The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

The Francisco Family has long occupied a position of prominence and consideration in N.J. It is now represented by five brothers, John W., J. Houston, Sherman G., Edward Ellsworth, and Frank M., sons of the late Edward who was one of the most honored and useful citizens of his times in Passaic County, serving as member and President of the Board of Freeholders. The brothers have maintained the substantial reputation of the family, all of them being men of active enterprise, and enjoying the respect of the Community. The late Edward Francisco was born in Bloomingdale, Passaic Co., NJ, Jan. 5, 1826. He was of original Spanish-French ancestry, but the Francisco Family from its early appearance in this country, has always been characterized by an earnest and patriotic devotion to American institutions. Brought up amid rural surroundings at a period when the public school system was in its infancy, his educational advantages were necessarily limited; but possessing an active and inquiring mind, he became by his own efforts a man of broad information. He was married Feb. 5, 1852, to Ann Forshee, by whom he had one son, John W., a civil engineer by profession. Mr. Francisco married, second in 1858 Mary E.

Houston, of Belleville, Orange County, N.Y. The now surviving children of this union being J. Houston, Sherman G., Edward Ellsworth and Frank M. A portion of his early life was spent in Newark, N.J. where he was engaged as a carpenter and a builder. About 1863 he purchased a farm at Great Notch and there continued to reside until his death. His life was mainly devoted to agricultural pursuits, in which he prospered, the fine condition of his property being in keeping with the entire character of the man, as he held the orderly management of one's affairs to be of prime importance. He was also to some extent engaged in business as a contractor. As a citizen, Mr. Francisco was actuated by the highest motives of usefulness to the community. He was recognized by his townsmen as a man of energy and integrity and by their suffrages was elected to the office of freeholder, in which he served for about 15 years. During the first four years of this period he was particularly active in behalf of wholesome public improvements and it was by his influence that the Canal Company, after a long struggle, was induced to make important changes in the character of its bridges (had bridges raised so they did not have to be opened), a service that was highly appreciated by the public. He died on the 22nd of June, 1899. The following published tribute was paid to him by a writer who knew him well, "As a citizen he was faithful in discharge of duty, as a neighbor he was kind and obliging. Jan Francisco, an early black Manhattanite, was manumitted by Willem Kieft 25 Feb 1644, and received a ground-brief (land patent) prior to 15 Dec 1644.

Jan Francisco and Anthony Portugis--two of West India Company's black slaves in 1626, who were manumitted in 1644, and granted a parcel of land on Manhattan by Peter Stuyvesant on March 25, 1647. Elsewhere in this article, [author] Swan appears to identify this Jan Francisco with "Francisco de Negar" who was one of several persons granted a patent to establish a settlement at Bushwick, Kings County, Long Island on 14 March 1661. Swan further cites a 1663 muster roll of Bushwick militia that includes "Francis the Negro" and "Antoon the Negro."¹

As a Revolutionary War veteran whose original shale headstone has very nearly perished, a new cast bronze flat marker was recently added to John's gravesite. It reads "John Francisco; Lieut Col Yates' Regt, 14 Albany County NY Militia; Revolutionary War; July 27, 1749; Dec 31, 1832."¹

His will, dated 22 July 1831 and proved 28 Jan. 1833 mentioned that his wife was to have \$300, son Francis Francisco, \$200, and he further mentions the heirs of daughter Lany Faks (husband, John), sons Henry and John, Henry's son, Isaac, and his daughter Henrietta Morse (husband Morgan Morse), heirs of son, Thomas (property in Town of Wells, Montgomery Co.), son David, heirs of son Cornelis, heirs of daughter Olive Fake, as well as "money deposited in Troy Savings Bank, claimed by me on one side and by Andrew, Jacob A., and John A. Snider and Gilbert Alexander against me. The executors were Adam Fake and Amasa Gage and the witnesses were Oliver Phelps and Robert Lyon of Canadaigua. A codicil, dated 27 Dec. 1832 mentioned Henrietta, "now wife of Morgan L. Morse, and daughter of my late son Henry. The witnesses were Chester Loomis and William C. Gooding of Gorham. A second codicil, dated 29 Dec. 1832, had as its witnesses Chester Loomis and Adam Fake.
