The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Dirck Huyck, of the Township of Kinderhook, in Duchess County, "being in an ill state of health, but of sound mind, memory, and understanding." I leave to my son, Burger Huyck, my negro, "Jo," in full satisfaction of his right of Primogeniture. I leave to my wife Sarah all my real and personal estate, during her natural life or widowhood, "and no longer." After her death I leave to my son Burger all my real estate, and which I received from my father or other wise, with all farming utensils, such as Waggons, Plows, Harrows, rakes, spades, etc. And he shall pay to my daughter Rachel £10, when of age. I leave all my personal estate to all my children, "born and unborn," viz., Burger, Rachel, Batie, and Mayke. I make my wife Sarah, and my brothers-in-law, Willem Klaw and Cornelius Van Dusen, and Matthew Goes, Jr., executors. Dated December 3, 1772. Witnesses, H. Van Schaack, Johanes Huyck, Elizabeth Huyck. Proved, July 1, 1773, before Peter Lansingh, Surrogate. Confirmed by Gov. William Tryon, November 2, 1773.

The Huygens were a prominent family in Wesel. Peter Minuit, who married Sybilla's sister, Gerduudt/Gertrude Raet, had a warm and familiar relationship with his brother-in-law by marriage, and a strong affection for his nephew Hendrick Huygen.

There was no minister at the time Minuit took charge of the New Netherland colony, but he was instrumental in having his brother-in-law Jan Huygen come to the colony as the storekeeper, and also to serve as a sieckentrooster or krankenbezoeker. This assignment, which was a combination lay preacher and male nurse, was a recognized ecclesiastical office in the Reformed Church. The incumbent was permitted to hold church services, lead the psalm singing, and read spiritual texts and commentaries to the people, although he was not allowed to administer certain sacraments.

Huygen was examined April 2, 1625, and approved by the Consistory of Amsterdam for services in New Netherland. He probably came over on the *Arms of Amsterdam* with de Rasiere, arriving July 28, 1626.

Willem Huycken (Hoecken), tailor, of Gowanus, emigrated in 1663. He signed his name "Wyellum Heocken." Mem. of R. D. ch. of Brooklyn in 1677, and of R. D. ch. of Flatlands in 1675, where he then resided; and took the oath of allegiance in Brooklyn in 1687. Bought one half of Cornelis Lambertse Cool's patent at Gowanus of Paulus Vanderbeek, he selling the other one half to Cornelis Gerretse Van Duyn. (The Huycken part was afterwards owned by Anthony Hulst, and the Van Duyn part by Peter Wyckoff.) This patent passed from Cool to Bredentent, and from the latter to Vanderbeek.

(Recorded for Simon Aertsen, and Antie Aertsen.) Joint Will. "In the Name of God, Amen. In the year 1687, this 27 day of March, appeared before me Jacobus Vandewater, Public Notary, admitted in the Town of Brookland, in Kings Co., and there residing, Mr. William Huyksen, Anntie Andies Williard, his wife, inhabitants of Gowanus, being known to me, and both being in perfect health, goeing and standing, and of full understanding, and not willing to depart this life before they have disposed of their temporal estate." They made the survivor of the two the sole heir to all the estate, but if the survivor remarry, one half is to be given to the children, namely, Machtell, Mary, Anna, Gretie, Catharina and Elizabeth, and such other children as they may yet have. Written at the house of the testators in the presence of John Jansen, Hendrick Slegt, Jacobus Vandewater. Proved by the oath of above witnesses, and confirmed by Governor Benjamin Fletcher, January 25, 1693/4.

Joint Will -- (Written in Dutch language.) In the name of God, Amen. In the year after the birth of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, 1687, the 27 day of March, Appeared before me Jacobus Vandewater, Notary Public, admitted in the village of Breucklin, in Kings County. The worthy Mr. William Huycken, and his wife, Anntie Willjoer, married people, known to me, and living at the Gowanus, both being in bodily health, going and standing. They leave their dead bodies to their heirs for a decent burial. They appoint as their universal heir the survivor or longest liver of the two, as to all real estate, cattle, goods, etc., without being obliged to give any account, and all personal estate, cattle, silver, gold, coined or uncoined. And after the death of both, then to their children, Machtel, Maria, Annettie, Gertruy, Catharina, and Elizabeth, and such further children as they may have. Excepting Gertruy, who is not in the possession of her senses, and she shall have a double portion. The real estate is not to be divided until all of the children are of age. Desiring no Courts to meddle with their estate, but thanking them for the trouble they may be willing to take. The party living the longest is to appoint guardians. This being plainly read to them, is their last will. Witnesses, Jan Jansen, Hendrick Slegt. At the house of the testators.

Annetje Andrieas Willjard m. (2) (intentions 19 June 1691 Flatbush Ref Ch) **Simon Aertse DeHart** (Ter Haert in banns), widower of Geertie Cornelissen.

"Wyellem Heocken" or Huyken, on whose estate "Simon and Annetie Aertse" or Aesen, Jan. 25th, 1694, petitioned for letters of administration, had six children, as per his will, dated March 27th, 1687, on file in the New York surrogate's office, viz: "Machtelt, Maria, Annetie, Geertruy, Catharine, "and Elizabeth Huycken." Of these Matilda or Machtelt m. Jan. 4th 1691, Cornelius Gerretse Van Duyn; Maria or Marretje m. Feb. 4, 1691, Denys Gerretse Van Duyn; Annetie or Jannetje was

bapt. Jan 28th 1683. He also appears.....Huyken's farm was sold, after his death, to Cornelis Gerritse Van Duyn. This farm passed from Cornelis Gerretse to his son Cornelius." -- The Bergen Family, Teunis G. Bergen, page 275
