The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Dirckje Tallman's father, Harmen Douwes Tallman was born about 1655 in Friesland and was the first white settler of Nyack, N.Y. in 1675.

In the Tappan Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were Abram Haringh and Dirckie Tallman j.d. born at Nayack in the County of Orange, both of the farm on the Manades [Manhattan] Island, betrothed in the presence of Daniel De Klerck."

Abraham Haring and Dirckje Tallman are believed to have lived on the Pascack Road north of the state border. His land holdings continued into present Bergen County, in the River Vale area, including 200 acres he bought before 1743 probably from Lancaster Symes. His son Cornelius A. Haring settled on this land in 1743 and inherited it at Abraham's death in 1771. Cornelius built a house here, and in 1778, Col. Baylor was captured at the house.

In his will, dated 10 March 1752, probated 5 May 1772, "Abraham Haring, of Orange County, yeoman" mentioned eldest son Abraham Haring (Hemps Meadow); second son Daniel (dwelling house, and rest of land of the farm I now live on); wife Derica; youngest son Cornelius (lot over the Hackinsack Creek, which I purchased of Lancaster Symes); leaves to 3 sons two mill lots to be divided equally; youngest daughter Rachel (an outset equal to that any of my daughters have had); eldest daughter Margaret Demarest; second daughter Braca Ferdan. Makes three sons and wife executors. Witnesses were Casporus Mabie, Cornelius Myer, John De Wint. Abraham Haring's will is in Liber 28, p. 238, Queen's College, Historic Documents Collection. In his will, he wrote: ...I, Abraham Haring, of Orange County, yeoman, being of perfect memory. I leave to my eldest son, Abraham Haring, £5 for his Birthright, being eldest son. I also leave him "all that lot of land called and known by the name of the Church Lot," with all improvements; Also as many acres of land out of the south bounds of my farm I live on, and to be added to said Church lot, as will make the said Church Lot equal in acres to the remainder of my farm. I also leave him all that lot of land "known by the name of the Hemps meadow." I leave to my second son, Daniel, my dwelling house and all the rest of the land that belongs to the farm I now live on, with the improvements (except one of the best rooms in the house, and a garden, and room in my barn, and 1/3 of the apples in my orchard, to my wife). And he is to have the same after the death of my wife Derica; Also a piece of land lying on the east side of the Kings road, which I bought of Ram Ramse. I leave to my youngest son, Cornelius, all that lot of land that lays over Hackinsack Creek, which I purchased of Lancaster Symes, with the improvements; "Also the Ring Boome lots of land," and one lot of Fresh meadow No. 4. I leave to my 3 sons, all those two mill Lots to be divided equally. I leave to my sons, Abraham and Daniel, all that 1/8 part out of 3/16 parts in the Commons of the lands in Tappan. And I will that within half a year "my sons transport to each other their shares of land." I leave to my son Daniel a plow and harrow, etc. To my daughter Rachel, an outset equally as good of all sorts as any of my daughters have had. I leave to my eldest daughter, Margaret Demarest, £100, after the death of my wife, in yearly payments of £12, 10 shillings. I leave to my second daughter, Braca Ferdan, £100 in same manner. To my youngest daughter, Rachel Haring, £100. All these to be paid by my sons. I leave to my wife Derica all the remainder of my personal estate, and the choice of one of the best rooms in my dwelling house, and a garden spot of ground, and room in my barn for 10 head of cattle, and 1/3 of the apples in my orchard, and firewood sufficient for one fireplace, "and long fodder for 10 head of cattle and 6 sheep," and 1/3 of all winter and summer grain and flax; "to be delivered at my dwelling house clear and free." And she is to have pasture for 10 head of cattle, 6 sheep, and 2 hogs. After debts are paid I leave all the rest to my 6 children, and all my real estate to my three sons. I make my three sons and my wife, executors. Dated March 10, 1752, "in the 25 year of His Majesty King George II." "Abraham Haringh." Witnesses, Casporus Mabie, Cornelius Myer, John De Wint. Proved, May 5, 1772, in New York.

In the m. record they are "Abraham Haring of Tappan, y.m. and Martyntje Boogert, y.d., born and living at Hakkensak."

Abraham P. Haring was a member of the 24th New York State Assembly (1745-47), the 28th Assembly (1759-61), and the 29th Assembly (1761-1768).

In 1745 he lived in Tappan on a farm inherited from his father.

Abraham P. Haring was a colonel in the New York militia during the French and Indian War and a Judge of the Orange County Court of Common Pleas.

In 1769, when the New York/New Jersey boundary dispute was settled, Abraham's farm was decreed to be in New Jersey.

In his will, dated 1771, proved 1793, he mentioned Wife Martinjie (Grietje**), 1 negro wench, mansion house and farm wheron I now live, and movable estate, during her widowhood. Oldest son, Peter, Dutch Bible and walking cane; also house and farm now in his possession, Son Abraham, home farm, after wife is married or deceased, he paying £200 for same. Son Cornelius already had his share. Sons, John and Abraham, 2 lots called the Church lots and each 1/2 of residue. Daughters, Mary, wife of Hendrick Zabriskie, and Margaret, wife of Isaac Blanch, each 1/2 of residue. Executors - sons John and Abraham. Witnesses - Yon Nagel, Christian Campbell, Thomas Outwater.¹

In the m. record they are "Abraham Haring, y.m. of Tappan, and Maria Demarest, born and living at Schraalenburgh."

Maria Demarest Haring, Abraham's wife, joined the Tappan Church by letter, 1 January 1732. Abraham was a deacon and an elder in the Tappan Church.

Abraham inherited land and purchased additional land accumulating between 600 and 700 acres.

Fabend wrote of Abraham Haring: "The 1779 tax records show him, at age 60, as the richest man in Harington Township, with £750 at interest and with a working farm of 256 acres. (He owned as well about 500 other acres his sons worked.)...At his death in 1791 at age 82, his inventory shows he still owned, besides his large farm, eight adult slaves, eight horses, two colts, ten cows, a heifer, two calves, 26 sheep, 14 swine, 50 dunghill fowl, and three bee hives."

He built his homestead on the west side of the main road near its bend to the east toward the ferry, about 1757-58, the time of his first marriage. He was a Captain in the Revolutionary War, and died between 1780 and 1783 while a prisoner of the British in New York. Fellow soldier James Riker (an orderly Sergeant in a company commanded by Capt. Abraham Harin), in an affidavit for pension application of Paul Powles, noted that Capt. Abraham Haring "was taken prisoner by the enemy and brought to New York and here died in prison."

Abraham A. P. Haring was the grandson of Pieter Haring, which relationship supplied the extra identifying initial to his name in order to differentiate especially for official records between him and his contemporary counterpart of the same rank, Captain Abraham A. Haring of Rockleigh.

Abraham A. P. Haring was a Captain in the Revolutionary War. He lived on Tappan Road, north of Blanch Avenue in what is present-day Norwood, Bergen Co., NJ, where he died in 1807.

Abraham's will was dated 11 Feb 1799, proved 2 March 1807. In it, Abraham Haring of Harington, Bergen Co., NJ, yeoman, mentions wife Sarah, Daughters Catharinah wife of Jacob Van Buskirk, and Martyntyte wife of John Powers. Executors: Sons-in-law Jacob Van Buskirk and John Powers.

Abraham Haring was devised the north half of the homestead farm by his father's Will. He lived in Harrington Township, Bergen Co., NJ.

He joined the British, becoming a United Empire Loyalist during the Revolutionary War. His estate was confiscated and the whole farm was levied upon by the State of New Jersey and sold to Henry Wisner in 1779. In 1783 Abraham filed a claim for his losses totaling 560 pounds and gave a power of attorney to William Bayard for handling the claim in England. Because it was not acted upon, he filed another claim in 1788 at which time he was then living on Staten Island. Both claims were apparently disallowed due to the fact that he had never left the country. In lieu thereof he was granted five acres in Shelburne County, Nova Scotia.

He was survived by his wife. She made a deed on 7 December 1795 to the children of John R. Flierboom for 12 acres at Old Tappan. She was still living in New York City when she made the mortgage on 2 April 1796 to Jacob J. Banta covering 6 acres in lot 5 [of the Kakiat Patent].

In 1776, Abraham Haring went to Stratford, Conn, where he spent the war years. On Oct 18, 1780, he petitioned the Conn. General Assembly, that he be permitted to sell certain real estate in New York for £1500 and to import the avails in British goods. Petition was denied. On petition he then was permitted to return to New York.²

"Abraham Herring, merchant...In September 1776, when the British occupied New York, Abraham Herring, the inspiration to these pioneers of Utica and an example to young Samuel, was twenty-one and already in business. He and his sisters were heir to their father's considerable estate, which consisted mainly of Manhattan lands. It had not been distributed in the three years between Elbert's death and the British invasion, perhaps because several children were still minors. It was to remain in limbo until after the British evacuation. Abraham left the city when the British arrived in September 1776 to find refuge in Stratford, Connecticut - unlike his Kip, DePeyster, and Gardner Jones in-laws who gathered in Tappan. In that same month, according to a family record, he married there Elizabeth Ivers, and it may be that it was because of her and her father, Thomas Ivers, that he had gone to Stratford. We know from the records of Christ Episcopal Church, Stratford - one of the earliest-established Anglican churches in colonial Connecticut - that two children born to Thomas and Hannah Ivers, younger than Elizabeth, were baptized there in the 1760s. While we do not know what Thomas Ivers was doing in Stratford, in New York City after the Revolution he established a rope works at Corlears Hook on the East River, suggesting that he had been familiar with supplying the needs of ships, which he could have done before the war in Connecticut. Abraham, later a trader and merchant, may have met him and his family under such circumstances early in his career. Thomas Ivers was strongly attached to the patriot cause, as evidenced by his election to the Common Council of New York City immediately after the evacuation. Shortly thereafter he was awarded confiscated Tory lands in the city." (Regina Haring's note: he got DeLancey lands in the Outward.)³

In 1776 Abraham fled with his family to Stratford, Conn., where he spent the war years. In 1790 he was a resident of the East Ward of NYC, where his household included three free males over 16, three under 16, three white females, and three slaves. In the city he became a merchant with trading interests in Albany and points west, including the early settlement of Utica. In the first NYC directory (1786) he was listed at 42 Water Street and was listed at other addresses on Water Street to 1798, when his office was at 192 Pearl to 1806, then at 44 Broadway. Later he entered into business with son Thomas. In his last years he resided at 45 Hudson Street. The New York Evening Post wrote on the afternoon of his death that he had been "born on an estate, owned and cultivated before and for a long time afterwards by his father, spreading from the Bowery across Broadway nearly to Hudson street of which Bond Street was the garden plot, and the site of the University, Washington Square and all the adjacent streets were enclosed fields for tillage and pasture. He had lived to see the almost magical changes the city has undergone, and was a most conspicuous representative of the old Dutch stock, its original founders." (NY Evening Post 3 Jan 1837).⁴

In the 1895 census of Montvale, Abraham and his family were in house #7 and his father Peter A. Haring was the only occupant of house #5. In 1900 he was living in Montvale, a 61 year old farmer who owned his own farm. He lived on the west side of Chestnut Ridge Road, just north of West Grand Ave., in an area then know as Chestnut Ridge and later as Upper Montvale.

Records indicate that he bought the property where the first district school was located on the corner of Chestnut Ridge Rd. and Summit Ave. in 1901 for \$173.00.

He served in the Civil War (Union). A. P. Haring enlisted, at age 21, 26 Aug 1862 Brooklyn, NY as a Private, for 3 years, in Co. C, 132 New York Inf. As a Private, he was Non Com Staff for promotion to Sergt. Major. On 5 Jan 1863 he was promoted at New Bern, NC, to 2nd Lieut., Co. C, 132 Inf. In 1863 he was transferred for promotion to 1st Lieut.

He was wounded at the battle of Southwest Creek, NC, in the spring of 1865, by a ball passing through his cheek, fired by a sharpshooter. After the first day the wound was left undressed for four days, which prolonged his suffering, and he was rendered unfit for service for several weeks⁴

Mustered out (discharged for wounds) on 15 March 1865. His widow, Emma, received a pension 16 April 1915.

Abram P. Haring was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor at Batchelder's Creek, NC 1 Feb 1864. With Eleven Men held an Army at Bay. On February 1, 1864, at 8:30 o'clock in the morning, General Pickett, of the Army of Virginia, attacked the outposts of the Union forces at a point where the Neuse Road crosses Batchelder's Creek, about eight miles from New Berne, North Carolina. At that point the Federal force consisted of only eleven men under Lieutenant Abram P. Haring, of Company G, One hundred and thirty- second New York Infantry. The evident purpose of the rebels was the capture of New Berne, which was stocked with ammunition, clothing and general stores in large quantities. General Pickett led his force divided into three columns and chose a most favorable time for his attack, for a fog and a light drizzling rain covered their advance, besides cutting off all Union signal communication. The strength of the Confederates was estimated as high as 11,000. "The location of our small reserve," Lieutenant Haring narrates, "was in a naturally strong position. The creek was fifty feet wide in front, with breastworks on either side about fifty feet long. During the preceding night we had taken up the bridge, and with the timbers and planks we constructed a small but strong breastwork, behind which we stationed ourselves. About 3:30 o'clock in the morning during a heavy fog, the Confederates attacked us in force, but were unable to dislodge us. I immediately dispatched a messenger to headquarters informing the commanding officer of the situation. In the meantime the enemy, feeling conscious of their strength, made a second attack, which like the first proved futile. We were keeping up a steady fire during this attack, and now our ammunition was pretty well exhausted, but the little we had left we used to good advantage." Thus did Lieutenant Haring and the eleven men of his command hold the powerful army of the rebel general at bay for several hours. All attempts to dislodge the Spartan band from the bridge and free the way for further advance, failed. Then batteries of artillery were brought up, but still Lieutenant Haring and his men refused to yield. In the meantime the defenders of the bridge were re-enforced by 150 men from the One hundred and thirty-second New York, and the rebels seeing that further attempts to dislodge them were useless changed their plan of attack, constructed a bridge across the creek at a point some distance below, and there attacked Lieutenant Haring's little force from the rear, thus driving them out of their stronghold. This is the praise which Captain Charles G. Smith, Lieutenant Haring's superior officer, in his official report, bestows upon the hero: "I feel it my duty to mention several instances of coolness and heroism, particularly that of Lieutenant Haring's brave defense of the Neuse bridge, which is worthy of especial commendation." Still more flattering is the following official reference to the incident by Colonel Claassen: "First Lieutenant Abram P. Haring commanded the reserve at the attack at the Neuse bridge and with eleven men heroically held that all-important point for hours, against thousands of the enemy." Abram P. Haring became a resident of Montclair, NJ in 1876. He purchased, in 1880, the Beatty farm, on Valley Road, and remodeled the homestead and resided there until 1891. In 1893 he moved into the large new house which he erected at 66 Park street. The house was designed by E. R. North, architect, and is the style known as colonial renaissance.⁴

Cornelius Haring and his wife, Cathalina Flierboom, joined the Tappan Church 24 October 1694.

Cornelius Haring owned a tract of 346 acres in the Tappan Patent, in what is now Norwood, N.J., where he made his home. This property, when the final division of the Tappan Patent was made in 1721, was bounded north by Abraham Haring, France Van Cela [Frans Van Salee?], and Cornelius Ackerson, west by Jacob King and France Van Cela, east by Garret Hubertse Blauvelt and Peter Haring.¹

In 1719, he purchased 274 acres between Schraalenburgh Road and the Hackensack River in what is now Closter and Haverth, from Samuel Demarest, Sr. He purchased 200 acres of lot 4 in the Kakiat Patent before February 1742, which he devised to his son Cornelius through his LW&T.

Cornelius Haring was a Judge of the Common Pleas in Orange County, NY in 1727; a member of the Provincial Assembly of New York, from Orange County, from 1727-37. Cornelius's family had lived in New York City, near the present Bleeker Street, but about 1686 they removed to the Tappan-Orangetown area.

Cornelius Haring made a LW&T, dated 7 February 1742, which was proved 28 June 1775 (filed at Trenton). In the will, he left to youngest son, Jacob, land at Tappan; to oldest son, John, the rest of the land in Tappan; to son Daniel, land where he lives at Hackensack Creek; to son Cornelius, land where he lives...

Lea Stratemaker, Cornelius C. Haring's first wife, received legacies (totalling 80 pounds, payable by her brothers and sister) from her father's Will, dated 30 March 1729, proved 2 August 1732 at New York. When Lea died in 1738 or 1739, administration on her estate was granted to her husband, "Cornelius Haring, Jr., farmer, of Orange County," on 24 September 1742 in New York.

Cornelius C. Haring was in occupation of his father's land in lot 4 [of the Kakiat Patent] when the latter's Will was drawn in 1742 and had probably resided there for some period of his first marriage. The original homestead dates from this approximate period and became changed and enlarged to care for the needs of a growing family. Subsequent owners also remodeled and enlarged the structure and it now stands at #525 River Vale Road, River Vale, N.J. The location is shown on Erskine's Revolutionary War Map No. 113, in 1780. In 1752 Cornelius purchased 1/8th part of lot 35 [of the Kakiat Patent].

Cornelius C. Haring served as a Captain in the Provincial troops of New York in 1759 and 1760, during the French and Indian War. He and his family were pro-British when the Revolutionary War came, and he and his son-in-law, John DeBaun, were arrested by order of the Council of Safety made 11 July 1777, for being "disaffected" to the American cause, and were jailed at Morristown. They later declared their innocence and were discharged upon taking the necessary oaths.

Cornelius died shortly after his release from prison, leaving a Will dated 28 August 1775, but which was not proved until 30 October 1783. The homestead farm was devised to sons Abraham and John; and the land in lot 35 [of the Kakiat Patent] to daughter Lea and son Dirck. Legacies were provided for the other daughters; as well as house room, furniture and necessities for the widow. She d. in October 1779, in which year the homestead farm in lot 4 [of the Kakiat Patent] was sold under confiscation by the State of New Jersey against sons Abraham and John, loyalists, to Henry Wisner of Orange County. Dirck Haring remained on the farm as a tenant until it was again sold.

Cornelius J. Haring inherited the westerly 170 acres of lot 4 in the Kakiat Patent. This land had been acquired as a homestead farm for him, and he went there to live at the time of his marriage. When his father, John C. Haring died, his Will proved in 1775 devised to son Cornelius the "land over the kill."

Cornelius and Elizabeth Haring lived in a small sandstone house in Hillsdale, which was demolished about 1867. Cornelius farmed this land and was buried in a family cemetery on the south line of the farm. His LW&T was dated 16 June 1800.

In the m. record they are "Cornelius Haering, y.m., born and living at Tappan, and Margrietjen Roelofsen, y.d., born and living at Hackensack."

Cornelius A. Haring was an Elder at Tappan (28 August 1769; 3 April 1774) and a member of the Irregular Church at Tappan. In June 1764 he represented 39 dissident families of Dominie Verbryck's Tappan congregation at a conferentie meeting.

Cornelius A. Haring, like his neighbors and relations, was also of pro-British sympathies when the Revolutionary War started, and among the local group arrested as "disaffected" to the American cause and taken to jail in Morristown in July, 1777. Upon his examination, he declared his innocence and was discharged after taking the necessary oaths.

On the night of the Baylor Massacre, 28 September 1778, he opened his house in what is today River Vale, to Col. George Baylor and some of his staff, who were later surprised by Grey's forces when they attacked the neighborhood. This homestead was torn down before 1820 and replaced with another at the same site. He purchased about 92 acres out of the south part of lot 34 [of the Kakiat Patent] at an unknown date, probably between 1774 and 1779, which was called the lot of land at "Pascack."

He and his wife were buried the same day, 16 January 1810, in a family cemetery now located at the north terminus of Gruman Court, on the easterly part of the farm. The North Schraalenburgh church record says they were "buried in one grave."

His Will, dated 20 December 1803, was proved 24 January 1810 (NJA 41:164/5). After providing for his wife, the homestead farm was devised to sons Roelof and Abraham, the north half to the former "where his improvements stand on," and the south half to the latter "where his improvements stand on." The land in lot 34 and a salt meadow at Orangetown, were divided equally between the sons, subject to payment of legacies totaling \$1000 to their four sisters. He mentioned wife Margaret; sons Roelof, Abraham; daus. Margaret, Dirckje (wife of Johannes Perry), Mary (wife of Isaac Perry), Charity (wife of David Demarest).

Cosyn Haring was a Tappan Patentee, an organizer of the Tappan Church, assessor (1708), and Captain of the militia (1715). He acquired well over 900 acres, mostly in Old Tappan, NJ. He built, about 1704, the Haring-De Wolf House near the state border in what is now Old Tappan, Bergen County, NJ.

Cosyn Haring's will was dated 13 Sep 1733, probated 13 June 1743. The will is in Liber 15, p. 60, Queen's College, Historic Documents Collection. In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. September 13, 1733. I, Cozyn Harring, of Tappan, in Orange County, yeoman, being in good health. My wife Marytie, whom I make executor, shall have, hold, and enjoy all that plantation where I do live at present, at Old Tappan. All that land which lyeth between the Common road and the land of Cornelius Switz, with all its appurtenances, and all movable effects, during her widowhood. After her decease I leave to my son John Harring all that my land where my said son doth live upon. That is to say, all that my land that lyeth between the Little Hills (or else the Little Mountains) and the land of Roelof Van Houten, according to the bounds and limit of my deed, except 1/2 the meadow within said bounds. I leave to my daughter Maritie, wife of Johanes Bogart, all that my land known by the name of Henry (?) meadow; Also a lot of land lying at a place called the Greenbush, both lying in said Tappan. I leave to

my daughter Grietie, wife of Jacobus Demarest, all the northeasterly half of my plantation where I dwell at present, adjoining to the land of Cornelius Smith; Also 1/2 of the land which belongs to said farm or plantation, "known by the name of the Little Mountains," And 1/4 of the meadow. I leave to my grand-children, viz.: Geritt Eckerson, Wilempe Eckerson, and Cornelius Eckerson, the children of my daughter Maria, deceased, all the southwest part of my farm or plantation where I live, lying between the Common road and the partition fence, except my house and barn, and one row of apple trees; Also 1/2 of the tract called the Little Mountains, which belongs to said farm, and 1/4 of the meadow. I leave to my son John, £50, and he is to be guardian of my grand-children. Witnesses, David Demorest, Jacob Flierboom, John Flierboom. Proved before Henry Ludlow, Esq., June 16, 1743.

S:112) Cornelius Vander Voort of the Township of Hackensack, conveyed to James Christey, Esq. of Bergen County, for £215, 40 acres more or less in the Township of Harrington, SW corner of lot sold by said Cornelius Vander Voort to Daniel Haring. Bounded E by said lot; N by land lately the property of Rachel Peake, deceased; W by Daniel Demarest; S by said James Christy. Signed by Cornelius VanderVort. Witnessed by Isaac Nicoll, Walter D. Nicoll.¹

On 9 April 1802 (recorded 24 Jan 1804, Bergen Co. R:308) Samuel G. Verbruyck and John D. Haring, executors of the Last Will and Testament of David A. Haring late of Harington Township, dec'd, conveyed to Maria Haring, widow of said deceased, of same place, for \$384.69, 7-2/4 acres, 30 rods, meadow and woodland in Harington Township beginning at SW corner of Abraham Ryker, whereas said David A. Haring was in his lifetime and at the time of his death seized of [said] real estate. Bounded N by Abraham Ryker; S by John A. Haring; E by land belonging to heirs of David Haring, dec'd; W by meadowlands belonging to heirs of Abraham Haring, dec'd. Signed by Samuel G. Verbruyck, John Davd. Haring. Witnessed by James Blacklidg, Abraham A. Haring.²

On 2 November 1805 (recorded 28 Nov 1805, Bergen Co. Deeds W:17) Whereas Mary Eckerson, wife of Jacob Eckerson of Harington is entitled to a Dower Right in the Real Estate of her former husband David A. Haring, deceased, of the same place, therefore said Jacob Eckerson and Mary, his wife, conveyed to David D. Haring, son of deceased, of same place, for \$166.56, three lots in Harington: (1) 8 acres. homestead lot bounded W and N by land of Jacob D. Haring, son of said deceased; E by Road; S by land of John A. Haring. (2) 4 acres, mountain wood lot, bounded S by land of said Jacob D. Haring; N by land of Samuel Haring, son of said deceased; W by land of David Haring, son of said deceased; E by land of Peter Riker. (3) 3 acres, 20 Rods of woodlot in swamp, bounded N by wood land of said Jacob and Samuel Haring; S and W by land of John A. Haring; E by woodland of said Jacob Haring. Signed by Jacob Ackerson, Marya Acker. Witnessed by Thomas Ecker, William Fedon [Ferdon?].²

David died while his youngest son was still an infant, and his widow, Maria Alyea, m. (2) 2 Jan 1803 Tappan Ref Ch, **Jacob Eckerson** and her young children moved with her to her new husband's home on the east side of Tappan Road in what is today Norwood, Bergen County, NJ.

David P. Haring was a Private in Captain Abraham A. P. Haring's Company of NJ Militia in the Revolution. He lived on Tappan Road in Norwood, Bergen Co., NJ and later in the Paramus area.

His widow filed for Revolutionary War Pension No, W24395. At NYC Common Pleas Court, 20 Nov 1838, Tryntie Haring, formerly Garabrants, age 80, widow of David P. Haring, who d. 18 Feb 1831, and is buried at the Greenwich RDC graveyard in NYC. Married at my uncle's, George Mabee, home in Tappan, Rockland Co., NY, 01 Dec 1783. Son, Peter Haring, b. 25 Sep 1784, bpt. 03 Oct 1784 Tappan RDC. At NYC Common Pleas Court, 30 Nov 1838, Tyler W. Lafetra testifies that David P. Haring died in his home in NYC, and he called Archibald C. Brady, sexton of the Greenwich RDC, to carry the body to the vault. Tryntie Haring has lived in my home since her husband died. At Rockland Co., NY Common Pleas Court, 24 Nov 1838, Cornelius C. Mabee, age 85, on 17 March last, "I know David P. and Tryntie Haring had a large number of children, they were my neighbors in my younger days, saw them attend church after their marriage in their wedding clothes, as was the custom in those days. Others mentioned in pension: Revs Samuel Verbyke [Verbryck] and Isaac Cole, pastors of the Tappan RDC, marriage records for 1754-1784 are missing. All testifying as fellow soldiers in the Revolution: James J. Blauvelt, age 76, of Passaic Co., NJ on 05 Dec 1839; John A. Haring, age 77, of NYC, formerly of Harrington Twp., Bergen Co., NJ on 09 Nov 1838; James Riker, age 77, of NYC, was Sgt. in Bergen Co. Militia, John A. Blauvelt, age 78, of NYC, was married on 04 Jul 1785, was neighbor of Tryntie Garabrants in younger days.

The following transaction may apply to this David P. Haring:

On 10 May 1805 (recorded 19 July 1805, Bergen Co. V:428) John J. Haring of the City of New York and Martyntyte, his wife, conveyed to David P. Haring of Franklin Township, for \$5,250., two parcels: (1) 250-1/4 acres, a message in Franklin Township beginning E corner of Roelif Verbryck's land; mentioned west bounds of the Old Farm which said John Haring first Bought, it being near the Old Saw Mill; mentioned woodland of John Rutherford; woodland of John Haring, deceased, devised by Last Will and Testament to his daughters; middle of road; bounded NW by land of said John Rutherford; NE by land of daughters of said deceased and part by middle of the road; SE by land of Jacob Hopper and part by land of Abraham Hopper; SW by Roelif Verbryck. (2) also 20-2/4 acres, 20 Rods, woodlot int he same place, bounded N by Roelif Verbryck; S by woodland of the daughters of said deceased; E by David Foshea; W by Peter Lozier. Signed by John Haring, Martyntyte Haring. Witnessed by Henry Van Dalsen, Abraham Ackerman.²

They lived in Harrington Township in the area that became Norwood, Bergen Co., NJ. He built the house at what is now 327 Tappan Road, Norwood, about 1800. On 1 May 1839, David Haring conveyed the property to his son, Peter D. Haring, with the provision that "his covenant was not to sell during life of grantor."¹

In the 1850 Federal Census he was reported as "blind." In that census, "Elizabeth Haring," aged 80 is listed as living with him; this may have been his step-mother. His will was dated 4 Mar 1844, probated 30 Sep 1853. In it he mentioned wife Lydia, son Peter, and daughter Winecha.

David D. Haring's father's homestead still stands on Piermont Road in Rockleigh, Bergen Co., NJ and is now known as Eagle Hill. David D. Haring's father died while he was still an infant, and his widowed mother married Jacob Eckerson and moved, with her young children, to her new husband's home in what is now Norwood, N.J.

About 1823, after living with his wife Leah's parents for two years, David bought the house still standing today at 328 Tappan Road, Norwood, Bergen Co., NJ.

David D. Haring was a weaver of coverlets of the deep blue and white type that enjoyed great popularity in the 1830s and 1840s. He worked on one of the two Jacquard loom mechanisms known to have existed in Bergen County soon after their American introduction in 1826 at the Philadelphia Exposition. He was actively weaving from 1830-1837. His coverlets (called "blankets in his own and other estate inventories in Bergen County) were woven of blue wool and white cotton, of two narrow loom widths seamed together in the center. His coverlets are treasured by museums and private collectors. Coverlets woven by David D. Haring are in the Art Institute of Chicago, The Valentine Museum in Richmond, Virginia, the Newark Museum and the Von Steuben House in River Edge, N.J., among other places.

David served in Captain Garret Eckerson's Bergen County Brigade, and also as a freeholder in 1851-53.

They were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, New Jersey, Bergen Co., Harrington Township, Schraalenburgh P.O., p. 16-

17, enumerated 12 July 1860, Dwelling 818, Family 860 (all b. Bergen Co., NJ) -- David D. Haring, 60, Farmer, value real estate \$6500, value personal estate \$800; Leah Haring, 58 [Wife]; David [Haring], 9; William King, 16, Help on Farm.

David D. Haring granted a mortgage in 1870 to Stephen Barnes, who built the house at what is now 711 Broadway in Norwood, NJ. Early in 1882, Barnes died. His estate had trouble paying the mortgage, and David D. Haring secured a sheriff's deed by way of foreclosure for an approximate unpaid balance of \$6,000. When Haring died in 1889, his daughter, Eliza Blauvelt, transferred the property, in 1893 to William A. Mitchell.¹

According to Firth Fabend, "Elbert's unusual first name suggests that from the time of his birth he had been designated by his parents as an heir or surrogate son of his aunt and uncle, the Lieverses, who were childless. He may even have been brought up by the Lieverses in their home. In any case, tax records show that, beginning in 1727 from the time of his first marriage, he lived next door to the Lieverses in the West Ward [of Manhattan]. By marrying (second) their niece, his own first cousin, Elizabeth Bogert, Elbert endeared himself to his Lieverse aunt and uncle, as well as to his Bogert aunt, Elizabeth's recently widowed mother—who shortly invited him to join the family business. One month after his marriage to Elizabeth Bogert, Elbert was made a freeman of the city, joining as a baker, the trade followed by his wife's family. Bakers...were near the top of the economic ladder in early eighteenth-century New York, under merchants...Starting in 1728 [Elbert] held two elected positions in the West Ward, as tax collector and assistant alderman...In October 1741 he became a church master (rank below deacon) in the Dutch Reformed Church of New York...[He later became] a deacon and then an elder in the New York Church."

He added to his Manhattan real estate holdings through inheritance: when his father, Peter, died in 1750 Elbert was willed "all the rest" (or what was outside of Orange Co.—presumably in Manhattan; and from his uncle-by-marriage, Elbert Lieverse, "limeburner, of New York City." one half of his real estate in Manhattan at Lieverse's death in 1752. In 1755 Elbert Haring purchased land adjoining his New York City farm, which gave him in total a butterfly-shaped property that extended from Broadway east to the Bowery and from present-day Waverly Place south to Bleeker Street, then called Haring or Herring Street.

He also owned the house in Tappan "where Casparus Mabie formerly lived," and which Elbert's widow, Elizabeth, advertised for sale in 1776 (she was living in this house at the time).

He and his children Anglicized the spelling of the surname to Herring.

In his will dated 17 June 1772, probated 13 Dec 1773, "Elbert Haring, of New York, yeoman" wrote: "being in a reasonable state of Health." All just debts and funeral expenses are to be well and truly paid. I leave to my son Peter £5, "with which to bar him from any further claim as heir at law." I leave to my wife Elizabeth all my silver wrought plate. Whereas I have given to each of my children who are of age a deed to a lot of land 25 feet wide and 100 feet long, adjoining to the road that leads from the Bowery Lane to Greenwich, therefore, to make my under aged children equal, I leave to my son Abraham, all that certain lot of land hereafter to be called Lot No. 3, bounded east by said road, south by Lot No. 2, now belonging to my son Nicholas, north by Lot No. 4, now belonging to my daughter Catharine, and extending west 100 feet. I give to my daughter Mary the lot of land to be called Lot No. 9, bounded east by said road, south by Lot No. 8, now belonging to my daughter

Anatje, and to extend along the road 25 feet, and west 100 feet. I leave to my daughter Sarah the Lot No. 10, bounded east by said road, south by Lot 9. I leave to my wife all the remainder of my personal estate, and the use of all my real estate, during so long a time as she remains my widow, subject to the payment of £100 to my son Abraham, and £100 to each of my daughters, Mary and Sarah, provided they have not their outsets before my decease. And my wife is to bring up, maintain, and educate my underaged children, and if the income of my lands is not sufficient, my executors may sell lands for that purpose. If my wife marries, I leave her £300. I leave to my niece, Elizabeth Bogert, who now lives in my family, £50 when she is married. After the death of my wife I leave all my estate, real and personal, as follows: Whereas my son Peter hath already had very considerable sums of money, I release him from all claims. And whereas my daughter Catharine, wife of George Brinkerhoff, hath received all the estate and effects of her mother; in order to make my other children as near as may be equal, I leave to my sons, Nicholas and Abraham, and my daughters, Margaret, widow of Cornelius Roosevelt, Cornelia, wife of Samuel Jones, Elizabeth, wife of John De Peyster, Jr., Anatje, wife of Samuel Kipp, Mary, and Sarah, £450 each, and to my daughter Catharine £400, and to my son Peter £50, to be paid before any general division. All the rest of my estate, real and personal, I leave to all my children, and to their heirs and assigns forever. If either should die under age or without issue, their share to go to the survivors. I make my wife Elizabeth, and my son Nicholas, and my son-in-law, Samuel Jones, and my brother-in-law, Petrus Bogert, executors. Dated June 17, 1772. Witnesses, John Montanye, Thomas Gallaudet, John Montanye, Jr. Codicil.--Whereas I, Elbert Haring, of New York, Gentleman, did make my will, dated June 17, 1772. I make my sons-in-law, John De Peyster, Jr., and John Haring, executors with the rest. Dated November 26, 1773. Witnesses, Jacobus Roosevelt, Jr., Luke Ranst, Adolphus Roosevelt. Proved, December 13, 1773.

In her will dated 12 Jan 1787, probated 30 June 1787 (rec. NYC), "Elizabeth Herring, of New York City, widow" mentioned six daughters Margaret Roosevelt, Cornelia Jones, Elizabeth De Peyster, Ann Kip, Mary Haring, and Sarah Jones; son Peter; grandchildren Elbert Kip and Elizabeth Kip, children of my daughter Ann Kip; Elizabeth and Elbert Roosevelt, children of my daughter, Margaret Roosevelt; Elbert and Elizabeth Haring, children of my daughter Mary Haring; Nicholas and Elizabeth Jones, children of my daughter Sarah Jones; Elbert and Elizabeth Herring, children of my son Abraham; grandchild Elbert Haring Jones, son of daughter Cornelia Jones; granddaughter Elizabeth Schuyler De Peyster, daughter of my daughter Elizabeth De Peyster; grandson Nicholas Herring, son of my son Nicholas. Makes son Abraham, son-in-law Gardner Jones, and grandson Cornelius C. Roosevelt executors.

Regina Haring wrote, in Jan 2005, "Elbert seems to have presided over the removal of the Indians from the southeast to Oklahoma, and was apparently ignorant of the fact that they were not being sent to lovely forested lands like those they were leaving, but to OK with so many dying on the trip. Everyone says he was honest and hardworking - but apparently not really competent in the position."

Frederick built a house on what is now Old Tappan Lane, Old Tappan, Bergen County, NJ on his grandfather's lands, before the Revolution. The house was passed on to the youngest of their ten children, Abraham F. Haring.¹

The homestead in Old Tappan, Bergen County, NJ was passed down through Abraham Haring (d. 1858) to his son, Frederick A. Haring. Frederick passed the homestead on to his son, Garret F. Haring, b. in 1854.¹

Gerrit F. Hering lived in Montvale, Bergen County, NJ in the Octagon House (built by his father-in-law, John J. Blauvelt). He was the operator of the saw and cider mill at Hering's Pond. He was a Mayor of Montvale, and a Freeholder of Bergen County, NJ.

According to a petition relative to her father's estate, he was living in Montvale as early as February 3, 1882. He served as the borough's first freeholder in 1894. In 1895 he was a "Commissioner of Deeds of County of Bergen" (St. Paul's - Ter Kuile deed) and a notary (census). He was Montvale's second Mayor from 1898-1901.

In 1900 he was living in Montvale with his wife "Amelia," ("J. Amelia in 1895), and his occupation was "cider manufacturer and saw mill." An ad in the 'Circle Hall' program in 1896 listed Garret F. Hering and Son makers of and dealers in sweet sparkling cider." This mill was previously owned by his father-in-law John J. Blauvelt. The pond formed by the mill dam was known for many years as Hering's Pond (later Huff's Pond). His son and later the Huffs conducted an ice making operation on the site. Also living with them in 1895 and 1900 was his father, Fredrick J. Haring, who was an 89 year old widower, who was "supported by son."

In the 1906-7 directory of Montvale Garret was a "station agent", in the 1907-10 he was "comm. of deeds," Garret and Amelia lived at 13 West Grand Ave. in the "Octagon House," built by his father-in-law. Tradition tells us that he flagged down the trains from the cupola of the octagon house.
