The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Aman was mentioned in the will of his grandmother, Anna Suire (widow of Jean Suire), dated 1727, probated 3 June 1728. Aman Guion was a blacksmith.

Elizabeth Sanson, wife of Aman Guion, was mentioned in the will dated 6 Jan 1746, of her father, Daniel Sanson.

In his will, he wrote: ...September 14, 1757. I, Aman Guion, of New Rochelle, blacksmith, being in good health. I leave to my wife Elizabeth a negro woman, "Mugg," Also the whole and sole use of all my estate, real and personal, during the time she remains my widow, and no longer. I leave to my son Aman £30. To my daughter Elizabeth £24 10s. To my daughter Susanah, widow of John Sandrine [Landrine], £11 10s. I leave to my sons, Elias, Benjamin, and Esai, all that house and lot where I now dwell, containing 14 acres of land and meadow, at New Rochelle, after my wife's decease or marriage, and they are to pay the legacies. All the movable estate that is left at the death or marriage of my wife I leave to my 3 sons, Elias, Benjamin, and Esai, and my daughters, Elizabeth and Susanah. I make my wife executor. Witnesses, John Angevin, James Resley, Robert Rolfe. Proved, June 7, 1760.

The widow Tamasen, having died without having proved the will, Letters of Administration are granted to sons Isaac and Amon, "The said Lewis Guion having died some short time after making his will."

Lewis Guyon, aged 24, was listed in the 1710 Census of Inhabitants of the Town of Eastchester (adult males only in this census). He was a blacksmith by trade.

Louis Guion was chosen one of the Assessors of Eastchester, Westchester Co., NY 5 April 1715.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, he wrote: 28 October, 1731. I, Lewis Guyon, of East Chester, being sick and weak. I leave to my wife 2/3 of personal estate after payment of debts and funeral charges. I leave to my daughter Mary, wife of John Alberson, £18. To my daughter Leah, wife of Philip Pinckney, £20. To my daughter Esther, when of age, £50, and to my daughters Isabell, Margaret, and Susanah, to each £50 when of age. I leave to my wife Dinah, the use of all lands and houses in Eastchester, Westchester, and New Rochelle, so long as she remains my widow. After the death of my wife I leave to my eldest son, Lewis Guyon, all my lands in Eastchester and Westchester, except 3 acres of salt meadow lying at Hutchinson's, in Eastchester. I leave to my son, Daniel Guyon, all my lands in New Rochelle, and the 3 acres of salt meadow. I make my wife Dinah, and my brothers Isaac and Hinman Guyon [Amon Guion], executors. Witnesses, Joseph Fowler, Joshua Tompkins, Roger Barton. Proved in Westchester, December 4, 1731.

Whereas Charles Johnston of the City of New York, Schoolmaster and Isabel his wife, late Isabel Guion, one of the children and devisees of Lewis Guion, Junr., dec'd, Lewis Guion and Martha, his wife, Charles Vincent and Hester his wife, late Hester Guion, one other of the daughters and devisees, Charles Morgan and Susannah his wife, late Susannah Guion, one of the daughters and devisees of sd. Lewis Guion, dec'd, all of Eastchester; John O'Briant and Leah his wife, one other of the daughters and devisees, Elias Chadeau and Margaret his wife, one other of the daughters of Lewis Guion, dec'd, of New Rochelle; by indenture bearing date 14 and 15 Nov 1748 did convey to Alexander Allair of New Rochelle, all ye farm and plantation.<sup>3</sup>
