sr. in 1704...Kothawak River.¹

Deed, dated 27 Jan 1749 (Liber G2, folio 291), Between Edward Earle (3rd) of Cekakus, Bergen Co., first party; Wm. Smith, 2nd party; and John Lewis, 3rd party. Edward Earle (1st), grandfather of said Edward, party to these presents, by gus last will, dated May 16, 1709, did bequeath all his lands &c. to his wife Hannah, and at her decease to his son Edward, Jr. (2nd), and after his decease to his son Edward (3rd) and his heirs &c. Edward Earle (1st), the grandfather, the said Hannah, and the said Edward (2nd), the son, are all dead, and the grandson (3rd), party to these presents is entitled to the premises as Tenant in Tail.⁵

In his will dated 18 Oct 1750 (proved 12 May 1755, NJ Lib. F, p. 273) "Edward Earle, of Seacacoss, Bergen Co., gentleman" mentioned his children Edward, John, Philipp, Antlebee, Robert, Mary (wife of John Nelson), Elizabeth, Hester. Granddaughters Elizabeth Daves, Elizabeth Nelson. He mentions house and lot; plantation adjoining Reynier van Gezen on Hackensack River. Also mentions personal property. Executors named are son John Earle, brother William Earle, and kinsman Daniel Smith. Witnesses were William Earle, Morris Earle and James McKinley.²

An inventory of the estate was made 8 May 1755 by Philipp Smith and John Smith.²

In the m. license record, he is "Edward Earl" of Bergen Co., and she is "Claucy/Claassie Vreeland" of Essex Co.

On July 20, 1762 Edward Earle and Klaatje his wife "of Cecaucus, in the County of Bergen in the Province of East New Jersey" sold twenty acres of land facing forty rods on the Hackinsack River, metes and bounds, for five hundred and fifty pounds. The deed describes the tract as "being part of a larger farm on which Edward Earle, the grantor, now lives," and later on says: "Excepting and always reserving unto him, the said Edward Earle, the grantor, and to his heirs and assigns forever, all the residue and remainder of the said farm or plantation over and above the twenty acres hereby granted, whereon the said Edward, the grantor, now lives, and of which the said twenty acres is parcel, situate at Cecaucus, and bounded northerly by the farm of Philip Earle, easterly by the farm of Daniel Smith, southerly by the farm of Robert Lake, and westerly by the Hackinsack River, containing five hundred acres of land and meadow, more or less. "And also excepting and reserving to him the said Edward Earle, the Grantor, all that certain cedar swamp, situate at Cecaucus, bounded northerly by the swamp of Philip Earle, easterly by the swamp of Job and Daniel Smith, southerly by the swamp of Hartman Brinckerhoff and westerly by Vangeesers Mill Creek, containing twenty seven acres more or less. "And also excepting and reserving to him the said Edward Earle &c. that certain tract of salt meadow bounded northerly and easterly by the salt meadow of said Robert Lake, southerly by the salt meadow of said Philip Earle, and westerly by the Hackinsack River, containing one hundred acres more or less. "And further that he, Edward Earle, the grantor, hath not by any ways or means whatsoever, at any time heretofore aliened, sold, conveyed or given to any person whatsoever any part of the parcel of land hereinbefore described or of the common or undivided lands to which he was ever entitled in the County of Bergen.

His will was dated 2 Nov 1787, probated 25 Jan 1788. In it, he wrote: "In the Name of God Amen I Edward Earle of Sea-coakes in the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, Being weak in Body But of sound and perfect mind and memory Do make and publish this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following (That is to Say) First, I give and Bequeath unto my Son Richard Earle the Sum of five pounds Lawfull money of the State of New Jersey which Legacy or Sum of money I will and order shall be paid within Six months after my Decease, also I Give and Bequeath to my Dear wife Clase Earle the Negro wench Nan and her child Isabel to hold to her and her heirs and assigns for ever. Also I give and Bequeath to my wife one of the Best Rooms in my house During her Natural Life also I order that my Sons Richard Earle and John Earle shall Decently maintain my wife out of my freehold Estate During her Natural Life Also I give and Devise my Dwelling house and Barn to my Said Son John Earle to hold to him his heirs and assigns for ever Also I Give and Devise the little Seader Swamp to my Son Richard Earle to hold to him his heirs and assigns for Ever, Also I Give and Devise Seaven acres and a half of Cleared-up Land Lying next to and adjoining Daniel Smiths Land to my Said Son Richard Earle to hold to him his heirs and assigns for Ever, Also I Give one half of the fruit of my orchard for the term of ten years after my Decease to my Said Son Richard Earle or to his heirs or assigns. I, Also, Give and Bequeath three hundred pounds Lawfull money of the State of New Jersey to my Son Edward Earle and to his heirs and assigns for Ever, to paid to him out of my freehold Estate when he comes to the age of twenty one Years old, Also I give and Bequeath Eighty pounds Lawfull money of the State of New Jersey to my Daughter Sicilia the wife of Rodman feilds, Also, I Give and Bequeath Eighty pounds Lawfull money of the State of New Jersey to my Daughter Mary Earle Each to be paid out of my freehold Estate within Eight Years after my Decease Also; I give the Negro wench Bett to my Said Daughter Sicilia - the wife of Rodman fields, I give the Negro wench hager to my Said Daughter Mary to hold to them their heirs and assigns for Ever, Also, I give and Devise to my Said Sons Richard Earle and John Earle and to their heirs and assigns for Ever. All the Restidue and Remainder of my freehold Estate to be Devided Equeally Between them or their heirs or Assigns the one half to Richard Earle and to his heirs and Assigns for Ever and the other half to Said John Earle and to his heirs and assigns for Ever, that is to Say, the upland Shall be Devided in two Eequal parts the meadow Joining the upland shall be Devided in two Eequal parts the Large Seader Swamp Shall be Devided in two

Equeal parts and also the Salt Meadow shall be Devided in two Equeal parts the whole of the above Said Lands and meadows lying on Seacoakes, I Give and Devise the Southerly half of Said lands to my Said Son John Earle to him and his heirs and assigns for Ever, and I give and Devise the Northerly half of Said Lands to my Said Son Richard Earle to him and his heirs and assigns for Ever, Also, I give the Rest of my moveable Estate to my Said Daughters Sicilia and Mary to be equeally Devided Between them to their and Every of their heirs and Assigns. for Ever, also its my will, that my Said Sons Richard Earle and John Earle or their heirs Executors or Administrators shall pay the Before mentioned Legiceas that is two hundred and thirty pounds Each, I hereby appoint my two Sons Richard Earle and John Earle and Isaac Vangeson Executors of this my Last will and Testament hereby Revoking all former wills by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal the Seacod Day of November in the twelfth Year of Independence and in the Year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and eighty Seven (???) Signed, Sealed published and Declared by the a Bove Named Edward Earle to be his Last will and Testament in the presence of us who have here unto Subscribed our Names as Witnesses in the presence of the testator . Edward Earle (his mark). Job Smith, Enoch Smith, John Day. (Probated 23 Jan 1788.)

The following transaction may refer to his children and wife:

On 1 June 1792, John & Elsey Earle, Clausia Earle and Mary Earle, all of Bergen Corporation, conveyed to John Smith, farmer, of same place, for £1300, 189.5 acres...line of Daniel Smith and John Leake...bounded by Edward Earle. Signed by Edward Earle, Elsey Earle, Clausia Earle (her mark) and Elsey Earle (her mark). Witnessed by Job Smith, Byneon Earle.¹

In his will, dated 8 July 1768, probated 8 April 1774, Sylvester Earle mentioned wife Megtell; sons Joost and Edward; son John Erle; children of dau. Christina, namely Megtell, Maria, and Sylvester; daus. Fytie, Henne, and Elisabet; dau. Elsy Van Boskerk. Appointed brother-in-law Johannes Demarest, brother-in-law Albert Zabriskie, and friend David Banta. Witnessed by Johannes Bougart, Derrick Lozeyr, Derrick Banta.

Sylvester Earle of Hackensack stated in his will that his wife was to have the "management of the plantation where I live" while a widow. The eldest son, John, was given certain specific tracts of land and a silver watch, and the younger sons, Joost and Edward, each inherited one-half of the father's plantation. Three unmarried daughters, Fijtje, Hannah, and Elizabeth, were to have £100 each "and as good outset as my other two daughters had." The money for the three unmarried daughters was to be paid in New York currency by Joost and Edward Earle a year after their mother died "that is if she live so long that my son Edward Earle in one en Twenty year old else to pay a year after" Edward came of age. Sylvester Earle's daughter Elizabeth and son Edward were to be maintained out of the estate until they reached twenty-one. To the children of Earle's daughter Christina, deceased, were devised £25 which was to be paid them by their uncle, John Earle, when they reached twenty-one years, and the land "lying at Kwaksak." Daughter Elsie Earle Boskerk received five acres of woodland. (Bergen C. Wills, Liber L, 30)¹
