The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Abraham Hardenburgh, of Guilford, Ulster County, Esq., being weak and sick. I leave to my wife Mary 2 cows and a steer, and a bed, bedstead, and bedclothes, curtains and furniture, and £355, and the use of the dwelling house and barn I purchased of Abraham Roosa and Elizabeth, his wife, at Guilford, with all the lot of land thereto belonging and distinguished as Lot No. 1; Also her choice of my waggons, horses, ploughs, etc., and after her death I leave them to my four children, Nicholas, Elias, Maritie, and Rachel. I leave to my wife during her widowhood a negro man and woman. I leave to my eldest son, Johanes, all my farm where I now live, at Guilford. That is to say all that part of a certain tract of 2000 acres formerly granted by Letters Patent to James Graham and John Delaval, known by the name of Guilford; Also 2 tracts of land thereunto adjoining formerly granted to Jacob Rutsen, as the same was in the possession of my

late father-in-law, Nicholas Roosa, and Sarah his wife, as the same was devised to the said Sarah by Jacob Rutsen, her father, by will (except such part as I give to my daughter Sarah, wife of Charles W. Brodhead) with all the buildings. And my son Johanes shall pay to my said daughter £400 in 3 years. I leave to my daughter Sarah, wife of Charles W. Brodhead, all my lands situate adjoining to the east and west sides of the land of Col. Abraham Hasbrouck, at Guilford, being part of two tracts of land formerly granted to Jacob Rutsen. And the division or partition line between my son Johanes and my said daughter Sarah shall begin at the southwest and southeast corners of said land, and runs from thence the same course, as the partition line is settled between Col. Jacob Rutsen, deceased, and the lines of Capt. Abraham Hasbrouck, deceased, with all the buildings. I leave to my other four children, Nicholas, Elias, Maritie, and Rachel, all the aforesaid Lot No. 1, at Guilford, which I purchased of Abraham Roosa and Elizabeth, his wife; Also my 1/7 of Lot No. 9, lying in the Great Patent, commonly called the Blue Mountain Patent, which said Lot No. 9 is bounded west on the west side of Popaping River, adjoining on the south side of a lot of Ver Planck, with all buildings. I leave to all my six children, Johanes, Sarah, Nicholas, Elias, Maritie, and Rachel, all that my 1/7 of the other lots of land lying in the said Great Patent. Whereof I am now seized in Common with my brother, Johanes Hardenburgh, and my brother-in-law, Charles Brodhead, and all the rest of my real and personal estate. My son Johanes shall have power till my youngest child is of age, to make partitions of land with other owners, and he and my brother, Johanes Hardenburgh, and Charles Brodhead may sell parts of the Lots, except Lot No. 9, to pay expenses of running lines for the better encouragement of settling said lands. I make my sons, Johanes, Nicholas, and Elias, and my son-in-law, Charles W. Brodhead, and my stepson, Joseph Gashrie, executors, and they are to sell the rest of movable estate at vendue to pay debts and legacies. My son Johanes, and Joseph Gashrie are to be guardians of the younger children. Dated September 22, 1771. Witnesses, John Terwilliger, Daniel Freer, Jr., Peter De Yoo, Jr. Proved, March 14, 1772, before John Bruyn. [NOTE.--The testator was one of the great landowners of Ulster County. The "Great Patent" was granted to Johanes Hardenburgh, and included a very large part of the Catskill Mountains, or as they were originally called the "Blue Mountains." The "Mountain House" is near the northeast corner of the Patent. W. S. P.]

In his will, he wrote: ...July 12, 1759. I, Charles Hardenbergh, of Kingston, in Ulster County, being weak and sick. "I desire to be buried in decent Christian burial." All debts to be paid. My executors may sell any part of my real or personal estate, as shall seem meet and expedient, to pay debts. "And if there are found sufficient effects to discharge all just debts without selling of all those effects which my dear and well-beloved wife Catharine has brought to me, then I bequeath to my wife all her wearing apparell, bedding, bed clothes, or whatever other goods or furniture she brought to me." After debts and funeral charges are paid and children brought up, all the rest leave to my children, Johanes and Catharine. I make my father, Johanes Hardenbergh, and my father-in-law, Petrus Smedus, executors. Witnesses, Adam Persen, tailor, Wilhelmus Mancius, Dirck Wynkoop, Jr., merchant. Proved, May 11, 1769.
