The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage and banns they were: Andries Grevenraedt, j.m. Van N. Yorke, en Anna Van Brug, j.d. als boven, beyde woonende alhier.

Andries Grevenraet was a mariner, trading along the coast between New York and Virginia.

Andries Grevenraedt, en syn huysv. Anna van Brug, were listed in the 1686 Dominie Selyns list of member of the NYC Ref Ch. They were living on Beurs Straet, ["Exchange Place"] (Whitehall Street). Listed before them were: Sara Bedlo, h. v. Claes Borger; Pieter de Riemer, en syn huysvr. Susanna de Forest; Isaac de Riemer; Juffr. Magareta de Riemer, l wed. van den Hr. Cornelis Steenwyck.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, dated 15 May 1708, probated 8 June 1710, he wrote: ...I, Andries Grevenraet of New York, mariner, being in perfect health. I leave to my eldest son Isaac, £10 when of age. I leave all the rest to my wife Anne with full power to sell. But if she remarry, then all my estate is to be divided into two parts by my cousin Abraham Gouverneur, Nicholas Rosevelt and my cousin Isaac Gouverneur. And one-half is to go to my wife and the other half to my children. Dated May 15, 1708. Witnesses, Manning Harmesen, Johanen Brat, Peter Van Dyck, Henry Swift. Proved 8th day of June, 1710.

Henry Crevenraedt. March the 11, 1699. Blewfield in Jamaica (West Indies). "I Henry Cravenraedt considering the uncertainty of this transitory life, doe leave and bequeathe unto Sarah my wife all that I have in this world, till my children come of age." Then two thirds of the estate to go to them. Leaves to son Isaac a seal ring with a black stone in it, marked H. G. Hopes that his wife "will be kind to the children and not rong them, but doe by them as she will answer to God Almighty." (No witnesses.) John Nanfan, Esq., Lieutenant and Governor-General and Commander in Chief of the Province of New York, etc. "Know yee that at New York the first day of (???) 1699, before me the will of Henry Crevenraedt was proved and allowed." Release. On 7 Apr 1716 Isaac Grevenraets of the town of New Castle to Jacobus Williams Neering of the county of New Castle. Isaac Grevenraets released & quit claim to Jacobus Williams Neering, son & heir of John Williams Neering, late of the County of New Castle, dec., all right & interest in a plantation below the town of New Castle called Hamburg & further release the said Jacobus Williams Neering from all manner of bequest & legacies whatsoever, which were bequeathed to wife Elisabeth Grevenraet, alias Elisabeth Williams Neering, by the will of John Williams Neering, her father, dated 4 June 1698. Signed Isaac Grevenraet. Delivered in the presence of Richard Halliwx & Rowland Fitz Gerald. Recorded 5 May 1720. (E1:328).<sup>1</sup>

Deed. On 15 June 1723 Isaac Gravenraet of the town of New Castle, cordwainer & Elizabeth his wife to Michael Vaughton of the town of New York, sailmaker. Whereas Jacobus William Neering by deed dated 3 Apr 1716 granted to Isaac Gravenraet a tract of land upon Hamborough Marsh bounded by Tom's Run containing 10 acres. Now Isaac Gravenraet & Elizabeth his wife for £30 granted to Michael Vaughton the above described 10 acres. Signed Isaac Gravenraet & Elizabeth Gravenraet. Delivered in the presence of Jonas Wright & Mary Yeates. Recorded 10 Aug 1726. (H1:12).<sup>1</sup>

Deed. On 19 May 1726 Michael Vaughton of the City of New York, sail maker & Catherine his wife to Hendrick Oblius of Fartain in the County of New York, Michael Turner, Jacobus Turner & Benjamin Devow of the County of West Chester, yeoman. Michael Vaughton & Catherine his wife for £35 granted to Hendrick Oblius, Michael Tumer, Jacobus Tumer & Benjamin Devow all that piece of marsh of Hamborough Marsh bounded by Tom's run containing 10 acres. Signed Michael Vaughton & Catherine Vaughton. Delivered in the presence of Isaac Gravenraet, Jacobus Williams & John Herbert. Recorded 10 Aug 1726. (H1:13).<sup>1</sup>

According to Liz Johnson, this may have been called "Hamburg" because John Williams Neering married a daughter of Nicolas de Meyer (merchant and 9th mayor of New York city), who was from Hamburg originally.<sup>2</sup>
