The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Adam Roelantszen Groen was the first schoolmaster in New Amsterdam. He was from Dockum, Friesland, one of the earlier colonists. He was born circa 1606. He came to New Amsterdam before 1633. His wife was Lyntie Martense. "Prior to 1646, he took his eldest son to Holland on business. During his absence, his wife Lyntie died, leaving several small children (the youngest of whom were only 4 and 2 years old respectively, with no one to look after them. On the 9th of March 1646,

the sad plight of the children was brought to the attention of the members of Council, who after due deliberation adopted the somewhat ponderous resolution of appointment four of the nearest neighbors-- to wit: Philip Geraerdy, Dr. Hans Kiersted, Jan Stevensen, the schoolmaster, and Oloff Stevensen van Cortlandt -- as curators or guardians to look at the children "till the arrival of the father or some news of him.

Cors Pieterszen sued Adam Roelantsen [Groen], as guardian for his wife's estate on 10 Jun 1638 to recover her share of her father's estate, her mother having died (Cors Pieterszen's wife was Tryntje Hendricks, dau. of Elsie Martense by her first husband, Hendrick Tomassen). The share turned out to be fifty carolus guilders which he received on 27 Jan 1639. "...appeared Adam Roelantsen and Cors Pietersen from Langeraer..." "First, Adam Roelantsen shall pay to the aforesaid Cors Pietersen, as husband and guardian of his wife Tryntje Hendricks, the sum of fifty Carolus guilders, reckoned at 20 stivers the guilders, on account of the purchase by said Adam Roelantsen from said Cors Pietersen, in the capacity aforesaid, of his wife's interest in the paternal estate of her deceased father Hendric Tomassen and her mother Elsie Martens, whereby I, Cors Pietersen, acknowledge that I am fully paid and satisfied..." "Furthermore, I, Cors Pietersen, promise not to revive any old disputes which heretofore have existed between Adam Roelantsen and me..." "Thus done and covenanted in Fort Amsterdam, this 27th of January 1638 [sic -- 1639?]" "This is the X mark of Cors Pietersen, aforesaid"¹

On 13 Oct 1638, Adam Roelantsen, aged 32 declared that in 1633 he was with Grietje Reyniers at the Strand, near the late warehouse of Cargoes, he heard the sailors of the ship "De Southberg" then lying in the roadstead, cry out to Grietje aforesaid, W____ [Whore] W____ [Whore], where upon she lifted her petticoat and slapped her backside, saying "Blaes en daer gchterin"

In the list of settlers arrived in Rensselaerswyck, in 1639, we find the name of Adam Roelantsen Van Hamelwaard, previously schoolmaster at New Amsterdam.²

By 1641 he was again in New Amsterdam. While Adam Roelantsen was officiating as schoolmaster he resided in the outskirts of the settlement, adjoining or in close proximity to the farm of Jan Damen, the south side of which bordered along Wall street. This is inferred from complaint made by Roelantsen that Damen's cattle trespassed on his premises in 1641. On February 2, 1642, the following agreement was entered into between Adam Roelantsen, from Dockum (a city in Northern Holland), on one side, and John Tenison, carpenter, on the other, respecting the building of a house for said Roelantsen. This was on the south side of Stone Street (then a mere road and unpaved), between Whitehall and Broad Streets, and next door but one to the brewery of the celebrated magistrate, Oloff Stephensen Van Cortlandt. His garden had a frontage of one hundred feet. The following is a translation of the contract: John Teunison agrees to build the same of the following dimensions: In length thirty feet, in width eighteen feet, in height eight feet; the beams to be hewn at four sides, the house to be well and tight clapboarded, and roofed with substantial reeden thatch; the floors tight and made of clapboards; two doors, one entry, a pantry, a bedstead, a staircase to go to the garret; the upper part of the chimneys to be of wood; one mantel piece; the entry to be three feet wide with a partition. The house to be ready by the first of May next. All for the sum of 350 guilders [\$140.] to be paid by Roelandsen, one-half when the timber is on the ground.²

In 1643, he was weighmaster, and he purchased a lot for a house and garden. He went to Holland July, 1646, and returned in November. In December he sold his homestead to Govert Artsen. He sued Jan Teunisen, Schout of Brooklyn, in 1647 for debt.²

Adam Roelantsen appears again in the records [of New Amsterdam?] on 13 and 17 Dec. 1646 -- charged with rape. He admits to having "felt the naked bosom of Weyntje Teunis, wife of Hark Syboltsen" and is sentenced to be whipped and banished. That sentence is postponed by the court "in consideration of his being burdened with four motherless children, and on account of the approaching cold winter, the prisoner [Adam Roelantsen] is reprieved to a future time, when he is to quit the country" (O' Callaghan "Calendar of Historical Manuscripts for the State of New York" Dutch Manuscripts Vol. IV Council Minutes p. 106). It doesn't appear the sentence was ever carried out.

Adam Roelantsen was appointed Provost in 1647, and on 4 Dec. 1649 in preparation for a trip, he gave "Power of Attorney. Adam Roelantsen Groen of Dockum, to Jacob Tysen, to take charge of his children and affairs during his absence in the West Indies."

Inn 1653 he was a member of the Burgher Corps of New Amsterdam. After 1653 neither his name nor that of his descendants is found in the Records

John Green was an employee of Sterling Furnace in June 1792. He worked there until 1794, then at the Augusta Works, a satellite operation of the Sterling Works. Later he must have given up the iron working business and gone into farming.¹

In In pension papers on 22 April 1818, he testified, "I was in the siege and the licking of Lord Cornwallis, and am now about 60 years of age."

One story is that John was on the staff of General Lafayette as a translator. It is told that in 1824, when Lafayette returned to tour the US, he met John at Newburgh, NY, and gave him a hat as a memento.¹

They lived in the area of Southfields, Orange County, NY, where Peter was said to have built the first furnace at Sterling Furnace and later worked as a blacksmith and ironmaster. Peter is said to have forged the chain that stretched across the Hudson at West Point to halt the advance of British ships in 1778.¹
