

-- FARRINGTON --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

31 Aug 1654 -- Thomas Applegat, pltf. v/s William Harck, deft., requests as Grandfather of the surviving child of Thomas Farrington, that deft. shall deliver up to him the goods and cattle, which he as Curator of the said child has in his possession according to the judgment of the Honble Director General and Council. Deft states, that three were chosen and appointed with him as Guardians and must be summoned conjointly and offers to give over to pltf. what he has in his possession belonging to the child, provided that Applegat may cite Harck and the other Guardians to appear on the next Court day and if they then are willing to deliver up to Applegat or have no valid reason, then shall Applegat be held to give other and sufficient security for his proper administration thereof.³

1 July 1697 (Westchester Town Trustee's Book, 1686-1702) -- "Whereas our beloved brother Richard Farrington, son of our father Thomas Farrington, late of Westchester, at his departure was to go on a boyage to Nevis, but since being informed that he was taken by the French and carried into France, and died there in prison....and whereas he had an estate from our father Thomas....we, the sister of Richard, come to an agreement on dividing the said estate." This was between Thomas Forgason and wife Mary, eldest daughter of Thomas Farrington, Elizabeth Farrington, the 2d daughter, and Abigail Farrington, the youngest daughter.¹

2 April 1698 (Town of Westchester Trustee's Book, 1686-1702) -- Benjamin Grant, husband of the said Elizabeth Grant, gives his consent to a transaction. Thomas Oakley and wife Abigail sell Benjamin Grant a right in the commonage.¹

Thomas and Maragrieta Farrington witnessed the baptism, 23 July 1758 New Paltz Ref Ch, of Maragrieta, dau. of Abraham Kool/Cool & Sarah Sluyter.

In his will, dated 15 April 1782, probated 31 Dec 1796, Thomas Farrington, of Eastchester, yeoman, devised to son George Farrington the farm where he then dwelt; mentioned daus. Hannah and Nepsee; devised to son Jonas the farm purchased of William Odell; mentioned wife Margaret; g.s. Abner, son of Robert Farrington; g.s. James son of Benjamin Farrington; son Thomas Farrington; g.s. Joseph and "Mosse" son of Thomas; dau. Sarah, wife of Anthony Valentine. Executors sons Jonas and George Farrington. Wit., "Aaron" Lawrence, Jacob Rich, Richard Budd.¹

In her will, dated 21 March 1784, probated 18 March 1789, Susannah Farrington, of Milesquare, NY, mentioned dau. Betsea Farrington; dau. Jean; dau. Sarah, wife of Aron Lawrence; dau. Masse. Youngest children to be brought up; what is left to be divided between Joshua, Benjamin, Betsea, Jane and Masse. Executors: friends, Isaac Lawrence and Anthony Valentine. Wit: James Valentine, Elijah Valentine, Annah Smith. Adm. granted James Farrington.¹

(Westchester Co., Administrations, Liber A, p. 15) -- Will of Susannah Farrington, dated 20 March 1784; "soon after died"; Executors Isaac Lawrence and Anthony Valentine; both relinquished executorship 18 March 1789, date of probate; Letters granted son James Farrington of Yonkers.²
