

-- GARDINIER, GARDINER --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: ...10 May, 1711, I, Benjamin Gardner, of West Farms, in the County of Westchester, being sick and weak. "I leave to the issue of my body begotten, or to be begotten, on the body of my loving wife, Elizabeth Gardner, if any such happen to be born into the world within nine months next after my decease," all my messuages and lands, except 8 acres of salt meadow lying near Bronx River, which I purchased of Josiah Hunt, as by deed will appear. For want of such issue, I leave all estate to my loving brother and sister, John Hedger, and Hannah, his wife, during their lives, and then to their heirs and assigns, and they are to pay to my wife £70. I leave to my brother, John Hedger, and his wife Hannah, the 8 acres of salt meadow above mentioned. I leave to my wife, Elizabeth, all household goods. All the rest of my goods and chattels I leave to my four sisters, Elizabeth Hunt, Margaret Hadden, Mercy Oakley, and Hannah Hedger. I leave to my two cousins, Elizabeth Dickman and Sarah Hedley, a heifer. I make my wife executor. Witnesses, John Bartow, Cicely Leggett, Daniel Clarke. Proved, June 29, 1711.

I leave to my wife all my grain and corn, "in doors and out doors." I leave to my daughter, Mary Parshall, 5 shillings. To my daughter, Bethiah Wells, 5 shillings. To my daughter, Patience Gardiner, one feather bed and bedding. I leave to my son, David Gardiner, all my lands, tenements, and meadows, with all privileges. I leave to my wife the use of the west room in my now dwelling-house, and all household stuff, and I make her and my son executors. Dated October 21, 1732. Witnesses, David Horton, Daniel Turriell, John Halloway. Proved, June 18, 1733. The widow, Martha Gardiner, and her son, David Gardiner, confirmed as executors.

The [father and son] came to Rensselaerwyck in 1642. Jacob Jansz flodder, as it was written in the early documents, came from Campen in the province of Overysseel and was a carpenter and miller. (This from J. F. K. Van Laer's appendix "Settlers of Rensselaerswyck 1630-1658" appended to the Van Rensselaer Bowier Manuscripts. Van Laer also notes that "in the first two volumes of deeds in the Albany county clerk's office, he is referred to as Jacob Jansz Gardenier, alias Flodder." Van Rensselaer Bowier Manuscripts: "Jacob Jansz (Gardenier) from Campen in the province of Overysseel, carpenter; generally referred to as Jacob Jansz Flodder; appears first in the accounts of the colony as helper of Claes Jansz Ruyter and not unlikely sailed with him in den Harinck, in Sept 1637. In the spring of 1642 he was at Amsterdam and applied to the patrol for permission to do carpenter work in the colony; the same year he is in the accounts charged with supplies. In 1647 he had a saw and gristmill in Greenbush which on 18 Nov 1649, was leased to Evert Pels and Willem Fredericksz. From 1653 to 1654 he appears as lessee of a mill at Bethlehem and 2 Feb 1654 he obtained the lease of the saw and gristmill on the fifth creek, for the term of eight years, beginning 18 May 1654. In the first two volumes of deeds in the Albany county clerk's office, he is referred to as Jacob Jansz Gardenier, alias Flodder."

As early as 1654 he is noted as owning saw mills, and in later court documents, mention is made of his mill(s) and/or of him needing to have "300 boards" cut at another mill.

He was also referred to as "Jacob the carpenter." In "early Records of the City and County of Albany and Colony of Rensselaerswyck, 1656-1675" translated by Jonathan Pearson, Vol 1 p 196: 28 Aug. 1654: "...also acknowledging that he [Jacob Janse Flodder] has accepted Claas Hendrickse Van Utrecht carpenter and Elbert Gerbertse as partners in the hire of the saw mill of Jacob Janse Flodder..."

At the end of March 1636 the younger [John] Winthrop [Jr.] himself was at last able to follow his advance party. He traveled on *Blessing of the Bay*, together with his engineer Lion Gardiner. This Scotsman, married to a Dutch girl from Woeren, had become an expert on the construction of fortifications while in the Dutch Army. Gardiner was to use his experience to help establish a settlement and fortification at the mouth of the Connecticut River (named, later, Saybrook).

Lion Gardiner of East Hampton, LI, wrote in his Bible: "In the year 1635, July 10, came I, Lion Gardiner, and my wife, Mary, from Worden, a town in Holland, where my wife was born, being the daughter of one, Derike Willemson, Deurant, her mothers name was Hackin, and her aunt, sister of her mother, was the wife of Wouter Leonardson, old burgomaster. We came from Worden, to London, and from there to New England, and dwelt at Saybrooke Fort, 4 years, it is at the mouth of the Connecticut river, of which I was Commmander; and there was born to me a son named David, 1636, the 29th of April, the first born in that place, and in 1638, a daughter was born to me, called Mary, the 30th, of August; and then I went to an Island of mine own, which I bought of the Indians, called by them Mannehonake, by us, the Isle of Wight, and there was born another daughter, named Elisabeth, the 14th of September, 1641, she being the first child of English parents, that was born ther."

Lion Gardiner was the first proprietor of Gardiner's Island, which he bought from an Indian sachem named Wyandanch, and which Gardiner named "Isle of Wight" (later changed to Gardiner's Island). Gardiner moved his family to the Island from Connecticut about the fall of 1639.

Lion's wife, Mary, was "from Woerden, a town in Holland." Lion was a redheaded giant of a man who stood some six feet tall at a time when the kings of England seldom reached five feet.

Lion Gardiner had a son named David "whom he dispossessed for fear that he would ruin the island as he had already squandered his own fortune. His grandson John [son of David] fathered innumerable Indians."

In 1653, Lion Gardiner, his wife, and daughters, moved to Easthampton.
