After their marriage Benjamin and Sophia Catherine lived on White's Pond in Waldwick.⁵

Benjamin Everson, 26, Farmer, and Sophia Everson, 25, were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township (Godwinville P.O.), Bergen County, NJ (probably in or near what is now Allendale-Waldwick area), enumerated 26 July 1860, Dwelling 407, Family 457 (all b. NJ) -- Benjamin Everson, 26, Farmer, value real estate 800, value personal estate 150; Sophia [Everson], 25; John [Everson], 5; Isaac [Everson], 2. They were listed just after the family of Jeramiah & Ellen Storm, and just before the family of John Van Blarcom.

Benjamin Everson was a Private in the Civil War. He served in the 33rd Regiment, NJ Vols., commanded by Capt. Westervelt. They marched from NJ to Tinleytown, a part of the District of Columbia, and wrote several letters, which were kept by his grand-daughter, Estelle Everson Hollbach, along with pictures etc., and letters to him from his wife, Sophia Courter, describing her efforts to keep the family farm going during his absence. He became ill with Typhoid Fever, while at Aquina Creek, in Stafford County, VA, and died at Belle Plains, VA Army Hospital on 21 Feb. 1864. Benjamin was attached to a medical unit while in the NJ Volunteers.⁵

Nothing is known of his place of burial, although we have papers covering the return, under Military Escort, of his body. He was brought home in the company of a Corporal, to NJ for burial. It seems likely that he lies beside his widow, Sophia, in the Courter family plot in Valleau Cemetery, Ridgewood. There is an occupied grave in the plot, with no marker.⁵

1864 15 February 1864 Matilda Everson and James Vreeland of Schraulenburg, Bergen County, NJ swore they saw Sophia C. Everson sign her name to forgoing declaration and further they knew Benjamin and Sophia C. Everson to be married and to have 3 children. They stated that Sophia C. Everson has not married since death of her children. Richard B. Westbrook of NYC appointed agent and attorney for Sophia C. Everson of Hohokus. It further states that she had three children and her husband died 23 Feb 1863 of Typhoid Pneumonia and she was applying for a Widow's Pension according to act of 14 Jul 1862. Admitted 17 Aug 1864 to a Pension of \$8 per month, commencing 23 Feb 1863. Signed Richard B. Westbrook, NYC, NY. C. M. Tompkins, Examining Clerk.⁵

1866 Application of Guardian of Minor Children in Order to Obtain Army Pension, Act July 14, 1862. 10 Jun 1866, appeared before me Jacob H. Blauvelt, Clerk, Levi Hopper age 63 guardian of children of Benjamin Everson. Witnesses were John J. Kiersted and W Blauvelt. Signed Levi Hopper. Affidavit of Witnesses Elias Folly and Abram Ackerman residents of Franklin and Hohokus Township, NJ, Bergen 17 Sep 1866, Sophia C. Everson resident of Hohokus aged 30 swore benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress, approved 25 Jul 1866. She states that she is registered at Paterson for \$8 pension #28.406. Elizabeth Pool and Matilda Everson said they knew Sarah 10 years and her husband about 7 years before his death.⁵

1867 7 Nov 1867 John E. ? Pastor of the New Prospect M. E. Church swears that 12 Oct 1865 bp children of Benjamin and Sophia Everson, they are John Everson b 24 Jul 1855, Isaac Everson b 27 Dec 1858, and Sarah Lizzie Everson b 24 Dec 1862. These dates are on church records and that Sophia has not since the death of her husband married and is still a widow and still cares for the above children. Signed J. E. Livingston. On the same sheet of paper it states Sophia C. Everson is applying for an increase of Pension # 28.406 in account of her husband, Benjamin Everson, dcd late Private Co D 22d NJ Vols. It names 3 children with date of birth. It mentions her post office as Hohokus, Bergen County, NJ. Also, on same sheet, it states that Sarah and Andrew Courter knew Benjamin and Sophia for lifetime. They were verifying facts stated about Benjamin and Sophia Catherine Everson. Signed Andrew his mark Courter and Sarah Courtier. (From the signatures it looks like Sarah Courtier is the mother of Sophia Catherine Everson.) Witnesses were Wm Hosney and M. O'Brien.⁵

apparently not accepted or recognized by her family, and by 1900 she was using her former married surname, Everson.

H. Lynch, Paterson, NJ and Wm High, Paterson, NJ, signed, John Bush, Justice of the Peace, Paterson, NJ, the foregoing copy is given under my hand and seal this 12 Jun 1876. Samuel R. Dean, Register of Vital Statistics. 12 Aug 1876, Sophia Folly states everything in her marriage certificate is correct except the spelling of her last name. It should be Everson and not Avison.⁵

26 Nov 1877 Maria and William I. Courter, Sophia and Elias Folly of Paterson, Andrew I. Courter, Leah Jane Courter, Sarah Ann Courter and James Henry Courter of Hohokus, Aaron and Maggie Courter of Franklin and Hohokus sell to Albert Lydecker for \$100 land in Hohokus on the Westerly side of the Hohokus Brook, Road to Campgaw by Martin Terhune and William Courter and Road to Paterson.⁵

Jan 1855, age 45, married 18 yrs., b. NJ, his parents b. Ireland, Lawyer; [Johnson], Elizabeth, Wife, b. Dec 1863, age 36, married 18 yrs., mother of 4 children, 2 children then living, b. NJ, her parents b. NJ; [Johnson], John, Son, b. Sep 1883, age 16, Single, b. NJ, his parents b. NJ, At School; [Johnson], Irene, Daughter, b. Sep 1892, age 7, b. NJ, her parents b. NJ, At School; Everson, Sophia, M. in Law, b. Dec 1836, age 63, Widow, mother of 0 children, 0 children then living [this is an obvious error], b. NJ, her parents b. NJ.

An obituary from an unidentified newspaper: Everson -- In this city, on Thursday, Feb 20, 1902, Sophia C. Everson, mother of Mrs. J. Johnson in her 66th year. Relatives and friends are invited to attend the funeral on Saturday, Feb. 22, 1902, from residence of her son-in-law, John Johnson, No. 38 Ward street, at 2:30 o'clock p.m. Interment private.

Cornelius Everson, 39, Farm Laborer, and Susan Everson, 41, were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township (Godwinville P.O.), Bergen County, NJ (probably in or near what is today the Waldwick-Allendale area). Listed with them were: Ellen Everson, 17; and James Everson, 14.

Cornelius Evason, 50, carpenter, and Susan Evason, 50, were listed in the 1870 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township (Ramsey P.O.), Bergen County, NJ. Living with them was Eugene J. Evason, 8.

He may have been the Cornelius Everson, 59, widower, who was boarding with Matilda Kinsey [widow of Israel Kinsey] in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ (in the area of what became Waldwick Borough) at the time of the 1880 Federal

Census.

It appears that Evert --?-- and Lysbeth Dircksen?? had at least three children: Volkert, Arent and Geertje who married Hendrick Pietersen van Wesel.¹

Lease (dated 14 May 1639) from Barent Dircksen to Gerrit Jansen and Volckert Evertsen of the bouwery called Walenstsein.²

September 11, 1639, declaration of Cornelis Leendertsen and others showing that Barent Dircksen sold his house and farm to Hendrick Pietersen: "Before me, Cornelis van Tienhoven, secretary in New Netherland, at the request of Hendric Pietersen from Hasselt, appeared Cornelis Leendersen, aged 24 years, Cors Pietersen, aged about 27 years, Hendric Westercamp, aged 26 years, Govert Loockmans, aged 22 years, and Pieter Loursensen, aged 24 years, who jointly declare, testify and certify, as they hereby do on their consciences, in place and with promise of a solemn oath if need be, that it is true and truthful that they, the deponents, on the 9th of November last, were at the house of Hendric Westercamp, baker, and there heard that Barent Dircksen, baker, had sold his farm where he lives, to wit, the aforesaid farm with all that is fastened by earth and nail, as it stands at present, to Hendric Pietersen from Hasselt, and that Barent Dircksen was to take away from the farm no more than his furniture and household stuff, with which he, Hendric Pietersen, and Barent Dircksen were satisfied, provided that that purchaser should pay to the vendor for what is above mentioned the sum of fourteen hundred and fifty Carolus guilders. All of which they, the deponents, declare to be true and truthful and that they state this without dissimulation or regard of person, only to bear witness to the truth. Done this 11th of 9ber Ao. 1639, in Fort Amsterdam. This is the X mark of Cornelis Leendertsen The is the X mark of Cors Pietersen Heinrich Westerkamp Govert Loockermans This is the X mark of Pieter Lourensen" (Page 244)²

March 15, 1642, will of Barent Dircksen van Norden and his wife: "· appeared Barent Dircksen from Norden* [and Lysbet] Dirckx, his lawful wife, residing [here] on the island of Manhatans in New Nether[land] · [24] do hereby make and conclude, their testament and disposition of last will · And whereas the institution of heirs is the foundation of all wills, without which no will can exist, he, the testator, declares and nominates Femmetje Alberts, his niece, [25] at present the wife of Hendrick Westercamp, to receive after his, the testator's, death, out of the estate left behind, the sum of two hundred Carolus guilders, after the payment of which neither she nor any other of his, the testator's, blood relations shall have any further claim, all other property which he, the testator, shall leave behind [being bequeathed] to [the aforesaid] Lysbet [Dircks]." [Footnote: "Norden, in East Friesland."] (Pages 23-26).³

Aug. 16, 1642, declaration of Jacob Jansen and others respecting stolen money: "Femmetjen Alberts, wife of Hendric Westercamp, at present in a state of pregnancy, at the request of Jacob Roy, gunner, attests, declares and testifies, in place and with promise of an oath if necessary, that it is true that she, Femmetjen Alberts, saw that Hans Nicols, while sitting in his house, before the arrival of the ship De Houttuyn, had in his hand a little lock and exhibiting a certain piece of bent iron said: 'I can easily open this little lock with it, whereupon he opened the lock, with these words, that he could open other locks with it also. All of which she declares to be true. Done the 16th of August Ao. 1642, New Netherland. This is the X mark of Femmetje Alberts Acknowledged before me, Cor. V. Tienh., Secretary" Page 63.³

May 9, 1643, declaration of Jacob Jacobsen Roy as to his debts: "· To Hendrick Westercamp, two hundred guilders · He declares that he owes the above and does not know of anything more. This 9th of May Ao. 1643, in the house of Jacob Roy, on the island of Manhattan, and in the presence of the undersigned witnesses." Page 126.³

May 19, 1643, will of Jacob Jacobsen Roy, gunner: "[Ja]cob Jacobsen Roy, gunner, laying sick in bed at the house of Hendric Westercamp, baker ·" Pages 130-131.³

Aug. 14, 1647, protest of Jan Laurensen Appel, attorney of Isbrant Dircksen Goethart, to the curators of the estate of the late Seger Tonissen for non-payment of a bond, with the answer thereto: Hendrick Jansz Backer served as witness in Fort Amsterdam in New Netherland. Pages Hendrick Jansz Backer served as witness in Fort Amsterdam in New Netherland. Pages 464-465.³

Volkert Evertsen, along with Ariaen Petersz and Vrouwtje Gerrits, witnessed the baptism 7 Sep 1640 NYC Ref Ch, of Pieter, son of Hendrick Pieterszen [Bras] & (1) Geertje Everts (no mother's name in bp. record; father's name: "Hendrick Pietersz.).

Volkert Evertzen later got a patent on Long Island near the land of Jacques Bentlyn.¹

"Before me, Cornelis van Tienhove, secretary in New Netherland, appeared Pieter Wyncoop, aged 24 years, who at the request of Leendert Arentsen declares, testifies and attests, as he hereby does, in place and with promise of a solemn oath if necessary, that it is true and truthful that he has heard Barent Dircksen, baker, say that one-half of the hay in the stack in front of the door belongs to Volckert Eversen, provided that he had also to pay one-half of the expenses, amounting to between 14 and 15 florins. Likewise, it is known to him, the deponent, that Leendert Arentsen has drawn some straw and chaff from said Barent Dircksen, without knowing how much. Done this 9th of March 1640, in Fort Amsterdam."²

Volkert died ca 1646 as Harmen Smeeman as the husband of Lysbeth, Volkerts mother, administered his estate. It names 'heirs' but that is all.¹

Cornelis Maeson or Maersen purchased, Oct. 24th, 1646, the plantation of Volckert Evertsen on the North river, adjoining the plantation of Wouter Van Twiller and Thomas ??.²

Aug. 26, 1651, power of attorney from Femmetje Albers to David Provoost to sue for a debt due her by Harmen Smeeman: "Femmetje Albers, wife of Hendrick Westercamp, appeared at the secretary's office and appointed Mr. David Provoost to demand in her name and as if she were present before the court of New Netherland by way of legal proceedings or other [294] proper and legitimate means from Harmen Smeeman who married the widow of Barent Dircksen from Norden the sum of two hundred guilders left and bequeathed to her, the principal, by will, as appears by the will dated the 25th of March 1642,* in the custody of the secretary according to the Register, and afterwards confirmed by his death; the principal promising that she will hold and cause to be held as valid whatever shall be done and performed in the matter aforesaid by David Provoost. Thus done and executed this 26th of August A.o. 1651, in New Amsterdam in New Netherland. This is the X mark of Femmetje Albers aforesaid, made by herself" [Footnote: "See Will of Barent Dircksen and his wife, dated March 15, 1642, in N.Y. Col. Mss, 2:13b.] Pages 293-294.⁴
