The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

They came to Allendale, Bergen Co., NJ about 1899. They lived at West Crescent Avenue. In January 1920 they were living in a house they owned on West Crescent Avenue.

He was president of the Allendale Board of Education for many years. He was in the lumber business in New York State, retiring about 1926. In the 1920 Federal Census he was listed as a lumber manufacturer. At the time of his death, he had been connected with the Midland Park branch of the Hudson-Essex garage, managed by Leslie Rudolph.

Ronald Estabrook was the proprietor of the Ramsey Hotel in 1929, and of the Steer Inn in Oct 1930. Estabrook instituted suit against James A. Hubbard for \$25,000, the result of a controversy about "The Steer Inn," a roadhouse within a few hundred feet of the Hubbard home. A raid on the resort by Bergen County detectives resulted in the seizure of a varied assortment of hard liquors, and incarceration of the bartender in the county jail, and \$200 fine imposed. Mr. Hubbard was chairman of the Citizen's League.

Living with them in June 1905 was Mary H. Sohn, b. Dec 1891 NY, housekeeper. Living with them in 1910 was Charles Moore, 37, widower, b. NJ.

On 27 December 1899 property at 128 West Crescent Avenue was conveyed from Benjamin Sutton and Ida Sutton, his wife, to Martha Amelia Hubbard, wife of James A. Hubbard.

- **Mary A. Hubbard**, b. 15 July 1892 NJ; d. 28 Nov 1987 Ocean Grove, NJ. She graduated from the Allendale Grammar School 21 June 1906. She never married. She taught in the Ramsey, NJ schools for 41 years and was principal of the Ramsey elementary school (later known as the John Y. Dater School) during World War II. In 1957 she retired, and she was honored when Ramsey's newly built school on Wyckoff Avenue was named for her: the Mary A. Hubbard School. She lived in Allendale (on Ivers Place in August 1955) until she retired and went to live at the Methodist Home in Ocean Grove, NJ. She was secretary of the Allendale Library Association, elected 14 Jan 1924.
- **Ralph Moore Hubbard**, b. about 1894 NJ; d. about 1972; m. -?- . He graduated from the Allendale Grammar School 27 June 1907. He lived in Moorestown, NJ in Sep 1931. He was a farmer and worked on farm projects for Rutgers University. They had a son and a daughter.
- **James Robert Hubbard**, b. 1896 NJ; d. 23 Dec 1918 in service in World War I, aboard the *U.S.S. Arizona*, of Spanish meningitis. He graduated from the Allendale Grammar School 23 June 1910.
- **John G. Hubbard**, b. about 1899 NJ; m. **Laura Duncan**. He graduated from the Allendale Grammar School 20 June 1912. In January 1920 he was single, and living with his parents. They lived on Woodland Avenue, Allendale in September 1931. He was an Allendale Borough Councilman in the early 1930s. He worked for the telephone Co. They had at least two children: John and Robert, by June 1932. They lived in Haddonfield, NJ in 1974.
- **Grace Evelyn Hubbard**, b. 9 Mar 1902 Allendale; m. 12 Oct 1929 **Wilbur R. Goetschius**. She graduated from the Allendale Grammar School 22 June 1916.
