The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Cornelis Yoralemon was an executor 18 Dec 1759 for the estate of his presumed father-in-law, Johannes Thomasee of Newark, Essex County. Captain of minute men in Revolutionary War, killed 1777/83 at Connecticut Farms (now Union), New Jersey near Belleville when he was fired upon by Hessian soldiers.¹

They lived at Second River, New Jersey. In 1765 he purchased 46.39 acres (S5:260) with brother John or nephew John in Morris County, New Jersey. However, it would appear that this land may have been in what is now Hardiston, Sussex County, New Jersey from later deeds of Sussex County (Q:444 and Q:447) where his nephew John afterwards resided and which county was formed from Morris County.¹

Derrick d. between 15 Jan and 8 Mar 1769. Will of Richard Joralemon, yeoman of Second River (now Belleville), New Jersey, dated 15 Jan 1769, named aunt Margaret Stanberry to be handsomely maintained as long as she lives; son, Jacobus, all real and personal property, except reserving for the use of my sister, Auriantje Wauters, the use of a room, while a widow. Executors, friends Ryner Brown and Joseph Kingsland. Witnesses, Hendrick Brown, William Kingsland, Henry Kingsland, and Henry Joralemon. Inventory, 8 Mar 1769. Proved 13 Mar 1769. Sarah was not named in his Will, but she was living 22 Dec 1777 when named in the Will of son, Jacobus.¹

In the record of their banns, they were: Helmig Jeralimans, y.m., and Anneke Lucasz, wid. of Frans Mennoury, both lived near New Albany.

Helmer is said to have left no issue and the land returned to the province. Helmer Janse was among a list of freeholders in 1720 in Cossackie and Catskill. Helmer Janse is presumed to be Helmer Janse Joralemon. The earliest date found for the Joralemon name was on 25 Dec 1687 Albany Ref Ch, when marriage banns were proclaimed for "Helmig Jeralimans, young man and Anneke Lucasz, widow of Frans Mennoury, both living near New Albany." in the Albany Dutch Reformed church records. After his marriage his name appears in church baptisms as Helmer Janse without the Joralemon attachment, until a 1702 baptism. But, again after this date his name appears as Helmer Janse, unless there was a Helmer Janse Joralemon and a Helmer Janse. Helmer is perhaps the Helmer Jansz who witnessed the baptism 27 Oct 1687 of Maria daughter of Lucas Lucasz and Dorthea Jansz in the Dutch Reformed Church of Albany, New York. Seven years after their marriage banns were published, Antje (Anna) appears as Antje Laurents (Lawrence), which is not the same as Lucas. No children can be found in church baptism records for Helmer Janse Joralemon and his wife Antje, which would perhaps further indicate that Helmer Janse of Catskill and Helmer Janse Joralemon were one and the same.

"Helmert Jansz witnessed a baptism 8 Sept 1689 of Agniet daughter of Francois Gaignon and his wife, Agniet Jansz.

"Helmert Jansz and Antje Laurents" were witnesses 28 Jan 1694 at the baptism of "Pieter son of Teunis Pietersz and Margriet Laurents."

In the inventory of the estate of Marten Gerritsen van Bergen, Albany, 6 May 1696 there was land at Coxhachy in partnership with Jan Bronk and an old dilapidated house and a barn in possession of Helmer Janse, with a cow (Early Records of Albany by VanLaer).

Helmer Jansen witnessed the Will of Hendrick VanWie, 3 June 1701 (Albany County Records, Wills I, p. 80). "Helmer Janse Jeraleman and Antje Jeraleman" witnessed the baptism 17 May 1702 of "Antje daughter of Ritchart Janse VandenBerk and Tryntje Hoochteeling." "Helmer Jansse and wife, Anna" were witnesses 7 Jan 1705 at the baptism of "Helmer Johannes son of William Turner and Abigail Bogart." "Helmer Jansse and wife, Antje" were witnesses 6 Apr 1707 at the baptism of "Jacob son of Jan Dekker and Tryje Bogert." "Helmer and Antie Jansen" were witnesses 25 Dec 1714 at the baptism of "Anna daughter of Cornelis and Antie Lanzensen." No further records have been found for Helmer and Antje in church

records.

Hellemer Janse Jeralewin was among a list of troops in the city and county of Albany under the command of Captain John Schuyler in 1715. Helmer was thus living in 1715, but it is undetermined if all of the above records relating to "Helmer Janse" refer to one and the same or if there was more than one person as Helmer Janse.

After his death, without issue, the authorities reclaimed the land which had been patented to Helmer's step-father?, Gysbert Uyt den Bogaert.

To the worshipfull the Justices of Peace conveind in Albany at ye sessions of ye Peace ye 7 of February 1698/9. The humble petition of Helme Janse showeth how ye his stepfather Gysbert Bogaert & Mary Jochemse his mother have been peaceably possessed of a certain peace of woodland situate lyeing & being on ye northside of Catskill for above twenty years last past which land they afterwards wist on ye 26 June 1684 purchased of ye native proprietors as by ye deed thereof made before ye magistrate of Albany at large boath appear, land stretches from a place called feemenhoek ye lyes opposite to Boomties hoek in ye river at ye mouth of Catskill & runs up northward along ye west side of Hutsons River to a small kill or creek called Stuck which comes into ye river over against Vastrix Island and is by computation about 2000 paces from thence stretches westwards into ye woods to beneath Dirk Teunises mill to ye southward to ye first creek ye runs into Hans Vossen kill or creek & then going along Hans Vossen hill till ye same comes unto Catskill & so along Catskill till ye come to Boomties hoek, together with a rather small piece of land of about three acres lyeing on ye north side of Catskill a litle above where Haris Vossen kill comes into Catskill being neer to ye kill it is fallen down into ye creek both which tracts & parcells of land ye sd Gysbert Bogart & his wife Mary Jochims have conveyed & transported to ye humble petitioner & in regard ye sd Gysbert hath never been able to be at ye charge of procureing a patent for his said land, (patents being formerly purchased at dear rates) is ye land being but of litle value he humbly prays your worships certificate of ye sd land is now belonging to ye petitioner & if yerecommend _____ to his Excellency ye Earl of Belloment for a patent for ye same and ye humble petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray. Albany 8 February 1698/9. The humble petition of Helmer Janse of Coxhacksy in ye County of Albany humbly showeth how that . . . (the remainder is the same as the above petition), dated 27 July 1702. Patent was granted 29 July 1702.

There is also another request by Helmer Janse describing the same land, undated. In this petition he is referred to as Helmer Janse of the County of Albany yeoman showeth that Gysbert Bogart your petitioners father in law on the 8 day of February 1698/9 conveyed to your petitioner (Helmer Janse) a certain peace of woodland . . . (remainder being the same as above). This petition may have ocured between the first one of 8 February 1698/9 and the one dated 27 July 1702.

Gysbert Bogaert is referred to as both stepfather and father in law in separate petitions. Mary Jochims is not named in the undated petition.

Pursuant to a warrant from his Excellency William Cosby Esq., late Governor & Commander in Chief of the Province of New York dated 6th of Feby 1735/6 survey'd by Edward Collins deputed by me for that purpose for John Lindesay a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying & being in the County of Albany on the west side of Hudson's River. Beginning at the mouth of a small run of water where it falls into Vassents Brook or Creek below Samuel Van Veighty's old grist mill & runs thence down the said brook as it runs to the Catts kill River then down the stream of said River to Hudson's River then up the stream of Hudson's River to the mouth of a small brook called Stuck where it falls into said River opposite to Vastrin Island then from the mouth of said brook called Stuck nearly north seventy three degrees thirty minutes west sixty five chains to the place where this tract began containing four hundred & sixty acres of land. Given under my hand this first day of August 1738. Cadwallader Colden.

To all to whom these presents shall come or may concern it is hereby certiyed that whereas John Lindesay had by his humble petition presented to his late Excellency William Cosby Esq., late Captain Corporal and Governour in Chief of the said Province of New York & in Council on the Eighteenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty three sett forth that by virtue of a writ issued in Chancery under the great Seal of the said Province to the Escheator of the County of Albany Directed; an inquisition was made by which it was found that Helmer Janse late of the said County deceased, about the twentieth of September one thousand seven hundred and thirty one dyed intestate leaving no issue behind him being at the time of his death seized of a certain tract of land in the County of Albany lying on the westside of Hudsons River near Katts Kill (Catskill). The petitioner therefore in order to encourage a discovery of the rights of the crown when concealed prayed his majestys letters patent for the tract of land aforesaid of which he the said Helmer Janse so as aforesaid dyed seized which petition having been there read and considered of his majesty's council of this Province did afterward showith on the same day humbly advise and consent that his said late Excellency should grant the prayer thow of in order to the granting whereof and in obedience to his majestys royal _____ we have set out for the aforesaid John Lindesay all that certain tract or parcel of land situate lyeing & being in the County of Albany on the westside of Hudsons River beginning at the mouth of a small run of water where it falls into Vassons Brook or Creek below Samuel Van Veightys grist mill and runs thence down the said brook as it runs to the Catts kill river then down the stream of said river to Hudsons river then up the stream of Hudsons River to the mouth of a small brook called Stuck where it falls into said river opposite to Vastrick Island then from the mouth of said Brook called Stuck nearly north seventy three degrees thirty minutes west sixty five chains to the place where this tract began containing four hundred and sixty acres of land and in setting out thow of we have had regard to the profitable and unprofitable acres and have taken care that the being thereof dos not extend along the banks of any river otherwise than is conformable to his majestys instructions for that purpose. Given under our hands the fifteenth day of August in the twelfth year of His Majestys reign anno domini 1738. Geo Clarke, Arthr Konnody, Cadwallader Coldon.

He served as captain in Essex County, militia during Revolution. He is perhaps the H. Joralemon who was a jerseyman prisoner in 1777 and 1778 in Provost Jail, New York during the Revolution. Taxed in Newark township, Essex County in Feb 1779 with 12 acres, 1 horse, 2 cows and in Feb 1780 with 23 acres, 2 horses, 1 pig.¹

Revolutionary War officer Henry Joralemon served as captain in the 2nd Reg. and was one of the daring quartet that surprised a group of redcoats partying at Bergen Hts., carrying off their highest ranking officer. The other participants in this event, known as "Capt. Kidney's Exploit", were brother Helmich Joralemon, Jacob Garland, and John Kidney. Named on D.A.R. Memorial Plaque in Second River Ref Church (Belleville, NJ) vestibule & Revolutionary War Monument in Churchyard.²

The 1769 Will of Margaret Stanberry gave "to Hendrick Jeroloman, son of Nicholas Jeroloman, 40 pounds."

In the Bergen Ref Ch record of their marriage intentions, they were: Jacobus Jansen Ralemon, Y.M. from N. Albany, and Pietertje Claes, Y.D. from Ahastmus.

John Ffransis [sic; possibly John Francisco?] who, with Keshee his wife, purchased twenty-four acres of land from Jacobus Joralomon within the bounds of Newark on 30th December 1695, recorded in the "Newark Town Book, from 1691," which is in the library of the New Jersey Historical Society.

Pietertje became a member of the Dutch Reformed Church at Bergen, New Jersey, 6 Oct 1690 and was dismissed by certificate to Acequeggenon (Acquackanonk) 16 Sept 1700. About 1700 among a lengthy list of names for "remonstrance of the inhabitants of East Jersey to the King, against the acts of the Proprietors, and asking for the appointment of a competent Governor" appears "Dit ist merke Jacob Rarleston III" and on the same list "the marke of Jan Raleman I." This perhaps refers to Jacobus and his brother Jan. Jacobus was elected deacon of the Dutch Reformed Church of Acquackanonk (now Passaic), May 1709, May 1711, and May 1714. In 1722 he was elected elder. Perhaps resided between Acquackanonk and Second River (which is now the outlying section of Newark and the towns of Belleville and Nutley), Essex County, New Jersey. Jacobus was a carpenter. "Jacob Jralemon and Petertje Klaesen" were among a register of names tabulated as a result of house visits by Rev. Henricus Coens, minister at Acquackanonk and Second River in 1726.

"Jacobus Joralemon of Second River, Essex Co., carpenter and wheelwright" dated his will 26 Mar 1757 (proved 20 Dec 1760). In his will (no mention of wife) he mentions children Derrick (sole Executor), Hans, Claus, Cornelius, Hannah, Ariantje, Cornelia, and Elizabeth. Mentions Phoebe, dau. of deceased son Hendrick. He mentions real and personal estate. Witnesses were Mark Dempsy, Thomas Harrison, Edmund Kingsland.

An Island and riverbed in the Passaic River was conveyed to Johannes Jeralemon by deed from East Jersey proprietors. On 24 Nov 1737 he signed an agreement with Hendrick Spier who was bpt 13 June 1681 at Bergen for the operation of a mill. The mill was at the foot of what is now Mulberry Street in Passaic. This is perhaps the same mill mentioned in the New York Mercury, June 28, 1756 as "near the falls of the Passaic."²

Johannes and Elizabeth resided at what is now Paterson, New Jersey. The pension application of their widowed daughter, Charity Hill in 1836 stated "her father moved from there (Paterson) to Sparta in Hardyston, Sussex Co. when she was about 12 years old." This would place the removal of the family to Sparta, Sussex County at about 1768. "John Jeraleman of Hardyston in the County of Sussex in the Eastern Division of the Province of New Jersey" gave a mortgage 12 Sept 1768 to "Dirick Dye of Achgueghenonk (Acquackanonk, which is now Passaic) in the County of Essex" for a certain tract of land "lyeing and being in the Township of Hardyston and County of Sussex."

He is perhaps the "John Yerolomon" who was taxed at New Barbados township, Bergen County, New Jersey in Sept 1779 as a householder with 43 acres, 2 horses, 5 cattle, and 3 pigs. He was taxed there in Feb 1780. He was living in Barbados Neck when named executor in the Will of son in law, William MacLean dated 6 May 1791 Barbados Neck, Bergen County. Maria was still living 27 Feb 1797 when she and John witnessed a baptism at Acquackanonk. He is perhaps the John Jeroloman who d. intestate bf 21 Aug 1807 in New Barbados township, Bergen County. Inventory dated 21 Aug 1807 by Samuel Lewis and Teunis Brown and sworn to by Cornelius Jeroloman.²
