The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

John Hegeman, in his will dated 9 May 1768, mentioned 5 acres in Flatbush, which by a deed dated April 26, 1768, I conveyed to Andrew Gautier, of New York, house carpenter, and is bounded on the south side in front of the road by the land of William Axtell, on the rear of the south side by Adrian Mortier, north by Evert Hegeman, west by main road, and east by the woods in Common. He made Andrew Gautier executor.

In his will, he wrote: I, Andrew Gautier, of the Township of Achqueghononck, Essex County, in the Eastern division of the Province of New Jersey, Esquire, being weak in body. After all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my executors, I leave to my eldest son and heir at law, Andrew Gautier, jr., my silver bowl, which was presented to me by the Church Wardens and Vestry of Trinity Church in New York, as a compliment for my assistance at the fire of the school-house and church, a representation of which is engraved on the said bowl, for his birthright. Unto my sons, Andrew and Daniel, all my real es-

tate in the City of New York, in equal shares. Unto my son Daniel, the parcel of land containing five acres, at Flat Bush in Kings County, which was given to me by John Hogeman, deceased. Unto my beloved wife Margarit, my lot of land, containing one and a half acres, which I bought of Doctor Walter De Graw, which I now dwell upon, at Achqueghononck aforementioned, with my dwelling house, barns, stables, etc., all that my wife Margarit brought with her (bonds, mortgages, plate and household furniture) at our marriage shall be returned to her. Unto my wife, my negro wench named Belle. Unto my wife and son Daniel, all my money in hand. Unto my son Daniel, £500, in consideration of a like sum which my son Andrew has had from me; after this legacy to Daniel is paid, the remainder of my money, due by bonds, notes, or book-debts, to go to my wife and said two sons, in equal shares; Also, all linen in like manner. Unto my wife, for life, my horse and riding chair; a pair of "Sconsers" gilt framed; eight mahogney chairs, worked bottoms; sufficient household goods and kitchen furniture to keep house with decently; the same to be returned again after her decease, to my sons, Andrew and Daniel, and be equally shared by them, except what she brought with her at marriage, and the negro wench named Belle. The rest of my personal estate to be shared equally by my two sons, Andrew and Daniel. Should either die without issue lawfully begotten, then his share shall remain to the survivor. I make my well-beloved friends, John Oothout, late merchant at New York; John Chetwood, Esquire; and Robert Drummond, Esquire, executors. Dated September 29, 1776. Witnesses, Daniel Rutan, William Wischam, Hessel Peterse. Codicil. The furniture given to my wife Margrit is to be left to the discretion of the executors. Dated September 29, 1776. Witnesses, Daniel Rutan; Hessel Peterse, of said Township, yeoman; William Wischam. Proved, March 6, 1784.

[NOTE.--In the City of New York, on the 8th of March, 1784, John Oothout "refused to be concerned therein" as an executor; and John Chetwood and Robert Drummond, "absent from this State"; letters of administration were granted to Andrew Gautier, of said City, gentleman.]

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were: Daniel Goutyer, j.n. Van West Jersey, met Maria Bogaart, j.d. V. N. York.

Registered for Mr. Daniel Gautier, Joyner ye 11th day of March Anno Dom 1725. Indenture of Jacobus DeHart son of Baltazar DeHart, Glassier, to Daniel Gautier, Joyner, to serve from January 4th, 1725/6 for Seven Years. Usual form including "find and provide unto the said Apprentice sufficient Drink, Lodging fitting for an Apprentice." Signed February 17th. 1725 by Jacobus DeHart. In the presence of Jno Peter Zanger, Ja. Wilmot. Acknowledged March 10th, 1725/6 before Jacobus Kip, Alderman.¹

In his will, proved 30 Jan 1745/6, Samuel Bayard of New York, merchant, mentioned "...the garden and lane I now occupy lying on the north side of Princes street, between the houses of Daniel and Andrew Gautier, and runs back of both their yards.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Daniel Gautier, of New York, carpenter, being in good health, I leave to my son Andrew all my wearing apparell, both linen and woolen, And all of my tools, benches, and implements, and the value of £10 in stuff; Also a gun and a sword. I leave to my daughter Mary my large black walnut cupboard. I leave all the rest to my wife Mary until my youngest child is of age, for her support and that of our children, and then she is to have 1/3, and the rest to my children. My executors are to sell real estate if necessary and all that my message or tenement and lot in the South Ward, which I purchased from Daniel Cosaart, and also the message and dwelling-house adjoining to the house in which I now dwell, with the ground which I formerly bought of Captain Kip and Alderman Van Ranst, and formerly did belong to Cornelius Roomer. I make my wife and my esteemed friends, Daniel Clarkson and John Chambers, executors. Dated March 18, 1739. Witnesses, Anne Chambers, William Bogart, Lancaster Green. Proved, January 8, 1747. The widow, Mary Gautier, was then Mary Blanchard. (Names of some children apparently omitted.)

Usual form including "the said Apprentice to be taught the Art or Mystery of a Joyner and shall also find and provide unto the said Apprentice Sufficient Meat, Drink, Apparell, Lodging and Washing fitting for an Apprentice excepting two Years and a half from the day of the Date hereof dureing which Term of Two Years & a half his said father engage to provide him Cloaths and said Master shall put Said Apprentice to the Night School three Months in Every year dureing Said Term, his father to pay one halfe of Said Schooling and his Master the other halfe and at the Expiration of Said Term shall give to said Apprentice One New Suit of Apparell (both Linnen & Woolen) besides his Common Wearing Cloaths" Signed December 7th, 1718 by James Davy, Joshua Davy. In the presence of Andrew Forrester, Will Bradford. Acknowledged December 7th, 1718 before John Johnston, Mayor.¹
