The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Ezekiel Hallstead, of Rye, in Westchester County, yeoman, "being greatly bruised by a late fall, and under apprehensions of its being of fatal consequences," but of sound mind. I leave to my wife Mary one room in my dwelling house, which she shall choose, and the use of the rest of my house with my children during the time she remains my widow. My son Ezekiel is to have the sole management of all my lands, the homestead, and orchards for the support of my wife and children till they are of age. I also leave to my wife one bed and furniture, and the furniture of her room, and a horse and side saddle, and if she marries she shall have £30. I leave to my eldest son Joseph £5, and as he is a cripple in his lower limbs, he is to be provided for by his mother in my family while she remains unmarried, and then to be cared for by my son Ezekiel, But if my son Ezekiel shall not provide for him, then he may live with any of his brothers and sisters, and Ezekiel shall pay him £12 a year, and provide him good wearing apparell. I leave to my son Ezekiel when of age all my house, lands, and out houses, lying in Perigo Neck, in Rye, which I bought of Timothy Knapp, Also the piece of salt meadow lying between Samuel Brown and Roger Purdy, adjoining to the burying place, with the upland belonging to me and adjoining to his meadow. I leave to my son, Philemon Hallstead, when 21, the dwelling house and all lands adjoining in Harrison's Purchase, which I bought of Bartholemew Sears and Mr. Sewall Sears, fronting on the west side to the road from Rye to the White Plains, with the saw mill and all utensils, Also a piece of salt meadow lying between Samuel Brown and Adam Symonds, and adjoining to the upland. I leave to my son Micah when 21 all my farm in the Manor of Cortlandt, being about 500 acres, with the houses and improvements. I leave to my son Ezekiel all my movable effects, and he is to pay to my daughter Sarah, wife of Frederick De Voe, £10, To my daughter Abigail, wife of Hachaliah Brown, Jr., £40, To my daughter, Mary Bishop, £50, "when she shall marry again," To my daughter Charity £9 on her marriage day. I make my wife and my son Ezekiel executors. Dated October 29, 1757. Witnesses, Hachaliah Brown, Abraham Theall, John Smith. Proved, December 3, 1757.

"I leave to my son Benjamin £12 yearly, and I request it of all my children, and leave it as a charge, to treat him with utmost and kind tenderness, and after the decease of his mother to live with one of his brothers or sisters." I leave to my daughter Martha £18, and 2 cows, and a bed, etc. To my daughter, Sarah Gurney, £3. To my daughters, Hannah Coe and Abigail Vandervoort, 5 shillings each. I leave to my wife as much household furniture as she thinks proper. To my son Benjamin a bed and chest. To my son Jonah a horse and plough and cart. To my son John a horse. All my real estate I leave to my sons, Caleb, Jonah, and John, as follows: Caleb is to have the farm on which he lives, and he shall not endeavor to take any advantage of his other brothers, and shall pay £4 yearly to Benjamin for his support. In his will, he wrote: ...January 22, 1735. I, Joseph Halstead, of the Borough town of Westchester, being sick. Whereas I have, together with Nathaniel Yeomans, of Westchester, entered into an agreement with Madame Brett, for the purchase of 300 acres of land, of which I am to have 200 acres, and to pay therefor the sum of £160, as by said agreement, dated in October last, my executors are to sell my negro slave "Peggy," and all my wheat, and apply the money towards paying for the said land; and they are to sell so much land from the farm where I now live as will pay the remainder, and they are to take a deed for the said tract of land for the use of my son Samuel Halstead. And if my executors are obliged to pay the last payment of £100 for the land I bought of Joseph Thorne, when his executors make good the title, then my executors are to sell so much of my farm as to pay for the same. Whereas I have given to my eldest son Joseph, a farm in Queens County, I leave him 5 shillings in full for his portion. Whereas I have given to my son Richard a farm in Orange County, I leave him 5 shillings. I leave to my son Ezekiel, my farm in New Rochelle, which I purchased of Joseph Thorne, with the buildings. If Madame Brett releases myself and the said Nathaniel Yeomans from the agreement, then I leave the remainder of my farm in Westchester to my sons Samuel and Michael. But if the agreement is not released, then I leave to my son Michael all my said farm, except what my executors may sell as afore stated. If my son Michael should die under age, then I leave the farm to my sons Ezekiel and Samuel. I leave to my daughter-in-law, Deborah Wright, all the goods that her mother, deceased, brought to me on our marriage. I leave to my son Michael, my cart, oxen, and implements. The rest of my personal estate I leave to my daughters, Anne, wife of Robert Ryder, Phebe, wife of Robert Marvin, Sarah, wife of Samuel (???), and Abyah, wife of Henry Gillian. I make my son Joseph, and my son-in-law, Robert Marvin, executors. Witnesses, Thomas Hadden, John Williams, William Forster. George Clarke, Esq., President of Council and Commander-in-Chief. To all, etc. Know ye that at New York, before Frederick Morris, Esq., on the 10 day of August, 1736, the will of Joseph Halstead was proved.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Richard Holstead, of Goshen, Orange County, New York, being now in health of body. Concerning my worldly estate, I give and bequeath in the following manner, desiring every one concerned in the distribution thereof will be contented and satisfied therewith. I give to my Executors so much of my moveable estate for them to dispose of for my debts and funeral charges. To my beloved wife Esther the remainder of my household furniture, excepting my large cupboard, and sufficient room in my dwelling house, and the benefit of half my homestead lot adjoining my said house; also one riding horse, two cows, six sheep; the above said benefit of my house and lot shall remain to her no longer than she shall remain my widow, and the furniture and creatures be hers forever. To my son Michael my whole farm that I now live on, lying on the west side of the "drowned land," and the Wallakill, within the Patent of Wawayandea, in the County aforesaid, which I lately purchased from Henry Davee, his deed will give the boundaries of said tract, which shall remain together with the "improvements and appurtenances thereunto," and my working horses, mares, and all other creatures, and farming utensils, to him, my said son Michael and his heirs forever. To my daughter, Sarah Seely, my above mentioned large cupboard, and half of my right to a certain tract of land which was set off, containing about 3,000 acres, for the benefit of those persons having town rights belonging to the township of Goshen, within the Patent of Wawayandea, which said half of my whole right shall remain to my said daughter and her daughters forever. To my grandson, Samuel Holstead, my other half of my whole right as above mentioned, for him and his heirs forever. To all my sons, Richard, Joseph, Isaiah, Benjamin and Michael Holstead, the remainder of all my town right of lands in the Wawayandea Patent. To my son Benjamin the remainder of my southeast division lot of land in the town of Goshen, supposed to be about ten acres. To my sons Richard and Isaiah, each 5 shillings out of my moveable estate. I order my son Michael to provide sufficiently with all necessaries and firewood for my wife Esther and for her creatures during her widowhood. I make my wife and sons, Joseph and Michael, or the survivors of them, my executors. Dated May 5, 1774. Note before signing the above, my will, is that my "Pue" in the "Presbeteran" meeting house in Goshen shall remain for the use of my family till they shall see cause to dispose of it. Witnesses, Henry David, Daniel Everett (of Goshen, Esquire), Susanna Huge. Proved, Orange County, December 1, 1785. Confirmed, New York, December 14, 1785.
