The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will dated 26 June 1731, probated 29 June 1732, Abraham Hyatt, the elder, of Eastchester, mentioned wife Hannah, daughters Rachel, Sarah, Mary, Jane, and Susannah; eldest son Abraham; other sons Elvan, John, and sons Caleb and Gilbert (when of age). He made son Abraham, "my brother" Caleb Hyatt, and friend Roger Barton executors. Wit: Jonathan Odell, Samuel Williams, Benjamin Drake. In the will, he wrote: 26 June, 1731. I, Araham Hyatt, the elder, of Eastchester, being sick. My executors are to sell all my lands in Eastchester old Patent and the buildings. I leave to my wife Hannah 1/3 of personal estate. To my daughter Rachael, £50, to my daughter Sarah, £50, and to my daughter Mary, £50, and to my daughters Jane and Susanah, £50 each. To my sons Elvan and John, each, £25. I leave to my eldest son Abraham, 24 acres of land on the east side of the highway, that leads towards the White Plains, through the land called the Long Reach, or the New Patent. Also my house and barn on the other side of the said highway, opposite to the said 24 acres. Also 76 acres thereto to be annexed, to begin by the said highway at a small brook a little south of the house, and running down by the brook, about 25

rods, and then north along the brow of the hill as the old fence stood, till it comes to a field called "Muck hole," and so to the land of John Ward, and so to said highway till it contains 76 acres; Also a piece of salt meadow at a place called Castle Hill. All the rest of my lands thereto adjoining I leave to my sons Caleb and Gilbert, with a piece of salt meadow at the Pines. My son Abraham is to pay to my son Elvans £25 when of age, and my sons Caleb and Gilbert are to pay to my son John when of age £25. I leave to my wife Hannah the use of the lands left to my sons during her widowhood, and I make her and my son Abraham and my brother, Caleb Hyatt, and my trusty friend, Roger Barton, my executors. Witnesses, Jonathan Odell, Samuel Williams, Benjamin Drake. Proved, June 29, 1732.<sup>1</sup>

In what is probably his will, he wrote: ...September 17, 1758. I, John Hiatt, of Phillipsburgh, in Westchester County, yeoman, "being now in perfect mind, Praise be to God." I leave to my wife Rachel a bed and furniture, a horse and cow, a pot and trammel, 3 chairs, and 2 platters. I leave all the rest to my daughters, Jane, Mary, and Elizabeth. My wife is to remain in possession of all improvements, but when she dies or is married they are to go to my sons, John, Arnold, and Thomas. And I make my sons John and Thomas executors. Witnesses, John Gerritts, Anne Van Noorstrand, Moses Van Noorstrand. Proved, December 6, 1758.

In his will, he wrote: ...April 22, 1760. I, John Hyatt, of the Manor of Cortlandt, in Westchester County. I leave to my wife Sarah my negro wench "Moll." After all debts are paid I leave £10 to my eldest son, John, and £30 to my second son, Joshua. I leave all the rest of movables to my wife and my second daughter, Sarah, and my third daughter, Hannah. I leave to my wife the use of my farm till my son Silvanus is of age. I leave to my son John the farm that he now lives on, with an addition to it off the east end of the farm that I now live on, according to the survey of Mr. Pierre Van Cortlandt. I leave to my son Joshua the farm that I have purchased of Andrew Barton, and on which said Barton now lives. I leave to my son Silvanus the farm I now live on (except as above) when he is of age "or sooner if he shall marry." If he dies I leave it to his brothers. I leave to my eldest daughter, Elizabeth Strang, £12. I make my wife and son Joshua and Nathaniel Hyatt executors. Witnesses, Ann Lane, Benjamin Lord, Joseph Strang. Proved, June 1, 1763.

I leave to my wife Abigail all my apparell and 1/3 of my movables, and 1/2 to my children. All my right and title to my farm is to be sold and divided among my children. My wife is to bring up my children till they are 14 years old. "My negro 'Derra,' is to be hired out till he shall have earned £56, and then to be free." I make David Frost and Nathaniel Hyatt, Jr., executors. Witnesses, Ezekiel Hyatt, Philip Burgdorp, Sarah Frost. Proved, March 8, 1775.
