

-- FOLLY --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

According to Judith Courter Ullman, there is a tradition that the Folley family was of Indian heritage.

On 7 Jan 1824 William and Anna Folly of Franklin sell to Abraham Folly of Franklin land in Franklin known as Fluata [Flacta > Flatts?] for \$201.25. It is by land of Adam Folly, John W. Bogart, Jacob Bonper [Bamper] and Daniel Shurte. William and Anna were interviewed 12 Jan 1824 by Jno. A. Van Voorhees. Recorded and Received on 29 Jan 1824.²

On 7 Jan 1828, Ann and William Folley, of Franklin, sells to Abraham Folly, of Franklin for \$150 land containing 16 94/100. It is on the road from Ramapo to New Prospect, it is by lands of Adam Folly to lands of William Folly to lands of

Abraham Foley. Witness, John A. VanVoorhees. Interviewed 9 Jan 1828 by John A. VanVoorhees. Received and Recorded 31 Jan 1828.²

On 2 May 1833 Abraham Folly, Peter I. Terhune, and Garret VanDein Ex. for William Folly, late of Franklin Twsp according to will dated 4 Feb 1828 he directed ex. to sell homestead farm of 30 acres at death or remarriage of wife. On 12 Dec 1834 Abraham and Catherine Folly sell to John Halsted all of Franklin Township for \$1.00 land to modify another deed 31 May 1831 where a mistake was made in description of land. It is by the public road leading to Godwinville and contains 3 acres. Witnesses were William A. Folly and Garret VanDien. Interviewed by Garret VanDien. Received and Recorded 4 Nov 1835.²

On 11 Jun 1834 Daniel Thomas and Margaret, his wife, of Franklin sell to Abraham Folly of Franklin 11 87/100 acres of land in Franklin for \$189.96. This land is bounded north by Abraham Folly, east by heirs of John VanBlarcom, south by lands of John Terwiliger and west by lands of Daniel Thomas. Interviewed 11 Jun 1834 by Garret VanDien. Received and Recorded 11 Jun 1834.²

1840 NJ, Bergen, Franklin Township census: Abraham Folley, 1 male 15-20, 1 male 20-30, 1 male 40-50, 1 female -5, 2 females 5 to 10, 2 females 10-15, 2 females 15-20, 1 females 20-30, 1 female 40-50. Neighbors: John Christopher, Charles Johnson, 4 folley brothers, Stephen and James VanBlarcom, Daniel Blauvelt, Lewis VanBlarcom Timothy Hagerty, John Ackerson, Lewis Miskler, Isaac Everson, John A. Abraham and Adaline Folly were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, Franklin Twp, dwelling 238, family 254. Abraham Folly, aged 56, a farmer with \$3000 real estate all b NJ; Adaline, aged 56; Rachel, aged 16; Mary, aged 11; Eveline, aged 7. Neighbors: Edward O'Neal, Barney Dogherty, Cesar Gray, Samuel Halsted, Henry DeGraw, Abraham Blauvelt, Daniel Blauvelt, Lewis VanBlarcom, Henry Marks, Abraham Hannen, Albert Smith, and Lewis Michelor.

She was listed in the 1860 Federal Census, New Jersey, Bergen Co., Franklin Township, Godwinville P.O., Dwelling 416, Family 466, enumerated 26 July 1860 -- Catharine Foley, 62, b. NJ; Evaline [Foley], 16, b. NJ; Margaret Youmans, 26, b. NJ; Margaret Youmans, 9, b. NJ; Abraham Terhune, 16, Farm Laborer, b. NJ.

The will of Abraham Folley written 17 Sep 1857, NJ, Bergen Cty #5476B. In the name of God, Amen I Abraham Foley Farmer of the township of Franklin county of Bergen State of NJ being of sound mind, memory and understanding for which blessing I thank God do make and publish this my last will and testament in the manner following that is to say. First it is my will and I do order that all my just debts and funeral expenses be duly paid and satisfied as soon as conveniently can be after my decease. Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Catharine all my real and personal estate until her death or intermarriage of the said Catharine. 2nd at the intermarriage of the said Catharine that she shall take as much of the furniture as she wishes and one cow. 3rd It is my wish and request that all my property both real and personal should be equally divided between my children William, Letty, Margaret, Adolphus, Ann, Eliza Jane, Sarah Catharine, Rachel, Mary. Emaline provided that the aforesaid children should have arrived to lawful age except Emaline at the time of her marriage she is to receive one hundred and twenty five dollars for her out set in addition to her share as aforesaid. 4th Its is my wish and request that if the youngest of my children should not have arrived to lawful age at the time of the death or intermarriage of my said wife that my property should then remain undivided until the youngest of my children becomes of lawful age. 5th It is my wish and request that if either of my children should die before the division of my property takes place and should leave lawful issue that their said issue should receive the part that would have been coming to the child or children dying as aforesaid. 6th It is my wish and request that if my wife Catharine should wish to sell my real estate she has the privilege so to do the same as I myself in my time of living and the proceeds to be put in trust and the in trust for the use of Catherine. Lastly I here by appoint my sons William A. and Adolphus A. Foley executors and my wife Catharine Executrix of this my last will and testament in witness where of I have here unto set my hand and seal this seventeenth day of Sept in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven. Abraham Folley Witnesses Daniel D. Depew & Stephen VanBlarcom. Inventory completed 8 July 1859. Household goods and equipment of a farmer. Bond and mortgage of William A. Foley date 10 May 1849 \$452.00. Note of Margaret Post dated 1 May 1859 300.00. Note of Anna Males dated 9 Feb 1859 30.00. Note of Abraham G. Ryerson dated 25 Jan 1858 50.00. Note of David A. Courter dated 6 July 1857 20.00. Cash 100.00. Total \$1431.²

Catherine Shurte, wife of Abraham Folley, dec'd, was listed as "Dismissed" in the 1 April 1865 membership list of the Wyckoff Ref Ch.

In her will (filed and proved 16 May 1889 in Essex Cty #22716G), she wrote: I Catherine A. Folley of the Township of Caldwell in the County of Essex and State of NJ being of sound mind, memory and understanding (for which blessing I thank God) do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say. First, Its is my Will and I do order that all my just Debts be duly paid and satisfied as soon as can be after my decease. Item, I give and bequeath unto my Daughters herein after mentioned to Wit. Lettie DeBaun, Margaret Post, Rachel Anderson, Mary Courter and Emma Courter all of my clothing and Furniture to be divided between them share and share alike and if either of them should die before my decease, their portion, It is hereby my will and I do order shall be equally divided among the surviving ones. Item. I give and bequeath to Rachel C. Odell, Millard F. Underdonk, Abraham F. Coe and Sarah A. Crane the sum of Fifty Dollars each. Item. I give and bequeath to my Deceased Son, Adolphus Folley's, Children: viz-Margaret C. Davie the sum of Fifty Dollars, Cornelia Garretson the sum of Twenty Dollars, Elizabeth Folley the sum of Ten Dollars, Abraham Folley the sum of ten Dollars and Mary Folley the sum of Ten Dollars. Item. I give and bequeath to my Grandson Judson Males the son of my deceased daughter, Annie Males, the sum of One Hundred Dollars, provided he should be living at the time of my decease. If not to be divided among my surviving children share and share alike. Item. I give and bequeath to my children William Folley, Lettie DeBaun, Margaret Post, Rachel Anderson, Mary Courter and Emma Courter all the residue of my Personal property share and share alike, but if any of my above children should die before my decease leaving a child or children the sum of one hundred dollars to be equally divided between them share and share alike. Lastly. I hereby appoint John DeBaun, Aaron Courter and William Folley- Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this ninth day of May in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty Five. Catharine A. (X) Folley, her

Mark. Signed, Sealed, Published and declared by the said Catharine A. Folley to be her last Will and Testament in the presence of us who were present at the same time and subscribed our names as witnesses in the presence of the testator and at her request. Mathias S. Canfield, Owen M. Beach. Joseph Kierstead and Aaron E. Stagg did inventory on 14 May 1889. -- Cash on hand, Sept 14th 1888, 115.30; Cash on hand in settlement of Folley vs Males in Passaic Circuit Court, now in hands of Wm A. Folley, \$696.00; Bond and Mortgage on Aaron Courter place in Caldwell Township --- paid to May 1st 1888. Face of Mortgage, \$1000.00; Note Aaron Courter, interest paid to May 1st 1888 face 250.00; Note of Aaron Courter, interest paid to May 1st 1888 face, 100.00; Note of Aaron Courter, interest paid to May 1st 1888 face, 50.00; Note of William A. The property is part of Lot 35 (137 acres) on the Ramapo Tract map, having belonged to Abr. Blauvelt 27 Jan 1787. The earliest part of the house was thought to have been built about 1770-1800; the newer section may have been built about 1860s. On part of the property was the only cranberry bog in Bergen County.¹

The will of Adam Folley, written 29 Jan 1857 and proved 20 Apr 1857 states the following information: Adam Folley of Franklin Township, Bergen, NJ, wife, no name, to receive all of estate, at her death sons, David Alyea and William Alyea, 2 lots of land in Franklin containing 14 acres and 1 acre, land described being near public road leading from Ramapo to New Prospect, by Garret VanDien, John A. Smith, James VanBlarcom. These two lots were purchased from Abraham J. Hopper and Adam Alyea. executors, Abraham Lozier, friend, and David Foley, son, Witnesses, John B. Wortendyke, Benjamin Smith, and Abrm VanBlarcom. Appraisers are Samuel Coe and John VanBlarcom, There are two small notes owed by Samuel Coe and Harry Hogland.²

In 1778 William Folly owned 100 acres of land in Franklin. Neighbors were: Samuel Day, Isaac Sisco, Joost Degrote, William Dam, James Jachlin, Albert Cornall, Conrad Stagg, Henry Oldis, John Fell, Esq., Wiert Banta, Jacob Valentine, Henry Laubach.

In 1779 William Folly owned 100 acres of land in Franklin. He was on exempt list for 1779 with 100 acres of land. New neighbors were Philip Hoofman, Sylvester Sisco.

In Feb 1780 William Folly owned 50 acres of improved land 50 acres of unimproved land. Next to him is a Peter Folly with 120 acres of improved land and 100 acres of unimproved land. New neighbor was Michael Fisher. In Aug 1780 William Folly owned 40 acres of improved land and 60 acres of unimproved land. Neighbors include: John Doremus, Jacob and Joost Debaun, Albert and Henry Terhune, Albert, Abraham and William Ackerman, Peter Goetchius. In Dec 1780 William Folly owned 40 acres of improved land and 60 acres of unimproved land. Added to this list of neighbors are Leah Terhune, more Ackerman and Hopper family.

In 1784 William Folly owned 100 acres of land in Franklin. The neighbors now switch back to list of people before Aug 1780. Added to list are Thomas and Peter Rapp.

William Folly's 1832 will names as executors Abraham Folly, son; Peter I. or J. Terhune, no relationship given; Garret VanDean, no relationship given.²

He is poss. the "old William Folly from Turnpike" who, according to Martha Ann Zabriskie's Diary, d. 16 Jan 1832. If so, he probably lived in what became Allendale Borough, which was known in the early 1800s as "The Turnpike" taking its name from the Franklin Turnpike, which runs through the town.

The following transaction may cite this William Folly's land as a boundary:

On 24 May 1806 (recorded 12 July 1806, Bergen Co. Y:169) Albert Zabriskie of the County of Bergen, yeoman, and Mary, his wife, conveyed to Peter Allen of the same place, Carpenter, for \$175., 6-1/4 acres, 38 square rods in the Township of Franklin, beginning corner of land of William Folly; Abraham Ackerman; heirs of Peter Debow, deceased. Bounded N by William Folly; E by Abraham J. Ackerman; S by said Albert Zabriskie; E by land of heirs of Peter Debow. Signed by Albert Zabriskie, Mary Zabriskie (her mark). Witnessed by Abraham A. Quackenbush, Abrm. Westervelt.³

William Folly was listed in the 1830 Federal Census: 1830 US Census, NJ, Bergen, Franklin Township, William Folley 2 males -5, 2 males 5 to 10, 1 male 10 to 15, 1 male 40-50, 1 male 90-100, 1 female 5-10, 1 female 10-15, 2 females 20-30, 1 female 30-40, 1 female 70-80. Neighbors were Albert G. Hopper, James Brinckerhoff, David and Peter D. Ackerman, John Bush, Abraham Vanderbeek, Hermanus Vanderbeek, John Zabriskie, Tobias Smith, Aaron Ackerman, Henry Marks, Albert Garrison, John Labach, Jacob Smith, Anthony Crouter, Henry Poorle, Barney Spear, John G. Ackerman, Abraham Quackenbush, John Carlough, Harmanus Smith, Henry Young.

William Folley, of the Township of Franklin, Bergen, NJ made his last will and testament on 4 Feb 1828. To his wife, Anna Folley, during her natural life or widowhood all my real estate, also, two beds and bedding, two cows, one hog and as much of my household furniture as she shall need to keep house. The remainder of my personal estate to be sold at auction to pay my debts and to pay for wife's upkeep. To my son, William W. Folley, land in his possession containing 33 acres, being on the west side of my farm purchased from John Stephens adjoining the land of Henry Bogert, also, all my blacksmith tools. To my son, Abraham Folley, thirty three acres of land where on he now lives lying on the east side of land devised to my son William. To my son, David Folley, six acres and 6/100 of an acre, lying on the east side of lands devised to and now in possession of my son, Abraham. To my son, Adam Folley, thirty three acres of land whereon he now lives being on the east side of the farm I purchased of John Stephens. To my son, Peter Folley, a lot of land containing 14 acres bounded by lands of Peter Goestches north by Peter VanZyle, east of the Public Road. I order my homestead farm containing 30 acres sold and the money to be divided between the heirs of my son Elias Folley. To my son David Folley, \$100, after death of my wife. To my daughter, Hannah, wife of John Smith, \$100, after death of my wife. To my daughter, Clara, wife of Daniel Smith, \$100, after death of my wife. To my daughter, Sally, wife of Peter Smith, \$1, after death of my wife. To my daughter, Elizabeth, \$10, after the death of my wife. To my grandson, Albert VanBlarcom, \$10, after the death of my wife. To my daughter, Mary, wife of Peter VanZyle, \$1, after the death of my wife. I appoint my son, Abraham Folley, Peter Terhune, and Garret Van Dean, ex-

ecutors of my last will and testament. Dated 4 Feb 1828. Signed with an X. Witnesses Abner Armstrong, Albert A. Smith (X), Garret A. Smith (X).² 10 Dec 1831, Codicil, grandson, Albert now deceased. Witnesses, Henry A. Hopper, Anthony Crouter, Andrew H. Hopper. Everyone swore as witnesses to signing of will and codicil 24 Jan 1832.²

Inventory value, \$159.24. Appraisers, Henry A. Hopper and Albert A. Smith. 1833.²

2 May 1833, Abraham Folly, Peter I. Terhune, and Garret VanDein Ex. for William Folly, late of Franklin Twsp according to will dated 4 Feb 1828 he directed ex. sell homestead farm of 30 acres at death or remarriage of wife. They sold two tracts for \$1880.07 to Aaron A. Ackerman. One on west side of Franklin Tpke, by Albert Garrison land, road from Franklin Turnpike to Ryerson's Mill containing 18 29/100 acres. The second lot beginning on east side public road containing 92/100 acres on the Franklin Turnpike, along line of Peter P. Ackerman and Albert Garrison. Witnesses Albert Garrison, John Lawbach. Interviewed 2 May 1833 by John G. Ackerson. Received and recorded 6 May 1833.²

2 May 1833, Abraham Folly, Peter I. Terhune, and Garret VanDein Ex. for William Folly, late of Franklin Twsp according to will dated 4 Feb 1828 he directed ex. sell homestead farm of 30 acres at death or remarriage of wife. They sold two tracts for \$614.23 to Abraham Garrison, of Franklin. First lot on the west side of Franklin Tpke by lands of Albert Garrison and Aaron A. Ackerman containing 9-64/100 acres of land. 2nd lot by land of Anthony Crouter, Aaron A. Ackerman and Peter P. Ackerman and Franklin Tpke. It contained 1 49/100 acres. Witnesses P. M.
