The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

In their marriage record, they were: Jacobus Gouleth, j.m. Van Buyck Sloot, en Janneken Cocher, j.d. Van N. Yorke, beyde wonende alhier.

In his will, he wrote: 15th day of September, 1722. "Know all men by these presents that I, Jacobus Goelet, of the city of New York, stationer, shopkeeper, and now in good health, perfect mind and memory; Thanks be given to God for his great mercy." I leave to my wife, Janitie, all my real and personal estate, none excepted, to be by her possessed during the time she remaineth my widow, with full power to trade, buy, and sell all movable estate, and, with the advice and consent of my three eldest children, to mortgage or sell my house or houses and lands. But if she should happen to remarry, then she shall deliver unto my dear and well beloved children, by she and me begotten, my great Dutch Bible, and 2/3 of my real and personal estate that is then in being and not by her disposed of. After the death of my wife, if she should not remarry, I will that my dear and well beloved children, named Jacob, Jan, Raphael, Aefie and Phillipus, shall be my true and lawful heirs, to inherit my estate. That is, to my eldest son Jacob, £5 and my old Dutch Bible as his acknowledgement of his birthright. "And it is my will that my daughter Aefie if not then married shall be set out in order, furnished with mourning and wedding robes, and reasonable linnen and housing stuff, as becomes a young woman of our degree." "And my youngest son Phillipus, if his apprentice time be not ended, I will that methods shall be taken by my children to find him as by agreement between his master and myself, and at the expiration of his apprenticeship so much as a new suit of clothes come to from top to toe, linnen and woolen, answerable to his reputation, and a near calculation to be made and collected out of my estate to find him with meat and drink, lodging and washing and mending. Or else my married children take turns to find him as aforesaid at their houses and in their own families until he is of the age of 22 years." And all the rest of my estate is to be equally divided among my children. I appoint my wife Janitie and my three oldest sons, Jacob, Jan and Raphael executors. Witnesses, Cornelius Clopper, William Myer, Jacob Blom. Proved, September 2, 1731. [Note.--Jacobus Goelet, the ancestor of a well-known family, first appears as a school-master, and afterwards a book-seller and stationer, his place of business being the "Sign of the Bible." This, which was also his dwelling-place, was in what is now Hanover square, directly opposite No. 114 Pearl street. Here he had two dwelling-houses, which previously belonged to Abraham Delanoy, who was also a school-master. These buildings, and many others around them, were bought by the city in 1819. They were all removed, and Hanover square opened as at present. Jacobus Goelet was, for many years before his death, the clerk of the Dutch church, and the records of baptisms, etc., are in his handwriting.--W. S. P.]

In the matter of her estate: George Clarke, Esq., President of Council and Governor. Whereas, Jeane Goelet, of New York, widow, died intestate, Letters of Administration are granted to her son Jacob Goelet, merchant, May 21, 1736.

Hester Weyman, widow of William Weyman, in her will dated 20 Sep 1769, proved 19 Oct 1769, mentioned her niece and godchild, Janet Goelet; left nieces Alice, Janet, and Elizabeth Goelet all of her wearing apparel; and mentioned her sister Elizabeth, wife of Peter Goelet.

In her will, she wrote: "...I, Elizabeth Goelet, wife of Peter Goelet, of New York, merchant, being of sound mind, by and with the consent, approbation, and free will and good liking of my said husband, signified by his being a Party hereto at signing the same, do make this my last will and testament." "So far as in me lieth I confirm to my said husband, Peter Goelet, all the powers given to him in the wills of my mother, Alice Ratsey, and my sister, Alice Ratsey." I leave all my estate to my six children, Alice, Janet, John, Peter, Elizabeth, and Robert R. Goelet. My executors may sell all my estate. I make my daughters, Alice and Janet, executors. The said Peter Goelet consents to the same. November 9, 1769. Witnesses, Hannah Inness, John F. Goelet, John McKesson. Proved at Fort George, in New York, before Edmund Fanning, Esq., September 12, 1771.

In his will, he wrote: I, Raphael Goelet, of New York, painter and glazier, being very sick. I leave to my nephew Jacobus, son of my brother, Jacob Goelet, my silver watch and chain and seal. I leave to my nephew, Francis Goelet, son of my brother John, my clock and cane. To my nephew Isaac, son of my brother, Philip Goelet, my gun or fowling piece, my cartouch box, and my silver-hilted sword. I leave to my nephew, Matthew Lyne, son of my late sister, Aesie Lyne, deceased, my two best coats, one waistcoat, 1 pair of breeches, 3 shirts, my neck-cloths, and all the gold and silver belonging to my body. All the rest of my wearing apparell I leave to my uncle Anthony Coessard's family, living at Raritan, in New Jersey. I leave to my God-son, Ernest Kip, son of my brother-in-law, Jacob Kip, £20. her better and more comfortable support, and after her decease, to the children of my brothers, Jacob, John, and Philip, and the children of my sister, Aessie Lyne. I make my wife and my brother Jacob, and my good friends, Joseph Leddell and John Bogart, executors. Dated December 23, 1747. Witnesses, John Alstyne, Stephen Terhune, Simon Johnson. Proved, January 7, 1747/8.
