The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Haring. Bounded N by lot no. 18; E by Peter Quidore; S by lot no. 20; W by lot no. 12. Signed by Peter C. Mabye; Abraham C. Mabye; Cornelius Ackerson; Leah Ackerson (her mark), John Iserman, Catherine Iserman. Witnessed by Benjamin Blackledge, Abraham Cole (his mark).<sup>1</sup>

On 1 May 1806 (recorded 4 June 1806, Bergen Co. Y:57) Marten Hagen of Harington and Sarah, his wife, conveyed to George Hagen of the same place, yeoman, for \$250., 10 acres being a piece of land part of the whole of Henry Ludlow, formerly of the City of New York, Gentleman, which lately has been conveyed by his heirs to Thomas Ludlow and by him to Marten Hagen, lot no. 8 on a map made 9 January 1802 by John D. Haring. Bounded N by lot no. 7; E by lot no. 13; S by lot no. 9; W by lot no. 3. Signed by Marten Hagen (his mark), Sara Hagen. Witnessed by Benj. Blackledge, Aury [Anny?] Martin.<sup>1</sup>

On 11 March 1812 (recorded 24 March 1812, Bergen Co. G2:170) George Hagens of Harington conveyed to Walter Parcels of the same place, for \$487.50, 10 acres of woodland at Closter Mountain in Harington, beginning corner of Frederick G. Haring's wood land. Bounded NE by woodland of Henry Montanye; S by woodland of said Walter Parcels and Frederick G. Haring; E by woodland of Henry Montanye. Signed by George Hagens (his mark). Witnessed by Benj. Blackledge, Elizabeth Vervalen.<sup>1</sup>

George Hagen of Orangetown, in his will dated Jan. 11, 1843, probated Oct. 30, 1847. mentioned Wife, Mary, whole estate. Executors: Abraham P. Mabye and James A. Ivers.

Mary Hagens, 79, was listed as head of the household in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Orangetown, Rockland County, NY. Listed with her were: Mary Beal, 55; and John Bell, 48, gentleman.

## Hagen, Johan Martin

"Johan Martinhague" was mentioned in the will dated 12 June 1772 of Jacobus De Vrees, of Orange Town, Orange County. De Vrees identified no relatives (apparently had no wife or children), but among his bequests: "I leave to Johan Martinhague, the interest due on a note of hand I have against him."

On 20 August 1784 (recorded 11 Nov 1803, Bergen Co. R:113), Cornelius Haring, Esq., agent of forfeited estates in the County of Bergen, issued out of Court of Common Pleas held at New Barbadoes, setting forth that at the term of January 1779 at Pompton, judgement against Johannes Marthage [Marthagen?] late of Harington Township, for joining the Army of the King of Great Britain [his land confiscated] and sold at public vendue to Rusolvency Aurijanse of Harington Township on 15 June 1784 for £63, parcel in Harington Township at a place called Closter. Bounded E by North or Hudson River; S by Daniel Vervalen; W by Hendrick Nagle and John and Resalvert Aurijanse; N by William Nagle, 15 acres tillable land. Signed by Corns. Haring. Witnessed by John Nafie, Petrus Haring.<sup>1</sup>

Fred Bogert wrote about the old Dutch cemetery in present Demarest, N.J.: "Originally known as Sautjes Tave's "Begraven Ground," the land occupied by the cemetery is part of a large tract purchased by Mattys P. Bogert in 1740 from Bernardus Verveele of Tappan. Sautjes Tave is old Dutch for Sarah's Matthew. The burial ground received the name when Sarah Bogert, wife of Matthew M. Bogert, who was born April 24, 1749 and baptized at the old Schraalenburgh Dutch Reformed Church, named the tract after her son, Matthew."

He was probably the witness referred to in this deed: On 5 January 1804 (recorded 28 March 1804, Bergen Co. S:28) Walter J. Stephen Hagen was listed in the 1820 United States Federal Census, New York, Rockland Co., Orangetown, with males: 0-2 (10-16)-0-0-0-1 (45 & over); females: 1 (to 10)-1 (10-16)-0-1 (26-45)-0-1 (foreigners not naturalized), listed after Henry Conklin, Johnathan Lawrence, George Man, and before Benjamin Grovestine, John Sneden, Robert Sneden, and Leonard B. Rice.

Stephen and Mary Hagens are listed in the 1850 Federal Census for Rockland Co., N.Y., Orange Town; he age 80, a farmer; she age 62. Also living with them are Stephen Hagens, age 20 (a late child? or a grandchild?); and Martin Parsells, age 43, carpenter.

Mary is listed in the 1860 Federal Census, Rockland County, Orangetown (Nyack P.O.; but known to be the area that was later called Palisades, N.Y.): Mary Hagens, 72; Stephen Hagens, 30, laborer; and Martens Parcels, 52, house carpenter.

In the 1865 NY State census, Mary is listed as a landowner.
