The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Gouverneur

The Gouverneur family ancestor was Nicholas Pierre Gouverneur (b. France, poss Jonaye in Brittany). He had served as Capt of the Horse under Henry of Navarre. After the king's assassination, he fled to Delft, and later to Amsterdam. He was granted arms by William of Orange. He prob m. a sister of Abraham Cuyler, wealthy merchant of Amsterdam, whose son Hendrick went to Albany in 1664 and son Reimer was in Amsterdam. His son was Peter Nicholas, father of Nicholas Pierre, the American ancestor. In 1650, he (Nicholas Pierre ?) went to Curacao, in the interest of his maternal g-f, who had business there. The Gouverneurs and the Cuylers maintained businesses there until after the Revolution. He went to New Amsterdam in the Spring of 1663 and joined the Dutch Church there, Jul 9. Aug 1664, he was in Albany as Atty for Cornelius Steenwyck. He was a prominent merchant in Amsterdam, trading with New Amsterdam, before emigrating to New Amsterdam.

Abraham Gouverneur was Recorder of New York, and a member of the Assembly.

When he was only 18 years of age, Abraham Gouverneur was made Clerk of Jacob Leisler's Committee of Safety and Town Clerk of the City of New York. He was attainted of high treason with Jacob Leisler and Jacob Milborne, condemned to death and his property confiscated. This judgment was reversed in 1695 and his estate was restored. He was elected to the Assembly in 1699 and served until 1702 and was Speaker of that legislative body in 1701 "and was regarded in his time as among the ablest and best of the Leislerian party."³

In his will, dated 12 Sep 1739, probated 8 Oct 1740, he wrote: I, Abraham Gouverneur, of New York, merchant, being in good health. I leave to my wife, Maria Gouverneur, all my real estate, houses, and lands, with full power to sell, and she may leave by will to my children, or any child, as she may think best. Whatever she may leave undisposed of I bequeath to my 3 daughters, Jacoba, Elizabeth, and Maria; And I leave to them and to the four children of my son Nicholas Gouverneur, viz., Abraham, Esther, Barent, and Nicholas, all my china ware, plate, pictures, slaves, and all the rest of my personal property. As for my daughter Maria, now married to Henry Myer, from whom she lives separate, she is only to have the use of her part. Mentions, "my daughter in law Gertruyd Gouverneur." I make my wife Maria, and after her decease my daughters (to the entire exclusion of the husband of my daughter Maria), and my nephew, Nicholas Gouverneur, and my good friend Paul Richards, executors. Dated September 12, 1739. Witnesses, Jacob Goelet, Charles Le Roux, Raphael Goelet. Proved, August 8, 1740.

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Mary Gouverneur, widow of Abraham Gouverneur, being of sound mind, "I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, hoping for pardon of my sins." And as to the worldly estate, real and personal, not only such as by the will of my late husband I am seized of, but also all such other estate as I am seized of, I direct that all debts be paid, for which I charge all my estate. I bequeath to Abraham Gouverneur, son of my deceased son, Nicholas Gouverneur, my Large Book of Martyrs, with silver hooks, and all other printed books that did belong to my deceased husband, but if he dies under age, then to his brother, Barent Gouverneur, in lieu of all pretense of heirship. I leave to my 3 daughters, Jacoba, Elizabeth, and Maria, all my household furniture and all the furniture that did belong to my husband. All the rest of my china, plate, pictures and rest of my personal estate, I leave 3/4 to my daughters, and 1/4 to Abraham, Esther, and Barent, the children of my deceased son, Nicholas Gouverneur. My executors are to take possession of all my estate, houses, and lands, with full power to sell the same; out of the proceeds they are to pay to my daughter Jacoba, £10 yearly, and the rest to all my children, and to the children of my son Nicholas. I make my daughters and my nephew, Nicholas Gouverneur, and my good friend, Paul Richards, Esq., executors. Signed, Mary Gouverneur. Dated March 14, 1740. Witnesses, John Hillyard, William Proctor, John Barbarie. Proved, September 15, 1747. At that time the daughter Maria was the wife of Jasper Farmer. [NOTE.-Mary Gouverneur was the daughter of the famous and ill-fated Jacob Leisler. Her first husband, Jacob Milbourn, perished, with her illustrious father, a portion of whose estate she inherited.--W. S. P.]

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Herman Gouverneur, of New York, merchant. Whereas I formerly conveyed to my wife Mary by deed, July, 1771, and now in care of Hon. Hugh Wallace, a tract of land in the Patent of Kayadraseras, or Queensbury, in Albany County, containing 3,244 acres. I hereby confirm the same. I also leave her the interest on £2,000; Also the use of all household furniture, plate, and wearing apparel. "I leave to my daughter, Maria Matilda, a negro girl, my gold watch and seal and gold sleeve buttons, and knee buckles, and my sleeve buttons, the stones of which are set in gold," and the interest on £1,000, when of age or married. I leave to my daughter Alida the interest on £1,000 when of age or married, and then the Principal. After payment of debts, I leave all the rest to my two daughters. Contingent legacy "to the children of my sister Gertrude Rutgers" and "my brother Isaac Gouverneur." I make my honored father, Nicholas Gouverneur, and my friend, Hugh Wallace, executors. Isaac was born in the Cingle, now Wall St., near Koenings Vally (now Pearl Street).¹

Isaac went with his mother to Holland and returned in 1682 and studied at the Dutch School under Jacob Goelet.¹

In 1698, he was a Freeman, NYC, merchant and trader. In 1700, he was Ensign in Co. of Capt. Lewis, under Col. De Peyster. Owned much property in Harlem, NYC and Curacao.¹

Isaac Gouverneur was a merchant in New York. His will was dated 10 May 1728.

All my bonds and money in the hands of David Ogden, Esq., are to be divided into two equal parts, 1/2 to my brother, Samuel Gouverneur, and the interest on the other half to my sister, Sarah Hall, during her life, and then to her children. A bond for £100, in the hands of Cornelius Low, to be put at interest for the use of my sister Broughton's 4 children, viz., Skelton, John, Sarah, and Mary, until they are of age, and then divided among them. The rest of my money in the hands of Cornelius Low I leave to Sarah Low, Johana Hall, Gertruyd Gouverneur, Isabella Morris, and Sarah Ogden. I leave to Sarah Ogden my damask table cloths and napkins. To Isabella Morris my dressing table and glass. To my sister Hall such part of my clothing, etc., as my executors may think best. And the rest, with my jewels, I leave to Sarah Low, Johana Hall, Isabella Morris,

Sarah Ogden, and Sarah Broughton. I leave to my brother, Isaac Gouverneur, "my sleeve buttons with my father's hair in them." To Gertruyd Gouverneur a gold ring, and my Psalm book with gold clasps, and my pair of spectacles set in gold. I leave to Isabella Graham a suit of mourning. "And I direct my executors to put my German girl Sophia and my sister Morris' negro wench 'Hannah' in mourning, as a gratuity to her for her care of me in my illness." And my said German girl is to serve out her time with my sister Morris. I make my brother, Nicholas Gouverneur, and my brother-in-law, Lewis Morris, executors. Dated November 4, 1758. Witnesses, John Jones, Isaac Low, Richard Morris. Proved, November 17, 1758. Confirmed by Governor Robert Monckton, August 17, 1762. Nicholas Gouverneur was then the surviving executor.

In the record of their marriage they were: [married] "8 Feb 1771 de heer Isaac Gouverneur, bachelor, born in New York in North America, and Meijffw Jannetje Ellis, widow of Thomas Pietersz Beeck, born Curacao. Witnesses: de heer Casper Lodewyk Van Utrecht; Meijffw Jannetje Ellis, widow of hr Jan Martin; Jacob Bennebroek Berch; Meijffw Martha Ellis, widow of hr, Rudolphus Bughy."¹

According to (Fernow's Wills) "Calendar of Wills on File and Recorded in the Offices of the Clerk of the Court of Appeals, of the County Clerk at Albany, and of the Secretary of State, 1626-1836, ed. by Berthold Fernow, 1896, " Isaac Gouverneur of Mount Pleasant, Essex Co., New Jersey, gentleman dated his will 4 Aug 1791. He first leaves a bequest to his nephew, Isaac Gouverneur of N.Y. City, merchant. He then leaves bequests to many relatives. The will was proved in and recorded NYC on 24 Sep 1794. A fuller abstract of the same will appears in the New Jersey "Calendar of Wills 1791-1795", pages 151-152. The will was not proved in the New Jersey court until 23 Mar 1795. In this abstract we learn that Isaac Gouverneur, nephew, merchant, inherited a corner house and lot on Front Street, New York together with the stone wharf and water lot opposite. The New Jersey abstract details the bequest given to each beneficiary of New Jersey in Isaac's will.

The Gouverneur family ancestor was Nicholas Pierre Gouverneur (b. France, poss Jonaye in Brittany). He had served as Capt of the Horse under Henry of Navarre. After the king's assassination, he fled to Delft, and later to Amsterdam. He was granted arms by William of Orange. He prob m. a sis of Abraham Cuyler, wealthy merchant of Amsterdam, whose son Hendrick went to Albany in 1664 and son Reimer was in Amsterdam. His son was Peter Nicholas, father of Nicholas Pierre, the American ancestor. In 1650, he (Nicholas Pierre ?) went to Curacao, in the interest of his maternal g-f, who had business there. The Gouverneurs and the Cuylers maintained businesses there until after the Revolution. He went to New Amsterdam in the Spring of 1663 and joined the Dutch Church there, Jul 9. Aug 1664, he was in Albany as Atty for Cornelius Steenwyck. He was a prominent merchant in Amsterdam, trading with New Amsterdam, before emigrating to New Amsterdam.¹

Groom's witness: Hendrick Veldman, Lieutenant of the Militia, in the service of the West India Company. Bride's witness: Geertruijda Cok, widow of Hans Willem Van Kinswilder. All living here. Married 21 May 1719."³

Nicholas Gouverneur was a businessman. 1771, Commissioner of the Loan Office. Loyalist sympathizer, remained at farm in Mount Pleasant, NJ, west bank of Passaic River, near Newark, NJ during war and d there. Will - House and lot, Newark, Land on west side of and on island in Lake Champlain, NH. He and his bro Isaac purchased a wide lot on the north side of Water Street from the Walton family ca. 1750. They purchased another lot of equal width, extending to the river. Through the lot was laid out Gouverneur's Lane. At 27 Front St, Isaac built his house, opposite 26 Front St, his store. He later purchased a lot on the west corner of Pearl St and Sloat Lane (now Hanover St) and built his residence there. His g-s Isaac, later built a more elegant residence there. After the Revolution, Nicholas purchased a great many lots of the confiscated DeLancey property. Through these, Gouverneur St was laid out in 1798. They also purchased large tracts in western NY, where the town of Gouverneur is located. Gouverneur Hospital also perpetuates their name. There was also a Gouverneur's Slip, and a Gouverneur Hill.

In her will, dated 12 Sep 1772, Mary Johnson mentions her daughter Mary Gouverneur and daughter Experience Gouverneur and son-in-law, Samuel Gouverneur.
