

-- HANSZ, HANSEN --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In the Albany Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were: Henderik Hansz, y,m., and Debora Van Dam, y,d., both of N.A. [New Albany].

In his will, he wrote: 2nd September, 1723. I, Hendrick Hansen, of Albany, yeoman, being weak in body. I leave to my oldest son, Hans Hansen, in his right of primogeniture, "my lot of ground in Albany, on the north side thereof," Bounded on the south by the house and lot of Cornelius Cuyler, north by Jacob Beckman, west and east by streets. I leave to my wife Deborah the use of all my real and personal estate, but not to sell or barter. After her decease all my estate is to go to my children. But if she marries she is to have the lot in Albany and the house between the house of Abraham Schuyler to the north, and the house of the Church Wardens of the Nether Dutch Church to the south, and also £10 yearly. My son Richard Hans is to have a convenient apartment in my house next to Abraham Schuylers, for his use. I leave to my sons Hans and Nicholas all that my farm and tract of land situate on the north side of the Maquese river, over against the land called Ticondoraga, bounded west by the tract of land of Mr. John Collins. Being in all 2,000 acres, and is granted unto me by Patent from Brigadier (General) Hunter, late Governor of the Province of New York. To be equally divided between them, and my son Hans is to have his choice of the parts. And whichever of the sons has the half on which my house, barn, barracks, and other buildings stand, he shall assist and pay one half of the workmanship and other charges of building such like houses and buildings on the other half. The mills erected, and to be erected, are to be in partnership between them. I also leave to my sons Hans and Nicholas, each one half of that piece of Pasture land lying in the township of Schenectady, on the south side of the high way that leads by the north side of the Fort, and is bounded west by the Pasture ground of Thomas Williams. Also that lot of ground in said town opposite to the house of Jacob Schermerhorn, and on the south side of the street, and bounded east by the lot of ground of Dow Angus, where he now lives near by the Church. Also all that certain tract of land in the township of Schenectady "near the Waestryna," and bounded partly by the farm of Jacobus Peek. These are to be equally divided between them. My son Hans Hansen is to pay to his two sisters, Deborah, wife of Jacob Beekman, and Maria Hansen, each £150. And my son Nicholas is to pay to each of them £100. I leave to my sons Hans and Nicholas all cattle and farming utensils, and they are to pay to their mother, if she happens to remarry, £10 yearly during her life, "except in time of war and when they may not peaceably enjoy what is bequeathed to them." [The rest of this will is not on record.]

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A group of Flatbush residents, in an agreement signed 21 November 1692, formed a consortium and sent a delegation to Pennsylvania, which then included Delaware, "to look out for a good piece of land and situation to reside upon, and the same having found to purchase for us and them together." Two of the principals were Aries Yansen [Vanderbilt] and Symon Hansen, whose children Antje Vanderbilt and Isaac Simonson would eventually marry.¹
