The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

There may be two or more distinct families filed here. One, apparently a Dutch family; the other a German Palatine family. Hendrick Folckers "Van Jever in Oldenburgert" m. 26 Feb 1655 NYC Ref Ch, Geertje Claes, from New Amsterdam.

Abraham Volck was mentioned in a Bergen County Road Return dated 23 Sep 1743, which was recorded at the request of Isaac Boogaert. Landmarks mentioned in the Return were the mill of Roelof Van Houten, land of Coenraad Stor, land of Johannes Pillesfelt, land of Barent Van Horne, land of Abraham Volck, meeting with Ramapogh Road.<sup>1</sup>

Andreas Volck, Husbandman and Vinyard, age 30; his wife Ana Catharina, age 27; and their three children, Maria Barbara Volckin, age 5; Georg Hieronymus Volek, age 4; and Anna Gertrauda Volckin, age 1, were listed in “The Names, Trades & ct of the German Protestants to be Settled at New York,” compiled 28 June 1708. Andreas Valch/Andrew Volck was one of the nine original patentees of Newburgh, NY. He later removed to Pennsylvania.

They settled in Lynn Township, Lehigh Co., PA by 1735. The family became Moravian.

Dirck Volkerts de Noorman, from Bergen, Norway (but residents of Hoorn, North Holland), first came to Nieu Nederlant with his brother, Cornelis Volckertsen, on a trading voyage in 1613 as captain in command of the ship *Nightengale*.<sup>2</sup>

He returned to settle here possibly as early as 1625 (note - some sources say he came by way of Hoorn.). He was a ship's carpenter, later a farmer. He was brought over with a group of Northmen by Secretary Isaac de Raisiere, because "They would know how to render pitch from the pine trees."

Maria (Vigne) Verplanck, and her sister Christina (Vigne) Volckertzen, their husbands and children, continued to live with Ariantje (Cuvilje) Vigne after her second marriage, to "Old Jan" Damen, on Manhattan, just north of the Wall, until 1638. In 1638, their growing families becoming too much for "Old Jan," he chased them all out, injuring Christina, and obtained a court order to secure his action. Declaration of Maurits Jansen and Pieter de Mey regarding an attempt of Jan Damen to throw Dirck Holgersen's wife out of doors: This day, the 22nd of July 1638, before me, Cornelis van Tienhoven, secretary of New Netherland, appeared Maurits Jansen (1) assistant, aged 20 years, and Pieter de May, aged 24 years, and jointly declared by true Christian words in place and with promise of an oath, if necessary, that it is true and truthful that the wife of Dirck Holgersen, Noorman, being at the house of Jan Damen and said Jan Damen telling her that she must go out of the house, she refused and did not intend to leave the house, whereupon Jan Damen aforesaid pushed said Dirck Holgersen's wife out of the house, as she would not depart by fair words. Dirck Holgersen thereupon coming to defend his wife, Jan Damen, drawing a knife, made a cut at said Dirck Holgersen, who took up a post and struck Jan Damen with it. This is all. They, the deponents, concluding herewith their declaration, etc. Signed Maurits Jansen and Pieter de Mey.<sup>1</sup>

"Declaration of surgeon Gerrit Schutt and Jan Pietersen respecting the above assault. "this day, the 22nd of July 1638, before me, Cornelis van Tienhoven, appeared Gerrit Schut and Jan Gietersen, alias Comrade Jan, (1) at the request of Dirck Holgersen, Noorman, and jointly declared by Christian words, in place and with promise of an oath if necessary, that it is true and truthful that they, the deponents, being some days ago at the house of Jan Damen, there saw and heard what follows. First, Jan Damen dunning Dirck Volckertsen for payment of fl.30, Dirck answered that he did not owe him anything. Jan Damen thereupon replied: "Begone out of the house!" and forthwith threw Christine, Dirck Holgersen's wife, out of doors and struck her. Furthermore, drawing a knife, he cut and thrust at said Dirck Holgersen's wife, as appears from the skirt which she then had on. Further, Dirck Holgersen, seeking to defend his wife, threw a pewter can at Jan Damen, but missed him, whereupon Jan Damen made for him with a naked knife in his hand, cutting and thrusting at him and, as the said Dirck sought to defend his life, Dirck aforesaid took up a post to keep Jan Damen off. As Dirck Holgersen was going toward the fort or elsewhere, said Jan Damen again beat Dirck Volgersen's wife with his fists and tore the cap off her head and challenged Dirck, saying: "If you have the courage, draw your knife". But Dirck, being sober, would not do so and only defended himself with a post. The deponents declared all this to be true. Done at Fort Amsterdam, the day and year aforesaid. Signed Gerrit Schutt and Jan Pietersen, nicknamed Comrade Jan made his X." The Volckertszens went to Green Point (Bushwick on Long Island), and the Verplancks to Bergen (now Jersey City), and lived there until the Indian Wars of 1643-44 brought them back to Manhattan. The families built adjoining houses on Smits Vly (Pearl Street from Wall Street north).

Between 1638-45, Dirck owned and probably occupied a large house at 125 Pearl Street, just below the Wall. He sold this house in 1645 and in 1648, Sgt Daniel Litschoe converted it into a tavern. In 1691, Captain Kidd lived half a block south of here.

On May 1, 1638, Dirck gave a note for 720 Guilders to Director Kieft. Dirck and Christina settled at Green Point, Bushwick (Brooklyn), across the East River. They bought 4-500 acres of land from the Indians in 1638. It was between Mespeth (Maspeth) Kill and Norman's Kill (named for him). On the north was Newtown Creek. In 1643 and 1655, the Indians burned his property and killed 2 of his sons-in-law. They returned to Manhattan during the Indian War of 1643-45, and built a house at Smits Vly, next to Abraham Ver Planck, on land bought from Cornelius Van Tienhoven, a brother-in-law (Aug 4, 1649) at the East River and Maiden Lane. He later divided this property into lots and sold them. He later owned other lots on Manhattan, as part of his wife's inheritance from her parents and step-father. [Damen had owned land from Pine St to Maiden Lane from the East River to the Hudson River.

On May 18, 1639, Kieft leased him a bouwery and stock "on halves", near Van Tienhoven's at Smits Vly. In Nov, 1642, he sold a house and lot on Manhattan to Govert Aertsen. On Apr 3, 1645, he obtained a grant of 25 morgens on the East River, at Maspeth Kill. He built a stone house here about 1645, which remained occupied for 200 years. He sold a portion of this, Sep 9, 1653, to Jacob Hay/Haes, who prob m. his dau Christina. On Jun 2, 1647, he gave a lease of land to Jochem Calder, on Long Island. On Mar 22, 1651, he sold a 22 morgen parcel at Maspeth Kill to Peter Hudde and Abraham Jansen. On Sep 18, 1651, he sold to Roelof Teunissen, a Swedish sea captain, a house and lot in Smith's Valley, on Manhattan. He had owned this land since 1645 and built the house on it. (Now 259 Pearl Street.) On Sep 9, 1653, he sold to Jacob Jansen Hey/Huys/Haes, 25 morgens of land and 6 morgens of valley at Maspeth Kill, along the river. By 1655, the Village of Boswyck (Bushwick) was incorporated with 22 families living there. On Oct 15, 1653, he sold a lot at Smith's Valley, on the strand, to Hage Bruynsen from Sweden. On Oct 15, 1655, he was taxed 10 florins. In 1657, he deeded Roeloff Teunissen some property on Pearl Street near the north corner of Lane, which he had acquired Aug 4, 1649.

In 1658 he was city carpenter. In Apr 1657, he acquired small burgher rights in New Amsterdam. On Oct 17, 1661, he conveyed a 1/4 part of his wife's inheritance (except the 1/8 part of a little field to pasture cattle) on the Maadge Paadje, in the rear of Lybbet Tysen. In 1662, he was a landowner at Bushwick and petitioned to have a road made through his land. In 1663, he served with the town's militia and in 1664, he was Supt of Fencing. In 1674, he still owned a house in NYC (located on the West side of Pearl St, between Franklin Square and Wall St), then Smith's Valley. Assessed in Bushwick, 1675, NYC in 1677. He gave some of his land to the village of Bushwick. Magistrate of Bushwick, 1681. Ensign, local militia, 1689.

That Dirck was a rough and ready man, as were most of these early settlers, is shown by old court records. He was called before the Magistrate for knifing a fellow card player whom he caught cheating, and would have no doubt been banished from the Colony had not his brother-in-law, Cornelis Van Tienhoven, interceded for him.

His in-laws were influential in the colony. Abraham Verplanck had accompanied the Director-General on his wars to chase the Swedes out of their Delaware Settlement, and had been granted "All the land he wanted along the South River"



(Delaware). Another brother-in-law, Jan Vigne, was the magistrate of New Amsterdam.

Dirck Volkerts left his sizable holdings to his son Volkert. The daughters received bequests of cash as their shares. When Volkert died without a will, the once large estate was divided amongst all the heirs, and the old stone homestead was acquired by a female descendant. Two of Volkert's sons, Dirck and Phillip, were already living in Somerset County in the Province of New Jersey, where they owned considerable land along the Raritan River. The "cadet" (younger) son Nicholas remained in Brooklyn.

Signed Hendericus Kuyper, Garret Lydecker and James Bourd. Witnessed by John Day and Philip Bourd [Board].<sup>2</sup>

It may be this "Hendrick Folk" who is listed in the 1779 Harrington Township Rateables with 118 taxable acres; and in the Feb. 1780 Harrington Township Rateables with 122 taxable acres, 2 horses, 4 cattle, 4 hogs, and a tavern.
