The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will (written in the Dutch language.) In the name of the Lord, Jesus, Amen. In the year 1715, the 15 day of June, in Kings County, Island of Nassau, in the village of Midwout, in the presence of the undersigned, the worthy Abraham Hegeman declares his will to dispose of his temporal affairs, because he is very sick and weak, but having his full understanding, and considering the uncertainty of life. It is my will that my wife Gertruy, shall remain in full possession of all my estate, real and personal, as long as she remains my widow, without being obliged to account to anyone. But if she re-marry, my entire estate shall go to my three children. I leave to my son Adrian, who is unmarried, a proper outset out of my estate, and if my daughter Catrina shall marry she is also to have a decent outset. If my wife dies before my youngest son, Jan, is of age, his brother Adrian and his sister Catrina shall decently maintain him, and have him taught till of age, out of my estate, and then he shall have his outset also. I leave to my eldest son, Adrian, for his Primogeniture, a silver cup, now in my house. All the rest to my three children. Witnesses, Joseph Hegeman, Benjamin Hegeman, Johanes Jansen. (No Probate date.)¹

He was a silk merchant. He and his wife, and several children, emigrated from Holland to New Amsterdam about 1652. He lived in New Amsterdam for a time then bought land on western Long Island, what is now Brooklyn and Flatbush, then called Midwout (middle of the woods). He was a sheriff and town clerk.

Adriaen Hageman purchased 59 morgens of land (a morgen is a Dutch unit of land equal to about 2 acres) in Midwout about 15 Apr 1661. Midwout is one of the six early villages in Brooklyn and now is called Flatbush. It was the farm area of New Amsterdam and had lush forests with game, wetlands and good fishing. The swampy areas must have reminded the Hollanders of home. Trading was done with New Amsterdam by ferry (230 years before the Brooklyn Bridge) and settlers apparently went to church (Dutch Reform) in New Amsterdam as the Hegeman baptismal records are there. Adriaen and his friend Jan Strijcker were involved in many political and legal affairs of Long Island. They functioned as the 2 schepens (judges) and Adriaen was the schout (sherrif) of the Long Island towns. The two men were close friends and were instrumental in building the first church on Long Island, the Dutch Reform Church at Midwout in 1654. The Church was rebuilt in 1698 and in 1776 its bell announced the advance of the British forces on New York. The present third church building, built in 1797, is still in the original location at the corner of Flatbush Avenue and Church Lane. The stones used in its construction were the remains of the second church. source: "The Stryker Family in America" by William Norman Stryker, 1979. In "The History of the Town of Flatbush", (GenealogyLibrary.com), p. 109, Adriaen is mentioned as being the first schoolmaster of the town of Flatbush, 1659-1671. Education and literacy were extremely important to the Dutch immigrants. Adriaen was born in Elburg, Gelderland in 1624, the son of Hendrick Hegeman, a minister of the Dutch Church at Vorchten. His 2 brothers were ministers of the Dutch church also. He moved to Amsterdam before 1649 to join the silk trade. On March 7, 1649 at the age of 25, he was married to Catarina Margits, the daughter of a London diamond cutter. What was Joseph Margits doing in Amsterdam? I suspect the English Civil War was a bit too hot for him. The 1640's were a tumultous time in England. In fact, the King was executed on Jan. 30, 1649, 2 months before Adriaen and Catarina's wedding.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...August 11, 1762. I, Adrian Hegeman, of the Ferry, in the Township of Brookland, in Kings County, baker, "desiring that all persons concerned may be fully contented and satisfied, and raise no contention." All debts to be paid. My executors are to sell all estate within 6 weeks at Publick Vendue, and all my estate in New Jersey or elsewhere. The proceeds and all the rest of my money I leave to my wife Sarah and my children, Cornelius, Dirck, Adrian, Elizabeth, wife of Jacobus Simonse, Sarah, wife of Richard Morrel, Lucretia, wife of Alexander Forbus, Petrus, Joseph, and the children of my eldest son, Denys Hegeman, deceased, who are to have their father's part, except that Adrian Hegeman, the eldest son of my said son Denys, deceased, shall have my silver watch and my Dutch Bible before any division is made. I make my son Dirck, and my brother, Denys Hegeman, and my grandson, Adrian Hegeman, executors. Witnesses, Christopher Codwise, butcher, Nicholas Van Dans, saddler, Simon Boerum, Esq. Proved, August 28, 1762.

All debts to be paid by my executors. I leave to my son Abraham my Great Dutch Bible, and my silver cup, for his birthright. I leave to my son Petrus my two weaver's looms, and furniture thereto belonging. To my daughter Gertruy my best feather bed and furniture. My executors are to sell all my house and real estate, and pay the proceeds to my sons, Abraham, Adrian, and Petrus, and to the children of my son Rem, and to my daughter Gertruy. The children of my son Rem are John, Joseph, Adrian, Catrina, and Rem. I make my son Abraham, of Amwell, in West Jersey, and my sons, Adrian and Petrus, and Cornelius Vanderveer, executors. Witnesses, Jacob Suydam, Jacobus Vandevinter, Hendrick Suydam. Proved, April 16, 1772.

An Andrew H. Hagerman, 30-40, was listed in the 1840 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ (prob. in western Mahwah area). Listed with him were one male 20-30, one female 5-10, and one female 15-20.
 They were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, New Jersey, Bergen Co, Hohokus Township, p. 20, enumerated 15 Aug 1850, Dwelling 435, Family 477 (all b. NY) -- Andrew Hagerman, 34, Farmer; Eliza [Hagerman], 29; States [Hagerman], 6; John [Hagerman], 3; Anny Bogert, 76, value real estate \$75,000; plus several black servants and laborers. Listed just after them was the family headed by Henry B. Hagerman, 64.

He was listed in the 1815 Longworth's American Almanac, New-York Register, and City Directory -- H. B. Hagerman, Attorney and notary, New York City

Henry Brazier Hagerman is said to have had Laroe ancestry. He graduated from Columbia in 1804 and was a New York lawyer. From 1812 to 1820 he rose from a captain to a colonel in the New York state militia.

He moved into Andrew Hopper's old home on Valley Road in Mahwah (run as in Inn during the Revolution; Anna Hopper Bogert was a granddaughter of Andrew Hopper). He was a Bergen County justice of the peace and a judge of the court of common pleas in the 1820s. He was a freeholder in 1839-40 and a member of the state assembly.

Henry B. Hagerman, 50-60, was listed in the 1840 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ.

Listed with him were one male 15-20, one male 20-30, two males 50-60 (including himself), one female 20-30, one female 40-50, one black male 10-24, one black female 10-24.

Henry B. Hagerman was listed on the Franklin Township tax rolls in 1814 and by 1817 he had 145 acres. By 1850 he had about 750 acres of land, the most valuable property in the Mahwah area.

He was listed in the 1850 Federal Census, New Jersey, Bergen Co, Hohokus Township, p. 20, enumerated 15 Aug 1850, Dwelling 436, Family 478 -- Henry B. Hagerman, 64, Farmer, value real estate \$2000, b. NY; Maria L. Hagerman, 20, b. NJ; plus two servants. Listed just before them was the family of Andrew (age 34) & Eliza (age 29) Hagerman; their family group included Anny Bogert, 76, she with real estate valued at \$75,000.

Witnesses, Peter Nevins, Joseph Hegeman, Johannes Schenck, Clerk. Proved, January 29, 1741, before John Moore, Esq. The widow being dead, Elbert Hegeman and Abraham Lott were made Administrators with the will annexed.¹

He was a farmer. All the family of Joseph Hegeman removed after his death, to Nine Partners, Pleasant Valley, Dutchess Co., where they bought land near their uncle Francis Hegeman who had moved there in 1724. The three boys with their brother-in-law Hendrick Lott operated a mill here, seven miles back of Poughkeepsie.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Joseph Hegeman, of Jamaica, on Long Island. I give to my wife Sarah, the use of all my lands and real estate while she remains my widow. But as soon as she marries she shall deliver them up to my sons. After her decease I leave all my real estate to my sons, John, Hendrick, and Joseph, and they are to pay £150 to each of their three sisters, Ariantie, wife of Hendrick Lott, Elizabeth, and Sarah. All personal estate to my wife and my 6 children. I make my wife Sarah executor. My eldest son, John, is to have £25. Dated April 1, 1741. Witnesses, Benjamin Whitehead, John Dorlandt, S. Clowes. Proved, May 5, 1741.
