The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Benjamin Fowler, of Flushing, in Queens County, yeoman, "being now very much indisposed in body." I leave to my beloved grandson, William Fowler, son of my son William, 5 shillings. I leave to my dearly well beloved wife Hannah "a negro woman, and her children, which she has or shall have," also a negro man and 1/2 of my movable state, and the use of 1/2 of my house and lands, "Except one negro man named Jube and he is to be sold, and my executors are to take the money to pay the bonds that I am bound for my son Moses." I leave to my son David all my land and meadow, and all my right and title in Flushing or elsewhere, and he shall pay to my executors £60, to go towards said bonds. I leave to my son Moses all my movable estate except £30. My son David is to pay to Mary, the now wife of Ezekiel Roe, £100, in four yearly payments. "After my wife's decease if it should so happen that my daughter Jemima should live and return from her elopement, and demand her negro wench 'Ginn,' which is dead, her eldest child shall be delivered unto my said daughter Jemima, with all her household goods which did belong to her." I leave to my son John a negro wench. I leave to my daughter Mary, wife of Ezekiel Roe, a negro wench. To my grandsons, Thomas and Moses Fowler, sons of my son Benjamin, £15 each. I make my wife and son John, executors. Dated April 8, 1769. Witnesses, John Earl, Benjamin Field, Stephen Ryder. Proved, February 24, 1772.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Edmund Fowler, of East Chester, yeoman, being of sound mind. I leave to my eldest son Gilbert, £200, after the decease of my wife Rachel, or sooner if my executors think fit. I leave to my son Edward all my lands in East

Chester at a place called Hutchins, which I bought of Jasper Drake as by deed; Also the lands and meadows I bought of Thomas Shute or his assignee, at Hutchins, aforesaid, except 7 acres of land and 2 acres of salt meadow and house, barn and Gristmill, lying north of the house and mills, and to be measured adjoining to the same. And he is to pay to my son Solomon £50, when of age. My wife Rachel is to have the use of 1/3 of said lands. My executors are to sell the said 7 acres of land and the house, barn, and mill, for the best price they can get, and the money to be put at interest for my son Solomon, when of age. I leave to my son Edward, 4 acres of salt meadows, which I bought of Samuel Fowler, lying at Hutchins. I leave to my wife Rachel the use of all the rest of my real estate for the use of herself, and for bringing up the children during twelve years. But if she dies, or is married, the executors are to sell all the rest of my estate, and to give good deeds to the purchasers. My wife is to have £300, and my best bed, etc., 10 silver spoons, a silver tumbler, and 6 tea spoons. The £200 to be paid to my son Gilbert out of the residuary estate. "My son Solomon is to be put at a School or Colledge, and give him learning fit to qualify him to be a Doctor." All the rest I leave to my 3 daughters, Rachel, Hannah, and Abigail. I make my wife Rachel and my friends, John Bartow and Anthony Bartow, executors. Dated November 30, 1747. Witnesses, Bartholemew Foye, Nathan Palmer, Elizabeth Flood. Proved, before Israel Honeywell, Esq., January 5, 1747/8.

In his will, he wrote: ...September 15, 1746. I, Gilbert Fowler, of Mamaroneck in Westchester County, being very sick. I leave to my brother, Joseph Fowler, £10, and to his eldest son, £40. All the rest of my movable estate to the youngest son of my brother Henry, and to the son of my brother, Henry Griffin. To William Burton's son John I give all my land joining to William Burton, it being 20 acres. I leave to Gilbert Budd, son of Underhill Budd, my land by John Griffin's. I leave to Mary Barker, my niece, and to my brother Henry Fowler my house, and to William Barker and Henry Griffin my clothes. Witnesses, James (???), Mark Giffin, Trustrum Sobe. Proved, March 27, 1747. There being no executors, Letters of administration are granted to Henry Giffin, in right of his wife Anne, formerly Anne Fowler, sister of Gilbert Fowler.

Henry emigrated to U.S about 1652 from Hambleton, England to Roxbury, MA (Now Boston). He was an ironmonger (blacksmith).

One account states that he arrived from London, England to Roxbury, MA, with Joshua Foote, "Ironmonger and Citizen of London" about 1652 or 1653, and accompanied him to Providence in January 1654.¹

Abraham Newell was his neighbor in Roxbury in 1652. Moved to Providence, R.I. where he resided from 1654 to 1665. Married Rebecca Newell in 1665. On June 4, 1655 Henry received a rebuke from Roger Williams and Providence for getting married prior to obtaining a marriage license. His explanation was that he was unable to obtain one because of the division of the town.

He was one of the Patentees of Eastchester, but it does not appear he ever lived there. He may have purchased his lands there with the intention of giving them to his son Henry, who did possess them after his father's death In 1666 his land was mentioned as a boudary when pieces of land were laid out in Eastchester. Henry Fowler's name is on the list of those whp took refuge at Muscatoe Cove (now Glen Cove), L.I., in 1676, as "having land assigned them," or who were in the employ of the Five Proprietors.¹

Henry Fowler received 74 acres and 37 acres respectively in the two divisions of land in Providence in 1675; and had land granted him in Eastchester in 1678. In 1678-9 he was ordered to maintain a fence on one side of his "whome lot," in Eastchester. On 17 March 1683-4, there was a draft of 92 acres of land to Henry Fowler on the "west side of 7 mile" in Providence; and in 1684, Henry Fowler of Mamaroneck deeded 60 acres of land in Providence to his son-in-law William Randall of Providence.¹

Henry Fowler, Sr. is definitely known to have been living in Mamaroneck in 1680 when he entered into an agreement , together with Thomas Hatfield, John Richbell and his own son-in-law Richard Ward, to build a sawmill there. Each of the above-named was to stand one fourth of the expense of building, and consequently, to receive one fourth of the profits. The exception to this was the iron work which belonged to Henry Fowler alone, as he, being an "iron monger" attended to this part of the business himself....Henry Fowler had purchased all the rights of Jeremiah Caniff in the Mamaroneck Township. This included houselot number one, and a 15-acre piece of fresh meadow lying dfractly behind the houselot to the northwest, across the Sheldrake river, which fresh meadow was bounded by both the Mamaroneck river and the Sheldrake. This right which Henry Fowler purchased from Jeremiah Caniff included also an allotment of salt meadow on Great Neck, and an eighth share in the undivided lands of Mamaroneck.¹

He died in the latter part of 1687, but because of his many and varied holdings and intersts, his estate wasn't settled until Dec.6, 1704 (administered by his son, Henry Fowler). An inventory of the estate had been taken in 1687 by Thomas Hatfield and Robert Bloomer, Sr.¹

Henry Fowler administered his father's estate, and immediately following his father's death in 1687, he assumed the title of Henry Fowler, Sr. He settled at Eastchester.¹

Henry Fowler, wife Abigail, and children Henry, Moses, William, John, Abigail, Rebecca, Susan, and Elener were listed on the 1698 Census at Eastchester.¹

Henry Fowler in 1701 was a member of the Colonial Assembly from Westchester Co., and was Supervisor of Eastchester in 1708. He was a Justice of the Peace. He frequently bought and sold land. He was one of the proprietors of the second or Long Reach Patent in Eastchester.

In his will, he wrote: ...March 3, 1730. I, Henry Fowler, Sr., of Eastchester, in the County of Westchester, being in health of body. I leave to my wife Sarah, the use of my dwelling-house and garden, during the time she remains my widow, and 1/3 of my movables. I leave to my son Henry 5 shillings, he having received the rest of his portion already. To my daughter, Abigail Morgan, 5 shillings, she having received her portion already. To my son Moses, 5 shillings, he having received his portion already. To my son-in-law, John Ward, 5 shillings. I leave to my son, William Fowler, 2 1/2 acres of land in Eastchester, on the northermost side of the Boston road as the said land was laid out by Palmer Doughty, Abraham Hyatt, and others. I also leave him £20. To my daughter, Susanah Ferris, 5 shillings. To my daughter, Eleanor Fowler, £10. To my son Edmund, 5 shillings, he having received his portion already. To my daughter, Mary Drake, 5 shillings, she having received her portion. The rest of my movable estate is to go to my said daughters and to my grand-daughter, Freelove Ward. I leave to my son, John Fowler, all and singular my houses, tenements, messuages, and buildings, to him and his heirs forever. I make my sons, Moses and William, executors. Witnesses, Elijah Taylor, John Miner, John Cuer. Proved, December 5, 1733.

In his will, he wrote: ...July 2, 1734. I, Henry Fowler, of Mamaroneck, in Westchester County, being sick and weak. I leave to my eldest son, (???) Fowler, 10 shillings and 1/3 of all my wearing clothes and 1/3 of all my armour, in full for all his claim as my eldest son and heir-at-law. I leave to my second son, Henry Fowler, my dwelling house, and lot unto the same belonging, And all my land from thence upward until it shall include my field "called ye Winfield," all of which lyeth adjoining to the "westernmost side of the road that leads from ye Country road, near Mamaroneck river, to ye Manour of Scarsdale;" Also 1/2 of all my salt meadow; Also 1/3 of my wearing clothes and 1/3 of my armour. I leave to my third son, Gilbert, "my Headly field so called," with the Homacks, and all my land thereto adjoining, on the east side of the road to the Manor of Scarsdale; Also 1/2 of my salt meadow, and 20 acres of land to be measured off the upper end of my Great lot, so called; Also the nursery of apple trees in the orchard near my dwelling house, and 1/3 of all my wearing apparell, and 1/3 of my armour. My son Henry is to pay to Joseph Fowler, the eldest child of my son Joseph, £20, on the 25th of December, 1740; Also he is to pay to my grand daughters, Sarah, wife of Underhill Budd, and Jane, wife of William Barker, each £10, on December 25, 1742. All the rest of my lands and tenements I leave to my sons Henry and Gilbert. I leave to my youngest daughter, Anne Fowler, all the wearing clothes and apparell that did belong to her mother, my late wife. The rest of my personal estate is to be sold "to ye best advantage," and out of the proceeds there is to be paid to my daughter Anne £80, when she is 18 years of age, and the rest to my three other daughters. The parts of my estate which are left to my sons are to be put at interest for them till they are of age. I appoint my brother, Moses Fowler, of Eastchester, and Mr. Daniel Purdy, of Rye, executors. Witnesses, Joseph Sutton, John Horton, John Horton, Sr. Proved, July 12, 1734.

In his will, he wrote: ...26 day of September, 1723. I, Jeremias Fowler, of East Chester, being very sick, I leave to my wife Elizabeth the use of my now dwelling house, lands, and meadows, within the Patent of East Chester, during her widowhood, and also one half of my movables. I leave to my son Joseph, the other half of the land I bought of Walter Thong. I leave to my son Jeremiah one acre of salt meadow which I bought of Jacob Lawrence "lying at a place called the Pieres." In his will, he wrote:...March 11, 1767. I, John Fowler, of the Precinct of Newburgh, in Ulster County, farmer, being sick. I leave to my eldest son Nehemiah all that farm of land he now lives upon, joining to Charles Tooker and Daniel Thurston, and running west to Hallit's land, Bounded north by Henry Smith and John Hasbrouck, east by Hudson river, "and he is to pay 1/2 of the Quit rent from the time he had it." If he dies without issue, then the farm is to be sold at Public Vendue, and the money paid to my sons Samuel and Isaac, and to John, Daniel, and Sarah, the children of my son Daniel, and to Thomas and Catharine, the children of my son John. If my son Nehemiah dies before his wife Abigail, she is to have two rooms in the house, and the use of three acres of land, and two cows and a horse. The land where Patrick Acom now lives I leave to my sons Samuel and Isaac, and to my granddaughters, Mary Meritt and Elizabeth Clark, and my son Samuel and my granddaughters are to have the south half. My son Samuel is to pay to my grandson, Thomas Fowler, £5, and to my granddaughters, Mary Meritt and Elizabeth Clarke, each £2 10s. The north half of said land I leave to my son Isaac, and he is to pay to his son Isaac £20, and to my granddaughter, Catharine Fowler, £10, when of age. I leave to my daughter, Elizabeth Wiggins, £25, and 1/2 of my movable estate. I leave to my grandson, Daniel Fowler, £30, and to my granddaughter, Sarah

Fowler, £20, they being the children of my son Daniel. I leave to Phebe and Abigail Becour £8 each. The rest of my money I leave to my sons Samuel and Isaac, and to my daughter, Elizabeth Wiggins, and the other half of my movable estate to my granddaughters, Sarah Conklin, and Elizabeth Kniffin, and Abigail Kniffin. I leave to my sons Samuel and Isaac all my woolen clothes, "and my son Isaac is to have the new sute, and my son Samuel is to have the old sute." I leave all my linnen to Daniel Kniffen and Stephen Wiggins. And what land remains unsold on the south side of my lot, I give to my son Isaac and to Stephen Wiggins. "If Stephen Wiggins does not pay the money to Brewer, which I am engaged for him, it shall be paid out of my daughter Elizabeth's share." At his marriage, Joseph Fowler settled on the homelot and mill land purchased by his father from Roger Barton in 1714, and come into full possession by will of his father dated 1723. In 1724 he was appointed Lieutenant of the local militia, serving through 1732.³

On 20 Feb 1707, Moses Fowler was a cordwainer from Eastchester, when he received a deed of gift for land in Eastchester from his father, Henry Fowler, Sr., of Eastchester. In 1709 he was appointed a 2nd Lieut. in the Eastchester Company of Westchester County Militia. In a 721 deed, he was called a carpenter.¹

In his will, dated 27 Dec 1744, probated 23 Jan 1745 (Westchester Wills Liber 15, p. 317), Moses Fowler of Eastchester, leaves to son Stephen "the land I bought of John Drake, and a piece adjoining, bought of Roger Barton, bounded east by road near Moses Hunt's land, south by Walter Briggs and running west to Bronx river, and along the river to Moses Hunt's land, and along his land to King's road, and along the road till it comes to a field called Jewells field, and along the same to land of John Archer, and along his land to first bounds. And another tract bought of Isaac Taylor and Joseph Sammon (Salmon?) and by his land to the King's road, and along that to land of John Fowler. And a piece of meadow near Sellick's land, bounded by meadow of Joseph Richardson, James Morgan, and the road. To son Elijah, the house where I now live, with barn and mill and land bounded west by King's road, and on the other sides by meadow ground, given to son Solomon, and by the Great Ditch, and a piece of meadow before my door, and a field called Jewells Field, bounded by King's road and road by Eastchester. Also a piece lying before Moses Hunt's door, being at the corner by the school house, and running with the road to Bronx river, and along the river to land given to my son Solomon. The executors are to sell the house and lot I bought of Abraham Hyatt, where my son in law Edward Barton lately lived. Mentions daughters Sarah, Elizabeth, Abigail, Marianne, Phebe, and Charity. Makes "my brother John Fowler, of Eastchester," and Jonathan Archer executors. Witnesses: Moses Hunt, Alex. Daniel, Tho. Allen.

In his will, he wrote: ...July 1, 1747. I, William Fowler, of North Castle, in Westchester County, Innholder, being very sick. I leave to my wife Mary 1/3 of all the farm that I now live upon, and 1/3 of my dwelling house and barn and orchard and meadow land, for her use during widowhood, and 1/3 of the movables, and a horse and saddle, and a silver tankard; "And my estate is to find her bread and meat for one whole year." I leave to my sons Caleb and Moses, all my farm meadows and lands after my wife's decease, but my son Caleb is to have the house and barn. I leave to my son Moses, my silver pike and scimeter. I leave to my daughter, Phebe Rundal, 5 shillings. To my daughter, Mary Brown, 5 shillings. To my daughter, Abigail Boker, and to my daughter, Rebecca Haight, 5 shillings each. To my daughter, Miriam Fowler, £25. To my daughter, Hannah Fowler, £30 "and a negro child, which I reserved of the wench I let James Rundall have, to be delivered when 18 months old." All my lands in North Castle, situate in Fortiners (Faucioniers) Waters & Company's west and middle Patents are to be sold. I make my wife and two sons executors. Witnesses, Samuel Dean, Anthony Wadham, Adam Johnson. Proved, September 14, 1747.

In his will, he wrote: August 17, 1765. I, William Fowler, of Hempstead, in Queens County, being sick. I direct my executors to sell my Patent Right and enough movable estate as will pay debts. All the remainder of my movables I leave to my wife Keziah. I also give to my wife the lot of land that formerly belonged to John Hall. "It lyes on the west side of my land, and is about six acres." I also leave her the use of my house and lands until my youngest son comes of age to bring up my children. I leave to my sons Joseph and William all my house and the remainder of my lands, and they are to pay to my three daughters, Mary, Ann, and Keziah Fowler, the sum of £5 each when they are of age. I make my friends, Joseph Hall, Jr., and Benjamin Lester, executors. Witnesses, James Eldred, Ann Hall, Phebe Thurston. Proved, October 17, 1765.
