The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

He was a deacon (before 1746), Capt. as early as 1723, and a Colonel.

He lived in Stamford. His father gave him land and meadow with dwelling-house wherein his son lived, land on the east side of Noroton River, meadow at Shipan, at Reed Pond, and in Shaw Swamp, Sep. 15, 1710. Jonathan bought other land east of [?] River in 1707-8, and his name afterwards appears very frequently on land records of Stamford, in deeds to and from his brothers and others. He took his father's ear-mark, entered in 1720.

By vote of the town in 1723 he was to sit in the second pew; in 1731 the society by vote desired him "to set in ye foremost pew [in the] meeting house." He was on the school committee in 1734 and later years; His name appears as Justice of the Peace in 1727, and as late as 1750; and marriages were solemnized by Jona. Hait Esquire." He was Judge of Probate in Stamford for at least 30 years, from 1737 to 1767. He was also one of the selectmen of Stamford for 30 years, first in 1717. He represented Stamford in the Gen. Court every year from 1724 to '67, except 1758 and '9.

In his will, dated Nov. 14, 1768, probated July 4, 1769, he mentioned his wife Melicent, sons, and four daughters.

He lived in Stamford, Ponus St., New Canaan Parish. He and his 1st wife owned cov. Stamford chh., June 30, 1751; but both joined the N. Stamf. chh. in 1788, and her death was rec. there. Wife Anna admitted to 1st Stamf. chh., 1810, death rec. there, and adm. her est. ap. in Stamf., March 4, 1817. His own death was rec. New Can. chh. Will rec. at Norwalk, dated 1803, proved June 27, 1820. It is said that he at first lived on Hoyt St., near his father, and afterwards rem. to Ponus St. Ear-mark ent. at S., May 7, 1751; deeds also rec. at S., in 1773, &c. He rep. S. in Ct. legislature in 1789.

He served in French and Indian war; was 1st Lieut. in 4th Reg., 1755, to go against Crown Point. He was called Capt. in 1764; was Capt. in 7th Ct. Reg., 1775, a Lieut. Col. of the 8th Conn. reg't, regular army and afterwards Col. during Revolutionary War. When the news of the first battle at Lexington and Concord reached the town, Joseph Hoyt of Stamford, who had now been for about twenty years in military life, enlisted immediately a company of thirty men, and started for New York City" . . . reported only 8 days service. "On returning, Capt. Hoyt commenced raising another co. for the continental service wherever needed. By the 6th of July he had organized a co. of 75 men who were reported ready for duty," and continued in service till Dec. 24, 1775. A tradition still current says that as he was marching his men along just at eve., he saw a fine flock of turkeys on a tree, and pointing to them, he said, "Boys, if you touch one of those owls, I'll have every one of you flogged." About midnight the Col. was invited out of his quarters to partake of a supper of "owls."

C., yeoman, and wife Rachel, deeded "land and houses and all in E. Chester," in 1740-41. Moses Haight, yeoman, of "Crum Elbow" precinct, Dutchess Co., N.Y., granted two deeds in 1751, one of land in Crum Elbow to Moses Haight, Jr., of same place, in the "4th mo. called June," and the other of land in "Nine Partners."<sup>1</sup>

In 1665 Saml. Hoyte signed a receipt for his full portion of the estate of his father, Simon Hoyte, and his name also appears on the agreement of 1674. Samll Hoyte is on the Stamford, CT town lists for 1667, and then rec'd a share in the horse-pasture. This year the records also show that Sam. Hoyt, the future deacon, gave offence to the stern Puritans by wrestling, or throwing stones into the swamp outside the meeting-house, on Sunday. On the Stamford land records, Book A, p. 36, is found: "...Samll: Hoyt etre This 7: decembr 1670, to him & his granted for ever viz: a sertaine pell of upland as a homlott Containing 3 acres more or less with ye swamp ajoyning as it was Leyed out by Rich: Law & frances bell appointed by the towne, ye said Lott bounded by ye Land yt was Tho stevens, Jno: Homes & Isac finch on ye west, & the Land granted to frances Brown on ye East, butting to Samll: finch & Coman Land North, & to front south with ye other Homelotts as ye fenc Now stands. Entre more. In the North feeld 3 acres of upland more or less, bounded by John Miller South, & ye Land of William Newman on ye North, butt-g to ffrances Homes & the high-waye on ye west, & the fenc & Jno Miller Land East, this psell of upland delivered by Joshua Hoyt to ye said Samll as pte of his portion of his fathers Estate. Entre more. In the New feeld four acres of upland more or less, bounded by ye fenc North, & ye Land yt was granted to Thomas Larrenc on ye south, the highway west, & ye fenc East, this said psell of Land granted by the towne vnto Samll: Hoyt & his for ever."

On Feb. 25, 1668--9, Samuel Hoyt was appointed one of the "fewers of ye fences for ye southfield." In April, 1677, Sam. Hoyt was appointed one of a committee to lay out land to Mr. Bishop; he was again a fence viewer in 1673--4 and '79; was collector in 1677--8 and '79; received a house lot for his services as a soldier, Sep., 1676. Sam. Hoyt was a lot-layer at various times, and he with his brother Joshua were two of a committee of four to represent the town in making an exchange of land in 1685--6. Sam. Hait received lot No. 16 of fresh meadow laid out in March, 1688. His name, with those of other Hoyts, occurs very frequently on the records of town meetings after 1682.

From the published Colonial Records of Conn. we learn that after the death of his brother Joshua he was a deputy for Stamford in the General Assembly, in 1689, 1690, '92, '93, '97, '99, 1703, 1704, and 1716. Of the eleven sessions when his name was recorded as a deputy, in the first four it was given Hoyte, the next one Hoyt, and the last six Hoyt. In May, 1698, "Mr Samll Hoyt" was confirmed by the Court as Ensign of "the trainband in the town of Stanford"; and in Oct., 1699, May, 1701, and May, 1702, he was appointed by the Assembly one of the Justices of the Peace for Fairfield County.

Oct., 1703, "this Assembly grant full power to Capt. Jonath. Sellick and Deacon Samll Hoyt to give legall conveyances of severall parcellls of land" which Nathaniel Mead, late of Greenwich, sold "in his life time but did not give deeds thereof." Oct., 1704, "this Court grants" power to sell land belonging to the "estate of William Clement late of Stanford deceased . . . with the advice of Lieut Waterbury and Deacon Samuel Hoyt." May, 1705, the "Articles of agreement(+) between the inhabitants of the towne of Greenwich on the east side of Myanos River and the inhabitants of said towne of the west side of the said river, exhibited in this Assembly" were "Subscribed in presence of us, Jonath. Sellick senr, John Davenport, Samll Hoyt senr, David Waterbury."

From the Stamford land records we gather the following: Samuel Hait bought meadow in North field, and other land in South field, of Robert Bates of Stamford, July 4, 1670; land in Shiphan-neck of Benj. Hait, Aug. 25,

The History of Stamford states that he was also a representative in Oct., 1689 and 1716.

Samuel Hoyt was a witness in 1668; exchanged lands in Shiphanneck with Cornelius Jones, Aug. 25, 1673; sold land in North field to Benj. Hoyt, same date; exchanged land with Clement Buxton in '74; bought land in Shiphan-neck in '76. Sam. Hoyt was a witness in '72; made an agreement with Obadiah Stevens concerning swamp lands in '78; sold land in the ox-pasture to Moses Knap, and bought 4 acres upon "norwato hill" of him, Jan., 1678--9. Sam. Hoyt also exchanged lots of 4 acres each, on "norwoton hill," with Nicholas Webster, Jan., 1678--9; bought land of Increase Holly, Feb., 1678--9; exchanged land with Jonas Seely, Jan., 1678--9. The town granted Sam. Hoyt 1 acre adjoining his home lot, probably in 1679. Sam. Hoyt appears as a witness six times in 1678, '79, and '80.

In the records thus far quoted, which include nearly all the entries in which he is mentioned prior to 1681, his name has been spelled Hoyt 40 times, Hoyte 8 times, Hoyt 9 times, and Hait 4 times. In addition to these 61 times, his name occurs at least 56 times, on the Stamford land records, from 1681 to 1700; for he bought or sold some thirty lots of land during these twenty years, and very frequently signed his name as a witness to the deeds of others. After 1698, Senior is usually added to his name. From 1700 to his death in 1720, he gave and received a still larger number of deeds than during the preceding 20

years; but on these land records his name is uniformly written Hait. In the records of his marriage and the births of his children, 1671--1691, the first 4 use Hoyt, 2 of the others Hoit, and the remaining 4 Hait. The "ear-mark" of Mr. Sam. Hait was entered at Stamford Dec. 2, 1702.

His name occurs on the Stamford records as Justice of the Peace in various years from 1699 to 1718, and as such he executed deeds, solemnized marriages, etc. He was called Deacon as early as 1702. He was one of the town's committee to treat with Mr. Davenport about his settlement as a minister in 1692--3, He was "townsman," or selectman, 14 years, first in 1676.

In his will, he wrote: "Know all whom it may concern that I Samuell Hait Senr of Stanford in the County of Fairfield and Colony of Connecticut being now aged and feeble of body & not knowing how soon it may be gods holy pleasure to bring a change on me by death or by deprivation of reason understanding and memory all which through the Lords great mercy and goodness I do now enjoye and at this present am continued in the full and free use thereof I being throughly persuaded that it is my duty to set my house in order before I dye I do therefore with deliberate & mature thoughts and consideration make this my last Will and hereby renouneing all other former will or Wills of date before this present And first I do att the call of god freely againe resigne my precious immortal Soul into his hands who gave it through the merits and intercession of Jesus christ my mercifull redeemer hoping for a glorious resurrection and an heavenly inheritance among them that are Sanctified and my body to the earth from whence it was taken by desent buriall at the discretion of my executor hereafter named there to remain untill the resurrection of the Just and as for what of worldly substance or estate it hath pleased god to betrust me with I do Will and dispose of the same as followeth... Impmis to say after my funerall Charges & all other my Just debts be paid: first I give unto the children of my beloved and deceased son Samuell Hait as in addition to what I formerly gave to my sd son Samll by deeds or otherways I say unto Samuell the son of my said son I give an acre of land att Westcots so called bounded by A brook East and by land of John Cressy and by my own land North and by A highway South also one piece of land att sd Westcots be it in quantity more or les as it is bounded east by land of John Cressey west by A brook South by a highway North by land of Haits and land belonging to John Bell also twenty acres of land att Heaggueth as it is so called lying att the North end of my land which is the North boundary and bounded East by A highway and West by A highway and South by my own land also I give unto my said son Samuell Haits son Samuell the fifth part of all my right in all lands lying in Commonage or unlaid out and undivided in the bounds of said Stanford whether sequest or others also I give unto him one bible

2ly I do give unto my well beloved son John Hait as an addition to what I have formerly given unto him by deed and other wise namely one acre of meadow in Shaw Swamp also half an acre of meadow in the East field bounded West by Joshua Haits lands East by John Holly North by Samuell Blatchly his land South by greens meadow or cart path also the one fourth part of the Land in my close att Westcots the whole tract is bounded East by A brook west by Land which I have given unto Samuell Hait North by Encrease Holly South by land of John Cressey and Samuell Haits land also one fourth part of my land in the horse pasture as it is so called the whole being in quantity and bounded as the Record sheweth, also one halfe a piece of Land att heagweth lying North of Joseph and Nathan Haits land bounded West by an highway and East by an highway or brook runnig North untill it cometh unto the twenty acres which I have given unto my grandson Samuell Hait also one fifth part of all my right in the Sequest land and in all other lands lying within the bounds of Stanford unlaid out

3ly I do give unto my well beloved son Jonathan Hait as an addition to what I have formerly given to him by deeds or otherwise one fourth part of my close att Westcots also one quarter part of my land att in the horse pasture also one halfe of the land att heagweek lying North of Joseph and Nathans land as is above discribed in Johns part in said land also one fifth part of all my lands lying in Commonage and yet not laid out as Sequest or others in which I have right unto also I do give unto him my said son Jonathan that bed which [he] hath with all furniture as may appear upon my book to belong to said bed

4ly I do give unto my well beloved son Joseph Hait as an addition to what I have already given unto him by deed or otherwise one fourth part of my close at Westcots and fourth part of my land in the horse pasture also one fifth part in my right in the Sequest lands & in all my undivided Lands also that bed whereon I lye after my decease I do give unto him with the bedstead and furniture which belongeth to the same according as upon my book may appear

5ly I do give unto my well beloved son Nathan Holly [prob. transcription error] in addition to what I have already given him by deeds or otherwise my homelott and house and all the building thereon besides that part mentioned in his deeds of gift also one quarter part of my close at Westcots and also one fourth part of my land in the horse pasture also one fifth part in my right in the Sequest Land and in all other of my undivided lands in Stanford also I do give him the bed which he lyeth on with all such furniture as by my book appeareth to belong thereto

6ly I do will and bequeath all the over pluss of meadow yet remaining unto me besides what I have given unto my three sons namely Jonathan Joseph and Nathan Hait I say to be Equally divided among them to witt that mead in the reed pond att Shiphand and as for all the remainder of my Estate not otherwise disposed of which is not in the particulars thereof mentioned in deeds of gift or noted down in my book as before given or mentioned above in this paper which I shall dye possessed of after my Just debts as is above expressed be paid my Will is that the same and the whole thereof be divided among my four sons to say John Jonathan Joseph and Nathan Hait to each of them an equall proportion.

7ly I do constitute appoint and Impower my well beloved son John Hait my whole and sole Executor to see this my last will and testament settled approved on all and singular the particulars therein mentioned and [for] his Encouragement thereto I do give unto my said son John out of my Estate reasonable satisfaction and now all my dear children unto whom I in conscience of my duty from A principle of fatherly affection I have endeavoured and that with A regard had unto equality and for the prevention of their dissatisfaction among you concerning my Estate I have according to my best understanding endeavoured that each of you should be suted and accomodated as well for the best conveniences as far as my small ability will allow, but may not Pretend unto such perfection as not to have missed of my aim herein altho perhaps you find in some particulars that your Expectation is not so answered as might have been yet what is done it being according to my best skill your duty is to accept thereof and to rest satisfled in your fathers pleasure herein and I leave this with you all my dear children as my solemn charge that you do not contend one with another about the Estate or any other matters but each and all of you endeavour always that love peace and good agreement maintained be alway among you as becometh brethren and may the god of peace dwell with you amen. Signed sealed and delivered Samuell Hait in presence of Stephen Bishop Senr,

Stephen Bishop, James Slauson.

Then follows the testimony of the above witnesses, taken June 6, 1720. Stephen Bishop Sen. testifies that "sometime in the beginning of the year 1714" he took down in writing, as it was then declared by the mouth of Dea. Samuel Hait, this last will and testament. After this comes the inventory, dated June 7, presented June 29, 1720, amounting to over £300.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Samuel Hoight, of Flushing, in Queens County, being sick and weak, but my understanding sound. I leave to my wife Sarah all my movable estate (except as follows) and also my house, barn and orchard and all the land that joins unto it which I have in Flushing, and one piece of 30 acres of woodland lying towards Bayside, and my meadow at the Round meadow, and all my other meadows in Flushing (except as follows) for her use and comfort until my son John shall arrive at the age of 21 or be married, and after that she shall have the use of one-half. I leave to my son Nicholas all that my 20 acre lot of land lying on the Hills where he dwells, and my four 10 acre lots lying under the Hills, situate as they are recorded in the Town Book of Records of Flushing; Also one-half of the shares of meadow that I have lying in Tiers neck, bounded north by Samuel Tatham's meadow, south by Thomas Ford's meadow. I leave to my son Jonathan one-half of that lot of land that lyeth within the township of Rye in Westchester County, it being the lot in No. 1, in the Purchase called Harrison's Purchase, provided he pay to Mary Tillman a debt of £27 which I stand bound for. I leave to my son David the other half of the said lot of land lying in the township of Rye in No. 1 of Harrison's Purchase. I leave to my son John my dwelling-house, farm, orchards and all my lands in the Town of Flushing (except as above), one-half at his marriage and the other half at the decease of my wife. If he die without issue then to the rest of my children I leave to my grand son James Hoight my share of fresh meadow lying on the upper part of the Fresh meadows. I order my negro man Luke to be sold and the money given to my daughters Hannah and Phebe. I give to my daughter, Sarah Titus, a negro boy. My executors are to sell 200 acres of land being part of my lot of land in Lot No. 6 of Harrison's Purchase in Westchester County to pay a debt of Thomas Cordall that I am bound for to Samuel Bayard and Rip Van Dam. I leave the remaining part of said tract to my five daughters, Susannah Griffin, Sarah Titus, Mary Halstead, Hannah and Phebe Hoight. And after the death of my wife my movables are left to my said daughters. The 400 acres of land that I have bargained for with John Harrison of East Jersey in exchange for my land in Amboy shall be divided among my four sons, Nicholas, Jonathan, David and John. I make my wife Sarah and my friends, Robert Field and William Willetts, executors. Dated 21st of 7th month, 1712. Witnesses, John Embree, Thomas Hinchman, Thomas Clement. Proved, October 21, 1712.

There have been claims that Simon Hoyt was born 20 January 1590, Dorchester Dorset, son of John and Ruth Hoyt.

Further, it has been claimed he m. Deborah Stowers, sister of Nicholas Stowers of Upwey, Dorset, but none of these claims have been verified. Deborah Stowers' brother Nicholas Stowers as well as the Spragues, all from Upwey, accompanied the Hoyts, with Governor Endicott to New England on the "Abigail."

Simon came with his family in 1629, of the *Lyon's Whelp*, including two sons, Walter (b. a. 1618) & Nicholas (b. a. 1620). It has also been suggested Simon had a brother, John Hoyt, who also came to New England. While searching for Rickards in West Hatch, Somerset 95 miles SE of Taunton) Robin Bush found a Simon Hoyt with a son, Walter (bpt. 1618) and another, Nicholas (bpt. 1620). These two dates correspond exactly with the estimated birth dates of the emigrant's sons.<sup>1</sup>

Simon Hoyte and his family can be found in the West Hatch Somerset parish registers. The baptisms of his first four sons, Walter, Nicholas, Alexander, and John can be found there, as can the baptism of his eldest daughter, Agnes. He married #1 Jane Stoodlie in Marshwood, Dorset. He married #2 Susannah.-?-<sup>1</sup>

Simon was of Charlestown, MA; Dorchester-1630; Scituate 1635; Came to Windsor, CT about 1639, where he sold his holdings in 1646. The "Old Goody Hoyt" who died 1644 at Windsor, may have been his mother. He received a grant of land at Fairfield, CT in March 6, 1649, having previously purchased land there from John Green. Not long before his death, he removed to Stamford, CT.

Simon married 2nd to Susannah - Smith with whom he joined the Church at Scituate, Apr-1635.

After Simon died, Susannah married **Robert Bates**, of Stamford, CT.

Agreement, 1 Feb. 1673/4, of Moses, Joshua, Samuel, and Benjamin Hoyt, Thomas Lyon, Samuel Finch, and Samuel Firman to distribute Est. of dec'd mother, Susanna Bates.

The earliest mention of the name of Simon Hoyt in this country is from the records of Charlestown, Mass.:-- "The Inhabitants ye: first settled in this place & brought it into the denomination of An English Towne were in Anno 1628 [1629?] as follo: vizt. Ralph Sprague, Richd Sprague, William Sprague, John Meech, Simon Hoyte, Abra: Palmer, Walter Pamer, Nicholas Stowers, John Stickline, Tho: Walford (smith yt: lived heere alone before), Mr: Graves (who had charge of some of the servts. of the Company of Patentees with whom hee built the great house this yeare for such of the sd Company as are shortly to come over which afterwards became the Meeting house), and Mr: Bright (Minister to the Companies Servants), by whome it was Jointly agreed & concluded yt: this place on the north side of Charles River by the natives called Mishawum shall henceforth from the name of the River bee called Charlestowne, wch was also confirmed by Mr John Endicutt Governour."

The records also state that in the summer of 1628 [1629?] "the Spragues and three or four others," with the approval of Gov. Endicott, traveled from Salem, "through the woods," to explore and settle Charlestown, where they found only one English abode, the "palisadoed and thatched house" of Thomas Walford, a smith; and that in "June and July, 1629" [1630], twelve ships arrived, bringing 1500 people, with dignitaries and Charles' Patent for Massachusetts Bay, after which the colonists separated, and settled Watertown, Dorchester, and other adjacent towns. Frothingham, in his History of Charlestown, states that the records above quoted were not written till 1664, and shows that some of the dates are one year too early. He is uncertain whether the journey of the Spragues from Salem to Charlestown was in 1628 or 1629; but Graves and Bright were not in Charlestown before 1629. The journey could not have been made before the autumn of 1628, and it seems much more proba-

ble that it took place in the summer of 1629. As only one name stands between the Spragues and Simon Hoyte on the Charlestown records, he was undoubtedly one of the "three or four others" who accompanied them from Salem to Charlestown, and he may have come to Salem in the same vessel with them.

It appears, therefore, that Simon Hoyt landed in Salem in 1628 or 1629, perhaps by the *Abigail* or the *George*, and very soon, in 1628 or 1629, probably the latter year, went to Charlestown as one of its first settlers. He could not have remained there more than a year or two, however, if he was one of the first settlers of Dorchester, in 1630. His name does not afterwards appear at Charlestown, but is found on the Dorchester records several times, as follows:--

April 3, 1633, Symon Hoite is given on a list as having two cows, and is therefore required to put up 40 feet of fence on the marsh. Oct. 8, 1633, Symon Hoyte is one of the two appointed to "see to the fences . . . for the east feild." Jan. 6, 1633, "It is ordered, that the marsh and swamp before Goodman Hosford and davy Wil[ton] shall be devided among themselves and Symon Hoyte." May 24, 1634, Symon Hoyte is one of the two appointed to "view the pales" [fences] of the north field. June 2, 1634, "It is ordered that Goodman Witchfeild and Goodman Hoyte shall have to be devided betweene them the marsh that lies in the north side of the necke, towards Boston, over agaynst mr. Rainsfords house, in Boston, being for 8 acres, by estimation." Feb. 10, 1634, Symon Hoyte is mentioned as keeping one bull. April 17, 1635, "It is also ordered, that the lott of medow that was Symon Hoytes, next to boston side, Joyning to John Witchfeild, shall be devided betwixt mr. Rodger Williams and Gyles Gibbes."

As the name of Simon Hoyt does not afterwards appear on the Dorchester records, it is evident that he left that town between Feb. 10, 1634-5, and April 17, 1635. From Dorchester he undoubtedly removed to Scituate, Mass., probably early in April, 1635, as "Symeon Hayte" and his wife joined the Scituate church April 19, 1635, and "Goodman Haites" house was built in that town between Sep., 1634, and Oct., 1636.

From Scituate, Mass., he went to Windsor, Ct. Hinman puts him in the party which reached there in 1639 The earliest mention of his name that has been found on the Windsor records is the following entry on the first book of land records: Feb. 28, 1640: "Symon Hoyt hath granted from the Plantation, for meadow and upland, adjoining fourscore acres, more or les, bounded west by wm. Hill, fro the River back one hundred and twenty rodd to the west, uppon the south it bounds fro wm. Hills lott along by the Rivulett untill it coms to Mathias Sentions meadow & then it turns about uppon the east and bounds by the said meadow in a streight lyne fro the river six rodd and then it turns agayne upon the south behind the end of Mathias Sention & Bagget Egglestons meadow, untill it coms to Elias Parkemans, and the Town Swampe and Elias Parkeman's meadow bounds it east, untill yt com to the foote of the hill in a streight lyne and fro thence yt turns & bounds upon the north untill yt coms to the utmost end of will Hills lott. Also on the north side of the rivulett four score acres, thirty of which is given his son Walter Hoyt fro the Towne, yt lyes neere the falls in the rivulett; it is in length fro the river back a hundred and twenty rodd, in breadth a hundred twenty six rodd, bounded euery way by the Comon."

In Stiles' History of Windsor, p. 123, may be found a "Plan of Ancient Windsor, 1640--1654." According to this plan, the land of Simon Hoyt lay on the east side of the rivulet, away from the other settlers; and this is probably the reason that he and his family were "freed from watch and ward" [guard duty] in 1640, they having enough to do to protect themselves from the Indians, without traveling a long distance to guard those who lived in the village. The name "Hoyt's Meadow" seems to have been then applied to this portion of Windsor, and that name is still retained.

From Rowland's and Grant's old Windsor records we learn that Simon Hoyt [or Hayt] had two children born at Windsor, one, his son Benj., in 1644; also, that "Hoyte's child died" in 1647, whether child of Simon or of Walter does not appear. Neither has it been found possible to determine who was the "Ould Goode Hoyt" [or Hayt] that died at Windsor in 1644. We have been unable to learn on what authority the History of Dorchester states that Simon Hoyt was an elder or deacon in Windsor; The first Dorchester colony reached Windsor in 1635. but most of the party returned to Mass. during the winter, on account of the great suffering and sickness experienced for want of shelter and provisions. The colony again went to Windsor the next spring, April, 1636. and we have found no other record of it.

The earliest mention we have found of Simon Hoyt at Fairfield (Land Records of Fairfield): "March ye 6th 1649. Granted unto Simon Hoitt from the Town...home lott Contayning two Acres and half more or less, bounded southwest with the land of Georg Godwin, on the southeast with...way, on the northeast with the land of John Tomson, on the north... with the Common. Alsoe in Sascoe neck, on the Iland Comonly Called Hoits Iland, one parcell of land contayning five Acres and half more or less, bounded on the west with the land of John Tomson, on the south with a marsh, on the east with a marsh, on the north with a brook. Alsoe in the feald Comonly called Winsor feald seven Acres more or les?? bounded on the west with a hieway, on the south with the land of Jo?? Wheeler, on the east with the marsh or meadow of Daniell fince, on the north with the land of Timothy ffoard & Nathan Gold. Also in Sasconeck in the meadowe aboue the bridge comonly called th?? new bridg one parcell of meadowe contayning eight Acres and half more or less, bounded on the east with the Creek, on the north with the land of Nathan Gould, on the west with the land of Richard [Perry?], on the south with the land of Thomas Dickerson.

"March ye 6th 1649. Simon Hoitt hath purchased of John Green one home lott Contayning three Acres more or less, bounded on the southwest with the land of henary Whelply, on the northwest with a hieway, on the northeast with the land of Baldwin." Simon also purchased of the said John five more lots of land, recorded on the same page. One, the last, was ten acres in the "newfeald."

It is possible that Simon Hoyt may have owned some of these lots some time before they were recorded, as he sold his land in Windsor in 1646, and these entries were all made at once. The earliest grant now left on the Fairfield records is dated Jan. 12, 1649. "Hoit's Island" is often mentioned on the old records, and seems to have been near Sasconeck and Salt Creek. Land of Simon Hoyt is mentioned in the boundaries of the lots of others in 1653, 1660, &c.; but the latter date was after his death. On the records of Fairfield, Jan. 12, 1658, it is stated that "Thomas Lyon of Fairfield hath purchased of Symon Hoyt of Stamford one parcel of land" in the "newfeild," bounded by land of John Hoyt on the north. This transaction was recorded just after Simon's death, and Thomas Lyon was probably his son-in-law, as will appear hereafter.

It is evident that Simon Hoyt removed to Stamford before his death, about 1 Sep 1657. Stamford records show receipts signed by Samuel Firman, "Moses hoyte of ye pla... Samuel Hoyte, Samuel Finch for his wife, and Benjamin they acknowl-

edge that they have received from their brother their full portion of the estate of their father, Simon Hoyte.

It appears that Simon Hoyt left a widow named Susanna, who married a Bates, (prob. Robert Bates, who d. in Stamford 11 June 1675) and died before Feb., 1674. From the fact that a Smith at Scituate is called his brother, it appears that either Simon, or a sister of his married a Smith. It is probable that Simon had two wives, and that Walter, Nicholas, and John were the sons of the first wife, as will appear from the following agreement, found on the Stamford records: "Witnes these presents an agreement made & concluded between vs viz: Moses Hoyt, Joshua Hoyt, Samuell Hoyt, Benjamin hoyt, Thomas Lyon, Samuel ffinch, Samuel firman consering ye distribution of ye Estate of our deceased mother Susana Bates, ye contents followeth -- That Moses Hoyt receive of Joshua hoyt ye Just sum of four pounds, thirteen shillings & sixpence which ye said Joshua doth agree to pay. & Samuel Hoyt to haue ye beding in his hands & ye horse & wels is in his hands. Benjamin Hoyt to haue ye ten pounds left in his hands by our mother Susana aforesaid. Thomas Lyon & Samuel ffinch to have ye horses & mares young and old runing in ye woods of norwake equally between us, & twenty shillings to each of vs, paid by our brother Joshua Hoyt which ye said Joshua agrees vnto. Samuel firman to have ye horses & mares runing in fairfeeld limitts, & twenty shillings more paid by our brother Joshua hoyt vnto me. The Residue of ye Estate of our foresaid mother remaining in ye hands of or brother Joshua Hoyt being four pounds thirten shillings & six pence, which ye said Joshua to haue as his pte in ye distribution of ye foresaid Estate mutually agreed vnto. (???) The distribution as aboue of ye Estate of or mother Amongst vs to our mutuall satisfaction, in consideration whereof we the aboue named doe hereby Joyntly & severally release, discharge & acquit our brother Joshua Hoyt, & one another from all & any futher demands of any right, title or interest in ye Estate aforesaid, & from all & any trouble or molestation in & about ye same. Joyntly desiring yt this our agreement may be comited to publike record for the further establishment of ye same, further more it is agreed by vs fore-named yt if yr shall arise any Just debts due fro our mother in her widdow-hood yt wee or any of vs know not of, yt wee ye forenamed will contrybute equally to ye payment of ye said debt. In witnes of truth vnto ye premises wee ye ptyes forenamed doe binde our selues firmly, as witnes our hands this 1th 12mo: Anno: 1674. Signed thus Moses Hoyt, Joshua hoyt, Samuell Hoyt, Benjamin Hoyt, Thomas Lyon, Samuell ffinch, Samuell firman. Wit: Abram Finch, Jonas Seely.

In 1640 Walter Hoyt was granted land at Windsor, CT; he moved by 1653 and became one of the first settlers at Norwalk. In 1684, making an oath as witness to the will of John Hoyt of Rye, he stated his age as about sixty five. In his will dated 1696, he stated his age as 78. He was Deputy for Norwalk, Oct. 1658, Oct. 1659, Oct. 1661, May and Oct. 1667, Oct. 1668, May 1670, May 1671, Oct. 1673, Oct. 1674, May 1676, May-1678, Oct. 1681. He was Sergt. of Norwalk Trainband [Militia] May 1659.

Walter may have had more daughters, as he evidently portioned them at marriage, and did not mention them in his will. His will was dated 11 Feb. 1695/6. Proved 11 April 1699. Inv. 10 Jan. 1698. He mentioned two sons: John of Danbury, and "Zarabell."
