The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

In his will dated 20 Nov 1775, probated 1 Dec 1775, Abraham Hatfield, of the White Plains, in Westchester County, NY, yeoman, wrote: I leave to my wife Anne, in lieu of dower, £50 and a negro girl, and a horse and riding chair, and 2 feather beds and furniture, and one looking glass, 1 great chair and 6 silver spoons, in bar of dower. I also leave her for the better support of herself and our children, Joseph and Mary, the use of the house where I now live, and the use of the land lying on the northwest side of the road leading from the Court House in the White Plains to New York. And also the use of such other lands as are not left to my son Gilbert, until my son Joseph is 21. I also leave her 2 rooms in my house, and the use of 1/3 of my lands. I leave to my daughter Lavina a horse and saddle and a cow, "which makes her equal with my other daughters"; Also a feather bed and £70. I leave to my daughter Mary £70, the interest of which is to be paid to my wife until my daughter Mary is of age, and if she dies, then to my daughters, Lavina, Alsie, and Margaret Compton. I leave to my son Joseph my silver knee buckles, shoe buckles, and stock buckle, and to my two sons, Gilbert and Joseph, all my wearing apparel. I leave to my son Joseph the house I now live in and all buildings, and all the land on the northwest side of the road that leads from the Court House to New York. If he dies without issue, then to my son Gilbert, and if he dies without issue, then to my daughters, Jane, Margaret, Lavina, Alsie, and Mary. I leave to my son Gilbert £10. My executors may sell property to pay debts. I make my wife Anna and my brother, Joshua Hatfield, and my son Gilbert, executors. Dated November 20, 1775. Witnesses, Job Hadden, Jonathan G. Graham, Benedict Carpenter, Quaker. Proved, December 1, 1775, before Caleb Fowler, Esq.¹

Matthys Hatfield was at New Haven, where he took the Oath of Fidelity 1 May 1660. He took a similar oath at Elizabethtown, NJ about 19 Feb 1665 and was one of the original Associates of Elizabethtown.

He was a Magistrate of Elizabethtown, NJ, and became High Sheriff and Alderman. He came from New Haven, Conn., where he was living in 1660.³

As Matthias Heathfield he appeared in NY records. He was a weaver and a boatman.

The name of "Mathias Helefeild (1670)" [Hatfield] appeared on an "Accompt [Account] of the Quitrents owing in Elizabethtown, ending Lady Day [25 March] 1685." Mathias Heathfield swore an oath of Fidelity, taken by the inhabitants of Elizabeth Town [NJ] 19 Feb 1665.

In his will, dated 19 April 1684, proved 13 Dec 1687, Mathias Hatfield mentioned wife and children spoken of, but not by name. Witnesses--George Ross, Humphrey Spinige. Proved December 13, 1687.

In his will dated 28 Dec 1753, Peter Hatfield, of the White Plains in Westchester County [NY], mentioned wife Elizabeth; son Joshua; son Peter; son Isaac. Named three sons executors. Wit: Abram Hatfield, David Horton, Jr., Caleb Hyatt, Jr.¹

In the will, he wrote: ...December 28, 1753, I, Peter Hatfield, of the White Plains, in Westchester County, being at present sick, I leave to my wife Elizabeth 1/3 of my whole estate and my now dwelling house adjoining to the kitchen, and 1/3 of the profits of my land (not otherwise left), during her widowhood. I leave to my son Joshua 10 shillings. My executors are to sell 10 acres of land and pay all debts. I leave to my son Peter all lands and messuages, subject to my wife's use, but if he die without issue then to my son Isaac. I make my sons, Joshua, Isaac, and Peter, executors. Witnesses, Abram Hatfield, David Horton, Jr., Caleb Hyatt, Jr. Proved, January 25, 1754.

In "The Hatfield Family in America" by Theresa Hall Bristol, in *New York Genealogical & Biographical Record*, Oct 1917, p. 388: Thomas Hatfield, a soldier in New Amsterdam 1665, m. Alice, dau. of Peter Ebel of New Amsterdam. Alice (Elsje) Ebel/Evel was bp. 23 Oct [16 Oct] 1650 NYCRefCh and prob. m. (1) William Traeter (Trotter?); they had a son Jacob bp. 17 June 1668 NYCRefCh with Peter Evel and Claertje Ebels as witnesses. William Trotter was one of the first Elizabeth-town, NJ Associates. Alice (Elsje) Ebel/Evel m. (prob. 2) Thomas Hatfield (spelled in NYCRefCh records variously, including Hertford, Hadvelt, Hertvelt). Thomas Hatfield purchased a home lot in Mamaroneck in 1671 from John Westcott, and became one of the Proprietors, receiving his share of the common allotment of land.

He was said to be the brother of Matthias Hatfield, and the son of Thomas Hatfield.¹ He was a soldier in the Dutch army.

30 April 1678 (Westchester Co. Deeds, Liber 4, recorded Albany, NY, p. 79) -- Recorded for Thomas Hatfield this following deed of sale 30 April 1678. John Westcott of Mamaroneck, for the sum of £40 of Marchantable pay to me in hand, paid or secured to be pad. before the delivering and delivery hereof, the recit whereof I do confirm unto the aforesaid Thomas Hatfield, a certain allotment or home Lott Lying Situate in Mamaroneck, being number six formerly in ye tenure and possession of James Mott, together with a Dwelling house and Orchard upon the sd. home Lott, also one eighth part of all upland or meadow above the Path now called the Country Road, betwixt the River commonly called Mamaroneck and a certain tree marked I R in a [part] of the Path called Dirty Swamp, to the Westward of sd. River [etc.].³

He transferred property in Mamaroneck (Mamaroneck sawmill, with the privilege of timber of all his undivided lands) to John Disbrow; this may have been transferred before 21 Mar 1677/8 but was not recorded until 21 Sep 1696 (Liber B. Westchester Land Records, p. 376).
