The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Jacob Sanders Glen was the only one of the Glen family to settle in Albany. He was a trader; Ensign in the Militia 1669; In his will, he directed: (Will written in Dutch form.) On August 14, 1685, before me, John Becker, residing in Albany, No-

tary Public, appeared Jacob Sanders Glen, living in Albany, sicke and being a bed, but fully using his understanding. He makes his present wife Catharine his sole heir and executor, of all lands, money, gold and silver, coyned and uncoyned," jewels and precious things. "And although he hath four children begotten by his said wife, viz., Johanes, aged about 10, Anake, 8, Jacob, 6, and Helena, 2 years, and his wife being with child of the fifth." It is his will that his wife be not troubled by the orphan masters, Trustees, Constables, the Court of the Town, or any other in power, or any Court or Judge that they shall not (excepting the respect due to them) in no ways to intermeddle with the children or estate. But she may not sell the lands, and when the children come of age she shall fit them out comfortably. His lands at Schenectady and the house where he now lives are to remain for his children. The lands at Schenectady are mentioned as in possession and under the care of his two brothers Sander and Johanes Glen. Witnesses, Dirck Wessels Ten Broeck, John Wendel, Robert Livingston. Thomas Dongan, Lieutenant - General and Governor, etc. To all to whom these presents may come. Know ye that at the Court of Sessions in the Town of Albany, held on Tuesday, March 2, 1685/6 the last will of Jacob Sanders Glen was proved and Letters of Administration were granted to his wife Catharine Glen and the will was confirmed April 1, 1686.

In his will, he wrote: I, Johannes Glen, of Schenectady in the County of Albany, yeoman, being very sick and weak. I leave to my beloved wife Janickie, my whole estate, real and personal, lying at Scotia, whereon I now live, during her widowhood. But if she marries, then she is to depart from the same, but shall receive the sum of £200, as her dowry. After the death of my wife, I leave to my two sons, Jacob Sanderse Glen, and Johannes Glen all my real and personal estate at Scotia, and they shall pay to my daughter Catharine, one third of the value as it shall be appraised. My will is that my younger brother, Sanders Glen, shall have the tract of land lying in Schenectady, on the south side of the Mohawk river, between the land of Ryer Schermerhorn, containing about 20 acres. Also the house and ground now in the possession of Thomas Noble, lying in Schenectady, and he is to pay to his brothers and sisters their proportionate part of its value. I make my brother in law, Mr. Abraham Cuyler, and Jacobus Beekman, both of Albany, executors. Dated September 26, 1706. Witnesses, Reyer Schermerhorn, Johannes Glen, John Collins.

In his will, dated 20 September 1767, he wrote: I, Johannes Glen, of Albany, merchant. I leave to the four children of my brother, Jacob Glen, late of Albany, deceased, viz. John, Hendrick, Cornelius, and Janettie (sic.), wife of Abraham C. Cuyler, one half of all my estate. [There was a daughter, Catherine, not named who probably died before 1767]. I leave to the four children of my sister Catherina, late wife of Johannes Cuyler, viz., Elsie, wife of Barent Ten Eyck, John Cuyler, Jr., Cornelius Cuyler, and Jacob Cuyler, the other half. I make John Glen, Jr., Hendrick Glen, Cornelius Glen, and Jacob Cuyler, executors. Witnesses, John Cuyler, Isaac Ver Planck, Abraham Yates, Jr. Proved, March 31, 1770.

A contract dated 2 March 1639 rendered this couple's names as "Sander Leenderts, van Duysert in Schotland" and "Catalina Jacobsz, van Alou in Schotland". The contract lists Sander as age 34 and Catalina as age 20. These ages put their dates of birth at, respectively, ca. 1604-05 and ca. 1618-19. "Duysert" is easily recognizable as Dysart in Fifeshire, Scotland.

Previous genealogists have interpreted "Alou" as "Ellon" in Aberdeenshire, but this article will demonstrate that this place is Alloa in Clackmannanshire.

Sander Leendertse Glen was a Scotchman in the service of the West India Company at Fort Nassau on the Delaware in 1633. He was a skipper in 1641, 1649; a resident of New Amsterdam for a time and in 1663 purchased lands in Schenectady which he called Scotia. He was a Magistrate and Captain of the Schenectady Militia in 1684.

In 1639 Sander Leendertsen Glen was a passenger on Ship *Haering* or *Den Harinck*. He married Catalyn Doncassen. He was one of the Indian traders at Beverswyck, and finally moved to Scotia, near Schenectada, of which tract he obtained a patent from Gov. Nicholls, in 1665. Reference is made probably to this gentleman by the French in their account of the burning of Schenectada, anno 1690, in the following terms: "At daybreak some men were sent to the dwelling of Mr. Sander, who was Major of the place at the other side of the river. He was not willing to surrender, and began to put himself on the defensive, with his servants and some Indians. But as it was resolved not to do him any harm, in consequence of the good treatment which the French had formerly experienced at his hands, M. d'Iberville and the great Agniez proceeded thither alone, promised him quarter for himself, his people and property, whereupon he laid down his arms on parole."<sup>3</sup>

On the 14th of October 1675. This day did Allexander Glynn of Schonectide for a valuable consideration of a valuable summe to him in [hand] paid to his full content and satisfaction before the recording of these Presents, Bargaine, sell alienate, transport and make over unto Abraham Lambertson Moll his heyres, Executors and assignes one parcell of Land, lying and being in the Smiths Valey Broad to the South East, or next the Strand, 53 foote and 7 inches, wood measure, and One hundred & sixty eight foote seven inches, ye same measure, on the West side of the house of sd Allexander Glinn, and is Broad behind to the North West, Twenty One foote nine Inches, with the use and benefitt of ye well being between him and the said Glinns house; To have and to hold &c as in forme accustomed--Dated ut Supra and the said Allexander Glynn signed & sealed and delivered the Principle conveyance or transport at ye speciall instant and request of the said Moll in Presents of us witnesses thereunto called. was signed & sealed by Allexander Glinn. Testes: Richard Charlton, John Sharpe.<sup>2</sup>

17, October, 1675. This day did Allexander Glynn for a valuable consideration &c Bargaine, sell, alienate, transport and make over unto Hendrick Vande Water a Certaine house and land thereunto belonging and appertaining lying & being in the Smiths Valey, betweene the house of Cornelius Clopper, Smith and Abraham Lambertson Moll, as it now lyeth in and between the fence of the before mentioned neighbours. To have and to hold to the said Hendrik Vandewater his heyres and assignes to the only proper use and behoofe of him the said Hendrick Vandewater his heyres and assignes. In Witness and confirmation whereof the said Allexander Glynn hath sett his hand and seale to ye Principle instrument or conveyance and delivered the same to ye said Hendrick Vandewater in Presents of us Was signed and sealed by Allexander Glynn. Wit: Jacob Lokerman, Ludovicus Cobes, John Sharpe.<sup>2</sup> On the same day, "Allexander Glinn of Schonectide conveyed to Hendrick Vandewater of New York, marriner, a Certaine Lott of ground or parcell of Land, lying and being in the Towne of Gravesend, on the West End of Long Island, Commonly called or known by the name of the Nine and Thirtieth Lott."<sup>2</sup>
