

-- GOETSCHIUS --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Cornelius Goetschius owned land on Cherry Lane, in what is now Monsey, Rockland Co., NY, which John Jacob Goetschius & Catherine Goetschius Wanamaker conveyed to Catherine Goetschius, widow, in 1860. In 1875 she as Catherine Montgomery, coveyed to Mary Alice, wife of John Henry Fisher, premises on Nyack Turnpike and Cherry Lane, reserving the possession of the dwelling house and garden for life.

Her estate record in 1890 shows that she left as her heirs her children: John J. Goetschius; Mary Alice Fisher; and Catherine Wanamaker, all living at the time in the town of Ramapo, Rockland Co., NY.

James Goetschius, 50, Farmer, and Eliza Goetschius, 47, his wife, were listed in the 1880 Federal Census, living on or near South Central Avenue, in Hohokus Township, Village of Ramsey, Bergen County, NJ. Living with them were their children: John, 17; William, 15; Mary, 14; Elizabeth, 12; and Rattie, 10.

They are listed in the 1895 New Jersey State Census, living in Hohokus Township: James R. Goetschius, Eliza Goetschius, Wm. R. Goetschius, John H. Goetschius, Elizabeth Goetschius, and Rachel Goetschius.

They were listed in the 1900 Federal Census, New Jersey, Bergen County, Hohokus Township (part of; West of E.R.R.), District 23, enumerated 1 June 1900 by Edgar A. DeYoe, Road leading from Allendale to R.R. Crossing North of Ramsey, Dwelling 5, Family 5 (Ramsey area) (all b. NJ, all parents b. NJ) -- Goetschius, James, Head, b. Jan 1831, age 69, married 43 yrs., Farmer; [Goetschius], Eliza, Wife, b. Apr 1832, age 68, married 43 yrs., mother of 8 children, 5 children then living; [Goetschius], Lizzie, Daughter, b. James R. Goetschius, 74, Farmer, and Eliza Goetschius, 73, were listed in the 1905 New Jersey State Census, living in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ, in a house on a farm they owned. Listed with them were: Rachel, 35, School Teacher; William, 39, Carpenter; Myra, 31; James, Jr., 6; Elizabeth, 3; and Wilbur, 1.

James R. Goetschius, 80, farmer, and Eliza Goetschius, 78, his wife, were listed in the 1910 Federal Census, living in a house they owned on Central Avenue in Ramsey, Bergen County, NJ. Living in the same dwelling was their son, William R. Goetschius and his family.

Abraham B. Van Gelder's will was probated 6 March 1876, and in it he devised "unto my sister Pernelphe commonly called Baletie, to her alone...all my lands given and devised to me by my father's last will and testament." He also willed to Pernelphe, all his possessions, but stipulated that she was to provide \$200 to her sister Ann, widow of John P. Goetschius.

On 18 April 1884, Pernelphe Van Gelder sold the homestead farm to her nephew, James R. Goetschius, for \$1500.

According to G. O. Zabriskie, in *The Zabriskie Family*, Johan Hendrick Goetschius "was the storm center of the Ref Chs

from the day he landed in Philadelphia in 1735 until his death 14 Nov 1774. His father had led a group of 400 emigrants from Switzerland and had been delegated supervision of the Ref. Chs in PA. He, however died upon arrival in Phila., and his son became the boy-wonder preacher of the area, covering about 20 parishes—all without legal ordination.

He was minister to congregations in the area of Skippack, Old and New Goshenhoppen, Oley, Bern, and Tulpehocken, Montgomery and Berks Counties, PA He also is said to have preached at Heidelberg or Cacusi, PA.

"In 1741 he was ordained by Dorsius, Frelinghuysen and the Presbyterian Tennant, in an effort to test the requirement that all theological candidates must return to Holland for ordination. In his first regular parish at Jamaica, L.I., the validity of his ordination was soon challenged and charges and counter-charges flew. Communications between New York and the Classis of Amsterdam were slow and the delay resulted in a full-scale breach in the Ch between the conservative Conferentie party and the liberal Coetus.

"In 1748 Goetschius was vindicated by the Dutch authorities and moved to Bergen Co. Here in addition to serving his parishes, he began to tutor young men for the ministry. Again his tempestuous disposition led to determined opposition and equally ardent approbation. Eventually his theological students formed the nucleus of Queens College (now Rutgers University) and he became one of its first trustees."

Other records give John's wife's name as Maria Decker, and Hannah Decker of New Paltz. Other spellings include Dedite-Deter-Doty.

They lived in the area of what is today Glen Rock, Bergen Co., NJ (in old Saddle River Twp.). He owned land in the Garfield area. G.O. Zabriskie wrote: "He may have lived in New Paltz or Rockland Co., NY as has been claimed, but this is doubtful."

On 3 May 1792 (recorded 2 July 1805, Bergen Co. V:226) Hendrick Ferdon of the Precinct of Hackensack, conveyed to John Huyler of the same place, for £20, 5 acres of woodland in Closter, beginning at line of John Huyler; mentioned woodland formerly belonging to John Mauris Goetschius and now to said John Huyler. Signed by Hendrick Ferdon. Witnessed by Timothy Miller, Abraham Ackerman.²

In 1827 he helped found the Second Ref Ch of Totowa (later Paterson) and was chosen an elder at that time.

His will was dated 8 May 1826, pr 12 Mar 1828. In it he mentioned wife Hannah; sons John (dec'd), Henry, and Jacob; daus. Polly, Rachel (dec'd), Sally Peggy, Hannah, Elizabeth, and Hetty; Gdchil. John, Hetty, Rachel, and Catherine—chil. of dec'd dau. Rachel; Gdsons Jacob and John—sons of dec'd son John. Sons Henry and Jacob were executors.

Will of John Goetschius, dated 8 May 1826, proved 12 March 1828, filed Hackensack, NJ [will provided from Ethel K. Konnight, who got the will from Trenton] -- In the name of God Amen, I John Goetschius of the township of Saddle River, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, yeoman considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, and being of sound and perfect mind and memory, Blessed be Almighty God for the same?, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say /First/ To give and bequeath to my loving wife Hannah Goetschius, all her wearing apparel, also the following articles, all my bedsteds, with all their furniture belonging to them, tea kettel, two brass kettels, two pair of andirons, shovel and tongs, half a dozen of silver spoons, a dozen tea spoons, two tables and a stand?, a looking glass, three pots, all my linnins, a Negro winch? and Negro boy, a Cobbert, my ___of hand? money, in gold and silver kind, two cows, and to be kept by my two sons Henry and Jacob, each the half in summer and winter and they must find her fire wood for her use, each to furnish half and half, also the one half of my dwelling house to live in as long as she shall remain my widow, but I will that she shall not let it out to any other person, it is my will also that my two sons Henry and Jacob shall find my widow Hannah support in vitals? and drink during her widowhood, all these before mentioned articles and provisions, I give unto her in lue? of her dowrey /Secondly/ I give and bequeath to my son Henry and with his heirs and assigns forever, a certain lot of land beginning at the Pascak River, in the line of John D Ryerson, a Northeasterdly? course to the Northeast corner of my South lot, and from thence along the line of said Ryerson to the road, from thence as the road runs, twelve feet from the corner of my cider mill, and from thence, straight down to the Pasaick? River, thence along the river to the place of beginning / Thirdly/ I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob, and to his heirs and assigns forever, a tract of land beginning at the Pascack? River in the Southwest corner of my farm in the line of John G Ryerson and from thence along said line Northwardly [Page 2.] to lands of John D Ryerson thence along said lands Eastwardly to a road, thence along said road Southwardly to my cider mill thence bearing with the line of my son Henry to the Pascack? River, thence up the stream

According to G. O. Zabriskie, in The Zabriskie Family, Mauritius Goetschius had led a group of 400 emigrants from Switzerland and had been delegated supervision of the Ref. Chs in PA. He, however died upon arrival in Phila., and his son, Johan Hendrick, became the boy-wonder preacher of the area, covering about 20 parishes—all without legal ordination.

In 1731 a tragic scandal struck the parish. Barbel Rudisühli, the maidservant at the parsonage, had an illegitimate son, Johannes, born January 21, 1731, and Pfarrer Goetschy was named the father. Barbel was exiled from the parish and died in Marpach on March 10, 1731. The child also died. The pastoral list reads: "Moritz Goetschy, remotus propter adulterium cum ancilla die 3 febr. 1731."³

Mauritz Goetschi, was a Swiss minister. He emigrated to America with his wife, nine children and 400 of his Swiss followers arriving in Philadelphia the end of May 1735, only to die within two months of his arrival. Three of his sons followed in his footsteps and became ministers.

This group of Swiss emigrants were imported from Rotterdam to Philadelphia in the ship *Mercury*. It qualified on May 29, 1735, after a two-day delay. Several (or more) of the party were said to have been sick on arrival, hence the delay in disembarking. Rev. Maurice Goetschy had been ill and died only one or two days after disembarking in Philadelphia. 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Dominie Moriches Goetschius (Johannes Mauritius Goetschius) was the minister of the churches at New Paltz and Shawangunk from 1760 to 1771, living at Shawangunk, where he died in 1771. He was a younger brother of Rev. J. H. Goetschius. He had studied medicine before coming to America, studied theology with his brother at Hackensack, N. J. and had preached two years at Schoharie.

Dominie Stephen Goetschius was a strong Calvinist and the organizer of no less than nine churches in Ulster County, NY. He was a minister of the Ref. Dutch Church, serving at New Paltz and Marbletown, N.Y (1775-1796). He was a graduate of Princeton and had studied theology with four eminent divines, including his father.

He was a Revolutionary War patriot; there is a DAR marker at his tombstone.¹

He came to Upper Saddle River from New Paltz, NY, in 1813-1814 at the age of 62. He was the sixth minister of the Old Stone Church (Saddle River Ref. Church) in Upper Saddle River and served both the Saddle River and Pascack congregations until he retired 21 years later in 1835.

During his ministry he lived in the old Hopper-Goetschius House at Lake Street and East Saddle River Road in Upper Saddle River.
