The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with citations.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Archibald Fisher, of New York, Physician, being at present sick. All debts and funeral expenses to be paid by my executors in convenient time. I leave to my wife Catharine 1/3 of all real and personal estate, and the use of the other 2/3 during the time she remains my widow, "in order the better to enable her to educate, maintain, and bring up my children until of age or married." After the death or marriage of my wife I leave all the rest of my estate to my four children, Gerritt Van Horne Fisher, Cornelius, Archibald, and my daughter, Catharine Goddard. I make my wife and my 4 children executors. Dated November 9, 1752. Witnesses, Joseph Murray, James Mazza, Richard Shuckburgh, chirurgon. Proved, November 2, 1759. Catharine Fisher and Cornelius Fisher being then the only two surviving executors. Confirmed by Governor Colden, May 18, 1761. Cornelius Fisher being then the surviving executor.

On 16 May 1795 (recorded 26 Feb 1805, Bergen Co. U:30) John Eckerson of Franklin Township, yeoman, Isaac Storm of the same place, and David Van Blarcom of the City of New York, labourer, and Mary, his wife, conveyed to **Conrad Fisher** of Franklin Township, yeoman, for £225, 75 acres being lot 30 in the Ramapough Tract in Franklin Township. Signed by Jan Eckerson, Isaac Storm (his mark), David V Blarcum (his mark), Witnessed by Abraham Westervelt.¹

On 1 March 1806 (recorded 8 March 1806, Bergen Co. X:149) Henry Banta of Sluckup in the Township of New Barbadoes, and Elizabeth, his wife, conveyed to **Coonrad Fisher** of the Township of Franklin, for \$175, 4-1/4 acres strict measure of woodland at Persackanack in the Township of Franklin; beginning at James Ackerman's land. Signed by Henry Banta (his mark), Elizabeth Banta (her mark). Witnessed by Henry Van Dalsen, William Van Dalsen.¹

On 1 April 1806 (recorded Bergen Co. X:293) Garret A. Post and Nelly, his wife, of Bergen County, conveyed to Coonrad Fisher of the Township of Franklin, 13 acres more or less in the Township of Franklin, beginning line of Roelif Romine; mentioned land of Conrad Pecker; Lodowick Bush; David Romine.¹

On 10 March 1812 (recorded 13 March 1812, Bergen Co. G2:217) Lodiwick Bush of County of Bergen and Lenah, his wife, conveyed to Conraed Fisher and Jacob Van Houten of the same place, for \$750, 12 acres more or less, messuage, house and lot in the Township of Franklin. Signed by Lodowick Bush (his mark), Lenah Bush (her mark). Witnessed by John A. Voorhis, Martin Van Houten.¹

Her funeral was from the Saddle River Lutheran Church, after 1 November 1854 and before 24 May 1855.¹

The will of David Fisher, (weak of body) of the Township of Franklin, was dated 13 April 1826 and proven 9 January 1827 in Bergen County. He mentioned first that he wished to receive a good Christian burial and that all his debts and funeral expenses be paid. Wife Elizabeth in addition to her dower rights was to receive the use of all household goods and furniture, during her widowhood, (except those herein disposed of). Sons Michael and David all tenements and real estate (subject to the right of dower of my wife, their mother). If they want to divide the land, David to have the tract with the old homestead. "Michael to have his share of apples from out of the orchard till he shall have apples of his own." Sons to receive all horses, wagons, harnesses, and other farming utensils and stock (except wool wife shall want for her use). Three daughters Maria, Hannah, and Catharine \$15.00 each, one year after my death paid by sons. Remainder after death of wife to five children share and share alike. The executors were his trusty friends Christian Wanamaker and John Mandingo and the witnesses were Peter Westervelt and David Christie (signed with his mark). David Fisher signed with his mark. [David Fisher will (1827), Bergen County Will Book C: 169.]¹

Since the daughters received only a small amount of money, and no outsets were mentioned, it is very likely that they were all already married and had received their shares; their husbands have not been identified.¹

The old homestead, was undoubtedly the property in Franklin Township, David had inherited from his father Michael Fisher's will dated 6 January 1802 and probated 9 June 1802. From that will David inherited "the south part of my farm, being the part on which I now dwell, per survey by John D. Harin[g], on March 15, 1796" also "all my horses, horned cattle, sheep and live stock; bed, cupboard, wagon, weaving loom and other utensils." [Michael Fisher Will (1802) New Jersey Will 3229B.] His brother Michael was to receive the other half of the property, and the two of them were to pay their five brothers or their heirs and one sister \$15 each. After the death of Mary all were to share equally in the estate. [Michael Fisher probate file (1802) No. 176, Bergen County Surrogate's office.]¹

David Fisher, 49, farmer, and Catharine, 40, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed with them were: Rachel, 16; Hannah, 13; and David, 9. Also living with them was Elizabeth Fisher, 88.

Catherine Fisher, 48, is listed as a widow in the 1860 census. Listed living with her were: David, 20, farmer; Maria, 30, old maid; Rachel E., 25; and Michael, 6. Living with her family was Ellen [Brundige? Brundigle?], 4.

W.D. Caty Fisher [Widow of David?], was listed in the 1865 New Jersey State Census, living in Hohokus Township.

Listed (probably living with her) were: David Fisher, Mary Fisher, Caty Fisher, Rachel Ellen Fisher; along with children aged between 5-16: Michael Fisher, and Ellen Fisher.

I leave to my wife Femtie the use of all estate during her life, and then to my five children, Jacob, Hester, wife of Cornelius Switts; Anke, Gertrude, and Lena. Lewis and Mary (Till) Fisher were New Jersey Loyalists who settled in New Brunswick, Canada after the Revolutionary war. They left their two eldest daughters, Mary and Elizabeth, in Ramapo with their grandparents Michael and Maria Fisher (buried in Ramapo Lutheran).

On 7 December 1776 at the outbreak of the American Revolution Lodewick/Lewis Fisher enlisted with the New Jersey Volunteers, a loyalist regiment under the command of Brigadier-General Cortlandt Skinner. The muster rolls show him as a private serving in Captain Peter Ruttan's company of the 4th Battalion, commanded by Lieutenant-Colonel Abraham Van Buskirk. Many of the soldiers in his company also came from Bergen County. In the rolls his name appears variously as Lodewig, Lodewick, and Ludovic, but most often as Lewis Fisher. The rebels captured him along with his brother Peter and several other members of Captain Ruttan's company on 20 or 29 December 1776. He was held prisoner for almost two years but escaped or was exchanged and returned to duty on 2 October 1778. His brother, however, remained a prisoner until the end of the war. Lewis was listed as "Sick in Reg[imen]t Hospital" in December 1780 but otherwise appears regularly in the muster rolls. For most of this period he was stationed at Staten Island, New York. His company does not appear to have been involved in any of the major engagements of the early years of the war, however, the regiment gained a reputation for making devastating raids on the New Jersey countryside from its Staten Island base.²

During the summer of 1781 the New Jersey Volunteers were consolidated into three battalions. Lewis Fisher joined Captain Edward Earle's company in the 3rd Battalion now under the command of Lieutenant-Colonel Abraham Van Buskirk. The company was stationed on Staten Island for much of 1781 and 1782 but spent most of 1783 at New Town, Long Island. His

battalion was involved in one major engagement during this period. According to the regimental history, Lieutenant-Colonel Van Buskirk "distinguished himself, with his battalion, at the attack on Fort Griswold, in the harbour of New London, Connecticut, and in the massacre which followed, and is spoken of in the report by [General Benedict] Arnold with applause for his great services". The force landed near New London on 6 September and Van Buskirk's men "took part in the closing scene of the desperate defense of Fort Griswold". Arnold then ordered the battalion "to take a hill which commanded the village. This was very quickly done, and General Arnold followed the force to the hill, which had been taken. During this fight they were compelled to storm Groton Fort . They massacred the garrison and burned the village of New London."²

The peace settlement was reached in early 1783 but the 3rd Battalion of the New Jersey Volunteers was one of the last units to evacuate New York, leaving in September 1783 as part of the "fall fleet" bound for Nova Scotia. Lewis Fisher and his family embarked in the SS Esther which sailed from New York with the SS Martha. The Martha was wrecked with heavy loss of life on Seal Island off Cape Sable, Nova Scotia, but the Esther, although "nearly lost", arrived safely at the mouth of the Saint John River in late September or early October 1783. The family travelled up river by schooner to Oromocto and then by foot and canoe to St. Ann's Point, later named Fredericton, where they arrived on 8 October 1783.²

Many of the soldiers of the 3rd Battalion of the New Jersey Volunteers settled at Fredericton that fall (most of the loyalists camped at the mouth of the Saint John river for the winter). During the winter of 1783/84 Lewis Fisher and his family, and most of the other settlers, lived in tents, suffering greatly under the conditions. As a loyalist he was entitled to land and he apparently received a grant of 200 acres in Maugerville township, to the east of Fredericton, on 26 December 1786. It does not appear that he ever took up this grant. It is probable that he had already built a log cabin in the spring of 1784 in the vicinity of Fredericton on land to which he had not yet received formal title. Many other loyalists had done the same out of necessity. This situation was recognized by the "Heddon grant" of 24 March 1788 which "was laid out in an irregular manner because the first arrivals had already settled there before the town was laid out". In the Heddon grant, "Ludwick Fischer" and twenty-nine others received a share of the 56-acre lot 29 which was just below Fredericton, in between Salamanca station and the present University Avenue. According to Lilian Maxwell, Lewis Fisher built his first home on the road up Forest Hill, which led to the sawmill and was the highway to Saint John.²

Lewis Fisher's petition to the Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick for land on 6 December 1792 reads: "That as your petitioner has a large family to support he humbly asks some portion of the lands in the rear of the lots of Doctor Charles Earl and James Ackerman. Your petitioner knows not the number or bounds of any particular lot therefore leaves it entirely to your Excellency's bounty." It is signed "Lewis Fisher" and a notation on the petition shows that it was for one of the back lots on the academy lands. It is not clear if this petition was granted, but at some point he acquired one of the "pasture lots" just south of Fredericton, located along the eastern side of the present day York Street, south of George Street and north of Montgomery Street. Apparently, he petitioned for land again on 18 May 1803 claiming that he had "never received any lands from Government." It is clear that he had received land by this time and it is possible that this petition was in the name of his son Lewis. The names of his sons Peter and David were also on the petition, however, Peter and David were aged 20 and 18, while Lewis Jr. was only aged 8. The petition requested that three be "registered as applicants for a lot of 200 acres to each of them on the right hand side of the road continued from the New Maryland Settlement. To commence with the lot applied for by Henry Fisher [the eldest son of Lewis], being the second lot on the right side from the former allotment and to continue along the said side of the said road". On 10 July 1806, the four Fishers (Henry, Peter, David, and Lewis or Lewis Jr.) received grants of land varying between 160 and 241 acres on the outskirts of Fredericton. This grant began a long connection between the family and New Maryland, a farming community (later a parish) south of Fredericton.²

This may be the Michael Fisher listed in the Franklin Township Rateables for 1779 and 1780. In 1779 he is listed with 125 acres and 9 horses and cattle. In 1780 he is listed as a single man with 50 acres improved land, 75 acres unimproved land, 3 horses, and 4 horned cattle.

The following transactions may refer to this Michael Fisher or his son, Michael:

On 1 January 1795, Elisha and Catherine Boudinot of Newark, Essex County, conveyed to Michael Fisher of Bergen County, for £148.2, 197 acres. Signed by Elisha Boudinot, Catherine Boudinot. Witnessed by William P. Smith.¹

On 10 February 1795, James Drummond and Rachel Drummond, heirs of the Earl of Perth, by their attorney Walter Rutherford, conveyed to Michael Fisher of Bergen County, for £148, 197 acres. Signed by Walter Rutherford. Witnessed by George Turnbull, Conradt Boss (his mark).¹

Michael Fisher's will dated 1801-2 shows that his children included Lodwick, Peter, Conrad, Rynhart (or Ryndert), Harmanes, David, Michael Jr., and Anna (mar. David Byard). In his will, he wrote: 1802, Jan. 6. Fisher, Michael, of Franklin Twsp., Bergen Co., yeoman; will of. Wife, Mary, real and personal estate in trust, during her widowhood. Thereafter, to the heirs of son, Harmanes, dec'd.\$15. To the heirs of son, Ryndert, \$15. Sons, Peter and Conrad, each \$15. Said sums to be paid by son, David Fisher, and the other half by son, Michael M. Fisher. Son David, the south part of my farm, being the part on which I now dwell, per survey by John D. Haring, on Mar. 15, 1796; also, all my horses, horned cattle, sheep and live stock; bed, cupboard, wagon, weaving loom and other utensils. Son, Michael M. Fisher, the remainder of my farm on the north side of partition line. Said sons, David and Michael, each to pay £75 with interest on a bond executed by me in favor of Cornelius Bogert; also to pay funeral expense of myself and wife. Residue of personal estate to be sold and proceeds divided between my children and grandchildren--to wit: Lodwick Fisher, David Fisher, Peter Fisher, Conrad Fisher and Michael Fisher, and the children of Harmanes Fisher, Ryndert Fisher and Anna Byard (wife of David Byard), in 8 equal shares. Son David, to keep deeds for my lands in his possession. Executors--friends, Abraham Westervelt, John M. Hopper, Richard D. Wannmaker, and Henry Wannmaker. Witnesses--Conrad Wannmaker, William Wannmaker and Hermanes Wannmaker. Proved June 9, 1802. Lib. 40 p. 34; file 3229B.²
