The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

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Hunt

There were many members of the Hunt family in Beekman and Pawling in the 18th century. Most of them were from the Westchester County Hunts but a few were from New England. The New England family settled in the Dover area while one branch of the Westchester group settled in Beekman in lot 2 of the Poughkeepsie Purchase near the intersection of Beekman Road and Greenhaven Road. In his will, he wrote: ...I, Caleb Hunt, of the Borough town of Westchester, yeoman, being sick. All my just debts in law or conscience to be paid. I leave to my wife Sarah all movable estate, and all my real estate of houses and lands during her natural life, for her support and the maintainance of my children, with full power to sell if she thinks best. After her death my executors are to sell all real estate, and 2/3 of the proceeds to be paid to my 5 sons, Gilbert, Isaac, Marmaduke, Solomon, and Caleb, and 1/3 to my daughters, Anna, Phebe, Sarah Anna, and Abigail. I make my wife, and Aaron Quimby, and Thomas Vail, executors. Dated April 22, 1748. Witnesses, Thomas Haddon, John Gordon, John Bartow. Proved, March 19, 1759, on the affirmation of John Gordon, "one of the people called Quakers."

I leave to my two brothers, Marmaduke and Solomon Hunt, the use of all that my Grove Farm, lands and tenements lying and being upon Throgg's Neck, being my real estate, Also the use of all personal estate, To use the whole during the term of 12 years, And they are to permit my loving mother, Sarah Hunt, to have any room in the house which she shall choose to live in during the said 12 years, And they are also to provide for her at her door a sufficient quantity of firewood for her own use, and also a sufficient quantity of Beef, Pork, wheat, corn, flax, and all other necessaries for her support, and the privilege to keep what poultry she pleases, And they shall also permit my sisters, Phebe, Sarah, and Anna Hunt, to live in my house during the said term, and provide for them maintainance suitable and convenient for them, Provided they help to labor in doing the house work and to help to milk and take care of the dairy, according to their strength, in a reasonable manner, And they shall also permit my two other brothers, Isaac and Josiah, to live in my said house during said term, and to provide for them a sufficient maintainance and apparell, Provided they help

carry on the business of the farm, That is, if Isaac, who is now absent, should come home, And the clear profits are to be used for the payment of my debts. At the end of the said term the farm and appurtenances are to be sold by my executors at public vendue, and all debts to be paid. My executors are to pay to a reputed child of mine, born of Anna Dean in 1759, £50 when she is 18 years old. Of the remainder I leave 2/3 to my brothers, but the oldest is to have a double share, and 1/3 to my sisters, Anna Shotwell, Phebe, Sarah, and Anna Hunt. I give my silver watch to Phebe Baxter, daughter of Deborah Brooks, my nurse. I make my mother, Sarah Hunt, my brothers Marmaduke and Solomon, and my uncles, Edward Hallock and Samuel Hallock, executors.

In his will, dated 3 March 1769, proved 12 Dec 1769, Caleb Hunt, of Eastchester, left to wife Sarah "all rights in the place we now live on, which was her father's Capt. Wm. Pinckney." To son Thomas 1/2 my land at City Island, and to daughter Eleanor Williams the other half. Mentions John Hunt, son of Capt. John Hunt; my grand son Stephen Williams. Makes wife and Benjamin Drake executors.

In another abstract of his will, he wrote: ...March 3, 1769. I, Caleb Hunt, of East Chester, in Westchester County, being sick. After all debts are paid, I leave to my wife Sarah all my right in the place we now live on, "which was her father's, Capt. William Pinckney's," deceased. I also leave her a bond of Moses Drake, and a bond of John Hunt, Jr., son of Capt. John Hunt, of Westchester; Also a negro man, "Frank," and 2 horses, and all my grain and household goods, and the interest on a bond of Nathan Vail. I leave to my daughter, Thamar Haight, 2 beds and furniture, and 3 cows, and sheep, and a looking glass, "and 1/2 of my land at the New City Island." I leave to my grandson, Stephen Williams, a cow and calf; To my daughter, Eleanor Williams, 1/2 of my land on New City Island, and 1/2 of my other monies. I make my friend, Benjamin Drake, and my wife Sarah, executors. Witnesses, Samuel Sneden, Moses Drake, Philip Huestis. Proved, December 12, 1769.¹

On 19 November 1803 (recorded 3 August 1805, Bergen Co. V:228) William Halsey and Julia, his wife, of New Ark in the County of Essex, conveyed to David Hunt of Paulus Hook, for \$3,500, 11-40/100 acres being several parcels of the farm lately belonging to Robert Kennedy, Esquire, commonly known as Kennedy's Farm; mentioned lots conveyed by Robert Kennedy, Esquire: lot no. 18 Moses T. Crane; Nicholas Cruger; John G. Warren of the City of New York, now belonging to

Capt. Pell; lot no. 8 to Mathias Day and John Hawthorn of New Ark, but now belonging to Cornelius Tuers; Passaic River; lot no. 10 to Johnson Tuttle of the City of New York; lot 71 to Samuel Griffin, Esquire; lot 74 to one Hoyt of the City of New York. Except lot 78 conveyed to Alexander McComb of New York...[deed goes on with more detail and descriptions]. Signed William Halsey, Julia Halsey. Witnessed by Moses Hedden, James Hedden.¹

On 13 July 1804 (recorded 3 July [should be Aug] 1805, Bergen Co. V:26) William Halsey and Julia, his wife, of Newark in the County of Essex, conveyed to David Hunt of Powlis Hook in the County of Bergen, for \$5,500., several tracts of land and meadow formerly known as Kennedy's Farm in the Township of New Barbadoes. Lengthy description of tracts; one of 102-18/100 acres strict measure; another of one acre. Signed by William Halsey, Julia C. Halsey. Witnessed by Elias Van Arsdale.¹

On 12 October 1804 (recorded 3 September 1805, Bergen Co. V:237) Nicholas Cruger of the City of New York, and Ann, his wife, conveyed to David Hunt of Poulis Hook, for \$310, parcel at New Barbadoes Neck, two of the 90 lots lately laid out on Kennedy's Farm, lots 11 (one acre strict measure) and 19 (one acre strict measure). Signed by Nicholas Cruger, Ann Cruger. Witnessed by Lewis Mosdeth?, Elisha Boudinot.¹

On 11 May 1805 (recorded 16 November 1805, Bergen Co. W:97) Jonathan Mulford and Phebe, his wife, of Barbadoes Neck, conveyed to Elijah Sandford of Barbadoes Neck, for \$1317.00, 23-24/100 acres upland and meadow on southern extremity of said Barbadoes Neck, beginning SW corner William Halsey's woodland, bounded N by said William Halsey; E by Major David Hunt; S by salt meadow; W by William Budd. Signed by Jonathan Mulford, Phebe Mulford (her mark). Witnessed by Thomas Ward, Betsey Ward.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Edward Hunt, of Newtown, in Queens County, gentleman, being sick. I leave to my wife Elizabeth, 1/3 of all movable estate, and the portion left to her by her father, which is in the hands of her brothers, Thomas and James Haggard, and she is to have the use of my estate in Newtown, during her widowhood, or until my sons Thomas and Jonathan come of age. Legacies to daughters Martha and Elizabeth. I make my wife executor, and John Hunt and Thomas Haggard overseers. I leave to my son Edward the land he now dwelleth on, in the County of Hunterdon, and œ4, and a small iron kettle for his birth right. I leave to my son Richard, the land that he dwelleth on in the County of Hunterdon, in New Jersey. I leave to my son Thomas my house and land that I now dwell on, as it is divided between him and his brother Jonathan, in the presence of James Renne and Nathaniel Haggard. Also a piece of salt meadow as it is divided, in presence of Benjamin Laurence, James Burroughs, and Benjamin Comfurth. Also a piece of land lying near the house of Thomas Robinson. He paying to his mother, Elizabeth, £30. I also leave him 1/2 of my purchase rights. I leave to my son Jonathan the land that Samuel Wright liveth on, as it is divided, And a piece of salt meadow, as divided, And a piece of land lying before the door of Abraham Bass, with the appurtenances. Also 10 acres on the west side of Juniper Swamp. I leave to my son Ralph Hunt, £1, to be paid out of the bond due to me from my brother, Ralph Hunt, with what he hath already received. I leave to my daughter, Sarah Titus, £18, to my daughter, Martha, £30. I leave to my daughters, Hannah and Abigail, all that land and house lot that was formerly Isaac Grays, and 12 acres of land in Juniper Swamp, And a piece of salt meadow by the meadow of their brothers, Thomas and Jonathan, when they are of age. I leave to my grand child, Sarah Reede, £2. Dated, January 15, 1715/16. Witnesses, Samuel Haight, Caleb Merill, James Burroughs. Proved, February 29, 1716, at a special meeting of John Jackson, Chief Judge of Court of Common Pleas, in Queens County, and Joseph Sackett, and James Hunt, Justices.

In his will dated 5 March 1772, probated 18 March 1772, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Elven Hunt, of the Borough town of Westchester, in Westchester County, being sick and weak. I direct all debts to be paid. My executors are to sell all my lands, meadow, house, and buildings, and all movable estate, within one year. My executors are to pay to my wife

Euphemia £300 in one year, in lieu of dower. The remainder to be put at interest for the support and education of my children. "That is to say, I order my oldest son, Thomas Hunt, to be learned to Read, to write and to cipher as far as the Rule of Three," and when he is 14 years old, he is to be put to a trade, my executors shall think most suitable for him. My youngest son, Elven, shall be kept at school until my son Thomas shall be 21, and then all the money to be divided between them. If both die, then to my nephew, Elven Ferris, son of John Ferris, and if he die, then to his eldest brother, John Ferris, Jr. I leave to my wife my best bed and chest of drawers, and my riding chair with harness. I make my friends, John Ferris, Daniel White, and William Honeywell, executors. Dated March 5, 1772. Witnesses, Ichabod Lewis, Cornelius Hunt, Isaac Leggett, Jr. Proved, March 18, 1772.

On 11 March 1711 he recorded his earmark in Westchester Co., NY. He settled at Philipsburgh by 1721 and on 23 Nov 1727 as resident of Philipsburgh he and brother Israel Hunt of Woodbridge, NJ sold land on Throg's Neck in Westchester to John Hunt. He came to Beekman about 1741. He was assessed in Beekman Precinct in Feb 1741/2 at #1, in Feb 1742/3 through Feb 1743/44 at £3, in Feb 1744/45 at £2, in Feb 1746/7 at £4, and in June 1758 at £1. He traded with James Woods, possibly before coming to Dutchess Co. An account dates as early as 20 Dec 1729 and runs through 1736. He bought handkerchiefs, 6 knives, a case of 3 knives and forks, 6 gallons, 3 quarts rum, linen, cambrick, calico chintz, frying pan and corn fan, skeins of thread, 2 yards tape, etc. He paid with a hog weighing 227 pounds and cash. His total account was £6/17/1-3/4 and he owed £1/14/3=3/4 after his payments were made. He furnished two steers and two oxen between 1746 and 1750 to the mill store of Henry Denker.¹

He first settled on a farm in lot 2 of the Poughquag Purchase on property that today belongs to either NYS as part of the Green Haven prison or part of lands owned by family of Frank Doherty (compiler of these Hunt records). "Jeremiah Hunt at Poughquiack Dr by indenture dated 1 May 1741 for 50 acres old & 150 new land in all 200 acres for his & wife's lives & wood in lot #4. The first 4 years shall pay 2 fowls & 1 day work & thereafter an additional rent from 1 May 1745 of £6 current money and so on to Increase 20 shillings on the rent yearly until it amounts to nine pounds with the work and fowls." The land was subsequently leased to John Vincent about 1748/9.¹

They lived in Westchester Co., NY. John Hunt, Constable, took the inventory of the estate of John Crouch of Westchester who died 24 Oct 1682. John Hunt, Alderman, took the inventory of the estate of Capt. William Barnes of Westchester 23 March 1701/02.¹

On 9 Jan 1711/12 he assigned the produce of an orchard on Throgmorton's Neck top his sons Jeremiah and Joshua during their minority.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...7 January, 1711/12. I, John Hunt, of the County of Westchester, yeoman, do make this my last will and testament. I leave to my son James Hunt, all that my land containing 30 acres upon Throgmorton's neck, and all the meadow adjoining thereto. Also a £25 privilege of Commonage when he is 21. Which said land lies adjoining to the land I have given to my son Josiah. And when my son James is 21, he shall pay to my daughter Mary Underhill £10, and he shall also pay to my son Josiah Hunt £15. My son James shall also have 6 acres of land lying between "Grove Siah's" and Horsman Molyneux land. I leave to my son John Hunt all that my homestead containing 60 acres, with all the meadow thereto belonging. Also a £25 privilege of Commonage. And all that land I bought of John Disbrow, and 5 acres of the land lying between "Grove Siah's" and Horsman Molyneux land. I leave to my son Josiah a £25 right of Commonage. My wife Grace Hunt is to have the rest of the personal property, and the use of the land given to my son John, till he is of age. I make my wife Grace, and my brother, Josiah Hunt, executors. Witnesses, Josiah Hunt, Daniel Clarke. Proved, January 16, 1711. [NOTE.--The expression "Grove Siah's" means Josiah Hunt of the Grove Farm.--W. S. P.]

In her will, she wrote: ...26 day of May, 1722. I, Grace Hunt, of the Borough Town of Westchester, widow of John Hunt, late of Westchester, being sick and weak. I leave to my son Joshua Hunt my silver tumbler and my Bible, which are now in his keeping. I leave to my son Jeremiah Hunt 30 shillings. To my son James 1 shilling. To my daughter Mary Underhill a bed and furniture, blanket, two pillows and two coverlids, "and the red and white worsted and linen stockings," also my red cupboard, all of which are in the house of said John Hunt. I leave all my other clothing to my two daughters Mary Underhill and Deborah Baxter. I leave to my daughter-in-law, Sarah Conklin, a bed and bolster. I leave to my son Obadiah one black chest and all my sheep and lambs, and to my son John all the rest of my household utensils, I leave to my son Obadiah all money owing to me. In his will, dated 31 Oct 1743, probated 14 Feb 1747 (Westchester Wills, Liber 16, p. 73), Josiah Hunt of Westchester, "Being far advanced in years" leaves to son Jacob all lands adjoining to my homestead of Grove Farm, where I now dwell, which I bought from the Trustees of Westchester, with some other Divisions, about 60 acres, situate on Throgs neck, lying between the Grove Farm, the land of Thomas Baxter, John Hunt, and the highway from Westchester to the Ferrey. Legacies to "my four daughters Rachel Fowler, Rebecca Pell, Lydia Briggs, and Tabitha." Executors are to sell all the lands on Throgs neck. Makes his son in law Walter Briggs and Anthony Bartow executors.¹

Another version of the will: ...I, Josiah Hunt, of the Borrough Town of Westchester, yeoman, being far advanced in years. All my just debts and funeral charges are to be paid by my executors. I leave to my sons Jacob and Caleb, each £10. To my son Solomon, £50. To my daughter Tabitha Hunt, £200. I leave to my son Jacob all those my lands adjoining to my homestead or Grove Farm, whereon I now dwell, which said lands I purchased from the Trustees of Westchester, with some other Divisions, containing about 60 acres, situate on Frogs Neck, as the same is bounded and lying between the said Grove Farm, and the land of Thomas Baxter, John Hunt, and the highway from Westchester to the Ferry. And he is to pay to my executors, for the use of my 4 daughters, Rachel Fowler, Rebecca Pell, Lydia Briggs and Tabitha Hunt, £50. I leave to my executors, £5 each; and they are to sell to the best advantage all my other lands on Frogs Neck. I leave to my 4 daughters all the rest of my movable estate and the money from the sale of the lands. I leave to my son Jacob a £25 right in the Commons of Westchester. I make my son in law, Walter Briggs, and my friend, Anthony Bartow, executors. Dated October 31, 1743. Witnesses, Edward Stevenson, Basil Bartow, Duncan Reed, John Bartow. Proved before Israel Honeywell, Esq., February 14, 1746/7.²

Thomas Hunt came to Boston by 1637 as an indentured servant to William Leete of Keyston. He removed to New Haven by 1639 as servant to Leete who was to become a Governor of the New Haven Colony, and later a Lt. Governor and Governor of the CT Colony after the New Haven Colony was brought under the government of CT under the charter of 1662. He married Cicely Clarke ca. 1640 and in 1643 they were ordered out of New Haven and removed to Stamford, CT. In 1652 he bought land on Spicer and Bracketts Neck from Augustine Harmons which became the nucleus for his famous Grove Farm. He apparently did not move there at that time because of disputes between the English and the Dutch who at that time occupied and claimed the New York area. He was in Elmhurst, L. I. in 1660-61 and ca. 1664 moved to his farm in Westchester Co. and was described as "a delegate from Westchester." He lived on this farm until his death in 1695.²

He was the original proprietor and patentee of the "Grove Farm" in the town of Westchester, where he lived. This estate was located on a fine point of land lying on the Sound, and along the east bank of Westchester Creek. It was purchased by Hunt from Augustine Hermans soon after 1652. It was patented to Thomas Hunt, 4 Dec 1667, by Governor Nicolls, and subsequently confirmed by Governor Dongan, 12 Jan., 1686.

Thomas Hunt, Sen., appears to have been in Stamford, Conn., in 1650; had interests in Middleborough (Indian name: Mespat) (Newtown) on Long Island in 1661. In 1663 he was made a freeman by the General Court of Connecticut. Baird, in his "History of Rye," says there is no evidence that he ever lived in that town, as asserted by some writers. Ralph Hunt, of Middleborough, who was an overseer of Edward Jessup's will, may have been a kinsman.

In his will, dated 1 Oct 1694, proved 27 Feb 1694/5 (Liber 5, p. 73), he wrote: I, Thomas Hunt, Sr., of the Grove Farm, in Westchester, being at this time weak in body. In order to settle and distribute my estate and to prevent all discords and troubles, that might otherwise arise among my children, I leave to Josiah Hunt, the eldest son of my son Josiah Hunt, and to his

heirs male, all my lands and meadows, known and called by the name of the Grove Farms, as mentioned in my Patent, granted by Governor Richard Nicolls, Dated the 4 of December, 1667, with all the houses and improvements thereon, with all household goods and articles of husbandry, and all live stock. And I do entail the said lands to his heirs male, from generation to generation, and no part of the same to be sold or disposed of. If he die without issue, then to his next surviving brother. I leave to my four sons, Thomas, Joseph, John, and Josiah £10 each. To my daughter, Abigail Pinckney, £10. Legacies to grandchildren, Abigail, daughter of my son Thomas, Abigail, daughter of my son Josiah, Martha, daughter of my son Joseph. My negro man Mungo is to live on the farm seven years, and then to be free. I desire my friends William Laurence, of Flushing, and Thomas Stevenson, of Newtown, to be overseers of my will. In witness whereof I, the said Thomas Hunt, Sr., have hereunto set my hand and seal, this First day of October, 1694. Witnesses, Robert Hoyt, Joseph Haviland, Edward Collier. -- Benjamin Fletcher, Captain-General and Governor, etc. To all to whom these presents may come. Know ye that at Fort William Henry, in the city of New York, on the 27th day of February, 1694/5, the last will of Thomas Hunt, Sr., late of Westchester, was proved, and Letters of administration granted to Josiah Hunt.

In 1683 he purchased from his widowed mother-in-law the Jessup farm in West Farms, Westchester Co., NY where he then lived until he died.

In June, 1704, he made affidavit that he was then "aged sixty-four or thereabouts."

Thomas Hunt, Jr. probably was living with his father at the "Grove Farm" at the time of the elder's death on 8 Feb 1694, but soon after he is found well settled at Hunt's Point, and in due time comes into possession of the whole estate. He appears to have been a man who, less prudent than his father, freely expressed his preference for the English to the Dutch rule, and was once on the point of being banished the province for refusing to take the oath of allegiance to the States General, but at his father's request was allowed to remain on acceptance of the oath and giving security for his good behavior.

Thomas Hunt came into possession of half the lands in West Farms by marriage to Elizabeth, daughter of Edward Jessup. This property was held by his descendants for one hundred and sixty years. On the extremity of Hunt's Point is the ancient burial ground of the family. It is made famous by being the last resting place of the poet Joseph Rodman Drake.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Thomas Hunt, Esq., of the Borrough town of Westchester, being far advanced in years. I leave to my eldest son, Stephen Hunt, a lot of salt meadow containing 4 1/2 acres, which I bought of William Lawrence, lying on the west side of Barretta creek. Also my £25 privilege in the Sheep Pasture or Commonage of Westchester, And the reason I now give him no more is because I have provided for him already according to my ability. I leave to my son, Charles Hunt, all those two tracts of land which I bought of the executors of Moses Fowler, by eed, November 14, 1745, which land is situate in the township of East Chester at a place called the Long Reach, both containing 100 acres. I leave to my son Elvin all the rest of my real estate, and he shall allow to my wife the entire use and benefit until he is 21, if she shall live so long and remain my widow. If my son Elvin dies under age, then my wife is to have the use of all my real estate for life if she remains my widow. If my son Elvin lives to be of age, he shall allow my wife Mary the use of a room in my house and 1/3 of my real estate. If my son Elvin dies under age, I authorize my grand sons, Sylvester Hunt, son of my son, Stephen Hunt, and Robert Hunt, Jr., son of my daughter Christina, and John Hunt, son of my daughter Alethea, to sell all my residuary real estate, and the money to be divided among my children and grand children, Stephen, Charles, Alethea, wife of John Hunt, Anna, wife of John Leggett, Helena, wife of Jonathan Odell, Martha, wife of James Tippet, and Myana Hunt, and my grand son, Robert Hunt, Jr. I leave to my daughter Anna, wife of John Leggett, £10. To the heirs of my daughter Christina, £5. To my daughter Alethea, wife of John Hunt, one large silver tankard and a silver bowl and 2 silver table spoons. I give to her daughter Elizabeth a feather bed and furniture. To my daughter Helena, wife of Jonathan Odell, £5. To my daughter, Myana Hunt, £100. I leave to my wife Mary 2 negroes and 1/3 of the remainder of my movable estate, and the rest to my son Elvin and my daughter Myana. I make my wife executor. Dated July 26, 1756. Witnesses, John Bartow, Samuel Embree, John Embree. Proved, July 15, 1758.
