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The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Peter Fauconnier and Magdalene [Pasquereau] his wife, were naturalized in England, April 4, 1685, in company with Louis Pasquereau and Magdalene his wife, and their children Louis, Peter and Isaac.<sup>2</sup>

He was a merchant in London.

Peter and Madelaine Fauconnier were in New York as early as December, 1702, when they petitioned, with others, for certain lands on Staten Island. Fauconnier stood high in favor with governors Bellomont and Cornbury, and was not only advanced to important offices under the colonial government, but also obtained large grants of land from them. His course was severely criticised by the opponents of these governors.<sup>2</sup>

In 1703, in a census taken that year, his family was enumerated living in the West Ward: Peter Fauconnier, Master of the Family, three females, two male children, two female children, and two negroes, male and female.<sup>3</sup>

He was Receiver-General for the provinces of New York and New Jersey under Cornbury.<sup>3</sup>

He obtained large grants of land, including land in the Ramapo Tract in Bergen County, NJ, and also a patent of land in Rye, Westchester Co., NY. He also had rights in the following Patents: Three tracts in Westchester Co.; Westenhook; Minisink; Little Nine Partners; Paullin's Purchase; Oriskany; Kayaderosseras, alias Queens Borough; Half Hollow Kills; land in Ulster Co.; Shenondohowah, or Clifton Park; Vacancies in Kings Co.; Vacancies in Staten Island.<sup>3</sup>

In Rye, the name was changed to its English equivalent, Falconer.

Pierre Fauconnier was born 1659 in Toers, France, son of Jean Fauconnier and Madelaine DelaTouch. He married Madeleine Pasquereau and thereafter settled in England where they were naturalized on April 4, 1685 and where he was a merchant. The family came to America in 1702 with the suite of Lord Cornbury for whom Pierre was private secretary. He became involved in many land transactions, including a large interest in the Ramapo Patent and tracts in Emerson and Oradell. On April 10, 1745 he conveyed to Magdalen Valleau, his daughter, all real estate lying in the provinces of New York and New Jersey in satisfaction of a debt to Peter Valleau, his son-in-law, for 800 pounds, and as security for other debts. At the time of his death he lived on a farm at a locality known as "petersfield" in what is now Oradell, which was advertised for sale in 1758 and on which stood a large brick house 56 feet long. His granddaughter, Anna Valleau, married Lucas, son of Nicholas LeSueur.

The surveyors do alter a two rod road which was laid in the year 1733, Nov. 22nd, as follows: Beginning from the house of Johann Pillesfelt as the road now goes to the house of Isaac Boogart; from thence as the road now goes to the line of Peter Fauconnier and Johannes Tysse's land; thence along said line till it comes to a small meadow; thence north with a small turn as the trees are markt till it comes to the said line again and so along the line to the end of the lott of Johannes Tysse; thence as the road now goes to the line of Gerrit van Blerkum to a black oak tree to the corner of his fence; thence from said tree to a black oak stump standing in his clear land; thence on a straight to where he has planted apple trees; thence south-westerly along his apple trees by the east side of his house as the Road now goes to the north side of John Van Blerkum's house along the two rocks; thence on a west line to the Old Road; thence as the Road now goes to the south side of the house of Peter Tibow's; from thence as the road now goes till it comes to the King's Road from Ramapog.

From *The Minutes of the Board of Proprietors of the Eastern Division of New Jersey from 1725 to 1744*, Perth Amboy: 1960; (Re: Ramapo Tract; paraphrased unless in quotes)

(Vol. IV, p. 458, Biog.)...Fauconnier, Peter (1658-1749): Ramapo, Bergen Co.; came to N.J. with Lord Cornbury; receiver general, N.Y., 1704; involved in land grants and speculation in N.Y. and N.J., especially in the Ramapo Tract; father of Madelaine (m. Peter Valleau).

(Vol. II, p. 90) 21 May 1740...Committee appointed to treat with the defendants in the Bergen causes...met with Mr. Moore, Mr. Fauconier, Mr. Fresneau, Mr. Barbarie, Luke Kiersted and others of the Bergen people...on 23 May 1740 the committee met with the same Bergen group, and Mr. Ogden on their behalf offered the Proprietors £300 for the whole tract of land, which the committee unanimously rejected.

(Vol. II, p. 112) 27 May 1740...on 25 March 1740 "Isaac Brower and Johannes Slott, both of Romapeck in the County of Bergen, who were settled on the tract of land which is in controversy with Fauconier and others, being threatened by Fauconier and Company, if they would not remove or comply with their terms, offered to accept of leases and hold under the Proprietors if they would defend them against Fauconier and Company...[the Board] drew leases to them...demised to the said Brower two hundred acres for three years, rendering 10 s per hundred rent on twenty fifth of March yearly...in like manner was demised two hundred acres to Johannes Slott where he lives and also one hundred acres on Haverstraw Creek on the south side of Spitsberg...

...Mr. Alexander [one of the Proprietots] further acquainted this Board that on the second of April last the said Brower came and complained to him that sundry of Fauconier's Company to the number of seven men and three women came and forcibly entered into his house and land so demised as aforesaid and cast him, family and goods out of doors and pulled down his house..." Brower asked for protection, and Alexander and Ashfield, with a Bergen County Justice, Sheriff, Deputy and two constables, with others gathered along the way for assistance, went to the premises. The trespassers had gone, and those who had come to assist helped Brower and his family to raise the house again.

...While at Ramapo, Mr. Alexander found several other settlers who wished to take leases of the Proprietors and be pro-

tected against the Fauconier Company (including five who had already taken leases of Fauconier & Co.). On 13 April 1740 Derick Vandermaker (Wanamaker) and William Ramsay came to New York and showed Alexander and Ashfield two leases. Settlers involved (with leases from Fauconier & Co.) were:

Jasper Farmer was a Captain of the New York Militia and a merchant in NYC.

Jasper Farmer, in his will dated 23 April 1758, and proved 9 May 1758, left his entire estate in equal shares to his wife, Mary and his sons Jasper and Peter.

In her will, she wrote: March 3, 1788. Maria Farmer, widow, of New York City, it is my desire to be buried in Trinity Church as near as possible to my late husband; Also my funeral conducted by a genuine Dutch Minister; Also by all the ministers of the Church of England; Also by the Reverend Doctor Rogers, and the assistant minister of his Church; Also by his Excellency the Minister of the United Netherlands; Also by the Governor of this State and the Mayor of this City; Also by Doctor Charlton, to all of whom I desire that scarfs and gloves may be given, as well as to my pall-bearers, and in order that the procession may be conducted exactly conformable to the old Dutch Custom, I desire that the advice of Jeronymus Van Alstine be taken; to my niece, Hester Gouverneur, daughter of my brother, Nicholas Gouverneur, deceased, the interest of £1,200 during her natural life; my executors to pay the above sum to David Provoost, who is to put the same at interest, the money so arising to be paid my said niece regularly, and after her decease the said David Provoost is to pay the £1,200 to Jasper Farmer, George Farmer, Anne Farmer, Peter Farmer, Sarah, Thomas, Elizabeth, Samuel, and Cornelia Farmer, children of my son Peter, divided equally among them, share and share alike. I direct that one half of whatever money I leave in the house be applied toward the £1,200 to David Provoost; to my niece, Hester Gouverneur, two gowns which belonged to my sister, the late Jacoba Gouverneur; to Peter Goelet, my pair silver candlesticks; to Jacobus Lefferts, Esq., my ebony tea table; to Gerard Walton, my two eight square burnedchina bowls; to Thomas Farmer, my silver salver; to Henry Remsen, my large gold medal with the Imperial Arms thereon; to my son, Peter Farmer, son of my deceased husband, my diamond mourning ring, which I had made in memory of his father, and £25 in cash to purchase mourning suits for himself and wife; to the wife

of said Peter Farmer, my crystal ring with Mr. Farmer's hair in it; to Jasper Farmer, son of Peter, my silver tankard marked M. G.; to George Farmer, my silver stand and castors; to Anne Farmer, daughter of Peter, two of my gold stay buckles; to Sarah Farmer, two of my gold stay buckles; to Elizabeth Farmer, my silver milk pot shaped like a cow; to Samuel Farmer, my small silver tankard; to David Provoost, my silver tea kettle and stand; the rest of my plate (excepting my teapot and dish and large silver bowl), with the remains of my gold, to the five youngest children of Peter Farmer, namely, Peter, Thomas, Elizabeth, Samuel, and Cornelia; the abovementioned teapot and dish and large silver bowl is to be sold with the residue of my estate; to my brother, Samuel Farmer, £50; to Eve Provoost, my gold spectacles; to the Rev. Samuel Provoost, my picture representing a Cook's Shop; all my best wearing apparel I give to Anne, Sally, Elizabeth, and Cornelia Farmer, daughters of Peter Farmer, to be equally divided among them; my negro woman named Nan and her sons, Rob and Prince, be entirely freed and discharged from slavery immediately after my decease; I give my lot No. 7, fronting Frankfort Street, New York City, with the dwelling house and buildings thereon, for the use of my negro woman during her natural life; the same to be sold after her death, and considered a part of the residue of my estate; to my negro woman, Nan, my daily wearing apparel, my scarlet cloak, my kitchen utensils, old bedding, one pewter basin, one pewter soup dish, two trunks, and three cords of wood, to be delivered to her by my executors the first winter after my decease; the residue of my estate, real and personal, to be sold; one-half part of the proceeds of my real estate to Jasper Farmer, son of Jasper Farmer, deceased, and the other half part, together with all the proceeds of my personal estate, to Jasper, George, Anne, Peter, Sarah, Thomas, Elizabeth, Samuel, and Cornelia Farmer, children of Peter Farmer, to be equally divided among them as they shall respectively come of age, to them, their heirs forever; if either of the children should die before coming of age, and without lawful issue, the share of the one so dying to be equally divided among the survivors. I appoint Peter Goelet, Jacobus Lefferts, Esq., and Gerard Walton, of New York City, and Thomas Farmer, of New Jersey, executors. Witnesses, Peter P. Goelet, gentleman; James Seton, Lewis C. Hamersley, gentleman; Andrew Seton, Jr. Proved, March 18, 1788.

His mother and father died when he was quite young, and he became the ward of Tobias Dixon, husband of his aunt Alice Feake, for whom he was undoubtedly named (no Tobias in the Feake family before him). He moved with his uncle to Germany and lived there some years until he was sent across the Atlantic to live with his paternal uncle, Lieut. Robert Feake, at Watertown, MA.

He later lived in Flushing, Long Island, NY. In 1662 he sailed for the Netherlands to collect an inheritance due his wife Anna from her Van Beyeren relatives. He never returned, deserting his wife Mary and her children. He appears to have become a mariner.

In 1833, Abraham Fielding acquired the parcel of land just north of Abraham Heaton's parcel. He acquired it from Jacob Naugle. In his will, he wrote: ...I, Samuel Fish, Jr., of Newtown, in Queens County, Innholder, being in good health. "Having especial trust and confidence in my three sons, Jonathan, Samuel, and Richard, and my son-in-law, Richard Betts, I therefore make them executors, requiring them to execute and perform this will to the best of their skill and understanding." I leave to my three married daughters, Ruth, wife of Richard Betts, Mary, wife of Samuel Renne, and Sarah, wife of William Sackett, £500 each, over and above what I have heretofore given them, to be paid in 3 yearly installments. I leave to my two daughters, who are unmarried and under age, viz., Abigail and Sarah, £500 each, when of age. The interest to be used for their education and bringing up. I also leave them two feather beds, and furniture, "to be good and fashionable." I leave to my wife Ann, and my two youngest children, "all that part of my dwelling-house and land and garden and orchard, where the Barber now lives, as a tennant under the widow Langdon, opposite to Culvers, in Newtown, as the same is included within the stone fences on the east and west, the westernmost fence being a little way eastward of the Presbyterian Meeting House, being now under lease from me to the widow Langdon for 4 years to come. And I advise my executors to purchase the unexpired term, so that my wife and daughter may have the immediate use." I also give to my wife my riding chair and horse, and one of my best cows, also £8 yearly and a negro girl named "Bett," also all the household goods I had with her since we were married. I leave to the Elders of the Presbyterian Church and Congregation in Newtown £10, to be put at interest for the support of a minister. I leave to my executors £10, to be distributed among such poor people in Newtown as have no support allowed by the Parish. Before any legacies are paid, all just debts and funeral charges to be satisfied. I leave to my son Jonathan all the cleared land and meadow which I lately bought of John Renne, with all buildings, also the northeast half of the woodland which I also bought of him, with liberty to pass and repass to the same. I also leave to him all the homestead lands and buildings which I formerly purchased of Capt. Nathaniel Lawrence, deceased. Also 4 acres of salt meadow which I lately purchased of the widow Langdon, lying near Flushing creek, in Newtown. Also 40 acres of upland which I lately bought of John White, adjoining the land of Jonathan Furman and Samuel Waldron, Jr. Also 1/3 of my right in Juniper Swamp, and he is to pay to my executors £400. I leave to my son Richard all the lands and meadows which I lately purchased of widow Langdon, containing about 70 acres, with all the buildings. Also a small piece of upland and meadow lying a little way south from the Common Burying Place in Newtown, being 4 acres, which I bought of Robert Titus. Also 2 acres of fresh meadow, which I bought of John Ketcham, in Newtown, and 1/2 of a lot of land which I bought of the executors of Peter Berian, lying in Dutch Church lane, in Newtown. Also 1/3 of my right in Juniper Swamp. I leave to my son, Samuel Fish, all that my homestead and orchard whereon I now live, containing 11 acres, adjoining southeast on the land I bought of Capt. In his will, he wrote: ...I, Edward Fleming, of the City of New York, Esquire, being in perfect health. I desire to be privately buried without ostentation or parade. I devise all my real and personal estate in manner following, that is, one half to my dearly beloved wife, Swaantie Fleming, during her life and no longer, and the other half to my son, Pierre Edward Fleming, but in case any other child should hereafter be born to me by my said wife, such child shall enjoy an equal portion of my estate with my wife and son. My wife shall receive the income of my whole estate during her widowhood and no longer out of which she is to maintain and educate my said child or children till they attain the age of twenty-one. For the better education of my children I give the tuition and custody of them to my wife, but if she die or marry during the non-age of my children the same shall devolve on my executors who are then to receive the income of my children and apply it as directed. De Peyster, now born or hereafter to be born of his present wife. I appoint my dear and beloved wife during her widowhood, my honored and esteemed Mother-in-law, Mrs. Cornelia De Peyster, and my respected sister-in-law, Mrs. Cornelia Du Bois, and my esteemed and respected brother-in-law, Pierre G. I leave to my son, Nicoll Floyd, my farm called Mastick, bounded west by land of Nathaniel Woodhull, north by a marked tree at the head of Poosepattuck, and running down the river to the main river of Mastick, and from thence to the bay, with all the stock and servants and movable estate, And 1/2 of the upper land bought of Major William Smith, and the land lying to the north, lying between Mastick and Connecticut rivers, running to the country road, And 1/2 my meadow at Nancomuck, These I leave to my sons Richard and Nicoll. I leave to my son Nicoll all my right and title in a place called Stars Neck, and all my lands and meadows to the west of Connecticut river, as far as to the Country road, And all my lands to the east of Mount Misery, running southerly as the Lots run, to the country road; with the right and half right in the Commonage and further Divisions in the Town of Brookhaven. I leave to my grand son Floyd Smith £100, when of age, To my daughter Margaret, £300, To my daughter Charity, £500, To my grand son, Benjamin Nicoll, £100, To my grand daughter, Gloriana Margareta Nicoll, £100, To my grand daughter Dongan, daughter of my deceased daughter, Ruth Dongan, £100. I leave to my son, Richard Floyd, the movable estate, where he now lives at South, commonly known by the name of Potesquash, and all other movable estate in Brookhaven, except as herein mentioned. I leave to my son Nicoll, £100 and a part of the land belonging to my homestead joining to the land of Daniel Brewster, Sr., southerly, and east by the water side, and west by fence. If this is sold, my son Richard shall have the refusal. I give 20 shillings yearly for 20 years for the repairs of Caroline church at Brookhaven. I make my two sons executors. Dated February 27, 1738. Witnesses, Samuel D'Honneur, Zophar Platt, Isaac Browne. Proved (date left blank). [NOTE.--Richard Floyd, the testator, was born May 12, 1665, and during his whole life was one of the most distinguished citizens of Suffolk County, inheriting a large estate, to which he largely added. He married Margaret, daughter of Colonel Matthias Nicoll, September 10, 1686. Their children were Susanah, wife of Edmund Smith, of Smithtown, L. I.; Margaret, wife of Judge John Thomas, of Westchester; Charity, wife of Benjamin Nicoll; Ruth, wife of Walter Dongan, of Staten Island; Richard<sup>3</sup>, born 1703, died 1771; and Nicoll, born August 27, 1705, died 1752. Richard Floyd<sup>2</sup> died February 28, 1728. Richard Floyd<sup>3</sup> married Elizabeth, daughter of Benjamin Hutchinson. They had, among other children, a son, Richard Floyd<sup>4</sup>, born February 26, 1731, and having through his adherence to the Royal cause forfeited his large estate, he died in New Brunswick in 1792. Jan Fort Orange was one of the 11 black men petitioning for their freedom on February 25, 1644, after 18 or 19 years of working for the Dutch West India Company.

Jan Premero, a slave, and the first husband of Marie Grande, had been murdered 6 Jan 1641 by 9 other West India Company slaves (including Jan Fort Orange). According to the court records, the defendants confessed that they had jointly committed the murder, and they claimed not to know which of them had struck the blow that actually caused the death of Jan Premero. Not wanting to execute all nine able-bodied men, the court resolved to have the prisoners draw lots, thereby leaving it to "Almighty God, maker of heaven and earth, to designate the culprit." The lot fell to Manuel de Reus, who was thereby sentenced to death. Two nooses were placed around his neck and he was pushed off a ladder. Both ropes broke, whereupon the bystanders called for mercy. Faced with this bizarre turn of events, the court reconvened, and after extracting promises of good behavior and willing service, pardoned Manuel and all his accomplices.<sup>1</sup>

On 13 Sep 1734 John Fred was elected Assistant Alderman of Montgomerie Ward, NYC.<sup>1</sup>

Captain John Fred lived on the lot, in New York, bounded south by Pearl street and east by Ferry street. A small part of it was taken for Ferry street. Martha Fred was the widow of Captain John Fred. Her dwelling house was the west corner of Pearl street and Ferry street. A part of the lot was taken for the latter street, but only a very small part.

In his will, he wrote: I, John Fred, of New York, mariner, being at present in good health, this 28 of March, 1737. I direct all debts and funeral expenses to be paid. I leave to my wife Martha all my furniture, household goods, kitchen stuff, and my gold and silver. Also all my negro slaves, male and female; I also leave to my wife all that the rest of my estate, real and personal, during her widowhood, for the support of my son, John Fred, till he is of age, when he is to receive 1/2 and the other half after the death of my wife. If he should happen to die, then I leave my estate to my brother, Henry Fred, and my sister, Elizabeth Fred. I make my wife Martha, and my kinsman, Simon Johnson, of New York, Esq., executors. Witnesses, John King, Charles Beekman, Jr., Catharine Mackpheadrix. Proved, February 26, 1755. Catharine Mackpheadrix was then the wife of Robert Gilbert Livingston, "merchant."

In her will, she wrote: I, Martha Fred, of New York, widow, being weak of body this 12 of July, 1756. I leave to my loving cousins, Margaret and Susanah Johnson, children of my loving cousin, Simon Johnson, of New York, Gent., all my furniture, household goods, and kitchen stuff, and gold and silver, and my wearing apparell, gold chains, Diamond and Gold rings, and all made up or wrought gold and silver, and all my slaves. My executors are to sell all my house and ground where I now live, situate in Montgomerie Ward, in New York. "I leave to the Rector and Inhabitants of the city of New York in Communion of the Church of England as by Law established £500, to be put at interest with sufficient securities, and the interest shall be

used in the fall of every year towards the clothing of the Poor children of Trinity Church School House, But this gift is upon this condition, that my executors shall be permitted (which I order them to do) to affix to or upon some open and conspicuous place in said Trinity Church, and there for ever to remain, a Frame and Picture wherein shall be written and inscribed in Large Golden letters the Contents and Substance of this Legacy or Bequest, the wording whereof I submit to my executors. But if the Corporation of said church shall neglect or refuse to comply with this request, then the said Legacy to be void and the sum to go to my legatees." I leave to my cousin, Simon Johnson, £500. To my cousins, Margaret and Susanah Johnson, each £500. To my nephew, John Fred Herring, son of my late brother, Benjamin Herring, £200. To the other 4 children [not named] of my brother, Benjamin Herring and his wife Wyndlyna, £100 each. I leave to Benjamin Herring, son of my late nephew, Aaron Herring, £300. To Isaac Herring, the other son of my nephew, Aaron Herring, £200, to be put at interest till they are of age. To my cousin, Mary Hude, daughter of my cousin, James Hude, Esq., £100. To Edward Cowenhoven, of New York, joiner, £50. To Richard Jeffries, God son of my late husband, £100. All the rest to Benjamin and Isaac, sons of Aaron Herring, and to the 5 children of my brother, Benjamin Herring, deceased, when they are of age. I make Simon Johnson and James Hude executors. Witnesses, Elizabeth Sharpas, Mary Peck, John White. Codicil, January 6, 1757.--Upon mature and deliberate consideration, I revoke the legacy of £100 left to Richard Jeffries, especially as I have been very disobligingly used by him, And I give £50 to John Burchil, son of Captain (-?-) Burchil, of New York, mariner, and God son of my late husband. I leave to Christina, daughter of Samuel Farmer, merchant, and my God daughter, £25, and to Mary Spader, "a girl or maid that now liveth with me," £25. Witnesses, Jane Caner, Mary Peck, John White, cordwainer. Proved, September 27, 1757.

It is generally accepted that the Fromanteels originated from Flanders (Southern Netherlands). Many spelling variations of the name 'Fromanteel' are known. At that time there was no civil registry to enforce and record standardised spellings. Even Fromanteel himself often spelled his own name differently.

Ahasuerus Fromanteel is acknowledged as 'the godfather' of the English clock development. He had siblings, baptised respectively Daniel, Esther, Samuel, Abraham, John and Elizabeth.

His sister, Elizabeth, married in 1646, to the clockmaker Andrew Prime, baptised as Andries Priem. His brother John, a silk merchant, d. in 1665 (probably of the plague).

Once established in London, by the 1640s, Ahasuerus had become embroiled in a dispute with the Dutch Reformed Church. That correspondence was carried out entirely in the Dutch language.

Sarah Winnock was the widow of a textile merchant with four children. She too came from the Dutch community, from Colchester.

*---children of Ahasuerus Fromanteel & (1) Maria de Bruijn:*

- **Mary Fromanteel**, m. July 1654 **Thomas Loomes**, a young clockmaker. He prob. died about 1665, poss. of the plague.
- **John Fromanteel**, b. about 1638. John, who had learned the pendulum application at Salomon Coster's, became a free-clockmaker in 1663. Given fact that clocks bearing his own name are known, it is conjectured that he worked independently of his father, possibly from his own workshop elsewhere. He was then 25 years old. John Fromanteel was just 18 years old when he signed that pivotal historic deed in early September 1657 to make the new pendulum clock movements on Christiaan Huygens' principle (also to learn some undisclosed 'secret', that Dobson showed was Huygens' endless-rope maintaining power). Their contract was notarised by notary Josua de Putter in The Hague.
- **Abraham Fromanteel**, d. 1731 Newcastle; m. **Anna Brown**. Apparently, Abraham Fromanteel was a regular visitor to Holland. In 1694 he had determined that henceforth he would no longer pay his fees to the Clockmakers Company, because "he was forthwith going to Holland." Anna Brown d. 1694 Holland. They had a dau. Anna, who m. 1684 at The Hague, clockmaker Christopher Clarke. Abraham possibly retained control of the London business, but had, in later life, returned to Newcastle where he died in 1731, making his will there in November 1730. Abraham worked in Newcastle. In 1678 he was a witness in litigation having roots in Cromwell's time (the 'interregnum'). Several of Abraham's clocks, bearing signature "A Fromanteel Newcastle", are known; also one marked "New Casteel", perhaps to signify an intended Dutch outlet?
- **Ahasuerus Fromanteel, Jr.**, d. 1703 Amsterdam. Ahasuerus junior, the second son to become a clockmaker, probably remained with his father. He too spent time in Holland.

Ahasuerus Fromanteel arrived in New York at age 24 in 1686. [Perhaps a different Ahasuerus Fromanteel, to be 24 in 1686, he likely would not be mentioning a granddaughter in his 1694 will.]

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were: Assuerus Fromantell, j. m. Van London, en Anna Jans, laest Wed. William More, beyde woonende alhier.

In his will, he wrote: ...2d day of April in the year 1694, I, Ashuerius Fromanteel, of New York, being in good health." I



leave to my son in law [step son] Johanes Stevenson £30, which sum I have agreed to pay him when he is 21, as by contract made before marriage with his mother may appear. I leave to my daughter in law, Hannah Moore, £30, when of age or married, as by the same contract. I leave to my grand daughter Mary Fromanteel £50 when of age. Leaves all the rest of estate to his wife Anne for life, "and then to our children," and makes her executor. New York on the 8th day of June, 1695, the last will of Ashuerius Fromanteel was proved, and Letters of administration were granted to the widow, Anne Fromanteel.

In his will, he wrote: I, Wright Frost, of Matinecock, in the Town of Oyster bay, yeoman, being weak in body, I leave to my son, Wright Frost, all my lands lying near the Island Swamp, so-called, which my father, William Frost, purchased of the Indians; Also my land lying in Musketo Cove, Patent, and 1/2 my part of the Great Meadow, so-called, which lyes with William Frost's meadow, undivided lands on the west, and land of William Frost on the east. And he is to pay £30 to my son Daniel. I also leave to my son, Wright Frost, my negro boy "Natt." I leave to my son Joseph all my land and meadow lying at the South side, where he now liveth, and for which he has already a deed; I also leave him my negro boy "Robin." I leave to my son Jacob, my homestead where I now dwell, with all houses and barns, and land down the neck, joining the same, lying on the east side of William Frost's land, "with all that is standing, lying, going, or becoming due upon the same;" Also 1/2 my meadow at a place called the Great Meadow, lying by William Frost's land; Also all my land lying at the head of Choagan

Swamp, called the Rye field, bounded west by William Frost, and north by the highway; Also all my land lying on the south side of the highway that leads from Oyster bay to Musketo Cove, on the south side of the Meeting House, which land I had of Freelove Jones, And all my land adjoining to the south side of the same; Also all my land on Oak neck, and 1/2 of my right of land on Pine Island, and all my right of marsh and meadow at Pine Island; Also my negro Janes and a pair of oxen, and 2 horses, and a mare that he calls his, and 3 cows, 10 sheep, and an ox-cart. I leave to my son Daniel "a piece of land joining to the east end of Hopkins land," being 20 acres, bounded east by William Frost, north by Benjamin Frost; Also all my meadow at a place called the Little Meadow, and my right of the creek and creeks lying between said meadows, except 2 acres of meadow joining to Racoon Swamp or creek, which said two acres I give to my sons Wright and Jacob. I give all my rights on the Great Plains to my four sons, Wright, Joseph, Jacob, and Daniel. My son Jacob is to pay to my son Daniel £200. I give all my lands lying down the neck, between my house and the Sound on the neck, commonly called Weekes neck, to my son Jacob. I leave to my wife Mary a negro girl, and a good feather bed and furniture, and 1/3 of all household goods, and a negro man, and all my flax and wool, and new cloth; Also 4 cows, 2 oxen, 15 sheep, and 6 swine, and a horse and saddle, and bread corn "and provision for her and the family, till next winter; and my syder that is now by me." I leave to my son Wright 1/2 of my right of land on Pine Island. I leave to my grand-daughter, Mary Frost, a negro girl. My wife is to have the use of 1/3 my homestead, during her widowhood. On Nov. 12, 1739, Wright Frost, Daniel Underhill, John Prior, Jacob and Daniel Frost sold Fox Island in Matinecock to Major Jones for a ferry wharf.

Capt. Wright Frost in 1746 issued a warrant for Benjamin Carpenter, for not appearing at training and fined him 11 shillings, which Carpenter refused to pay, and Capt. Frost took seven pounds of wool as an equivalent, March 28, 1746.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Wright Frost, of the town of Oyster Bay, being through the Mercy of God in enjoyment of Health." All just debts to be paid, "and in order to it, it is my will that my wife ~~Prudence~~ [Freelove] and my sons, Zebulon, Penn, and Daniel Wright, shall carry on all their business jointly, as we have done heretofore," and support their families, and pay debts as soon as they can. I leave to my wife all movable estate within doors, and a negro man, a horse, 6 sheep, and her choice of rooms in my house, and the use of 1/3 of meadows and Creek Thatch. I leave to my son Daniel my 2 lots of land lying in Mosquito Cove Patent, one of which I had of my father, Wright Frost, being 50 acres, and the other I bought of Jacob Furman, 30 acres, with all appurtenances. I leave to my daughter Jemima so much of my out door movables as will make her equal to the outsetting I have given to my daughters, Mary Thornycroft and Phebe De Milt. I leave to my sons Penn and Daniel so much utensils of husbandry as will make them equal to what I have given to my son Zebulon. My sons and my daughter Mary, if she shall be a widow, are to have the privilege of living in my house with my wife. I leave to my daughters, Phebe De Milt and Jemima Frost, each £100. These legacies are to be paid by my 3 sons. My executors are to put £95 at interest for my daughter, Mary Thornycroft. I make my sons Zebulon and Penn, and my cousins, Daniel Underhill and Thomas Pearsall, executors. I leave to my son, Penn Frost, all my right on Pine Island, and to my 3 sons all my right in the Great Plains. Witnesses, Joseph Latting, George Townsend, Thomas Frost. Proved, March 5, 1760.
