

-- **HOOGLAND, HOAGLAND** --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Mentions "my brothers, Johanes and Joras Hooglandt," and sisters Aeltie, wife of Johanes Byvanck, Maritie and Sarah. I appoint my friends and relatives, Johanes Hooglandt, Daniel Rapalye, David Provoost, Jr., and Jacobus Goelet, guardians of my children, and my wife Anne executor. Dated September 9, 1702. Witnesses, Petrus Bayard, Everardus Bogardus, Abraham Gansevort. Proved, May 13, 1712, before Henry Wileman, Esq.

There is a complete history of Adrian's life in Carpenter's History of the Hoagland Family, where it was reported that Adrian could have had a 2nd wife, Catherine Catland. However, she could have been the wife of Adrian's son, Adrian (53); there is no information to be found on the younger Adrian than the date of his baptism and the fact that he was not mentioned in his father's will in 1771. It is possible that the younger Adrian could have married, had children, and died between 1727 and 1771.¹

Adrian was a carpenter. In 1760 he and his brother-in-law bought 235 acres of land, of which each took half, in the area called Bloomingdale, which is now between 105th street and 125th street in New York City. Here he lived until his death.¹

Adrian Hogelant and Engeltje, his wife, with the bp. 27 April 1746 Schraalenburgh Ref Ch, of Engeltje Kovenhoven, dau. of Jacob Kovenhoven & Neeltjin Hoogland.

In his will, he wrote: ...February 26, 1771. I, Adrian Hogeland, of the Out Ward of New York, yeoman, being aged. I direct all debts to be paid. I leave to my son Benjamin for his birthright £10. I leave to my son William all my cooper and wheelwright tools. To my daughter Antje £60, and a bed and bedstead. I leave to my granddaughter, Engeltie Oostranor, £60. All my lands, swamps, meadows, and buildings are to be sold by my executors, and I leave all my estate to my children, Neeltie

Cowenhoven, Engeltje Lent, Jean Hogeland, Margaret Fletcher, Benjamin, and William, Antje and Adriana Day. I make my son-in-law, Richard Fletcher, and my sons, Benjamin and William, executors. Witnesses, Martinus Schoonmaker, Adolph Benson, Benjamin Vandewater. Proved, September 15, 1772.

This Hoogland family came from Haarlem, Holland to New Amsterdam in 1655.

The house of Christopher Hoogland was the south corner of Broadway and Maiden Lane, New Amsterdam (NYC).

Tryntje Cregier, wed. van Stoffel Hooglant, was listed in the 1686 Domnie Selyns list of members of the NYC Ref Ch. She was living on Paerl Straet, (Pearl Street) (Between State and Whitehall Sts.). Listed before her were: Jan Willemszen, en syn huysv. Lysbeth Fredricx; Marten Cregier. Listed after her were: Margareta Blanck, h. v. Philip Smit; Gerrit Hardenberg, en syn huysv. Jaepje Schepmoes; Sara Hardenberg; Isaac Greevenraedt, en syn huysv. Marrisie Jans; etc.³

Catharina Cregier m. (2) 30 Oct 1688 NYC Ref Ch (banns at New Amersfoort) (19 Nov 1688 Flatbush Ref Ch), as his third wife, **Roelof Martenszen** (Schenck), widower of Annetje Pieters & -?-.

The first deed for land in the present Passaic County, N.J., was to Christoffel Hoogland in 1678. It was for 2 tracts of land, one of 158 and the other of 120 acres, lying on opposite sides of the Vreeland brook, now largely used as the tail of the Dundee Canal. The tract is, and for many years has been, known as the Dundee section of Passaic City, in Passaic County, comprising the First Ward of that city, and perhaps part of the Fourth Ward. Hoogland sold to Hartman Vreeland, who was one of the Acquackanonk patentees, and when the patent was granted for Acquackanonk, "Hartman's Island," including the Hoogland patent, was excepted. (William Nelson)¹ Hoogland probably never settled on this land.

Christopher made his will: Christopher Hooglandt, New York. "In the name of God, Amen. Know all men, who shall see this Publick instrument, that in the year after the Nativity of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, 1676, the 12th day of March, on Monday in the afternoon about 5 o'clock, did appear in their own persons before me Wm. Bogardus, Notary Public, residing in New York, admitted by the Rt. Hon. Lord Edmund Andross, Governor-General, in the behalf of his Royal Highness,

James Duke of York and Albany, etc., and in the presence of the underwritten witnesses. Mr. Christopher Hoogland and Mrs. Catharine Cregier, joined in marriage, living within this city and both well known to me and to the witnesses, the testator being sickly, and the testatrix going and standing and sound of body, but both using fully and absolutely their senses, memory and speech." They have nominated and instituted their children, Dirck, Harman, Martin, Christopher and Frances DeGroot Hoogland, and the children which they may by the blessing of God get in the future, their lawful descendants and heirs equally and that the eldest son shall not pretend any prerogative therein. And further the testators out of special love and natural affection in matrimony received, and if God pleases to be received, declare that the whole estate shall go to the survivor for life. If the survivor remary, an equal division is to be made between the children, and they are to be caused to learn to read and write, and a trade by which they may live, and when they come of age they shall receive their portions and the survivor is not to diminish the right of the children but rather to help and assist them. And it is their will that the survivor shall not be obliged to give any account of the estate to the orphan masters of this city "or where the funeral house may be," or to the testator's friends, excluding them, "All Laws and Statutes to the contrary notwithstanding." Done at New York in the house of the testators in the presence of Mr. Francis Rumbaut and Paul Richards, merchants. Translated from the Dutch, by P. Delanoy.²

At a Court of Records held in New York on Tuesday the 11 of May, 1686, the will of Christopher Hoogland was proved, and his wife Catharine was confirmed as administratrix, April 14, 1687.²

I leave to my son Christopher all my wood lot in Flatbush, "at a place commonly called Fresh Kills point," bounded east by land of Derick Remsen, south by the Long meadow, west by Wilhelmus Stootoff, and north by a Crepil Bush (swamp), and being 4 acres. In 1739 they purchased the homestead and farm where the father of Christopher had lived for twelve years preceding that date, which farm they continued to occupy until their death. Christopher Hoagland was named in 1723 among the supporters of the Dutch Church 'over the Raritans.' In 1750 he contributed £4 towards building a church at Harlingen. In the Brooklyn Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were: 1662, October 8: Dirck Jansze Hooglant, "from Maerseveen" to Annetje Hans, widow of Jan Clercq, after three proclamations [of banns], and [with] certificate "from Middelwout."

In a deposition dated August 20, 1667 Dirck declared that he was about 32 years of age. He came to this country about 1657 from Utrecht; in the census of September 30, 1687 it was stated that Dirck had been here about thirty years. During his life Dirck acquired several plots of land in and around Flatbush and Bedford NY and lived on at least two of them at some time. One of the plots is of considerable interest since it proved relationship to his sons Jan and Willem. On August 25, 1668 a deed was recorded in Midwout wherein Balthasaer DeHart sold to Derck Jansen Hoghglant a "bowery" amounting to about 26 morgens (a morgen was approx 2 acres) on which there was a house in which Dirck lived for some time. The ownership of this property was passed to Jan and then to Willem.

Annetje Fedden, a member of the Flatbush Ref Ch, was said to be the sister of Rensie Fedden (wife of Minne Johannes). Annetje, Rensie and Minne reportedly arrived on the ship *Statin* in 1663.

In the Flatbush Ref Ch record of their marriage banns, they were: "Joris Dirckse Hoghlandt, young man residing on Staten Island, and Catrijntie Dannelse Bighant [an error of transcription], young woman from Brooklyn were betrothed on 5 April 1689."

Joris/George Dircksen Hogeland appears to have occupied the farm of his father on Staten Island, NY.¹

Joris Dircksen Hogeland dated his will 19 May 1711; it was probated 13 May 1712. In it, he makes mention of his wife and eight children; and being very sick, he signs with his mark "8" the name being written "Joris Hogelandt." (In the name of God, Amen. I, Joras Hoglandt, of Staten Island, being sick and weak. Considering the shortness of the life of man upon this earth, I leave to my eldest son, Dirck Hoglandt, £5, and also my gun when he is of age. I also leave him all my lands and meadows when of age, and he is to pay to the rest of his brothers and sisters £500. If he die under age the lands are to go to my son Daniel. I leave to my wife Katharine the sole use and benefit of estate during the minority of my sons, and after they are of age she shall have the use of one third the estate. If both my sons die then all the property is to go to my children, Katharine, Elizabeth, Maritie, Dirck, Alske, Daniel, Amitie, and Sarah. I appoint my wife executor. Witnesses, John Woglum, Jr., Andries Bowman, Oswald Foord. Proved, May 13, 1712.)¹
