The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

They lived in the family homestead on River Vale Road in River Vale, Bergen Co., NJ, conveyed to Abraham by an unrecorded deed when he married, by his father, together with 8 acres of land at that location. He inherited land on the east side of the road, opposite the homestead, together with other land to the west for life, by his father's will in 1829.

They were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Washington Township, where he was a farmer. The next family listed was that of John A. Hopper.

They had no children. His will was dated 11 Dec 1847 and in it he devised his homestead and land to his wife; and the land in which he had a life interest, to his brothers. After Helena died, the executors of her estate sold the homestead and land on both sides of the road, on 3 June 1864, to John A. Hopper, reserving the cemetery "as fenced in and used as a burying ground," being a plot about 26 feet square. Hopper later had the remains and stones removed to Westwood and the site was then abandoned as a burying ground.

The homestead, probably dating from the 1730s, was subsequently destroyed by fire and replaced by the present smaller house at #401 River Vale Road.

He was a farmer and they lived in his father's homestead on River Vale Road, River Vale, Bergen Co., NJ, where John was

taxed for 100 acres in 1779. The house was shown on Erskine's Revolutionary War Map No. 113 in 1780, under John's name. He later purchased a considerable amount of the land west of Cedar Lane in Hillsdale, and the homestead formerly owned by his brother Jacob. He later resided in a frame house built on the south side of Piermont Avenue in River Vale.

They lived in his father's homestead farm on the south side of Piermont Avenue in River Vale, Bergen County, NJ, for which John received a deed from his sisters in 1854 for their interest. His will was dated 21 Jan 1895. The farm was sold to Sarah M. Bradbrook in 1894.

They were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Washington Township, with his father: John Flearaboam, 66, farmer, value of real estate \$3,000.; John Flearaboam, 29, farmer; Rachel Flearaboam, 29; Elen Flearaboam, 10; and Garret H. Flearaboam, 5.

Matthys Servaes, the ancestor of the Flierboom family of New York and New Jersey, was living at Albany prior to 1658 and probably married Marritje Jacobs there. He came to New York before 1672 and lived on the farm of Peter Stuyvesant, deceased. He later went to Tappan and was in Orange County when he took the oath of allegiance in 1687.

In Tappan he lived on land owned by Adrian Lambertsen Smith, who excepted three acres given to Tys Servaes when the land was sold to Cornelius B. VanderWyck on 4 Aug 1688. Matthys Servaes returned to New York and lived in the East Ward, where he died abt. 1695.

Some of his children and possibly his wife were living by 1696-1697 at Achter Kol, the Newark Bay area in New Jersey.

Previous to 1693 the family adopted the name Flierboom, meaning Elder tree. The Hunterdon County, New Jersey, branch of the family has retained the more original spelling of Vlerebome. The Bergen County branches generally used Flierboom, although found in a variety of spellings. One of these changed to Freeborn for convenience.

Peter Vlierboom, cordwainer, was admitted as a Freeman in New York City on 29 October 1734. He probably lived in his father's house on Queen Street since he was to pay his mother a yearly rent, according to his father's will.

In his will, he wrote: ...September 29, 1747, I, Peter Vlereboom, of New York, cordwainer, being at present sick and weak. All my debts are to be paid and an inventory made within six weeks. I leave to my only son, Seraphanus, £5 for his birthright. I leave to my wife Janettye, the income of all my estate, for her maintainance and that of our children. If she remarries, then all to go to her and my children, Seraphanus and Gertruy. My executors may sell all real estate. I make my wife Janettye and my brothers-in-law, Peter Vandervoort and Cornelius Vanderhoff, executors. Witnesses, John Bogart, Jr., John Dally, John Dally, Jr. Proved, December 12, 1747.

Servaes was a carman in New York, where he was made a freeman 18 Dec 1695.

He was on the tax list in the North Ward in 1699. By 1707 he had joined the Lutheran Church in which he became a leading member, and marriages and baptisms were sometimes performed at his house. On June 27, 1713 he purchased from Johannes Beekman a lot on the north side of Queen Street on which he erected a house. He also owned another house opposite the Moravian Meeting House, fronting on Fair Street. Both were advertised for sale in 1759, after the death of his wife.

In his will dated 16 Sep 1730, probated 28 Feb 1743 in NY, Sawas Flierboom of New York, carman, mentioned son Matthew (heir at law); wife Gertrude; children Mary, Margaret, Matthew, and Peter. Wit: Cornelius Folleman, William Goolding, H. De Meyer.¹ The heirs sold the Queen Street house to John Burling for 760 pounds.
