

-- FIELD --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

This family has been traced back to John Fields, the astronomer, and even further, to William the Conqueror's time, when the name was De la Ffeld. Robert Field, b. 1605, at Sowerby, Eng., came to Newport, R. I., before 1638, and, in 1645, was one of the patentees of Long Island lands, including the site of Flushing. He d. before 1673. He m. (1) Ruth Fairbeck; (2) Elizabeth Taylor; (3) Charity (???). Sons were John, Robert, Anthony and Benjamin. A son of Anthony, John Field, b. 1659, settled near Bound Brook in 1695, and was the ancestor of the Field families in that locality and near Lamington. --- "Field" in *Somerset County Historical Quarterly*, Vol. V, p. 195

Anthony Field, of Harrison's Purchase, Westchester county, N. Y., named in Flushing Record, b. there; will dated April 21, 1773. His wife Hannah, dau. of William Burling, of Flushing, m. there; co-executrix of her husband's will.

Anthony Field, son of Benjamin and Hannah, who was born in 1698, and married Hannah Burling, removed to Harrison, sometimes called "Harrison's Purchase" and sometimes "Purchase," in 1725. This tract was bought from the Indians by John Harrison, of Flushing, to whom it was conveyed by a deed of Pathungo, sachem, or chief of the tribe, residing there, dated Jan. 24, 1695. It is in the county of Westchester, and about thirty miles from New York [City]. Originally it formed part of Rye, but was separated from it after the Indian deed referred to, and successfully resisted the claims of ownership made by this town. Bolton, the historian of Westchester, says: "Nearly all the settlers of this purchase came from Flushing and other towns on Long Island." And again: "This seems to have been a favorite settlement of the Friends. They were shamefully persecuted in Connecticut and Massachusetts; from there driven to Long Island. Even there they could find no rest, for the governor of New York issued an order forbidding them to worship, even in a barn. So they crossed by means of the ferry to Rye and settled principally in Harrison."

Anthony Field gave the ground for the first Friends meeting house erected here in 1727, which land adjoined his estate.

His will was dated, "this twenty-first day of the fourth month (called April), 1773." After providing for his wife Hannah, he directs his land to be sold "that lies on the North side of the road that leads from King street to White Plains"; and out of the proceeds certain sums to be paid to his sons Thomas, Samuel, Anthony and John, "which will make them equal with what my son Benjamin hath already had, which is eighty pounds"; also forty pounds to son William and the same sum to daughter Sarah out of the said proceeds, and the remainder of same to be equally divided between his children, Thomas, William and Sarah. "When my widow pleases to sell the farm, where I now live on the East side of the road that leads from the Purchase meeting house to Rye," eighty pounds is to be paid "to my son Moses Field," the remainder to be divided equally between his--the testator's--"widow" and his children, except Anthony, who has had his full share. His land in Hampshire (i. e., New Hampshire) is to be equally divided between his sons William and Moses. "My beloved wife Hannah Field and my sons Benjamin and John Field to be executors."

His death is entered as follows in the Friends' register of Harrison: "Anthony Field died 9th mo. 2nd 1777," and he was interred in the burial ground of the meeting house there.

Friends' register reads: "Benj. Field, son of Anthony Field of Long Island, deceased, and Hannah Bowne, daughter of John Bowne of Long Island, aforesaid married 30th, 9th, 1691, at John Bowne's in Flushing."

Deed of land by Benjamin Field to Samuel Bowne, dated 9th, 12th month, 1696-97.

Benjamin Field bought land from cousin Benjamin Field at Chesterfield NJ but did not move there.¹

In a list of the inhabitants of Flushing in 1698 is the following: "Benj. Feild and Hannah his wife, children Benj., John, Anthony, and Sam'l, negroes Jo and Betty."

Preserved at the old Bowne house are two or three letters, dated at Chesterfield in 1700 and 1701, signed B. Field, and addressed to Samuel Bowne (Hannah Bowne's brother). They relate to purchases of land in that neighborhood, in which they were both interested. One of them speaks of "another purchase of land to the quantity of 1,000 to 1,500 acres," which "lyes above the falls of Delaware, about 10 or 11 miles from Salem."

In his will, he wrote: ...The Second day of August, 1762. I, Caleb Field, of Flushing, in Queens County." My executors are to sell 60 acres of the upper part of the place that I had of Daniel Laurence. I leave to my son Thomas all the lands and meadows that I had of Daniel Laurence, except 10 acres of wood land, And all the land I had of Nathan Field. But if he does not live to be of age, then it is to go to my wife and son and my three daughters. My executors are to sell the lot that I had of John Masston [Marston], "which is called Franklin's Lot." I leave to my son Philip all the lands and meadows which I purchased of Mary Hinchman, and a lot joining that I purchased of John Marston, and 10 acres of woodland that I purchased of Daniel Laurence. My wife is to live on the place I have given to my son Philip until all the children are grown up. I leave to my wife and my daughters, Elizabeth, Mary, and Anne, all the money from the sale of lands, and all my movable estate. I make my wife Anne, and my brother, John Rodman, and John Field, executors. Witnesses, George Noostrant, Johanes Areson, Hannah Noostrant. Proved, March 10, 1769.

He was born in Flushing, L. I., where he resided and where he was married. Some time after his marriage, about 1732, he moved to the Oblong, locating on Dingle Ridge, now in South East, Putnam county, N. Y., where his last child, Jane, was born. She was the first white child born on the Oblong. Samuel became a prosperous farmer, a well known and highly re-

spected citizen, and whose well preserved house is still standing. He was a Quaker and belonged to the Society of Friends.

Another account says: Samuel appeared on Dingle Ridge on the Oblong before 1733 with sons William, John and Stephen, and daughters, Elizabeth and Anna. He settled on a square one mile north and south and seven-eighths of a mile east and west, on the south side of the town of South East. Dutchess county, N. Y., since set off as a part of Putnam county. He was probably the first settler on the Oblong in South East. His daughter Jane, born Aug. 18, 1733. was the first white child born on the Oblong. Samuel's will recorded in the Surrogate's office, Poughkeepsie, is a unique document. He was a prominent citizen of South East; was supervisor of the South Precinct of Dutchess County (now the part that is Putnam Co.) 1754-56; was a prominent member of the Society of Friends, as were his children. He and many of his descendants were buried in the Friends' burying ground at Peach Pond, where, unfortunately for us, no records were kept and no inscriptions on the stones.

In his will, dated 17th of 11th mo., 1760; probated 7 Feb 1788, Samuel Field, of Dutchess Co., left to wife Mary the use of the estate; to son William all book debts, bonds, and notes; lands to sons William, John, and Stephen; furniture to daus. Elizabeth Palmer, Ann Palmer, and Jane Coe. Executors: wife Mary, and sons William, John, and Stephen. Wit: Joseph Field, Jr., Nehemiah Field, Jr., and John Field, Jr.

It is my will and order that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid. I leave to my sister, Hannah Field, £70, and all my bed clothes, woolen and linnen, and my desk of drawers, and my watch, "and my Bleeding Samchier and my case of Horse Flaines." I leave to my brother Joseph £30. To my brother Nathaniel's son, William Field, £30. To my brother Caleb's son, Thomas Field, £20. "I leave to my little cousin, Rodman Field," my chest and feather bed and 2 pillows. To my sister Sarah Clarke's son, William Clarke, £30. All the rest of my estate to my brothers, Nathaniel, Caleb, and Joseph, and to my sisters, Sarah Clarke and Hannah Field, and to Rodman Field. I make my sister, Hannah Field, executor. Witnesses, William Glean, Samuel Skidmore, John Field, Jr. Proved, March 23, 1759.
