

-- FONTEYN, FONTAINE --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

The Antoine/Anthony Fountain family was a separate family, no connection to the Fonteyn Family of New York and New Jersey even though at times Fonteyn was misspelled as Fountain. Antoine alias Anthony Fountain was of Staten Island, Richmond County New York. I briefly mention this on the first page in my article "Which Charles Fountyn?" beginning in the Nov 2009 issue of *New Netherland Connections*. Abraham Van Tine, of Middlesex Co., NJ, formerly a Private in the New Jersey Militia (in the Revolution?), was listed as a pensioner in 1835. He was placed on the pension roll on 25 April 1833; pension commenced 4 March 1831.²

Abraham Van Tine, of Middlesex Co., NJ on 12 Sep 1832, when he was about 72 years of age, and having served in the New Jersey Militia during the Revolution, applied for a military pension (No. New Jersey 9289). He had no record of his birth because his family's records were destroyed in the Revolution. He served under a Captain Lott, and Lieut. James Sickles. He enlisted at Millstone, in Somerset Co., NJ, where he then lived. Immediately after his enlistment he removed to New Brunswick, NJ and then to Elizabeth, in Essex Co., NJ. He served 6 months; then enlisted again for 5 months under Lieut. Nixon. He also served under Capt Adam Hylar [Huylar?], who commanded a company of whale boats at New Brunswick. He was taken prisoner and was in the Provost prison in NYC for 7 months. Other names he recalled serving under: Capt. Peter Nevius. Other names who could testify to his service: Darby Oram. Abraham Van Tine made his mark to this document. There is no genealogical information in this document except his estimated birth date, and his death date.¹

Charel Fonteyn, Frenchman (Huguenot emigrant) and his wife Catharyn de Baile sailed aboard *der Vergulde Beaver* de-

parting from Holland 17 May 1658. They settled first in New Amsterdam and later in Bushwick, Kings Co., NY.²

Charles Ffontaine and wife Katrina of Boswyck wrote their will 1 Aug 1687 directing that their estate was to go to the survivor until his or her death or remarriage and then was to be divided equally among their children. The eldest son, not named, was to receive "100 guildens." Upon the death of both Charel and Catharyn, their youngest child, Charles Ffontaine, was to receive "600 guildens Wampum value."²

Carel/Charles Fonteyn settled at Six-Mile Run, Somerset County, N. J., where both he and his wife became members of the Dutch church in 1710. He was an elder in the church in 1711. The name "Fonteyn" later became "Van Tyne" and "Vantine."

In his will, dated 30 April 1733 Somerset Co., Charles Fontine/Fontyne, yeoman; mentioned wife, Eleanor. Oldest son, Charles, land upon Raritan River, Somerset Co., "adjoining where my son Johannes now lives, which joins land of my son Abraham." Other children--Maritje, Leah, Reynier, Jacob. Executors--Sons Charles, Reynier, Johannes, Jacob, Abraham, and son-in-law, Cornelius Suydam. 1733, April 30. Codicil. Son, Abraham, to live on plantation one year after death of testator. Same witnesses. Proved 17 May, 1734.

Charles Fontaine wrote his will 24 March, 1766, he of New Brunswick, Middlesex County, NJ, died prior to May 26, 1766, giving a list of the children of his first wife, and mentions his wife Sophia and her four children, Executor his friend John Ryder, witnesses, John Whitlock, George Rollin and Reuben Runyon.

Another version of the will: New Jersey Colonial Documents, Vol. 33, p. 150: 24 Mar 1766 Charles Fountain of New Brunswick, Middlesex Co: will of, son- Charles 10 shillings, (this is double what the others receive); son-Ephra. 5 shillings. Sons-John and Samuel, each 5 shillings. Dau-Mary Snoterly 5 shillings. Daughters- Hannah Fisher, Cathrin Blackhorn, Sarah Hays and Jemime Higbe, each 5 shillings. Rest to be divided between my wife, Sophira, my sons, Isaac, Abram and Jacob, and my daughter, Eve. Executor--friend John Ryder. I give to my last wife's four children an equal share with my wife, when my said children are brought up. Witnesses--John Whitlock, George Rollin, Reuben Runyon. Proved May 26, 1766, Lib. H, p. 612.¹

The cattle mark of Vincent Fountain was recorded in 1701, and he gave his age in 1706 for the census as 36. He served in the militia in 1715.¹

I leave to my son Vincent, 150 acres of land and meadow in Middlesex County, New Jersey. It being 1/2 of a tract of land of 300 acres. "It is my will that my much honored mother, Sarah Dye, shall be decently maintained, and sufficiently provided for, out of my estate, and to be tended attendance as her feeble and old age shall require." I leave to my wife Anne certain slaves, and the use of property during widowhood. I make my wife and my sons, and "my beloved friend and nephew, Stephen Marteneau," executors. Witnesses, William Voorhis, Rem Vanderbeek, John Dupuy. Proved, June 14, 1732.
