The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Also lot in Township of Saddle River beginning middle of New Road that leads from the Pompton Road to the Ponds at a corner of Daniel Heddens Bark Mill lot; line of widow Elizabeth Van Blarcom. 60/100 acres. Signed John Dooremus, Ann Dooremus (she by mark).¹

On 27 April 1803 (recorded 6 Sep 1803, Bergen Co. R:48), Daniel Hedden and Mary, his wife, of the Township of Saddle River, to John Moffat of the Township of Saddle River, a lot situated in the mountains beginning at the beginning place of a lot and survey made for Derick Van Houten, bounded n by land of Van Houten; w by John Van Winkle Junr and Isaac Van Saun; s partly by Daniel Dod and partly by said John Moffat; e by John Moffat. 19-1/100 acre. granted all the Oak Timber lot for saw logs, Hickory wood, Chestnut for one year and three months to take timber off lot; stone in quarry for his own personal use. Signed Daniel Hedden, Mary Hedden.¹

On 14 April 1804 (recorded 6 June 1804, Bergen Co. S:282) Daniel Hedden and Mary his wife, of the Township of Saddle River, conveyed to John Moffatt of the Township of Saddle River, for \$79, 3-16/100 acres of land in the Township of Saddle River beginning NE corner of quarry lot belonging to said John Moffatt. Signed by Daniel Hedden, Mary Hedden. Witnessed by Abraham Willis, Jacob Van Winkle.¹

On 7 May 1804 (recorded 6 June 1804, Bergen Co. S:285) Daniel Hedden and Mary, his wife, of the Township of Saddle River, conveyed to John Moffatt of same place, for \$450 land in Township of Saddle River, beginning SE corner of lot formerly sold by John Doremus to said John Moffatt and also most northerly corner of said Daniel Hedden's lot purchased of John Condit called the saw mill lot; Road that leads from saw mill; E side of brook. Bounded E by land of Richard Degraw and the heirs of James McCurdy, deceased; S by land of said Daniel Hedden. Signed by Daniel Hedden, Mary Hedden. Witnessed by Peter Van Allen, Abraham Willis.¹

On 7 August 1804 (recorded 13 July 1805, Bergen Co. U:409) Daniel Hedden of the Township of Saddle River and Mary, his wife, conveyed to Peter Van Aulen of the same place, for \$120, 2-1/2 acres on the side of the Pompton Road, a little to the W of the Dwelling House of said Daniel Hedden, beginning middle of said Pompton Road opposite the N corner of Peter Hopper's land at Road leading to the ponds; mentioned Road from Patterson to Pompton. Signed by Daniel Hedden, Mary Hedden. Witnessed by David Hunt, Abraham Willis.¹

On 1 January 1805 (recorded 9 July 1805, Bergen Co. U:369) Daniel Hedden and Mary, his wife, of the Township of Saddle River, conveyed to Hugh Bigg of the City of New York, for \$828, 27-60/100 acres of woodland in the Township of Saddle River, beginning W corner of lot sold by said Daniel Hedden to Walter Frederick. Bounded E by Walter Frederick; S by Francis Van Iderstine; W by land now or late of Daniel Dodd; N by Nichls. Van Blarcum. Signed by Daniel Hedden, Mary Hedden. Witnessed by Abrm. [or Edmd.?] Blackly, Junior, James Dods.¹

On 2 February 1805 (recorded 8 January 1805 [1806?], Bergen Co. X:41) Cyrus Jones and Jemima, his wife, of the County of Essex, conveyed to Isaac Canfield of the County of Morris, 7-60/100 acres and half of right to water courses, etc. Whereas Jotham Hedden, late of the State of New Jersey, deceased, died seized of one equal undivided part of a certain bark mill and tract of land in the Township of Saddle River; Daniel Hedden and Cyrus Jones, administrators of the estate of Jotham Hedden...[history of transactions regarding premises]. Signed by Cyrus Jones, Jemima Jones. Witnessed by Daniel Harrison, Cys. Munn.¹

On 1 April 1805 (recorded 13 July 1805, Bergen Co. U:417) Daniel Hedden and Mary, his wife, of the Township of Saddle River, conveyed to James Austin of Paterson in the County of Essex, for \$250.69, 7-42/100 acres strict measure in the Township of Saddle River, beginning on line of lot of heirs of John I. Post, late of Paterson, deceased. Signed by Daniel Hedden, Mary Hedden. Witnessed by John G. Van Houten, Abrm. Willis.¹

On 6 August 1805 (recorded 29 January 1806, Bergen Co. X:104) Daniel Hedden and Mary, his wife, of the Township of Saddle River, conveyed to William Halsey, Esquire, of Newark in the County of Essex, for \$1,000., 71-80/100 acres woodland in the Township of Saddle River. Signed by Daniel Hedden, Mary Hedden. Witnessed by James Austin, Abrm. Willis.¹

On 13 August 1805 (recorded 29 January 1806, Bergen Co. X:100) Daniel Hedden and Mary, his wife, of Paterson in the County of Bergen, conveyed to William Halsey of Newark in the County of Essex, for \$4,800., two lots in the Township of Saddle River: (1) 58 acres strict measure called the Squawbrook lot; (2) 59-30.100 acres known as the Van Orden lot. Signed by Daniel Hedden, Mary Hedden. Witnessed by Israel Hedden, Thomas Ward.¹

On 15 August 1805 (recorded 30 May 1806, Bergen Co. Y:31) Daniel Hedden of the Township of Saddle River, and Mary, his wife, conveyed to Walter Kendrick of the City of New York, hatter, for \$1,000, two lots in the Township of Saddle River: (1) 5-11/100 acres bounded S by middle of public road leading from Paterson to Pompton; E by said Daniel Hedden; N by Saw Mill lot; W by road leading to the Ponds. (2) 3 acres strict measure, adjoining lot; bounded E and N by line of the bark mill lot. Signed by Daniel Hedden, Mary Hedden. Witnessed by Thomas Ward, Benjamin Vincent.¹

On 10 September 1805 (recorded 30 May 1806, Bergen Co. Y:27) Daniel Hedden and Mary his wife of the Township of Newark in the County of Essex, conveyed to Walter Kendricks of the City of New York, for \$2,574.72, two parcels in the Township of Saddle River. (1) 53-37/100 acres; (2) 27-1/2 acres, beginning corner of lot heretofore sold and conveyed by said Daniel Hedden to Walter Kendrick; James McCurd. Signed by Daniel Hedden, Mary Hedden. Witnessed by Thomas Ward.¹
