The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

The public are respectfully informed that the subscriber has on hand, and offers for sale, *Hitchcock's Improved Patent Freeborn Ploughs*, with wrought iron standards and braces, of different sizes, which he will sell as cheap, for cash, as the Pot Metal Ploughs heretofore have sold. As he has been careful in selecting the best timber, he will warrant them to be superior to any now in use, and to perform the work to the satisfaction of the purchaser. He also, will constantly keep on hand, plough shares of every description to suit the ancient, as well as the modern ploughs. Abraham Hitchcock. Hackensack, [M]arch 16th 1824. N.B. Court held 4 Jan 1658 (Colonial Records of New Haven) -- Inventory of the estate of Edward Hitchcock, deceased, taken 23 Nov 1658, attested by the widow Frances. Deacon Miles and John Cooper took oath that the inventory was just, etc. The widow says that something tending to the nature of a will was expressed to Matthias Hitchcock and Edward Patten a little before his death.

Court held 5 April 1659 (Colonial Records of New Haven) -- Frances, widow of Edward Hitchcock, with Matthias Hitch-

cock and Edward Patterson, testify that Edward Hitchcock when sick, said he intended to give his wife's kinswoman Elizabeth Perry, a child's part. Court so ordered.

Court held 3 May 1659 (Colonial Records of New Haven) -- John and Samuel, sons of Edward H----, deceased, pro-pounded for liberty to choose their guardian, John, the eldest, nominated Samuel Andrews, but the Court advised him to take advise of Deacon Miles and of Ensign Linden and any other of his friends in this matter. Samuel was thought not to be at ag, therefore the case concerning both of them was respited until another time.

Court held 11 May 1659 (Colonial Record of New Haven) -- On testimony of Frances, widow of Edward Hitchcock, as to changes in estate, a new inventory was taken, amount £185.10s.9d. Deacon Miles appraiser, testified as to corrections, etc. Property divided among the widow, Frances, John, the eldest son, whose share was by his consent committed to Ensign Lindon; Mary, eldest dau., Abigail, whose share was at her desire entrusted to Sergeant Munson; Samuel was not of age to choose a guardian, and his share remains under the care of the Court; and Elizabeth Perry, a Kinswoman of the widow.

Land Records, Liber B, p. 116b) -- John Hadden, Senr. and Elizabeth his wife, of Westchester; "Whereas my son-in-law, George Clevenger and Sarah his wife, my own daughter, was possessed of 5 a. of land in Yonkers Plantation in their lifetime, which did belong to me, sd. John Hadden, Snr.; same sold to Samuel Hitchcock for the use of grandson John Clevenger, son of George and Sarah Clevenger, dec'd.²

23 Sep 1699 (Westchester Co. Land Records, Liber B, p. 103) -- Receipt to Benjamin Hitchcock, by Samuel Betts of Lower Yonkers, in full satisfaction of legacy of wife Mehittabel, left her by her father's will.² [PAW: This may be an error and Samuel Hitchcock is meant]
