The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Isaac Hicks, of Hempstead, in Queens County, Gent., August 3, 1745, being sick. My executors are to sell all my salt meadow in Flushing and all my movable estate to pay debts. All the rest of my real estate I leave to my sons, Benjamin, Gilbert, and James. I leave to my wife Elizabeth £20 yearly, to be paid by my sons, Thomas, Henry, Benjamin, Gilbert, and James. I leave to my sons, John and Isaac, each 5 shillings, I having already given them certain tracts of land. My executors are to sell all my messuage, tenement, and lands whereon I now live in Hempstead, containing 300 acres. The proceeds to be paid to my sons, Thomas, Henry, Benjamin, Gilbert, and James, and I make my sons executors. Witnesses, Richard Cornell, Benjamin Hicks, Jr., S. Hicks. Proved, September 30, 1745.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Isaac Hicks, of Hempstead, in Queens County, this 20 of January, 1761, being weak in body. "In order to settle my affairs so as to prevent any difference after my decease." I leave to my wife Charity a bed and furniture and œ20 a year during her life. I leave to my son Edward all that part of my farm he has now in possession, being the land that formerly belonged to John Hicks. Also that piece of wood land that lies by the Hollow near the road that leads to Cow Neck, And he is to pay to my wife Charity £10 a year. I leave to my son Charles all the rest of my lands and meadows and house and buildings, and my wagon, plough, and harrow, and the use of a bed and bedding until he is married, and then to my daughters Amy and Sarah, And he is to pay to my wife Charity £10 a year. I leave to my daughter Amy my desk. To my daughter Sarah my riding chair, "but my family shall make use of my riding chair as they did during my life, so long as my family continue together," or till my daughter Sarah is married. I leave to my granddaughter, Fannie Cornell, £200. And I leave to my daughters Amy and Sarah the rest of my money, stock, and household goods. I make Stephen Hicks and Benjamin Hicks, Jr., executors. Witnesses, Henry Stocker, John Mitchell, Cornelius Van Wyck. Proved, April 28, 1762. Cornelius Van Wyck being one of the People called Quakers.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, John Hicks, of Hempstead, in Queens County, Gent., this 8 of November, 1745, being but weak. All debts and funeral charges to be paid. I leave to my daughter, Elizabeth Hicks, a large silver tankard. My executors are to sell all my lands and goods in Hempstead, and all of my meadow in Flushing. All the rest of my estate to my children, William, Timothy, Robert, James, Elizabeth, and Hannah, equally, but £20 is to be taken out of the share of Elizabeth. I make my brothers Isaac and Thomas, and my brother in law, Cornelius VanWyck, executors. Witnesses, Henry Hicks, James Rockwell, Charles Hicks. Proved, March 8, 1746.

John and Rachel Hicks witnessed the baptism, 17 April 1797 at Paramus Ref Ch, of Rachel, dau. of Casparus & Maria Barbarow.

On 1 May 1800 (recorded 20 May 1806, Bergen Co. W:396) James Van Houten of the Township of Franklin, wheel right, and Mary, his wife, conveyed to Conrad Packer of the Precinct of Saddle River, for £90, 16 acres more or less in the precinct of Saddle River near the high mountain; mentioned line of Gilbert Lake; line of Joseph Witten. Signed by James Van Houten, Mary Van Houten (her mark). Witnessed by Albert Wilson, John Rut. [?] Hicks.¹

On 1 May 1800 (recorded 15 May 1807, Bergen Co. Z:144) James Van Houten of Township of Franklin, wheelwright, and Mary, his wife, conveyed to John Harris, of the same place, Carpenter, for £100, 5 acres strict measure in the precinct of Saddle River; mentioned one half of sawmill on Brook called Crockale Voll; Line of John Corter; Joseph Whiton; lot formerly belonging to John Condit or Aaron H. Post. Signed by James Van Houten, Mary Van Houten (her mark). Witnessed by Albert Wilson, John R. Hicks.¹

On 7 April 1803 (recorded 9 January 1807, Bergen Co. Z:152) John Young of the Township of Franklin, farmer, and Martha, his wife, conveyed to Matthew Steward of the same place, yeoman, for \$87.81, 3-78/100 acres in Franklin Township, lot no. [blank] in Ramapock tract, beginning land of John Hicks; land of John Debaun; Coonrod Wannamaker. Bounded S by said John Debaun; W and N by said John Young; E by said Matthew Steward and others. Signed by John Young (his mark), Martha Young. Witnessed by Thomas Pound, James Demarest.¹

On 3 March 1804 (recorded 14 May 1806, Bergen Co. Y:17) Conrad Wanmaker of Bergen County, yeoman, and Maria, his wife, conveyed to David Bayard of the same place, for £18, 1 acre strict measure in the Township of Franklin, beginning at land of Abraham Aury; along road. Signed by Coonrad Wanmaker (his mark), Maria Wanmaker (her mark). Witnessed by John Rnt.? Hicks; Thomas S. Banta.¹

On 9 April 1805 (recorded 10 July 1805, Bergen Co. V:146), John DeBaun of the Township of Franklin, and Wyntyte, his wife, conveyed to Thomas Ackerson of the Township of Harington, for \$692.66, 31-66/100 acres in the Township of Franklin,

beginning corner of land of Matthew Coe; mentioned said Ackerson's land. Bounded W by land of Matthew Coe; N by land of John DeBaun; SE by land of said Thomas Ackerson and Garret Hopper. Signed by John Debaun, Wyntye Debaun (her mark). Witnessed by John R. Hicks, James Demarest.¹

On 15 November 1805 (recorded 25 August 1806, Bergen Co. Y:225) John R. Hicks and Rachel, his wife, of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to David Byard of the same place, for \$25, 1 acre in the neighborhood of New Success in the Township of Franklin, beginning high road, corner of James Degrote; John R. Hicks. Signed by John R. Hicks, Rachel Hicks (her mark). Witnessed by John Young (his mark), Wintent [?] Debaun (her mark).¹

John R. Hicks will was proved in Bergen County (3734B). An inventory was made in 1817.²

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Thomas Hicks, Jr., of Flushing, in Queens County, being weak and indisposed. I leave to my wife, Deborah Hicks, the use and benefit of my homestead where I now live, to wit, that part that was James Clements, Together with 10 acres of woodland at the northeast corner of my 100 acres, and all the housing and orchards during her widowhood, Also the use of the meadow I bought of Francis Doughty, And the use of my whole plantation till my son, Thomas Hicks, comes of age. I leave to my son Thomas, all the lands and plantation I bought of Richard Chew, with all the 100 acres that I bought of John Hinchman, except the 10 acres at the northeast corner, which I leave to my son Augustine, Also the meadow that was formerly James Clements. I leave to my son, Augustine Hicks, all my homestead that was James Clements, after my wife's decease, Also the 10 acres of woodland at the northeast corner of my 100 acres, And all the meadow that was Francis Doughty's, with all the haying and orchards. I leave to my son Whitehead Hicks, all the 10 acre lots bought and purchased by my father in law Daniel Whitehead, deceased, Situate and lying upon the south side of the Hills, to him and his heirs and assigns. And my son Thomas is to pay to his brother Whitehead £25, when he is of age. And my son Augustine shall pay him £10. And my son Thomas shall pay to his brother, Stephenson Hicks, £100 when of age. I leave to my six daughters, Abigail, Deborah, Mary, Elizabeth, Hannah, and Martha, two thirds of movables. I appoint my wife executor, and my brother, Jacob Hicks, and Thomas Willett, Jr., and James Johnson, overseers. Dated April 30, 1712. Witnesses, James Clements, Francis Doughty, John Ryder. Proved, October 20, 1712. The widow Deborah Hicks, having died, and Thomas Willetts, Jr., and James Johnson, having refused the executorship, and the said Deborah Hicks having made a will and appointed John Rodman, Robert Fields, Francis Doughty and Samuel Bowne, executors, And Samuel Bowne and John Rodman by writing dated

October 16th having refused, Letters of administration are granted Robert Field, Francis Doughty, and Jacob Hicks.

In her will, she wrote: I, Deborah Hicks, widow, late wife of Thomas Hicks, being weak in body but well in understanding. I think it convenient to settle and dispose of that estate my deceased husband left me, and make this my last will. Leaves £15 in money to Benjamin Field and Elizabeth his wife, with my youngest son, Stephenson Hicks, to bring him up. I leave all the rest of my estate to my seven children, Abigail, Deborah, Mary, Elizabeth, Hannah, Martha and my son, Stephenson Hicks. My daughter Martha I bequeath to my loving friend, Martha Thorne, and my daughter Hannah I bequeath to my dear cousins, Robert and Phebe Field, desiring them to bring up my dear children in the way of truth and fear of God. I appoint my loving friends, John Rodman, Robert Field, Francis Dougherty and Samuel Bowne, executors. Dated the 14th day of 4th month, 1712. Witnesses, James Scriven, James Jacobsen, John Hasyter. Proved at Flushing, July 24, 1712, before John Coe, Esq., Judge of the Court of Common Pleas, and John Johnson and Samuel Bayley Justian, and confirmed by Governor Hunter, October 21, 1712.
